

ORDINATION SERVICE

An impressive ordination service was held in the Pilgrim Holiness Tabernacle in Hutchinson, Kansas, Sunday, August 3, 1958 at 9:00 a.m.

The service opened by singing "A Charge to Keep I Have" and "Rock of Ages", led by Rev. Wayne R. Plummer. Rev. Floyd M. Eichelberger offered prayer. Appropriate portions of scripture were read from Timothy and Titus by Rev. B. F. Ireland, Rev. Ray L. Jellison, and Rev. F. M. Eichelberger. Rev. Howard K. Busby, Kansas District Superintendent, gave the charge to candidate, Rev. Wilbur Eichelberger, basing his remarks on Acts 20:17-28. He spoke about three things that are necessary for a successful pastor, supported by the above scripture.

He must have a Divine call.

He must have and live a holy life.

He must have a compassionate heart.

After the prayer of consecration and the laying on of hands, Rev. Busby completed the charge. The ordained was then congratulated and wished the continued blessings of God upon his life and ministry.

IN MEMORIAM

In memory of Sister Anna Minerva Cork, an ordained minister of the Pilgrim Holiness Church.

She was the devoted companion of Reverend J. J. Cork, and a very effecient "Pioneer" minister of the Gospel. Despite many hardships the Macedonian call spurred her on through many dark nights and over long miles to school-house revivals and preaching points.

Ordained in 1919, she was a true "Pilgrim" at heart and preached the Gospel without fear or favor, but with power. Like Esther of old, she was unyielding in her faith and devotion. Consequently many of our Kansas churches owe their birth to this Mother of Israel and her husband.

In later years, though broken in body and suffering greatly, her courage, testimony, and firm grip on God encouraged all of her sick-room callers. On August 19, 1957, she went to be with Jesus. Our prayer is that her mantle shall fall on another who will carry the message of the cross with the burden and zeal that was hers.

JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

The Forty-fifth Annual Conference of the Kansas District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at 8:00 a.m. Monday, August 4, 1958 at the Camp Meeting Tabernacle at Hutchinson, Kansas.

FIRST SETTING

The Conference opened with Sr. B. F. Durham at the piano and Rev. B. F. Durham leading in singing, "Tis So Sweet to Trust in Jesus." Rev. Harry L. Solter led the Conference in prayer.

Rev. Howard K. Busby, our District Superintendent, having been authorized by General Superintendent, William H. Neff, to conduct the Conference, was introduced and took charge.

Rev. Busby explained why no General Superintendent could come. He read Second Timothy 2:9-21 and spoke briefly.

The roll was called.

It was moved and seconded that the three center sections to the posts and the platform constitute the Conference Bar. Carried.

The good report of our beloved District Superintendent, Rev. Howard K. Busby, was read and accepted with a hearty 'Amen'.

A verbal report was given by our Assistant District Superintendent, Rev. Ray L. Jellison, and also was accepted with a hearty 'Amen'.

Moved and seconded that the time of Conference be from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon, and from 1:30 p.m. to 5:30 p.m. with recess from 12:00 noon to 1:30 p.m. Carried.

The report of the Examining Board was read and accepted.

It was recommended by the District Council that Rev. and Mrs. Glenn Slater, ordained ministers in the Bible Missionary Church, be received on their credentials. They were heartily received.

Rev. H. K. Busby gave a talk relative to the necessity of each church having a delegate for the Annual Conference.

Report of the Auditing Committee was read and accepted.

Report of the District Treasurer was read and accepted.

The new church of Arlington was received into the Conference. The pastor, Rev. Jack Avery, and the delegate, John Hirt, were presented to the Conference and gave their testimonies.

Rev. Lorren D. Elliott, District Treasurer, gave a talk relative to the splendid way the churches had responded in paying their budgets.

We recessed for a few minutes.

The following were introduced to the Conference and gave their testimonies: Rev. Roy Nible, District Superintendent of Texas; Rev. and Mrs. Williams, evangelists of the Friends Church from Colorado, Rev. and Mrs. Glenn Slater, ordained ministers from the Bible Missionary Church, received into the Pilgrim Holiness Church during this Conference, and Rev. Floyd Hadsell, ordained minister received into this Conference from the South Central District.

It was moved and seconded that Rev. and Mrs. Williams and Rev. Roy Nible receive honorary seats within the Conference Bar. Carried.

Moved and seconded that we dispense with the reading of the Statistical report. Carried.

The report of the Ways and Means Committee was read and accepted.

The report of the Memorial Committee was read and reverently accepted while we stood with bowed heads as Rev. Busby led in a heart-felt prayer of appreciation for the life and works of the deceased.

