ORDINATION SERVICE

A very impressive ordination service was held in the Pilgrim Holiness Tabernacle in Hutchinson, Kansas, Sunday, August 4, 1963, at 9:00 a.m.

The service opened by singing "A Charge To Keep I Have" and "Rock of Ages" led by Rev. Naaman Dowty. Rev. Robert H. Heckart offered prayer. Appropriate portions of Scripture were read from First and Second Timothy and Titus by Rev. B. F. Ireland, Rev. Floyd M. Eichelberger, and Rev. Wayne R. Plummer.

Rev. Earl E. Bell, the candidate for ordination was seated before the altar and his wife given an honorary seat by his side.

Rev. Howard K. Busby, our District Superintendent, brought a fine message from Acts 20:17-33. He stated that four requirements of a minister were:

He must be holy in heart.

He must have a passion for the souls of men.

He must live a life of self-denial.

After the prayer of consecration by Rev. Robert H. Heckart, and the laying on of hands, Rev. Busby completed the charge. The ordained was then congratulated and wished the continued blessings of God upon his life and ministry.

JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

The Fiftieth Annual Conference of the Kansas District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at 4:00 p.m. for the short session on Saturday, August 3, 1963, at the Camp Meeting Tabernacle in Hutchinson, Kansas.

The Conference was called to order by the District Superintendent, Rev. Howard K. Busby. Motion carried that the chair appoint a secretary pro-tem. Daniel Busby was appointed. Rev. Robert H. Heckart led in prayer. A partial report of the Examining Board was read recommending Rev. Earl E. Bell for ordination. Motion to accept the recommendation carried. Motion prevailed to recess until 8:00 a.m. Monday, August 5th.

The Regular Session of the Conference opened Monday at 8:00 a.m. with Rev. E. W. Burton leading in singing, "Leaning On The Everlasting Arms." Mrs. Homer Teats was at the piano. Rev. O. M. Allen led in prayer.

The District Secretary reported that word had come from our General Superintendent, Dr. Melvin H. Snyder, that he could not be with us, and that he was authorizing Rev. Howard K. Busby, our District Superintendent, to conduct the Conference.

Rev. Busby read II John and spoke from verse 8, "Look to yourselves, that we lose not those things which we have wrought, but that we receive a full reward." He emphasized the danger of our losing Our Faith, Our Fire, and Our Future.

The roll was called.

The report of our faithful and beloved District Superintendent, was read and received with deep appreciation.

The report of the Assistant District Superintendent was read and accepted.

The report of the Auditing Committee was read and accepted.

The report of the Examining Board was read and ratified.

The report of the District Treasurer was read and accepted.

The next order of business was the reading of the personal reports of the pastors.

It was moved and seconded that since our General Superintendent was not here to hear the reports that we dispense with the reading. This was declared out of order by the chair.

It was moved and seconded that one person read all the reports. Lost.

After the reading of the reports the following were introduced to the Conference and gave their testimonies: Rev. James D. Burnett from the East Michigan District, Rev. Morris Berry from the Northern Indiana District, Rev. and Mrs. O. James Cook from the Central District, Rev. and Mrs. Thomas E. Aslin from the Tennessee District, Rev. Ray Gilbert from the Rocky Mountain District, and Rev. David Moore from the Kansas District. All became members of the Kansas Conference.

The Conference was recessed for ten minutes.

The report of the Resolution Committee was heard.

Under II District Work, motion carried to change No. 8 from 10% gain to a simple gain. Motion lost to change No. 9.

Under III Camp and Conference motion lost to change No. (2) under "Rules." No. (3) and (4) were changed. No. (9) added which reads, "The Pilgrim Youth lunch stand will be closed during each Tabernacle service and at 10:30 each night.

No. 2 and 8 were changed. No. 16 deleted and a new one added.

Under IV Educational Work, No. 4 was struck out.

Under V Sunday School and Youth, No. 15 was added. (These changes can all be seen under their respective listing.)

The report of the Ways and Means Committee read and accepted.

A brief statistical report was read and accepted

The report of the World Missions Committee was read and accepted.

Motion carried that the District Secretary write a letter of sympathy to Rev. and Mrs. Richard E. Long expressing the deep feeling of this Conference to them in their time of bereavement. The Conference stood with bowed heads while Rev. James Cook led in prayer.

Motion carried that the District Secretary write a letter to Rev. and Mrs. Victor Marvin expressing the sympathy of this Conference to them in Sister Marvin's affliction.

Report of the Sunday School Committee read and accepted.

Moved and seconded that we reconvene after dinner at 1:00 p.m. instead of at 1:30. Carried.

Motion carried that the election of officers be the order of the day at 1:00 p.m.

