JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

The Forty-Eighth Annual Conference of the Kansas District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at 8:00 a.m. Monday, August 7, 1961, at the Camp Meeting Tabernacle at Hutchinson, Kansas.

The Conference opened with Mrs. F. N. Griffin at the piano and Rev. F. N. Griffin leading in singing, "Tis So Sweet To Trust In Jesus." Rev. Paul Sickler led in prayer.

Rev. Howard Busby, our District Superintendent, introduced Rev. R. G. Flexon, our General Superintendent over this area. Rev. Flexon expressed regret that owing to the present set-up in our Church, he never again would be able to serve this area. He urged that Central Pilgrim College ever be a Preachers Training School. He read from Haggai 1:8 "Go up to the mountain, and bring wood, and build the house; and I will take pleasure in it, and I will be glorified, saith the Lord." His subject was, "When is God Glorified in the Church?" He stated that God is glorified in the Church when-

1. The service begins on time and stops on time, unless God takes over.

The services are cheerfully and regularly attended.

3. The public knows where the Church is located by the right kind of advertising.

4. The spiritual walls are not tempered with untempered mortar, as misplaced emphasis on holiness, demonstration, finances, education, or tolerance.

5. The preacher has something to say—something to set before his people.

6. The Church has a venturesome faith.

The roll was called.

Motion made, seconded, and carried that Sister Ray Jellison be seated within the Conference Bar with full privileges.

Rev. L. E. Schendel, District Superintendent of the Rocky Mountain District, was introduced to the Conference, gave his testimony, and was granted an honorary seat within the Conference Bar.

Rev. D. R. Close, pastor of Lima, Ohio, was introduced to the Conference, gave his testimony, and was granted an honorary seat within the Conference Bar.

The report of Rev. H. K. Busby, our faithful and beloved District Superintendent, was read and accepted by a rising vote of appreciation.

Report of the Auditing Committee was read and accepted.

Report of the District Treasurer was read and accepted.

Report of the Statistical Committee was read and accepted.

We were recessed for ten minutes, 10:10-10:20.

Report of the Sunday School Promotional Secretary was read and accepted. Report of the Resolution Committee read and acted upon. No. 2 under division I was amended to read 'with regular salary.' Under Division II, No. 12 and 13 were added. No. 14 to have a building committee was lost. Under Division III, No. 15 was amended to include the entire daily schedule. No. 16 was added. No. 17 to have the District Minutes removed during election was lost. No. 18 to have a Camp Manager was finally tabled. Under Division V, No. 8 had the last phrase deleted. No. 12 changed to read 'Sunday School Class session.' No. 14 was added.

Report of the Ways and Means Committee was read and acted upon. There were a few minor changes and No. 14 was included in No. 3, and then a new No. 14 added.

Rev. and Mrs. Wm. S. Deal were introduced to the Conference. They gave

their testimonies and were granted honorary seats within the Conference Bar. Report of the Memorial Committee was heard. Five memorials were adopted and sent to the Polity Committee in Indianapolis. (Three were passed before the noon recess, two afterward).

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the 48th Conference of the Kansas District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church now in session at Hutchinson, Kansas. Greetings:

I am humbled as I think of the goodness of our Heavenly Father which has enabled us to meet again in this lovely place to worship Him and to seek light that will better enable us to build His kingdom.

Such a report as I make has to be so incomplete. The story of battles, victories, disappointments, heartaches and pain cannot well be recorded here although there is a record kept of these things. Our one new project that we planned for last year has made some splendid forward strides. Reports of this work will be given elsewhere. This El Dorado work can be organized any day. We have acquired lots with a building on them. Much hard work was

necessary to make the building ready for living and worship. It is almost completed. Our east Kansas men have labored faithfully in this effort, but special mention is due Brother Victor Marvin for his tireless effort in the project. Brother Marvin has driven countless miles and has been on the job there 41 days. Brother Elliott has carried a heavy load in El Dorado this year but the load will be lighter very soon and we will occupy and dedicate the new quarters on some glad day in the near future. This has been made possible by your prayers and gifts.

Reports given in this conference will reveal that some outstanding gains are being made in the work while in some places we are suffering losses.