The Resolution Committee reported. It was moved and carried that we vote only on items changed.

Moved and seconded that matrons be placed over the girl's dormitory and that the grounds be policed. A free discussion followed and a motion prevailed to refer the matter back to the committee for redrafting.

It was moved and carried that the election of officers be the order of the day following the devotional service at 1:30.

SECOND SETTING

The second sitting opened by singing "Blessed Be The Name of the Lord". This was followed by Scripture quotations, after which Frank Welch led in prayer.

The following officers were elected:

Rev. Howard K. Busby was elected District Superintendent for a two-year term on the first ballot with 69 out of 75 votes.

Assistant District Superintendent, Ray L. Jellison; District Secretary, Wayne R. Plummer; District Treasurer, Lorren D. Elliott.

Other council members are: B. F. Ireland, F. M. Eichelberger and Robert H. Heckart.

Examining Board Member, 1958-1961, F. M. Eichelberger; Educational Board Members, 1958-1961 Claude Overholt and 1958-1959 Paul McNall; Bible School Board Member, Wayne R. Plummer, and District Trustee, 1958-1961, Clarence Berggren.

The Resolutions Committee reported:

It was moved and seconded that we give one service to Sunday School promotional work during Camp. Carried.

Moved and seconded that the council appoint a matron over the girls' dormitory and that a committee be appointed to see that those staying on camp premises are in on time and that proper order is maintained. Carried.

Moved and seconded that the council re-group the resolutions and put those under 'Standing Resolutions' that need not be changed from year to year. Carried.

Motion prevailed that the District Council hear the Minutes read, correct if necessary, and approve them.

Motion prevailed that all unfinished business be attended to by the District Council.

Report of the Stationing Committee was read.

The Sunday School Committee gave their report. Sharon Springs won the Certificate of Award for the greatest numerical gain. Salina won the award for the greatest percentage gain.

Several 'Thank You' notes as listed under Special Resolutions were passed.

It was moved and seconded that we adjourn. Carried.

The Minutes were later approved.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the 45th Annual Conference of the Kansas District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church now in session. Greetings:

Time hurries us along toward the half century mark in our history as a part of God's great work in the Kansas District. It is a kindly providence that allows us to gather for business at the close of a gracious Camp Meeting.

You will rejoice in this Conference as our youngest church at Arlington is presented. Rev. Jack Avery held a tent meeting in this place last fall and in the early winter we were able to organize the new church. Their facilities are limited, but people have come in spite of this. Their Sunday School has hit the 70's. They are looking for another location with added room.

Our work at the Peoples Mission is still unorganized. The Mitcheners have had a good year there and this should be a fine work until Jesus comes. We bought a parsonage that is joined onto the Mission and this house has been much improved and will aid us greatly in our work there.

For weeks plans have been underway to establish a new beachhead for God and the Pilgrim Holiness Church in Hill City, Kansas. Brother and Sister Rovenstine will be on that field in a few days.

Forward moves have been made in many of our churches, some of these meeting the need of the years.

A splendid parsonage was built at Argonia and we were there in early spring to dedicate it. We also dedicated the new annex at Toronto some time ago. This adds greatly to our property there and gives us a much better opportunity to do God's work. Lyndon has nice new church doors. Fall River and Syracuse have done considerable face lifting with paint, etc., while there are parsonage improvements made at Fredonia and Winona. The Goodland church has installed a new ceiling and indirect lighting fixtures. At St. Francis there is a new garage and built-in cupboards in the parsonage. The church interior has been re-painted. Bird City also has new kitchen improvements, while Colby has concentrated their efforts on reducing the debt on the organ. We rejoice with the Johnson church as they move forward most satisfactorily to liquidate their indebtedness. Salina has added a room to their parsonage and have made other improvements. Wichita First has done extensive work on the church and parsonage and they hope for new pews before long. The Hutchinson church has refinished their pews and will be doing other work soon. Thus it goes, some projects small and some large, but all backed with faith and effort and a desire to better serve Him and this generation. Amen!

Our Youth Camp at Rock Springs was well attended. Strong emphasis was laid on the importance of seeking and serving God.

God gave us an excellent Ministerial Convention, long to be remembered by those in attendance.

The General Conference of 1958 brought new responsibilities to be borne and we have spent considerable time in trying to help the brethren choose a new location for the Bible College.

I have received pay for 19,812 miles of travel from the District. I have made 92 visits to the churches and beside this have called at our parsonages 79 times. I have preached 129 times and have held four revivals and one Camp meeting. Two of these revivals were on the District where I served without pay. I have conducted four funerals and spoken at several school exercises. I have attended all meetings of the General Board, and Bible College board, and was present at the Church Leaders Conference. My salary is paid and the churches have been gracious in giving me \$426.92 in love offerings. We have been able to return \$975.00 into the work of the church and thank God for this privilege.

