JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

The Forty-Third Annual Conference of the Kansas District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at 8:00 a.m. Monday, August 6, 1956 at the Camp Meeting Tabernacle at Hutchinson, Kansas.

FIRST SITTING

The Conference opened with Rev. Elmer Jantz, pastor of the Scott City Church, leading the song "How beautiful to walk in the steps of the Saviour". Rev. Marion B. Hill, pastor of the St. Francis Church, lead the Conference in a gracious season of prayer.

Rev. Howard K. Busby, District Superintendent, introduced to the Conference Rev. Paul F. Elliott, General Secretary of Sunday Schools and Youth Work, as our presiding officer. Rev. Elliott spoke from the seventeenth verse of Obadiah, "Possess your possessions", showing Obadiah's vision of the Church with its battles, victories, and holiness.

The roll call was read.

Moved and seconded that the three center sections to the posts and the platform constitute the Conference Bar. Carried.

Moved and seconded that the time for conference be from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon, and from 1:30 p.m. until 5:30 p.m. with recess from 12:00 to 1:30. Carried.

Report of the examining Board read and approved.

On recommendation from the District Council Rev. and Mrs. Ira Diggs were received on their credentials from the Fire Baptized Church; Rev. Diggs as an ordained minister and Mrs. Diggs as a licensed minister.

Rev. Dee Zahner was received as a licensed minister into the Conference.

The good report of our beloved District Superintendent, Rev. Howard K. Busby, was read and accepted with an appreciative standing vote and a hearty 'Amen'.

A verbal report fraom the assistant district superintendent, Rev. Ray Jellison, was given and accepted.

Report of the auditing committee was read and accepted.

Report of the district treasurer was read and accepted.

Report of the district Sunday School committee was read and accepted.

Report of the statistical committee was read and accepted.

Moved and seconded to recess for ten minutes. Carried.

Report of the Ways and Means committee read and accepted as revised.

Moved and seconded that we have election of officers at 10:30. Carried.

Report of the Resolution Committee read and accepted as revised. Report of the Foreign Missionary Committee read and accepted,

Report of the Foreign Missionary Committee read and accepted, with the exception of number 3 which was referred back to the committee.

The election of officers became the order of the day.

Other members of the District Council:—B. F. Ireland, F. M. Eichelberger, and Roy Glendening.

Each of the above officers were elected on a first ballot.

The Reception Committee introduced Rev. Dean Mitchener who was then received into the Conference.

The final report of the Missionary Committee was read and accepted.

Moved and supported to license Joe Robinson as song evangelist. Carried. He was introduced and given an honorary seat within the Conference Bar.

Moved and supported that the Sunday School Institute replace our Ministerial Convention for this conference year. Carried.

Several 'Thank you' notes as listed under 'Special Resolutions' were moved and carried.

Rev. P. F. Elliott gave an instructive talk relative to the Pilgrim Holiness Advocate, the General Budget, our new graded Sunday School literature, and the Forward Movement.

Moved and seconded that all unfinished business and the reading of the minutes be left to the District Council. Carried.

Rev. Victor Marvin gave a report stating his pleasure in being a Pilgrim Holiness member of one year standing. Also saying that it was his birthday. 'Happy Birthday' was sung - thereby wishing him God's blessing.

Moved and seconded to adjourn. Carried. After the Doxology was sung the closing prayer was offered by Rev. Howard K. Busby, who was beginning his fifteenth year as our District Superintendent.

The Minutes were approved by the District Council.

ORDINATION SERVICE

A very fine ordination service was conducted in our Camp Meeting Tabernacle in Hutchinson, Kansas at 9:00 a.m. Thursday morning, August 2nd, 1956, in which Rev. Paul McNall was ordained to the ministry.

Rev. B. F. Ireland led the congregation in song, after which prayer was offered by Rev. Ray Jellison. Scriptures were read by Rev. Howard K. Busby, Rev. Lorren D. Elliott, and Rev. Wayne R. Plummer.

Rev. Paul F. Elliott, General Secretary of Sunday Schools and Youth Work, gave the Ordination address, using for his text 1 Cor. 9:19 "I have made myself servant unto all, that I might gain the more."

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the 43rd Annual Conference of the Kansas District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church now in session, Greetings!

God, through His mercy has allowed us to serve Him and this age through another year. It has, always been a year of battles, but at no time have the clouds obscured the sun. We thank God for this. Many victories have been won and forward moves made, which is all in keeping with our great crusade which we call "A Forward Movement."

