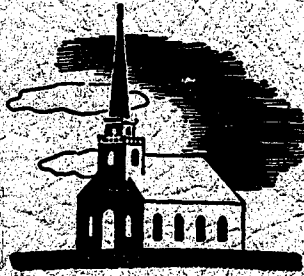

The Forty-Ninth Annual Conference of the Kansas District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at 8:00 a.m., Monday, August 6, 1962, at the Camp Meeting Tabernacle at Hutchinson, Kansas.

The Conference opened with Rev. J. Orvan Keller at the organ and Rev. Dean Mitchener leading in singing "The Solid Rock." Raymond Frank led in prayer.

Rev. Howard K. Busby, our District Superintendent, introduced our presiding officer, the Rev. Melvin Snyder, our General Superintendent over this area. Rev. Snyder read from Matt. 8:5-13, and spoke on the great faith of the Centurian, who had—

1. A faith exercised in a profound humility.

## REPORT OF THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

1. We recommend that all pastors pay the tithe from their pastoral salary through the church treasurer to be applied as follows: three-fourths to District Budget; one-fourth to District Church Extension Loan Fund.

2. We recommend that the District Superintendent, Evangelists, Evangelistic Singers, Home Missionary Workers, and unstationed Ministers pay seventy-five percent of their ministerial tithe to the District Treasurer to be applied as follows: four-fifths to District Budget; one-fifth to District Church Extension Loan Fund. We further recommend that the Conference payment, for all pension plan members of the above groups who comply with the provisions of this recommendation, be paid from the District Budget.

3. We recommend that each church pay the following amounts per each assessable member as reported to the last District conference:

District Budget \$2.50; United Stewardship Fund \$8.00; General Conference Expense Fund \$.40.

8. We recommend that each church of the District be apportioned \$5.00 per member in full standing for the financing of our Zone School, Central Pilgrim College, Bartlesville, Oklahoma, as suggested by the Board of Trustees of the College. We further recommend that all offerings received for this school, with the exceptions of Memorial Pledges, and other Building Fund or Property Payment, may be applied on this \$5.00 apportionment.

9. We recommend that all churches take a love offering for the District Superintendent at time of his regular visits.

10. We recommend that all money raised by the representatives of the General Church and institutional interests be turned over to the local church treasurer and be used for the purpose for which it was raised.

11. We recommend that our District Secretary be paid \$100.00 per year and that our District Treasurer be paid \$200.00 per year.

12. We recommend that any person whose travel is authorized by the District have his traveling expenses met on the same basis as the District Superintendent.

13. We recommend that a form copy of the budget apportionments for each church be sent to the local church treasurer immediately after the conference.

14. We recommend that the month of September be designated as District Church Extension Month and that a special offering be received by each church for this purpose.

## STANDING RESOLUTIONS

### 1. Local Church Work

1. We recommend that opportunity for baptism be given by our churches at least once each year.

2. Resolved that each pastor may hold two revival meetings each year off his charge with regular salary.

3. Resolved that our churches do not open their doors to other churches, organizations, institutions, or individuals for financial appeals.

4. Resolved that no pastor employ an evangelist outside the Pilgrim Holiness Church without first consulting the District Superintendent.

5. Resolved that each pastor leaving his charge, prepare and leave for his successor a complete calling list with the location of the homes.

6. We recommend that each pastor be granted two weeks vacation each year with regular salary.

### II. District Work

1. Whereas, the Conference has approved the Blue Cross-Blue Shield plan, be it resolved that it be optional with the local churches to pay one-half of the monthly payments.

2. Resolved that the District Council appoint an editor for the district publication.

3. Resolved that any pastor, who is required to be away from his church on district, local, or general business, shall receive his salary as usual.

4. Resolved that we, the Kansas District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, go on record as opposed to members of the Pilgrim Holiness Church being required to violate their religious convictions and the standards of the Church in physical education classes in the public schools.

5. Resolved that the committees be appointed by the council, and the names of those appointed on said committees be printed in the district Minutes.

6. Resolved that in the event of death of any of our pastors' or evangelists' immediate family, the District Secretary shall be immediately wired, and in turn each pastor shall be notified by wire by the District Secretary.

7. Resolved that no mortgage be placed upon our District Camp Grounds, parsonage, and equipment pertaining thereto, without two-thirds vote of the Annual District Conference.

8. Resolved that each church strive for a 10 percent gain in membership and that each pastor work toward that goal.

9. Resolved that our Kansas District Minutes be sold at 50c each to individuals desiring them. Be it further resolved that each pastor find out how many individuals from his church desire a copy and that he order that amount from the District Secretary not later than September 1st.



10. We recommend that each church help to defray the expense of our District paper by paying five cents per copy for those received.

11. Resolved that each local church assume the payment of the basic telephone bill each month. This does not include the toll calls which are not made in the interest and direct benefit of the local church.

12. Resolved that each local church pay all parsonage utilities.

13. Resolved that members of the Blue Cross and/or Blue Shield program be dropped if and when they become thirty (30) days delinquent upon notification.

### III. Camp and Conference

1. Whereas the Pilgrim Holiness Church Camp Grounds at Hutchinson, Kansas, has been established and dedicated for the purpose of that fellowship and ministry that will promote and propagate scriptural Holiness, it is expected that those attending shall willingly observe the following:

#### RULES

- (1) Smoking on grounds prohibited.
- (2) The wearing of immodest dress will not be tolerated.
- (3) Those sleeping on camp premises are expected to be in and quiet by 10:30 p.m.
- (4) Resolved that the council appoint supervisors over the boys' and the girls' dormitories, and a committee to see that those staying on the camp premises are in on time and that proper order is maintained.
- (5) Unmarried young persons shall not be permitted to stay in tents unless chaperoned by their parents.
- (6) Loud talking, rowdyism, or behavior unbecoming a Christian will not be tolerated in the dormitories.
- (7) It is presumed that those attending the camp have read and are willing to observe the above rules and regulations.
- (8) Any one refusing to comply with the above rules and regulations may expect to be asked to leave the camp premises without any refund of registration fee.

2. We further recommend that the above camp rules and regulations be printed on cards for display on camp premises.

3. Resolved that the three center sections in the tabernacle to the posts and the platform constitute the Conference Bar.

4. Resolved that the time for the Conference be from 4:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. on the last Saturday of the Camp, and from 8:00 a.m. to 12 noon, and from 1:30 p.m. to 5:30 p.m. with recess from 12:00 noon to 1:30 p.m. on the day following the close of Camp.

5. We recommend that the first service of camp meeting be conducted on Friday night of the first week and that all pastors make a special effort to come on the day previous to assist in making preparations for the camp.

6. We further recommend that all pastors make a special effort to attend all of camp and conference.

7. Resolved that the District Camp have Children's and Young Peoples' services.

8. Resolved that our District Conference convene at 4:00 o'clock on the last Saturday afternoon of the District Camp for the purpose of hearing and acting upon the reports and recommendations as provided for in Section 163 of the 1958 Manual, and that it shall reconvene at the close of Camp for the regular business.

9. Resolved that each church furnish the District Secretary with the names of its delegates at least 24 hours before the Conference convenes.

10. Resolved that each pastor urge his people to bring their musical instruments to camp.

11. Resolved that each church take a special offering for camp.

12. Resolved that the first Friday night service and the day services of the first Saturday be designated as Young People's Services, and that the Youth Conference be held on the first Saturday afternoon of camp.

13. Resolved that those attending the Sunday morning service of the camp meeting be given credit on Sunday School attendance in their home church.

14. Resolved that we have men's and women's prayer bands during camp meeting, and that the leaders be appointed by the district council.

15. Resolved that the daily schedule be as follows: Rising Bell 6:30 a.m., Prayer Service 7:00, Breakfast 7:30, Morning Service 10:15, Dinner 12:00 Noon, Children's Service 2:30 p.m., Afternoon Service 2:30, Supper 5:00, Youth Service 6:45, Evening Service 7:30, Curfew 10:30.

16. Resolved that the District Council appoint a committee, of at least 3 and not more than 5, to make a further study of the feasibility of relocation of the district camp grounds and submit a report to the next District Conference.

The committee appointed is: Rev. Paul Sickler, Chairman, Rev. John Rovenstine, Rev. Francis Hobbs. The expense account not to exceed one hundred (\$100.00) dollars.

#### **IV. Educational Work**

1. We recommend that at each annual camp meeting, on the last Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday, there shall be one daily session of the Educational and Examining Boards for the purpose of the examinations of licensed ministers and deaconesses. All ministers knowing themselves due to appear before these boards are urged to be present with their recommendations.

2. We further recommend that the time of each session shall be announced from the platform.

3. We recommend that all ministers working toward ordination consult with the educational board by the close of the district conference.

4. Resolved that one-half year's credit on the study course be granted for each year of seminar work, subject to the approval of the ministerial Study Course Agency.

#### **V. Sunday School and Youth Work**

The duties of the Sunday School Committee in harmony with the manual of the Pilgrim Holiness Church shall be as follows:

1. The District Sunday School Committee together with the District Superintendent shall arrange for Sunday School Conventions to be held in the district during the year.

2. To promote and encourage the Sunday School work throughout the district.

3. To present an annual report to the Conference which shall include the following:

- (A) A statement of the work accomplished during the year.
- (B) A statement of the general conditions of the Sunday School work in the district.

4. We recommend that where possible each local church conduct a Summer Vacation Bible School, and a report of that work shall be sent to the District Sunday School Committee.

5. We further recommend that each Sunday School Superintendent make an earnest effort to attend and bring as large a delegation as possible of Sunday School Workers to the Sunday School Convention.

6. Resolved that each church strive for a 15 percent gain in Sunday School attendance, and that they use the plan suggested by the General Church.

7. Resolved that each church of the Kansas District seek to establish children's meetings.

8. Resolved that each church on the Kansas District in which Young People's Societies are not organized, or have no services in their behalf, endeavor to organize a chartered Young People's Society (as suggested by our General Church).

9. We recommend that the District Young People's Committee arrange for Youth Conventions to be held throughout the state.

10. Resolved that the Sunday School Committee be appointed and announced by Thursday of camp.

11. Resolved that a Sunday School promotional service be held during camp.

12. Resolved that each Sunday School cease counting fifteen minutes before the close of the Sunday School Class session; thereby placing all Sunday School counting on an equalized basis.

13. Resolved that the Sunday School committee be appointed for a three year term; and that one member be appointed each year.

14. Resolved that the District authorize the Promotional Secretary's trip to the National Sunday School Convention annually—Pilgrim when possible and N.S.S.A. otherwise.

### SPECIAL RESOLUTION

1. Be it resolved that a rising vote of thanks be given to Rev. Melvin H. Snyder for the efficient way in which he conducted the conference.

2. Be it resolved that a rising vote of thanks be given to our beloved District Superintendent Rev. H. K. Busby for his labors of love for Christ and the Kansas District.

3. Be it resolved that a vote of thanks be given Gilbert Sherman and Francis Hobbs, for their labors on the camp ground throughout the year.

## DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the 49th Conference of the Kansas District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church now in session at Hutchinson, Kansas, with General Superintendent Melvin H. Snyder presiding. Greetings!

Through the mercy of a loving Heavenly Father we are allowed to gather on this sacred spot to again assemble our reports and make plans for the furtherance of His work.

A year ago we reported our hopes for El Dorado and I am glad to tell you that the church there has been completed, organized and they have shown some fine gains. The church with parsonage attached is a credit to our district and is due largely to the faithful labor of brother and sister Lorren Elliott. We dedicated the church some months ago and the building was more than filled.

Gains are noted here and there in various departments of the work and these are reminders of what can be done. We show a gain in both membership and Sunday School attendance. We have responded well to the appeals made to us by the General Church and our District stands high year after year among the other Districts in the church. We rank well in Advocate subscriptions and this is something we should continue.

Sharon Springs is taking new ground under the leadership of Rev. A. I. Wise. Their building program has seemed slow to them but I marvel at the way they have gone so far with full payment of their bills. Just now they are getting a loan of \$6,000 that will enable them to complete a plant that will be adequate for a large congregation and growing Sunday School.

Oakley is busy on a lovely new church in a new location. This should enable them to meet a challenge that has faced them for quite some time in their field. Brother Bushman is to be commended.

The Lakin church is well on the way to completion of their parsonage. Brother Mueller has worked faithfully and the building shows the splendid skill of the builder. This is one of our finest buildings.

I was glad to participate in a mortgage burning service at Argonia as they cleared their parsonage debt. Another year could bring Argonia into such a report again in a different way.

Bit by bit Wichita First Church has improved and added to their facilities with new pews until their church is much changed within.

Wichita Olivet has new pews and seem to always be improving their property in one way or another.

Wichita Bethel has shown outstanding gains and new life and they are talking of some type of building program.

Sickness laid heavy hands on a number. Brother Marvin has been ill for many weeks and just recently underwent major surgery. He is able to carry on again. We thank God for this.

Sister Leatherman, our pastor's wife at Toronto, underwent an operation in the spring. She is sufficiently recovered to be with us in the Camp this year. God is good to us all as we walk farther into the valley.

Three of our long time gospel workers have been called to that land that they so often sang and preached about. They are named elsewhere in our Minutes but their deeds and lives are so well known that a further word is not needed. In each case I was privileged to speak at their memorial services and mingle my tears with those their loved ones shed.

Interest in our Youth Camp held at Rock Springs is growing and the attendance is good. We hope to meet there again in a few days.

Brother Hobbs and his people are to be commended for their aid in the maintenance of the Camp Ground and our District property. Their continued help is badly needed as we face the task of immediately reroofing all of our buildings here, because of the heavy hail damage.

I have served this year as Vice-Chairman of the Central Pilgrim College Board at Bartlesville, as a member of the General Board and as a member of the Polity Committee of the General Conference. My report shows that I have preached 103 times and beside this have made 75 parsonage calls. I have visited our churches 86 times. I took only one meeting off the District, a camp at Frankfort, Indiana, and held one revival on the District and that was in Toronto. I think by record shows more funerals than in any year of my life. I spoke at one commencement and delivered one Baccalaureate sermon. In our work in the District we report 21,114 miles of travel and I have received \$469.93 in love offerings as I have visited the churches. My cash pledges made to support the work are paid.

Our prospects for the future are as great as our faith in God. The great need of this hour in this Conference is again for men. Dedicated men, consecrated men, men with a holy purpose to do His will and build his kingdom.

Think of me kindly beloved, I have not done my best, many times I have known better than I have done. I have tried to do my best with what we have had to work with. Our forces are terribly thin and there are yawning gaps to be closed or our work will further suffer. I am deeply grateful for the patience of God's people and the prayers of all that have helped to sustain us on this year's journey. Brethern, pray for me.