It has been a busy year and this report tells of a part of our activity. God has the record and that complete. We shall ever be grateful for the prayers and kind words that have encouraged us along the way.

REPORT OF THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE—1958

1. We recommend that all pastors pay all their Ministerial tithe through their local church treasurer; three-fourths to be applied on District Budget and one-fourth to apply on loan fund for District Church Extension.

2. We recommend that the Evangelists, District Superintendent, Home Missionary workers, Evangelistic singers and unstationed ministers pay seventy-five percent of their ministerial tithe to the District Treasurer, one-fifth of which to apply on District Church Extension Loan Fund, the balance to apply on District Budget. We further recommend that the conference payment for pension plan members be paid from the District Budget.

3. We recommend that our churches be apportioned for the District budget at the rate of \$2.00 per member in full standing; and at the rate of \$8.00 per member for the United Stewardship Fund, which apportionment equals the following amount for each church:

4. We recommend that the District Superintendent have the privilege of conducting two revival meetings off the district, and that he have a two week vacation each year.

5. We recommend that all the churches send in all money to the District Treasurer so as to reach him by the tenth of each month.

6. We recommend that we pay our District Superintendent at the rate of \$250.00 per month plus five cents per mile car expense when traveling in his own car and actual expense when traveling otherwise. We further recommend that the district pay his telephone bill and \$15.00 per month for utilities.

7. We recommend that each Sunday School be apportioned the following per month for District Home Missions.

11. We recommend that our District Secretary be paid \$100.00 per year and that our District Treasurer be paid \$200.00 per year.

12. Be it resolved that the traveling expense of any minister whose travel is authorized by the district have his traveling expense met on the same basis as the District Superintendent.

13. We recommend that a form copy of the budget apportionments for each church be sent to the local church treasurer immediately after the conference.

14. We recommend that each church be assessed at the rate of 35c per member per year for General Conference expense.

STANDING RESOLUTIONS

I. Local Church Work

1. We recommend that opportunity for baptism be given by our churches at least once each year.
2. Resolved that each pastor may hold two revival meetings each year off his charge.
3. Resolved that our churches do not open their doors to other churches, organizations, institutions, or individuals for financial appeals.
4. Resolved that no pastor employ an evangelist outside the Pilgrim Holiness Church without first consulting the District Superintendent.
5. Resolved that each pastor leaving his charge, prepare and leave for his successor a complete calling list with the location of the homes.
6. We recommend that each pastor be granted two weeks vacation each year with regular salary.

II. District Work

1. Whereas the Conference has approved the Blue Cross-Blue Shield plan, be it resolved that it be optional with the local churches to pay one-half of the monthly payments.
2. Resolved that the District Council appoint an editor for the district publication and that he be chairman of the Sunday School Committee.
3. Resolved that any pastor, who is required to be away from his church on district, local, or general business, shall receive his salary as usual.
4. Resolved that we, the Kansas District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, go on record as opposed to members of the Pilgrim Holiness Church being required to violate their religious convictions and the standards of the Church in physical education classes in the public schools.
5. Resolved that the committees be appointed by the council, and the names of those appointed on said committees be printed in the district Minutes.
6. Resolved that in the event of death of any of our pastors' or evangelists' immediate family, the District Secretary shall be immediately wired, and in turn each pastor shall be notified by wire by the District Secretary.
7. Resolved that no mortgage be placed upon our District Camp grounds, parsonage, and equipment pertaining thereto, without two-thirds vote of the Annual District Conference.
8. Resolved that each church strive for a 10 percent gain in membership and that each pastor work toward that goal.
9. Resolved that our Kansas District Minutes be sold at cost (60c each for 1958 Minutes) to individuals desiring them. Be it further resolved that each pastor find out how many individuals from his church desire a copy and that he order that amount from the District Secretary not later than September 1st.
10. We recommend that each church help to defray the expense of our District paper by paying five cents per copy for those received.
11. Resolved that each local church assume the payment of the basic telephone bill each month. This does not include the toll calls which are not made in the interest and direct benefit of the local church.