Wichita Trinity has been completed and dedicated. This is one of our finest churches in the District. (Kansas City has a beautiful Church which we were privileged to dedicate.) The new Topeka church and parsonage gives us one of the best opportunities we have ever possessed in the Kansas District. The Iola church has been freed from debt. Big Bow raised money for beautiful pews that are installed. These and other splendid improvements are the result of vision, prayer and faith.

Adoption of the Blue Cross-Blue Shield has been a great blessing to our pastors. The churches have stood loyally by in this undertaking. Rev. Colaw worked faithfully for us in getting the plan set up.

The Harkins family deserved special mention in the splendid way they have maintained the property and Camp Grounds.

With our other labors we have served the Lamont Church as pastor. This church paid us forty dollars for a week meeting. Exclusive of this, the year's salary has been paid to the District Treasurer.

Our membership gain in the District was not as large as last year, but we are glad for a gain. It is regrettable that our Sunday School will show a loss this year

This District has paid me for 20,249 miles of travel. I have visited the churches 83 times. Besides these visits I have made 91 parsonage calls, I have preached 179 times, made 175 other calls, and held four revivals. In addition I have preached several funerals, conducted one wedding, dedicated two churches and new church pews at Big Bow. Some 250 people have sought God at our altars. I have attended all of the meetings of the General Board, the church leaders' Conference at Indianapolis, and have tried to serve faithfully on the Bible College Board. My salary is paid and the churches have given me \$335.66 in love offerings.

It is impossible to list the countless other activities we have been engaged in while serving God and others. He has the record.

I wish to thank the churches and pastors for their hospitality and kindnesses shown us. Your prayers, faith, and labors have made possible the good work done.

We recommend that the Evangelists, District Superintendent, Home Missionary workers, Evangelistic singers, ministers pay 75% of their ministerial tithe to the District Treasurer, one-fifth of which to apply on District Church Extension Loan Fund, the balance to apply on District Budget. We further recommend that the conference payment for pension plan members be paid from the District Budget.
- 3. We recommend that our churches be apportioned for the District budget at the rate of \$2.00 per member in full standing; and at the rate of \$6.00 per member for the General Budget, which apportionment equals the following amount for each church. The first item is the district Budget.

- 4. We recommend that the District Superintendent have the privilege of conducting two revivals meeting off the district, and that he have a two week vacation each year.
- 5. We recommend that all the churches send in all money to the District Treasurer so as to reach him by the tenth of each month.
- 6. We recommend that we pay our District Superintendent at the rate of \$250.00 per month plus five cents per mile car expense when traveling in his own car and actual expense when traveling otherwise. We further recommend that the district pay his telephone bill and \$15.00 per month for utilities.
- 7. We recommend that each Sunday School be apportioned the following per month for District Home Missions.

- 8. Whereas the General Board has requested that each district place its zone school in its district budget, be it resolved that each of our churches raise a monthly free will offering for our school.
- 9. We recommend that all churches take a love offering for the District Superintendent at time of his regular visits.
- 10. We recommend that all money raised by the representatives of the General Church and institutional interests be turned over to the local church treasurer and be used for the purpose for which it was raised.
- 11. We recommend that our District Secretary be paid \$100.00 per year and that our District Treasurer be paid \$150.00 per year.
- 12. Be it resolved that the traveling expense of any minister whose travel is authorized by the district have his traveling expense met on the same basis as the District Superintendent.
- 13. We recommend that a form copy of the budget apportionments for each church be sent to the local church treasurer immediately after the conference.
- 14. We recommend that each church be assessed at the rate of 25c per member per year for General Conference expense.

REPORT OF THE RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE

I Local Church Work

- 1. We further recommend that opportunity for baptism be given by our churches at least once each year.
- 2. Resolved that each pastor may hold two revival meetings each year off his charge.
- 3. Be it resolved that our churches do not open their doors to other churches, organizations, institutions, or individuals for financial appeals.
- 4. Resolved that no pastor employ an evangelist outside the Pilgrim Holiness Church without first consulting the District Superintendent.
- 5. Resolved that each pastor leaving his charge, prepare and leave for his successor a complete calling list with the location of the homes.
- 6. We recommend that each pastor be granted two weeks vacation with pay.

II DISTRICT WORK

- 1. Whereas the Conference has approved the Blue Cross-Blue Shield plan, be it resolved that it be optional with the local churches to pay one-half of the monthly payments.
- 2. We recommend that the Conference adopt the Forward Movement plan as recommended by the General Church. The Committee of five to consist of the District Superintendent, the District Secretary, Executive Secretary of the Youth, Chairman of the Sunday School Committee, and one at large to be appointed by the district council.
- 3. Be it resolved that the district council appoint an editor for the district publication.
- 4. Resolved that any pastor, who is required to be away from his church on district, local, or general business, shall receive his salary as usual.
- 5. Resolved that we, as the Kansas District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church go on record as opposed to members of the Pilgrim Holiness Church being required to violate their religious convictions. and the standards of the Church in physical education classes in the public schools.
- 6. Resolved that the committees be appointed by the council, and the names of those appointed on said committees be printed in the district minutes.
- 7. Resolved that in the event of death of any of our pastors' or evangelists' immediate family, the District Secretary shall be immediately wired, and in turn each pastor shall be notified by wire by the District Secretary.
- 8. Be it resolved that no mortgage be placed upon our District Camp grounds, parsonage and equipment pertaining thereto, without two-thirds vote of this conference.
- 9. Be it resolved that each church strive for a 10 per cent gain in membership and that each pastor work toward that goal.

III—CAMP AND CONFERENCE

1. We recommend that a system of rules and regulations governing our camp and premises be adopted by this conference which shall read as follows:

Whereas the Pilgrim Holiness Church Camp Grounds at Hutchinson, Kansas, has been established and dedicated for the purpose of that fellowship and ministry that will promote and propagate scriptural holiness, it is expected that those attending shall willingly observe the following:

Rules

- (1) Smoking on grounds prohibited.
- (2) The wearing of immodest dress will not be tolerated.
- (3) Those sleeping in dormitories are expected to be in and quiet by 11:30 p. m. unless special permission is obtained from those in authority.
- (4) Unmarried young persons shall not be permitted to rent tents except by special permission and that only if properly chaperoned.
- (5) Loud talking, rowdyism, or behavior unbecoming a Christian will not be tolerated in the dormitories.
- (6) It is presumed that those attending the camp have read and are willing to observe the above rules and regulations.
- (7) Anyone refusing to comply with the above rules and regulations may expect to be asked to leave the camp premises without any refund of registration fee.
- 2. We further recommend that the above camp rules and regulations be printed on cards for display on camp premises.
- 3. We recommend that the first service of camp meeting be conducted on Friday of the first week and that all pastors make a special effort to come on the day previous to assist in making preparations for the camp.
- 4. We further recommend that all pastors make a special effort to attend all of camp and conference.
- 5. Resolved that the District Camp have Children's and Young People's services; workers to be secured as soon as possible.
 - 6. Resolved that we hold conference at the close of camp.
- $\,$ 7. Resolved that each pastor urge his people to bring their instruments to camp.
- 8. Resolved that each church take a special offering for the camp.
- 9. Be it resolved that the first Friday night service and the day services of the first Saturday be designated as Young People's Services, and be it further resolved that the Youth Conference be held on the last Saturday of camp.
- 10. Resolved that those attending the Sunday morning service of the camp meeting be given credit on the Sunday School attendance at home.
- 11. Resolved that we have men and women's prayer bands during camp meeting, and that the leaders be appointed by the district council.

IV--EDUCATION COMMITTEE

1. We recommend that at each annual camp meeting, on the last Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, there shall be one daily session of the Educational and Examining Boards for the purpose of the examination of licensed ministers and deaconesses. All ministers knowing themselves due to appear before these boards are urged to be present with their recommendations.

- 2. We further recommend that the time of each session shall be announced from the platform.
- 3. We recommend that all ministers working toward ordination consult with the educational board by the close of the district conference.
- 4. We recommend that one-half year's credit on the study course be granted for each year of seminar work approved. This credit does not apply to the reading course required in the manual.

V—SPECIAL RESOLUTIONS

- 1. Be it resolved that each church furnish the district secretary with the names of its delegate or delegates at least 24 hours before the conference convenes.
- 2. Moved and seconded to express our appreciation to Mr. and Mrs. Loren Harkins and Rev. F. N. Griffin for their work on the camp grounds by a rising vote of thanks. (Carried).
- 3. Moved and seconded to show our appreciation for the beef donated by Carl Dillon by a rising vote of thanks, (Carried).
- 4. Moved, seconded, and carried that we show our appreciation to Rev. R. W. Wolfe, Rev. P. F. Elliott, Rev. and Mrs. James Butler, and Jim Strader for their work with us during the camp by a rising vote of thanks.
- 5. Moved and carried to give a rising vote of thanks for Rev. H. K. Busby for his untiring labors as our district superintendent.
- $6. \;$ A rising vote of thanks was given to the following for their labors during the camp:

Dave Jellison and John Rovenstine, tent men.

John Keller, Elmer Jantz, Francis Hobbs, A. E. Whittinston, and Sisters W. C. Byrd and Crystal Conard in the kitchen.

Charles Colaw for his work with the youth.

J. T. Randall for his work on the district paper.

SUNDAY SCHOOL REPORT

Our losses in Sunday Schools over the Kansas District this year show 7%. We lack 4% losing all we had gained in the preceding year with a 11% gain.

The greatest percentage gain for the year was Humboldt with 54% gain. Wichita Trinity had the largest numerical gain with 17% gain for the year. We have 12 churches showing gains, one church holding its own, and 20 churches showing losses.

Sunday School Conventions were held over the Kansas District at Topeka, Toronto, Wichita Trinity, Brewster, and Garden City. Bro. P. F. Elliott, our General Secretary of Sunday Schools, spoke at each place, stimulating interest and zeal in our Sunday School work.

A Sunday School revival campaign was held this past year bringing good reports from some of our churches, with records

broken, and interest increased. Lyndon came out in front with 148% gain from Easter to Mother's Day, and with the highest numerical gain of 125 for the seven Sundays. There were good reports on our Vacation Bible School efforts, with a number of churches participatnig.

Ribbons given our Sunday Schools for gains shown during the past year include—Humboldt, a gold ribbon with a gain of 54%; Lyndon, a red ribbon, gain 35%; Topeka, a blue ribbon, gain 22%; Natoma, a blue ribbon, gain 20%; and Wichita Trinity, a blue ribbon, gain 19%.

The Sunday School Board met twice during the year.

SUNDAY SCHOOL AND YOUTH WORK

The duties of the Sunday School Committee in harmony with the manual of the Pilgrim Holiness Church shall be as follows:

- 1. The District Sunday School Committee together with the District Superintendent shall arrange for Sunday School Conventions to be held in the district during the year.
- 2. To promote and encourage the Sunday School work throughout the district.
- 3. To present an annual report to the Conference which shall include the following:
 - a. A statement of the work accomplished during the year.
 - A statment of the general condition of the Sunday School work in the District.
- 4. We recommend that where possible each local church conduct a Summer Vacation Bible School and a report of that work shall be sent to the District Sunday School Committee.
- 5. We further recommend that each pastor resolve to make an earnest effort to attend and bring as large a delegation as possible of Sunday School workers to the Sunday School Convention.
- 6. Be it resolved that each church strive for a 20 percent gain in Sunday School attendance this year, and that they use the plan suggested by the General Church.
- 7. Be it resolved that each church of the Kansas District seek to establish children's meetings this conference year.
- 8. Be it resolved that each church on the Kansas District where Young People's Societies are not organized, or have no services in their behalf, endeavor to organize a chartered Young People's Society (as suggested by our General Church) and where it is impossible to do so, that they strive toward this goal.
- 9. We recommend that the District Young People's Committee arrange for Youth Conventions to be held throughout the state.

REPORT OF THE FOREIGN MISSIONARY COMMITTEE

- 1. We recommend that by a rising vote of thanks we express our appreciation to Rev. and Mrs. E. L. Wilson, our assistant Secretary of Foreign Missions, Miss Anna Eubanks, Promotional Secretary of Foreign Missions, and Mrs. Hankins for their faithful representation of foreign missions to our camp.
- 2. We recommend that the first Sunday afternoon of the 1957 camp be devoted to the interest of foreign missions.
- 3. We recommend that the first Sunday of each month be designated as Missionary Sunday by our local churches, that prayer be offered, and that an offering be taken for foreign missionary work.
- 4. Because of the cost of our foreign Missionary work, we recommend that our churches give as much as possible above the foreign missionary budget.
- 5. We recommend that our pastors encourage those who feel the call of God to special service, and that the church assists them in their preparation as much as possible.
- 6. We recommend that our local missionary societies be encouraged to send as many packages of used clothing as possible for distribution to the needy fields, and that the missionaries be remembred at Christmas and birthdays.
- 7. We recommend that the district secretary send to each local church Missionary Society an annual report blank covering the yearly work. The blank to be filled out and returned to the secretary with the annual church reports at the close of the conference year.
- 8. We recommend that our pastors endeavor to organize and encourage a junior Missionary Society in their churches.