Our treasurer's reports reveal that as Kansas Pilgrims we will be true to our trust and have again paid our General budget nearly 100%. This places us at the top of all the Districts in the church. God has enabled us to give over \$27,000.00 during the year to our Zone School at Bartlesville. Much improving has been done in the churches and parsonages that should better enable us to carry out the program of God. It was a high day at Johnson when we burned the mortgage last fall. The Solters were greatly used of the Lord in this undertaking. Sharon Springs continues to enlarge their facilities in the church. Brother Wise is leading this effort in a wonderful way. Several thousand dollars were spent at Big Bow on the church and the result was most gratifying. New siding, rest rooms, a nursery; an overflow room were among the things added. We dedicated these things debt free some months ago. The new building at El Dorado is something to rejoice over, has a fine appearance, is well located and should be worth some \$10,000.00, and possibly more. Time would fail to tell of the countless other improvements that have been made.

Illness has dealt crippling blows here and there among our workers. Our long time friend and brother, Rev. Ray L. Jellison, fell from a mortal wound and was lost to us last November. He shall never be forgotten.

Rock Springs was another in a series of Youth Camps where God was again given glory and surely much good accomplished. I thank God that I have been able to make them all.

Brother Hobbs, David Jellison and brother Sherman are to be commended for their diligence around the Camp ground. The Hutchinson church was most helpful this summer when we made the new exit from the parsonage basement. Funds for this project was furnished by the Kansas Youth. All of you should look at this improvement. It makes for safer housing for our girls during Camp.

We have tried to perform the services committed to us as a member of the General Board, as Vice President of the Bible College Board at Bartlesville, and as your District Superintendent.

My report shows that I have preached 137 times and in addition have made 85 parsonage calls. I have visited the churches 97 times. I have preached several funeral sermons, delivered one baccalaureate address and have tried to sow beside many waters as I have visited hospitals, etc., etc.

I have labored in two Camp meetings and two revivals during the year and have been paid for 19,462 miles of travel and the churches have been kind to remember me with \$446.16 in love offerings as I have made them visits.

In conclusion I would add—our work suffers keenly from the need for more men. Not necessarily great men but more men and holy men. Men that share His passion, His love and His work. Men that will do and will die for the greatest cause that men have known. I am sincerely sorry if I have failed any of you in any way and am very grateful to God and to all that have lightened the load and helped to pave the way to the success we have shared.

REPORT OF THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

1. We recommend that all pastors pay the tithe from their pastoral salary through the church treasurer to be applied as follows: three-fourths to District Budget; one-fourth to District Church Extension Loan Fund.

2. We recommend that the District Superintendent, Evangelists, Evangelistic Singers, Home Missionary Workers, and unstationed Ministers pay seventy-five percent of their ministerial tithe to the District Treasurer to be applied as follows: four-fifths to District Budget; one-fifth to District Church Extension Loan Fund. We further recommend that the Conference payment, for all pension plan members of the above groups who comply with the provisions of this recommendation, be paid from the District Budget.

3. We recommend that each church pay the following amounts per each assessable member as reported to the last District conference:

District Budget \$2.50; United Stewardship Fund \$8.00; General Conference Expense Fund \$.40.

8. We recommend that each church of the District be apportioned \$5.00 per member in full standing for the financing of our Zone School, Central Pilgrim College, Bartlesville, Oklahoma, as suggested by the Board of Trustees of the College. We further recommend that all offerings received for this school, with the exceptions of Memorial Pledges, and other Building Fund or Property Payment, may be applied on this \$5.00 apportionment.

9. We recommend that all churches take a love offering for the District Superintendent at time of his regular visits.

10. We recommend that all money raised by the representatives of the General Church and institutional interests be turned over to the local church treasurer and be used for the purpose for which it was raised.

11. We recommend that our District Secretary be paid \$100.00 per year and that our District Treasurer be paid \$200.00 per year.

12. We recommend that any person whose travel is authorized by the District have his traveling expenses met on the same basis as the District Superintendent.

13. We recommend that a form copy of the budget apportionments for each church be sent to the local church treasurer immediately after the conference.

14. We recommend that the month of September be designated as District Church Extension Month and that a special offering be received by each church for this purpose.

REPORT OF THE SUNDAY SCHOOL COMMITTEE

The Sunday School Committee of the 1960-1961 conference year submits the following report:

The Promotional Secretary traveled to Indianapolis last September for the Sunday School Leaders Conference, and for a second trip to help plan for the National Pilgrim Sunday School Convention. Plans were made to hold a three day Sunday School Convention at Bartlesville, Oklahoma, but were later cancelled.

During the past year eleven issues of the 'Progress of the Kansas Pilgrims' were printed. We are able to present a completed Sunday School statistical report. All churches are reported for the conference year.

We have 13 churches this year which had better than a 15% gain, the Conference goal. Ten of them showed over 20% gain.

STANDING RESOLUTION

I. Local Church Work

1. We recommend that opportunity for baptism be given by our churches at least once each year.

2. Resolved that each pastor may hold two revival meetings each year off his charge with regular salary.

3. Resolved that our churches do not open their doors to other churches, organizations, institutions, or individuals for financial appeals.

4. Resolved that no pastor employ an evangelist outside the Pilgrim Holiness Church without first consulting the District Superintendent.

5. Resolved that each pastor leaving his charge, prepare and leave for his successor a complete calling list with the location of the homes.

6. We recommend that each pastor be granted two weeks vacation each year with regular salary.

II. District Work

1. Whereas, the Conference has approved the Blue Cross-Blue Shield plan, be it resolved that it be optional with the local churches to pay one-half of the monthly payments.

2. Resclved that the District Council appoint an editor for the district publication.

3. Resolved that any pastor, who is required to be away from his church on district, local, or general business, shall receive his salary as usual.

4. Resolved that we, the Kansas District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, go on record as opposed to members of the Pilgrim Holiness Church being required to violate their religious convictions and the standards of the Church in physical education classes in the public schools.

5. Resolved that the committees be appointed by the council, and the names of those appointed on said committees be printed in the district Minutes.

6. Resolved that in the event of death of any of our pastors' or evangelists' immediate family, the District Secretary shall be immediately wired, and in turn each pastor shall be notified by wire by the District Secretary.

7. Resolved that no mortgage be placed upon our District Camp Grounds, parsonage, and equipment pertaining thereto, without two-thirds vote of the Annual District Conference.

8. Resolved that each church strive for a 10 percent gain in membership and that each pastor work toward that gcal.

9. Resolved that our Kansas District Minutes be sold at 50c each to individuals desiring them. Be it further resolved that each pastor find out how many individuals from his church desire a copy and that he order that amount from the District Secretary not later than September 1st.

10. We recommend that each church help to defray the expense of our District paper by paying five cents per copy for those received.

11. Resolved that each local church assume the payment of the basic telephone bill each month. This does not include the toll calls which are not made in the interest and direct benefit of the local church.

12. Resolved that each local church pay all parsonage utilities.

13. Resolved that members of the Blue Cross and/or Blue Shield program be dropped if and when they become thirty (30) days delinquent upon notification.

III. Camp and Conference

1. Whereas the Pilgrim Holiness Church Camp Grounds at Hutchinson, Kansas, has been established and dedicated for the purpose of that fellowship and ministry that will promote and propagate scriptural Holiness, it is expected that those attending shall willingly observe the following:

RULES

- (1) Smoking on grounds prohibited.
- (2) The wearing of immodest dress will not be tolerated.
- (3) Those sleeping on camp premises are expected to be in and quiet by 10:30 P.M.
- (4) Resolved that the council appoint a matron over the girls' dormitory, and a committee to see that those staying on the camp premises are in on time and that proper order is maintained.
- (5) Unmarried young persons shall not be permitted to stay in tents unless chaperoned by their parents.
- (6) Loud talking, rowdyism, or behavior unbecoming a Christian will not be tolerated in the dormitories.
- (7) It is presumed that those attending the camp have read and are willing to observe the above rules and regulations.
- (8) Any one refusing to comply with the above rules and regulations may expect to be asked to leave the camp premises without any refund of registration fee.

2. We further recommend that the above camp rules and regulations be printed on cards for display on camp premises.

3. Resolved that the three center sections in the tabernacle to the posts and the platform constitute the Conference Bar.

4. Resolved that the time for the Conference be from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon, and from 1:30 p.m. to 5:30 p.m. with recess from 12:00 to 1:30.

5. We recommend that the first service of camp meeting be conducted on Friday of the first week and that all pasters make a special effort to come on the day previous to assist in making preparations for the camp.

6. We further recommend that all pasters make a special effort to attend all of camp and conference.

7. Resolved that the District Camp have Children's and Young Peoples' services.

8. Resolved that we hold Conference at the close of camp.

9. Resolved that each church furnish the District Secretary with the names of its delegates at least 24 hours before the Conference convenes.

10. Resolved that each pastor urge his people to bring their musical instruments to camp.

11. Resolved that each church take a special offering for camp.

12. Resolved that the first Friday night service and the day services of the first Saturday be designated as Young People's Services, and that the Youth Conference be held on the first Saturday afternoon of camp.

13. Resolved that those attending the Sunday morning service of the camp meeting be given credit on Sunday School attendance in their home church.

14. Resolved that we have men's and women's prayer bands during camp meeting, and that the leaders be appointed by the district council.

15. Resolved that the daily schedule be as follows: Rising Bell 6:30 a.m., Prayer Service 7:00, Breakfast 7:30, Morning Service 10:15, Dinner 12:00 Noon, Children's Service 2:30 p.m., Afternoon Service 2:30, Supper 5:00, Youth Service 6:45, Evening Service 7:30, Curfew 10:30.

16. Resolved that the District Council appoint a committee, of at least 3 and not more than 5, to make a study of the feasability of the future relocation of the district camp grounds and submit a report to the 1962 District Conference.

The committee appointed is: Rev. Paul Sickler, Chairman, Rev. John Rovenstine, Rev. Francis Hobbs. The epense account not to exceed one hundred (\$100.00) dollars.

IV. Educational Work

1. We recommend that at each annual camp meeting, on the last Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, there shall be one daily session of the Educational and Examining Boards for the purpose of the examination of licensed ministers and deaconesses. All ministers knowing themselves due to appear before these boards are urged to be present with their recommendations.

2. We further recommend that the time of each session shall be announced from the platform.

3. We recommend that all ministers working toward ordination consult with the educational board by the close of the district conference.

4. We recommend that one-half year's credit on the study course be granted for each year of seminar work approved. This credit does not apply on the reading course required in the manual.

V. Sunday School and Youth Work

The duties of the Sunday School Committee in harmony with the manual of the Pilgrim Holiness Church shall be as follows:

1. The District Sunday School Committee together with the District Superintendent shall arrange for Sunday School Conventions to be held in the district during the year.

2. To promote and encourage the Sunday School work throughout the district.

3. To present an annual report to the Conference which shall include the following:

- (A) A statement of the work accomplished during the year.
- (B) A statement of the general conditions of the Sunday School work in the district.

4. We recommend that where possible each local church conduct a Summer Vacation Bible School, and a report of that work shall be sent to the District Sunday School Committee.

5. We further recommend that each Sunday School Superintendent make an earnest effort to attend and bring as large a delegation as possible of Sunday School Workers to the Sunday School Convention.

6. Resolved that each church strive for a 15 percent gain in Sunday School attendance, and that they use the plan suggested by the General Church.

7. Resolved that each church of the Kansas District seek to establish children's meetings.

8. Resolved that each church on the Kansas District in which Young People's Societies are not organized, or have no services in their behalf, endeavor to organize a chartered Young People's Society (as suggested by our General Church).

9. We recommend that the District Young People's Committee arrange for Youth Conventions to be held throughout the state.

10. Resolved that the Sunday School Committee be appointed and announced by Thursday of camp.

11. Resolved that a Sunday School promotional service be held during camp.

12. Resolved that each Sunday School cease counting fifteen minutes before the close of the Sunday School Class session; thereby placing all Sunday School counting on an equalized basis.

13. Resolved that the Sunday School committee be appointed for a three year term; and that one member be appointed each year.

14. Resolved that the District authorize the Promotional Secretary's trip to the National Sunday School Convention annually—Pilgrim when possible and N.S.S.A. otherwise.

SPECIAL RESOLUTION

1. It was moved and carried to give a rising vote of thanks to Rev. R. G. Flexon for the efficient way in which he conducted the Conference.

2. It was moved and carried to give a rising vote of appreciation to Rev. H. K. Busby, our District Superintendent, for his untiring labors of love throughout the year.

3. Motion prevailed to give a vote of thanks to Gilbert Sherman, F. M. Hobbs, and David Jellison for their work on the Camp ground.

4. It was moved and carried that we show our appreciation to Rev. Walter Drown, Rev. Wm. S. Deal, and Loren Brecheisen and family for their work with us during the camp by a rising vote of thanks.

5. It was moved and carried that we express our deep appreciation to Mrs. Bertha Busby and her Sunday School class for providing the Camp with six new steel cots.

6. A rising vote of thanks was given to the following in appreciation of their work.