III. Camp and Conference

1. Whereas the Pilgrim Holiness Church Camp Grounds at Hutchinson, Kansas, has been established and dedicated for the purpose of that fellowship and ministry that will promote and propagate scriptural Holiness, it is expected that those attending shall willingly observe the following:

RULES

- (1) Smoking on grounds prohibited.
 - (2) The wearing of immodest dress will not be tolerated.
 - (3) Those sleeping on camp premises are expected to be in and quiet by 11:00 p.m.
 - (4) Resolved that the council appoint a matron over the girls' dormitory, and a committee to see that those staying on the camp premises are in on time and that proper order is maintained.
 - (5) Unmarried young persons shall not be permitted to rent tents except by special permission and that only if properly chaperoned.
 - (6) Loud talking, rowdyism, or behavior unbecoming a Christian will not be tolerated in the dormitories.
 - (7) It is presumed that those attending the camp have read and are willing to observe the above rules and regulations.
 - (8) Any one refusing to comply with the above rules and regulations may expect to be asked to leave the camp premises without any refund of registration fee.
2. We further recommend that the above camp rules and regulations be printed on cards for display on camp premises.
 3. Resolved that the three center sections in the tabernacle to the posts and the platform constitute the Conference Bar.
 4. Resolved that the time for the Conference be from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon, and from 1:30 p.m. to 5:30 p.m. with recess from 12:00 to 1:30.
 5. We recommend that the first service of camp meeting be conducted on Friday of the first week and that all pastors make a special effort to come on the day previous to assist in making preparations for the camp.
 6. We further recommend that all pastors make a special effort to attend all of camp and conference.
 7. Resolved that the District Camp have Children's and Young Peoples' services.
 8. Resolved that we hold Conference at the close of camp.
 9. Resolved that each church furnish the District Secretary with the names of its delegate or delegates at least 24 hours before the Conference convenes.
 10. Resolved that each pastor urge his people to bring their musical instruments to camp.
 11. Resolved that each church take a special offering for camp.
 12. Resolved that the first Friday night service and the day services of the first Saturday be designated as Young People's Services, and that the Youth Conference be held on the first Saturday afternoon of camp.
 13. Resolved that those attending the Sunday morning service of the camp meeting be given credit on Sunday School attendance in their home church.
 14. Resolved that we have men and women's prayer bands during camp meeting, and that the leaders be appointed by the district council.

IV. Educational Work

1. We recommend that at each annual camp meeting, on the last Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, there shall be one daily session of the Educational and Examining Boards for the purpose of the examination of licensed ministers and deaconesses. All ministers knowing themselves due to appear before these boards are urged to be present with their recommendations.
2. We further recommend that the time of each session shall be announced from the platform.

3. We recommend that all ministers working toward ordination consult with the educational board by the close of the district conference.

4. We recommend that one-half year's credit on the study course be granted for each year of seminar work approved. This credit does not apply on the reading course required in the manual.

V. Sunday School and Youth Work

The duties of the Sunday School Committee in harmony with the manual of the Pilgrim Holiness Church shall be as follows:

1. The District Sunday School Committee together with the District Superintendent shall arrange for Sunday School Conventions to be held in the district during the year.

2. To promote and encourage the Sunday School work throughout the district.

3. To present an annual report to the Conference which shall include the following:

(A) A statement of the work accomplished during the year.

(B) A statement of the general condition of the Sunday School work in the district.

4. We recommend that where possible each local church conduct a Summer Vacation Bible School, and a report of that work shall be sent to the District Sunday School Committee.

5. We further recommend that each Sunday School Superintendent make an earnest effort to attend and bring as large a delegation as possible of Sunday School Workers to the Sunday School Convention.

6. Resolved that each church strive for a 15 percent gain in Sunday School attendance, and that they use the plan suggested by the General Church.

7. Resolved that each church of the Kansas District seek to establish children's meetings.

8. Resolved that each church on the Kansas District in which Young People's Societies are not organized, or have no services in their behalf, endeavor to organize a chartered Young People's Society (as suggested by our General Church) and where it is impossible to do so, that they strive toward this goal.

9. We recommend that the District Young People's Committee arrange for Youth Conventions to be held throughout the state.

10. Resolved that the Sunday School Committee be appointed and announced by Thursday of camp.

11. Resolved that a Sunday School promotional service be held during camp.

SPECIAL RESOLUTIONS

1. Moved and seconded that we express our appreciation to Gilbert and Olive Sherman and Rev. F. M. Eichelberger for their work on the camp grounds by a rising vote of thanks. Carried.

2. It was moved and carried that we show our appreciation for the beef donated by Carl Dillon by a rising vote of thanks.

3. It was moved and carried that we show our appreciation to Rev. and Mrs. Jason Felter and boys, Rev. and Mrs. Eldon Rotz, and the singing Salvadores for their work with us during the camp by a rising vote of thanks.

4. It was moved and carried to give a rising vote of thanks to Rev. H. K. Busby for his untiring labors as our District Superintendent, for his efficient conducting of the camp and conference, and for his excellent culinary art.

5. A rising vote of thanks was given to the following in appreciation of their work:
