DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the 44th Annual Conference of the Kansas District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church now in Session, Greetings:

The past twelve months have swiftly flown by and we find ourselves at another time of reporting to you.

As always, the forces of evil have been arrayed against us, but beloved, we need expect no less until the end. We are highly privileged to to be engaged with Him in this Holy War.

We have organized two churches this year and each has a place of worship, well situated. Brother David Jellison went into Salina with a tent immediately after Camp last year and after several weeks in the tent, the District portable tabernacle was erected. The new church was organized in the early autumn and this spring they have erected a nice new church. We also own a parsonage here and this has been much improved. Rev. Roy Glendening found a dwelling in Wichita that was open for services and a start was made. They soon outgrew the home and a hall was rented. In this hall a church was organized in December. Soon after this the new church purchased a fine property in Wichita, a church building nearly new and very adequate for our need.

It has been our privilege to dedicate these new churches and raise offerings for the same.

Recently we acquired a new property in Wichita through the kindness of brother and sister John J. Doll. This work has been operating under the name of "The Peoples Mission". This church is very nice and gives us a real opportunity to minister in another section of this great city. Brother Doll has pastored the church since its founding.

By faithful effort the Toronto church has been able to add several nice Sunday School rooms. The Lamont church has a new annex providing several Sunday School rooms and needed space.

Iola has improved their church and made a splended purchase of a much needed parsonage. Wichita First church has made needed changes in their basement. Fredonia and Humbolt have refinished their pews and floors. These and other forward steps have been taken by the churches and are the result of sacrifice and faith.

During most of the year we tried to pastor the church at Lamont. All money received from this work was given to the church. A new and able pastor has replaced us there.

Death made serious inroads upon us as a District this past year. What else can we expect? God help us please . . . to watch, to pray and be ready.

Many changes are being made among our workers. Numbers of new soldiers have been called to the colors. I pray that we may not be found wanting.

Soon after Camp last year we participated in our first District Youth Camp, preaching in the night services. God gave us a real salvation time and the District still enjoys the results.

I have received pay for 21,653 miles of travel from the District, I have visited the churches 84 times. Beside these visits I have made 68 parsonage calls, I have preached 170 times, made 116 other calls and held 5 revivals. I have preached several funerals, conducted one wedding, dedicated two churches and one baby. Numbers have sought God at our altars. I have attended a meeting of the General Board, the church leaders Conference and have met with the Bible College Board twice.

My salary is paid in full and the churches have given me \$301.69 in love offerings. We have returned over \$1350.00 to the work this year. This covers a part of our work and surely all that is necessary. We are grateful to all who have smoothed our path and helped to make our service to God and others possible.

REPORT OF THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

1. We recommend that all pastors pay all their Ministerial tithe thru their local church treasurer; ³/₄ to be applied on District Budget ⁴/₄ to apply on loan fund for District Church Extension.

2. We recommend that the Evangelists, District Superintendent, Home Missionary workers, Evangelistic singers, ministers pay 75 percent of their ministerial tithe to the District Treasurer, one-fifth to which to apply on District Church Extension Loan Fund, the balance to apply on District Budget. We further recommend that the conference payment for pension plan members be paid from the District Budget. 3. We recommend that cur churches be apportioned for the District

budget at the rate of \$2.00 per member in full standing; and at the rate of \$6.00 per member for the General Budget, which apportionment equals the following amount for each church.

4. We recommend that the District Superintendent have the privilege of cunducting two revival meetings off the district, and that he have a two week vacation each year.

5. We recommend that all the churches send in all money to the District Treasurer so as to reach him by the tenth of each month.

6. We recommend that we pay our District Superintendent at the rate of \$250.00 per month plus five cents per mile car expense when traveling in his own car and actual expense when traveling otherwise. We further recommend that the district pay his telephone bill and \$15.00 per month for utilities.

7. We recommend that each Sunday School be apportioned the following per month for District Home Missions.

8. Whereas the General Board has requested that each district place its zone school in its district budget, be it resolved that each of our churches raise a monthly free will offering for our school.

9. We recommend that all churches take a love offering for the District Superintendent at time of his regular visits.

10. We recommend that all money raised by the representatives of the General Church and institutional interests be turned over to the local church treasurer and be used for the purpose for which it was raised.

11. We recommend that our District Secretary be paid \$100.00 per year and that our District Treasurer be paid \$150.00 per year.

12. Be it resolved that the traveling expense of any minister whose travel is authorized by the district have his traveling expense met on the same basis as the District Superintendent.

13. We recommend that e form copy of the budget apportionments for each church be sent to the local church treasurer immediately after the conference.

14. We recommend that each church be assessed at the rate of 25c per member per year for General Conference expense.

REPORT OF THE FOREIGN MISSIONARY COMMITTEE

1. We recommend that by a rising vote of thanks we express our oppreciation to Rev. and Mrs. Merton Rundell for their faithful represtation cf foreign missions to our camp. 2. We recommend that the first Sunday afternoon of the 1958 camp be

devoted to the interest of foreign missions.

3. We recommend that the first Sunday of each month be designated as Missionary Sunday by our local churches, that prayer be offered, and that an offering be taken for foreign missionary work.

4. Because of the cost of our foreign Missionary work, we recommend that our churches give as much as possible above the foreign missionary budget.

5. We recommend that our pastors encourage those who feel the call of God to special service, and that the church assists them in their pre-paration as much as possible.

6. We recommend that our local missionary societies be encouraged to send as many packages of used clothing as possible for distribution to the needy fields, and that the missonaries be remembered at Christmas and birthdays.

7. We recommend that our pastors endeavor to organize and encourage a junior Missionary Society in their churches.

REPORT ON THE RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE

I Local Church Work

1. We recommend that opportunity for baptism be given by our churches at least once each year.

2. Resolved that each pastor may hold two revival meetings each year off his charge.

3. Resolved that our churches do not open their doors to other churches, organizations, institutions, or individuals for financial appeals.

4. Resolved that no pastor employ an evangelist outside the Pilgrim Holiness Church without first consulting the District Superintendent.

5. Resolved that each pastor leaving his charge, prepare and leave for his successor a complete calling list with the location of the homes.

6. We recommend that each pastor be granted two weeks paid vacation.

II DISTRICT WORK

1. Whereas the Conference has approved the Blue Cross-Blue Shield plan, be it resolved that it be optional with the local churches to pay one-

half of the monthly payments. 2. Whereas the Conference has approved the Forward Movement Plan as recommended by the General Church, therefore we recommend that the committee consists of the District Council.

3. Resolved that the district council appoint an editor for the district publication.

4. Resolved that any pastor, who is required to be away from his church on district, local, or general business, shall receive his salary as usual. 5. Resolved that we, as the Kansas District of the Pilgrim Holiness

Church go on record as opposed to members of the Pilgrim Holiness Church being required to violate their religious convictions, and the standards of the Church in physical education classes in the public schools.
6. Resolved that the committees be appointed by the council, and the

names of those appointed on said committees be printed in the district minutes.

7. Resolved that in the event of death of any of our pastors' or evangelists' immediate family, the District Secretary shall be immediately wired, and in turn each pastor shall be notified by wire by the District Secretary.

8. Resolved that no mortgage be placed upon our District Camp grounds, parsonage and equipment pertaining thereto, without two-thirds vote of this conference.

9. Resolved that each church strive for a 10 percent gain in membership and that each pastor work toward that goal.

III CAMP AND CONFERENCE

1. We recommend that a system of rules and regulations governing our camp and premises be adopted by this conference which shall read as fellows:

Whereas the Pilgrim Holiness Church Camp Grounds at Hutchinson, Kansas, has been established and dedicated for the purpose of that fellowship and ministry that will promote and propagate scriptural Holiness, it is expected that those attending shall willingly observe the following:

Rules

- Smoking on grounds prohibited. (1)
- (2)The wearing of immodest dress will not be tolerated.
- Those sleeping in dormitories are expected to be in and quiet (3) by 11:30 p.m. unless special permission is obtained from those in authority.
- Unmarried young persons shall not be permitted to rent tents except by special permission and that only if properly chap-(4) eroned.
- Loud talking, rowdyism, or behavior unbecoming a Christian will not be tolerated in the dormitories. (5)
- (6) It is presumed that those attending the camp have read and are willing to observe the above rules and regulations.
- (7) Anyone refusing to comply with the above rules and regulations may expect to be asked to leave the camp premises without any refund of registration fee.

2. We further recommend that the above camp rules and regulations be printed on cards for display on camp premises. 3. We recommend that the first service of camp meeting be conducted

on Friday of the first week and that all pastors make a special effort to come on the day previous to assist in making preparations for the camp.

4. We further recommend that all pastors make a special effort to attend all of camp and conference.

5. Resolved that the District Camp have Children's and Young People's services; workers to be secured as soon as possible.6. Resolved that we hold conference at the close of camp.

7. Be it resolved that each church furnish the district secretary with the names of its delegate or delegates at least 24 hours before the conference convenes.

8. Resolved that each pastor urge his people to bring their instruments to camp.

9. Resolved that each church take a special offering for the camp.

10. Resolved that the first Friday night service and the day services of the first Saturday be designated as Young People's Services, and be it further resolved that the Youth Conference be held on the last Saturday of camp.

11. Resolved that those attending the Sunday morning service of the camp meeting be given credit on the Sunday School attendance at home.

12. Resolved that we have men and women's prayer bands during camp meeting, and that the leaders be appointed by the district council.

IV EDUCATION COMMITTEE

1. We recommend that at each annual camp meeting, on the last Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, there shall be one daily session of the Educational and Examining Boards for the purpose of the examination of licensed ministers and deaconesses. All ministers knowing themselves due to ap-pear before these boards are urged to be present with their recommendations.

2. We further recommend that the time of each session shall be announced from the platform.

3. We recommend that all ministers working toward ordination consult with the educational board by the close of the district conference.

4. We recommend that one-half year's credit on the study course be granted for each year of seminar work approved. This credit does not apply to the reading course required in the manual.

V SPECIAL RESOLUTIONS

1. Moved and seconded to express our appreciation to Gilbert and Olive Sherman and Rev. F. N. Griffin for their work on the camp grounds by a rising vote of thanks. (Carried).

2. Moved and seconded to show our appreciation for the beef donated ty Carl Dillon by a rising vote of thanks. (Carried).

3. Moved, seconded, and carried that we show our appreciation to Rev. and Mrs. P. W. Thomas, Rev. Robert H. Heckart and E. W. and Caroline Lewis for their work with us during the camp by a rising vote of thanks.

4. Moved and carried to give a rising vote of thanks for Rev. H. K. Busby for his untiring labors as our district superintendent.

5. A rising vote of thanks was given to the following for their labors during the camp.

SUNDAY SCHOOL AND YOUTH WORK

The duties of the Sunday School Committee in harmony with the manual of the Pilgrim Holiness Church shall be as follows:

1. The District Sunday School Committee together with the District Superintendent shall arrange for Sunday School Conventions to be held in the district during the year.

2. To promote and encourage the Sunday School work through out the district.

3. To present an annual report to the Conference which shall include the following:

a. A statement of the work accomplished during the year.b. A statement of the general condition of the Sunday School work in the District.

4. We recommend that where possible each local church conduct a Summer Vacation Bible School and a report of that work shall be sent to the District Sunday School Committee.

5. We further recommend that each pastor resolve to make an earnest effort to attend and bring as large a delegation as possible of Sunday School workers to the Sunday School Convention.

6. Be it resolved that each church strive for a 20 percent gain in Sunday School attendance this year, and that they use the plan suggested by the General Church.

7. Be is resolved that each church of the Kansas District seek to establish children's meetings this conference year.

8. Be it resolved that each church on the Kan. Dist. in which Young Peobe the resolved that each church on the Kan. Dist. In which roung reo-ple's Societies are not organized, or have no services in their behalf, en-deavor to organize a chartered Young People's Society (as suggested by our General Church) and where it is impossible to do so, that they strive toward this goal.

9. We recommend that the District Young People's Committee arrange for Youth Conventions to be held throughout the state.
