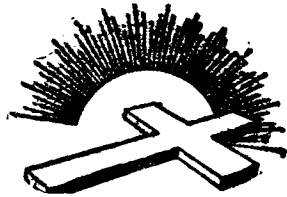

JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

The Forty-fourth Annual Conference of the Kansas District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at 8:00 a. m. Monday, August 5th, 1957 at the Camp Meeting Tabernacle at Hutchinson, Kansas.

FIRST SETTING

The Conference opened with special prayer for Sr. Homer Teets who was to be operated on at that hour. Rev. B. F. Ireland led in prayer. Rev. Dean Mitchener led in singing Showers of Blessings.

Rev. Howard K. Busby, District Superintendent, introduced to the Conference Rev. P. W. Thomas, Editor of the Pilgrim Holiness Advocate as our presiding officer. Rev. Thomas stated that in as much as he had been our evangelist during the camp that he would not address the Conference at this time, but asked Rev. Granville Carroll to read the 103rd Psalm.

The roll call was read.

Moved and seconded that the three center sections to the posts and the platform constitute the Conference Bar. Carried.

The good report of our beloved District Superintendent, Rev. Howard K. Busby, was read and accepted with a hearty 'Amen'.

A verbal report was given by our Assistant District Superintendent, Rev. Ray L. Jellison, and was accepted with a hearty 'Amen'.

Moved and seconded that the time for conference be from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon, and from 1:30 p.m. to 5:30 p.m. with recess from 12:00 to 1:30. Carried.

A partial report of the Examining Board read and accepted. (See their report for ministers received and licenses granted)

Miss Nellie Carroll, O. M. Allen, Naaman Dowty, Kay Cole, Willis Snyder, and Miss Letha Wood, were introduced and gave their testimonies as new members of the Conference.

Report of the Auditing Committee read and accepted.

Report of the District Treasurer read and approved.

The reception committee presented Rev. C. E. Wert, President of the Colorado Springs Bible College, who spoke briefly about its opportunities, responsibilities and needs. His words were received with a hearty 'Amen'.

Moved and seconded to omit the reading of the statistical report. Carried.

Report of the Ways and Means Committee read. Moved and seconded to read only those items which the committee revised. Carried.

Moved and seconded to accept adjusted report according to membership and Manual. Carried.

Changes in Sunday School apportionment read and approved.

Moved and seconded to adopt remaining items of the Ways and Means as recommended by said Committee. Carried.

Report of the Resolution Committee read and accepted.

Moved and seconded to recess for ten minutes. Carried.

Report of the Foreign Missionary Committee read and accepted.

Two new churches with their pastors and delegates were presented to the Conference by our District Superintendent, Rev. H. K. Busby.

Salina, Rev. David Jellison, pastor, Kenneth Brown, delegate.

Wichita Bethel, Rev. Roy Glendening, pastor, Mrs. Cody, delegate.

Motion was made and seconded that these churches be received into the Conference. Carried.

The Memorial Committee reported. Four Memorials were passed and sent to the Polity Committee to be presented to the General Conference in June 1958.

Further report of the Examining Board read.

It was moved and seconded to receive Rev. Robert H. Heckart as an ordained minister on his transfer from the Rocky Mountain District. Carried.

It was moved and seconded to receive Rev. Omar K. Biddlingmeir as an ordained minister on his credentials from the North Central District. Carried. Rev. and Mrs. Biddlingmeir gave their testimonies.

Report of the Memoirs Committee read and accepted by standing. God's sweet presence settled down upon the conference. Rev. P. W. Thomas led in prayer, thanking God for the good lives and influence of those gone on ahead, and asking God's blessing on those left behind.

Moved and seconded that the election of officers become the order of the day. Carried.

Since as a Conference we were allowed six Ministerial Delegates in addition to the first four mentioned who are delegates by virtue of their office, it was moved and seconded that in the election of those delegates, the six persons receiving the greatest number of votes be declared elected. Carried

Alternates for Lay Delegates: First, Clint Moffat; Second, Clarence Berggren, and Third, Tommy Brammer.

Bible School Board Member is Wayne R. Plummer.

In the election of the Educational Board and the Examining Board it was moved and seconded that the one receiving the greatest number of votes be elected for the longest term of office, and ones receiving the next two highest be elected for the shorter and shortest terms respectively. Carried.

Educational Board Member for 1957-1960—Naaman Dowty. (Has first year's work); 1957-1960 James Butler (Has local preacher's); 1957-1959 J. A. Doane (Has second year's work); Claude Overholt has third year's work.

Examining Board Member for 1957-1960 John Keller; 1957-1959 Robert H. Heckart; 1957-1958 F. M. Eichelberger.

District Trustee for 1957-1960 is Aaron L. Kearney.

Moved, seconded, and carried that the following be approved as evangelists and singers according to Page 51, Sec. 93, Par. 10 of the Manual. J. H. Philpot, J. Orvan Keller and wife, A. R. Wylie, J. H. Robertson and Morris Berry.

A further report by the District Treasurer was read.

The routine if the Conference was broken and brightened by the ordination of Sister P. W. Thomas as a Deaconess. Word had come from California District requesting that we do so. Rev. H. K. Busby officiated and gave the charge. He was assisted by Ray Jellison, B. F. Ireland, Roy Glendening, and Wayne Plummer, who read Mat. 25:31-40.

Several 'Thank You' notes as listed under 'Special Resolution' were moved and carried.

A report of the stationing of pastors was read by Rev. H. K. Busby.

Moved and seconded that all unfinished business and the approving of the Minutes be left to the District Council. Carried.

Rev. P. W. Thomas gave a short talk on the need of organization, noting its permanency, its fellowship, and its effectiveness.

Moved, seconded, and carried to adjourn by singing, "God be with you till we meet again".

Rev. P. W. Thomas offered a closing prayer.

The Minutes were later approved by order of the District Council.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the 44th Annual Conference of the Kansas District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church now in Session, Greetings:

The past twelve months have swiftly flown by and we find ourselves at another time of reporting to you.

As always, the forces of evil have been arrayed against us, but beloved, we need expect no less until the end. We are highly privileged to to be engaged with Him in this Holy War.

We have organized two churches this year and each has a place of worship, well situated. Brother David Jellison went into Salina with a tent immediately after Camp last year and after several weeks in the tent, the District portable tabernacle was erected. The new church was organized in the early autumn and this spring they have erected a nice new church. We also own a parsonage here and this has been much improved. Rev. Roy Glendening found a dwelling in Wichita that was open for services and a start was made. They soon outgrew the home and a hall was rented. In this hall a church was organized in December. Soon after this the new church purchased a fine property in Wichita, a church building nearly new and very adequate for our need.

It has been our privilege to dedicate these new churches and raise offerings for the same.

Recently we acquired a new property in Wichita through the kindness of brother and sister John J. Doll. This work has been operating under the name of "The Peoples Mission". This church is very nice and gives us a real opportunity to minister in another section of this great city. Brother Doll has pastored the church since its founding.

By faithful effort the Toronto church has been able to add several nice Sunday School rooms. The Lamont church has a new annex providing several Sunday School rooms and needed space.

Iola has improved their church and made a splended purchase of a much needed parsonage. Wichita First church has made needed changes in their basement. Fredonia and Humbolt have refinished their pews and floors. These and other forward steps have been taken by the churches and are the result of sacrifice and faith.

During most of the year we tried to pastor the church at Lamont. All money received from this work was given to the church. A new and able pastor has replaced us there.

Death made serious inroads upon us as a District this past year. What else can we expect? God help us please . . . to watch, to pray and be ready.

Many changes are being made among our workers. Numbers of new soldiers have been called to the colors. I pray that we may not be found wanting.

Soon after Camp last year we participated in our first District Youth Camp, preaching in the night services. God gave us a real salvation time and the District still enjoys the results.

I have received pay for 21,653 miles of travel from the District, I have visited the churches 84 times. Beside these visits I have made 68 parsonage calls, I have preached 170 times, made 116 other calls and held 5 revivals. I have preached several funerals, conducted one wedding, dedicated two churches and one baby. Numbers have sought God at our altars. I have attended a meeting of the General Board, the church leaders Conference and have met with the Bible College Board twice.

My salary is paid in full and the churches have given me \$301.69 in love offerings. We have returned over \$1350.00 to the work this year. This covers a part of our work and surely all that is necessary. We are grateful to all who have smoothed our path and helped to make our service to God and others possible.

REPORT OF THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

1. We recommend that all pastors pay all their Ministerial tithe thru their local church treasurer; $\frac{3}{4}$ to be applied on District Budget $\frac{1}{4}$ to apply on loan fund for District Church Extension.

2. We recommend that the Evangelists, District Superintendent, Home Missionary workers, Evangelistic singers, ministers pay 75 percent of their ministerial tithe to the District Treasurer, one-fifth to which to apply on District Church Extension Loan Fund, the balance to apply on District Budget. We further recommend that the conference payment for pension plan members be paid from the District Budget.

3. We recommend that our churches be apportioned for the District budget at the rate of \$2.00 per member in full standing; and at the rate of \$6.00 per member for the General Budget, which apportionment equals the following amount for each church.

1. We recommend that by a rising vote of thanks we express our appreciation to Rev. and Mrs. Merton Rundell for their faithful representation of foreign missions to our camp.

REPORT ON THE RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE

I Local Church Work

1. We recommend that opportunity for baptism be given by our churches at least once each year.

2. Resolved that each pastor may hold two revival meetings each year off his charge.

3. Resolved that our churches do not open their doors to other churches, organizations, institutions, or individuals for financial appeals.

4. Resolved that no pastor employ an evangelist outside the Pilgrim Holiness Church without first consulting the District Superintendent.

5. Resolved that each pastor leaving his charge, prepare and leave for his successor a complete calling list with the location of the homes.

6. We recommend that each pastor be granted two weeks paid vacation.

II DISTRICT WORK

1. Whereas the Conference has approved the Blue Cross-Blue Shield plan, be it resolved that it be optional with the local churches to pay one-half of the monthly payments.

2. Whereas the Conference has approved the Forward Movement Plan as recommended by the General Church, therefore we recommend that the committee consists of the District Council.

3. Resolved that the district council appoint an editor for the district publication.

4. Resolved that any pastor, who is required to be away from his church on district, local, or general business, shall receive his salary as usual.

5. Resolved that we, as the Kansas District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church go on record as opposed to members of the Pilgrim Holiness Church being required to violate their religious convictions, and the standards of the Church in physical education classes in the public schools.

6. Resolved that the committees be appointed by the council, and the names of those appointed on said committees be printed in the district minutes.

7. Resolved that in the event of death of any of our pastors' or evangelists' immediate family, the District Secretary shall be immediately wired, and in turn each pastor shall be notified by wire by the District Secretary.

8. Resolved that no mortgage be placed upon our District Camp grounds, parsonage and equipment pertaining thereto, without two-thirds vote of this conference.

9. Resolved that each church strive for a 10 percent gain in membership and that each pastor work toward that goal.

III CAMP AND CONFERENCE

1. We recommend that a system of rules and regulations governing our camp and premises be adopted by this conference which shall read as follows:

Whereas the Pilgrim Holiness Church Camp Grounds at Hutchinson, Kansas, has been established and dedicated for the purpose of that fellowship and ministry that will promote and propagate scriptural Holiness, it is expected that those attending shall willingly observe the following:

Rules

- (1) Smoking on grounds prohibited.
- (2) The wearing of immodest dress will not be tolerated.
- (3) Those sleeping in dormitories are expected to be in and quiet by 11:30 p.m. unless special permission is obtained from those in authority.
- (4) Unmarried young persons shall not be permitted to rent tents except by special permission and that only if properly chaperoned.
- (5) Loud talking, rowdiness, or behavior unbecoming a Christian will not be tolerated in the dormitories.
- (6) It is presumed that those attending the camp have read and are willing to observe the above rules and regulations.
- (7) Anyone refusing to comply with the above rules and regulations may expect to be asked to leave the camp premises without any refund of registration fee.

2. We further recommend that the above camp rules and regulations be printed on cards for display on camp premises.

3. We recommend that the first service of camp meeting be conducted on Friday of the first week and that all pastors make a special effort to come on the day previous to assist in making preparations for the camp.

4. We further recommend that all pastors make a special effort to attend all of camp and conference.

5. Resolved that the District Camp have Children's and Young People's services; workers to be secured as soon as possible.

6. Resolved that we hold conference at the close of camp.

7. Be it resolved that each church furnish the district secretary with the names of its delegate or delegates at least 24 hours before the conference convenes.

8. Resolved that each pastor urge his people to bring their instruments to camp.

9. Resolved that each church take a special offering for the camp.

10. Resolved that the first Friday night service and the day services of the first Saturday be designated as Young People's Services, and be it further resolved that the Youth Conference be held on the last Saturday of camp.

11. Resolved that those attending the Sunday morning service of the camp meeting be given credit on the Sunday School attendance at home.

12. Resolved that we have men and women's prayer bands during camp meeting, and that the leaders be appointed by the district council.

IV EDUCATION COMMITTEE

1. We recommend that at each annual camp meeting, on the last Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, there shall be one daily session of the Educational and Examining Boards for the purpose of the examination of licensed ministers and deaconesses. All ministers knowing themselves due to appear before these boards are urged to be present with their recommendations.

2. We further recommend that the time of each session shall be announced from the platform.

3. We recommend that all ministers working toward ordination consult with the educational board by the close of the district conference.

4. We recommend that one-half year's credit on the study course be granted for each year of seminar work approved. This credit does not apply to the reading course required in the manual.

V SPECIAL RESOLUTIONS

1. Moved and seconded to express our appreciation to Gilbert and Olive Sherman and Rev. F. N. Griffin for their work on the camp grounds by a rising vote of thanks. (Carried).

2. Moved and seconded to show our appreciation for the beef donated by Carl Dillon by a rising vote of thanks. (Carried).

3. Moved, seconded, and carried that we show our appreciation to Rev. and Mrs. P. W. Thomas, Rev. Robert H. Heckart and E. W. and Caroline Lewis for their work with us during the camp by a rising vote of thanks.

4. Moved and carried to give a rising vote of thanks for Rev. H. K. Busby for his untiring labors as our district superintendent.

5. A rising vote of thanks was given to the following for their labors during the camp.

Dave Jellison and John Rovenstine, tent men.

John Keller, Elmer Jantz, Francis Hobbs, A. E. Whittington, and Sister W. C. Byrd in the kitchen.

James Butler for his work with the youth.

J. T. Randall for his work on the district paper.

SUNDAY SCHOOL AND YOUTH WORK

The duties of the Sunday School Committee in harmony with the manual of the Pilgrim Holiness Church shall be as follows:

1. The District Sunday School Committee together with the District Superintendent shall arrange for Sunday School Conventions to be held in the district during the year.

2. To promote and encourage the Sunday School work through out the district.

3. To present an annual report to the Conference which shall include the following:

a. A statement of the work accomplished during the year.

b. A statement of the general condition of the Sunday School work in the District.

4. We recommend that where possible each local church conduct a Summer Vacation Bible School and a report of that work shall be sent to the District Sunday School Committee.

5. We further recommend that each pastor resolve to make an earnest effort to attend and bring as large a delegation as possible of Sunday School workers to the Sunday School Convention.

6. Be it resolved that each church strive for a 20 percent gain in Sunday School attendance this year, and that they use the plan suggested by the General Church.

7. Be it resolved that each church of the Kansas District seek to establish children's meetings this conference year.

8. Be it resolved that each church on the Kan. Dist. in which Young People's Societies are not organized, or have no services in their behalf, endeavor to organize a chartered Young People's Society (as suggested by our General Church) and where it is impossible to do so, that they strive toward this goal.

9. We recommend that the District Young People's Committee arrange for Youth Conventions to be held throughout the state.