We recessed at 12:00 noon.

Conference was called to order at 1:00 p.m. by Rev. H. K. Busby, the presiding officer. Rev. Chancy Beckner led in prayer.

It was moved and carried that the Chair appoint tellers. Those appointed were: Raymond Frank, Wendell Rovenstine, Earl Bell, and James D. Burnett.

"Blest be the Tie that Binds" was sung, followed by "We shall wear a Crown."

The Conference was dismissed with prayer by the District Secretary.

The Minutes were later read and approved.

REPORT OF THE DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

To the 50th Conference of the Kansas District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church now in progress at Hutchinson, Kansas, and to the saints abroad: Greetings! Through the mercy of God we have reached the half century mark in our existence. Our growth has been painfully slow, yet eternity alone will reveal what has been done, how God has enabled us on countless occasions to throw roadblocks in the devils way, snatch souls as brands from the burning as prayer and faith have prevailed.

I consider it a privilege to once more stand here and give a fragmentary report of our part done in God's work in this area. As usual there are gains in some places and losses in others. Our churches have done well in raising district and general funds. I am grateful for this as from month to month we rank high in the entire church reports. A recent report says that we are carrying 70% of Central Pilgrim College support at Bartlesville. It may be that we cannot continue at this pace but our giving of this hour buys time for the school as beach heads are being established.

It is well nigh impossible to mention all of the fine things done among the churches but we will try and list a few. Goodland has installed a hot water heating system at considerable cost. Sharon Springs has made fine progress toward the completion of their building. This improvement gives them greatly added facilities and their debt is small. St. Francis has a new roof on the church and they have lowered the ceiling in the church. The latter was helped wonderfully in a number of ways. Humboldt has done interior work in their church that helps greatly. Colby has their educational wing about finished and they have been holding their services here for several months. By a strange set of circumstances Hill City was able to acquire a property at a very reasonable figure. This was a dwelling badly damaged by fire. It has been converted into a roomy place of worship and there is a fine spot along side for a church. They have done well in the past months toward paying for this purchase and what they have done should serve as an inspiration to those who just think it cannot be done. When God leads there is a way. Salina is about to launch a program that will give them a new sanctuary. The new parsonage at Lakin is now occupied and is probably one of the finest in the entire church. Olivet in Wichita is now purchasing a parsonage. This meets a pressing need and is well located. The Oakley church, well located and well built enables us to meet a challenge provided by this growing west Kansas town. New pews at Osawatomie are a beautiful and fine addition. So the never ending story goes on.

Lack of adequate forces greatly hinders at this time in the planning for new works. This is difficult for me to bear. Unless help comes soon, we will suffer greatly. Sister Marvin's recent illness is a cause for concern. Brethren, the battle is not won. Our only hope is to be a church militant. We desperately need a revival, a revival led by our ministers. Anything less dooms us to individual failure and will write "Ichabod" over the door of our beloved Zion. The tides of worldiness and materialism must be checked if we are to have a worthwhile survival.

Rock Springs and the youth camp continues to be one of the highlights of the year. It was a privilege to be the speaker at the Camp and a joy to see many seek and find God at an altar of prayer.

God enabled us to reroof all of our buildings at the Camp ground. Our men did the work gratis and we enjoyed the fellowship of those days. Brother Hobbs and his people continue to show fine cooperation in supporting the Camp and Brother Whittington has aided in many ways this year.

Again I have served as Vice-chairman of the College Board at Bartlesville and as a member of the General Board of the Church and attended their meetings. My report shows that I have preached 145 sermons and have made 73 parsonage calls. I have visited the churches 87 times. Funerals, school activities and dedications have taken some of our time. We have traveled 21,780 miles for the district and have received \$401.78 in love offerings.

I am humbly grateful for an opportunity to serve God and His saints. Your prayers and patience are solicited as we look forward to greater things in Him.

REPORT OF THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

1. We recommend that all pastors pay the tithe from their pastoral salary through the church treasurer to be applied as follows: three-fourths to District Budget; one-fourth to District Church Extension Loan Fund.

2. We recommend that the District Superintendent, Evangelists, Evangelistic Singers, Home Missionary Workers, and unstationed Ministers pay seventy-five percent of their ministerial tithe to the District Treasurer to be applied to District Budget. We further recommend that the Conference payment, for all pension plan members of the above groups who comply with the provisions of this recommendation, be paid from the District Budget.

3. We recommend that each church pay the following amounts per each assessable member as reported to the last District conference:

District Budget \$2.50; United Stewardship Fund \$8.00; General Conference Expense Fund \$.40.

4. We recommend that the District Superintendent have the privilege of conducting two revival meetings off the district, and that he have a two week vacation each year.

5. We recommend that all the churches send in their remittances to the District Treasurer so as to reach him by the tenth of each month.

6. We recommend that we pay our District Superintendent at the rate of \$300.00 per month. His traveling expenses shall be paid as follows: 5c per mile when traveling in his personal vehicle, actual expense when traveling by other means, and full re-imbursement for meals and lodging. We further recommend that the District pay his telephone bill and \$20.00 per month for utilities.

We further recommend that all offerings received for this school, with the exceptions of Memorial Pledges, and other Building Fund or Property Payment, may be applied on this \$5.00 apportionment.

9. We recommend that all churches take a love offering for the District Superintendent at time of his regular visits.

10. We recommend that all money raised by the representatives of the General Church and institutional interests be turned over to the local church treasurer and be used for the purpose for which it was raised.

11. We recommend that our District Secretary be paid \$100.00 per year and that our District Treasurer be paid \$200.00 per year.

12. We recommend that any person whose travel is authorized by the District have his traveling expenses met on the same basis as the District Superintendent.

13. We recommend that a form copy of the budget apportionments for each church be sent to the local church treasurer immediately after the conference.

14. We recommend that the month of September be designated as District Church Extension Month and that a special offering be received by each church for this purpose.

15. We recommend that each Sunday School be assessed yearly 10c per scholar on the previous year's Sunday School average attendance to finance a district Sunday School promotion program. Such monies to be sent to the District Treasurer with the regular remittances.

6. We recommend that our pastors endeavor to organize and encourage a Junior Missionary Society in their churches.

STANDING RESOLUTIONS

I. Local Church Work

1. We recommend that opportunity for baptism be given by our churches at least once each year.

2. Resolved that each pastor may hold two revival meetings each year off his charge with regular salary.

3. Resolved that our churches do not open their doors to other churches, organizations, institutions, or individuals for financial appeals.

4. Resolved that no pastor employ an evangelist outside the Pilgrim Holiness Church without first consulting the District Superintendent.

5. Resolved that each pastor leaving his charge, prepare and leave for his successor a complete calling list with the location of the homes.

6. We recommend that each pastor be granted two weeks vacation each year with regular salary.

II. District Work

1. Whereas, the Conference has approved the Blue Cross-Blue Shield plan, be it resolved that it be optional with the local churches to pay one-half of the monthly payments.

2. Resolved that the District Council appoint an editor for the district publication.

3. Resolved that any pastor, who is required to be away from his church on district, local, or general business, shall receive his salary as usual.

4. Resolved that we, the Kansas District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, go on record as opposed to members of the Pilgrim Holiness Church being required to violate their religious convictions and the standards of the Church in physical education classes in the public schools.

5. Resolved that the committees be appointed by the council, and the names of those appointed on said committees be printed in the district Minutes.

6. Resolved that in the event of death of any of our pastors' or evangelists' immediate family, the District Secretary shall be immediately wired, and in turn each pastor shall be notified by wire by the District Secretary.

7. Resolved that no mortgage be placed upon our District Camp Grounds, parsonage, and equipment pertaining thereto, without two-thirds vote of the Annual District Conference.

8. Resolved that each church strive for a gain in membership and that each pastor work toward that goal.

9. Resolved that our Kansas District Minutes be sold at 50c each to individuals desiring them. Be it further resolved that each pastor find out how many individuals from his church desire a copy and that he order that amount from the District Secretary not later than September 1st.

10. We recommend that each church help to defray the expense of our District paper by paying five cents per copy for those received.

11. Resolved that each local church assume the payment of the basic telephone bill each month. This does not include the toll calls which are not made in the interest and direct benefit of the local church.

12. Resolved that each local church pay all parsonage utilities.

13. Resolved that members of the Blue Cross and/or Blue Shield program be dropped if and when they become thirty (30) days delinquent upon notification.

III. Camp and Conference

1. Whereas the Pilgrim Holiness Church Camp Grounds at Hutchinson, Kansas, has been established and dedicated for the purpose of that fellowship and ministry that will promote and propagate scriptural Holiness, it is expected that those attending shall willingly observe the following:

RULES

- (1) Smoking on grounds prohibited.
- (2) The wearing of immodest dress will not be tolerated.
- (3) Those sleeping on camp premises are expected to be in by 10:30 p.m. and lights out and quiet by 11:00 p.m.
- (4) Resolved that the council appoint resident supervisors over the boys' and the girls' dormitories, and a committee to see that those staying on the camp premises are in on time and that proper order is maintained.
- (5) Unmarried young persons shall not be permitted to stay in tents unless chaperoned by their parents.
- (6) Loud talking, rowdiness, or behavior unbecoming a Christian will not be tolerated in the dormitories.
- (7) It is presumed that those attending the camp have read and are willing to observe the above rules and regulations.
- (8) Any one refusing to comply with the above rules and regulations may expect to be asked to leave the camp premises without any refund of registration fee.
- (9) The Pilgrim Youth lunch stand will be closed during each Tabernacle service and at 10:30 each night.

2. We further recommend that the registrar have the above camp rules and regulations printed on cards for display on camp premises, and presented to each one registering.

3. Resolved that the three center sections in the tabernacle to the posts and the platform constitute the Conference Bar.

4. Resolved that the time for the Conference be from 8:00 a.m. to 12 noon, and from 1:30 p.m. to 5:30 p.m. with recess from 12:00 noon to 1:30 p.m. on the day following the close of Camp.

5. We recommend that the first service of camp meeting be conducted on Friday night of the first week and that all pastors make a special effort to come on the day previous to assist in making preparations for the camp.

6. We further recommend that all pastors make a special effort to attend all of camp and conference.

7. Resolved that the District Camp have Children's and Young Peoples' services.

8. Whereas the "Ordination" service is of great importance, and

Whereas, we, of the Kansas District, prefer to have it during Campmeeting rather than on the day of Conference, and

Whereas, it is desirable for relatives and friends of the candidates to be present for the service. Therefore, be it

Resolved, that the names of prospective candidates for ordination shall be presented for action by the District Conference prior to their proposed ordination. Be it further

*Resolved, that the District Council, upon reports from the Educational and Examination Committees, shall prepare a list of the remaining requirements which are to be met during the Conference year in order to qualify for ordination; a copy of said requirements shall be placed on file with the Secretary of each of the above Committees, and the respective candidates. Be it further

Resolved that said candidates appear before the Education and Exami-

nation Committees not later than Wednesday during the succeeding Campmeeting to report their current status on said requirements. Be it further

Resolved that any candidate who has kept his trust inviolate and has fully met the stated requirements shall be ordained in a special service during the Campmeeting upon the action of the previous District Conference.

If requirements have not been met in full the District Council may make further recommendation to the succeeding District Conference.

9. Resolved that each church furnish the District Secretary with the names of its delegates at least 24 hours before the Conference convenes.

10. Resolved that each pastor urge his people to bring their musical instruments to camp.

11. Resolved that each church take a special offering for camp.

12. Resolved that the first Friday night service and the day services of the first Saturday be designated as Young People's Services, and that the Youth Conference be held on the first Saturday afternoon of camp.

13. Resolved that those attending the Sunday morning service of the camp meeting be given credit on Sunday School attendance in their home church.

14. Resolved that we have men's and women's prayer bands during camp meeting, and that the leaders be appointed by the district council.

15. Resolved that the daily schedule be as follows: Rising Bell 6:30 a.m., Prayer Service 7:00, Breakfast 7:30, Morning Service 10:15, Dinner 12:00 Noon, Children's Service 2:30 p.m., Afternoon Service 2:30, Supper 5:00, Youth Service 6:45, Evening Service 7:30, Curfew 10:30.

16. Be it resolved that due to the existing limitations and our expanding program of our Kansas District Camp Grounds, the District Council be authorized to explore the feasibility of securing nearby property for Kansas District usage and to take such action as they find necessary.

IV. Educational Work

1. We recommend that at each annual camp meeting, on the last Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday, there shall be one daily session of the Educational and Examining Boards for the purpose of the examinations of licensed ministers and deaconesses. All ministers knowing themselves due to appear before these boards are urged to be present with their recommendations.

2. We further recommend that the time of each session shall be announced from the platform.

3. Resolved that one-half year's credit on the study course be granted for each year of seminar work, subject to the approval of the ministerial Study Course Agency.

V. Sunday School and Youth Work

The duties of the Sunday School Committee in harmony with the manual of the Pilgrim Holiness Church shall be as follows:

1. The District Sunday School Committee together with the District Superintendent shall arrange for Sunday School Conventions to be held in the district during the year.

2. To promote and encourage the Sunday School work throughout the district.

3. To present an annual report to the Conference which shall include the following:

(A) A statement of the work accomplished during the year.

(B) A statement of the general conditions of the Sunday School work in the district.

4. We recommend that where possible each local church conduct a Summer Vacation Bible School, and a report of that work shall be sent to the District Sunday School Committee.

5. We further recommend that each Sunday School Superintendent make an earnest effort to attend and bring as large a delegation as possible of Sunday School Workers to the Sunday School Convention.

6. Resolved that each church strive for a 15 percent gain in Sunday School attendance, and that they use the plan suggested by the General Church.

7. Resolved that each church of the Kansas District seek to establish children's meetings.

8. Resolved that each church on the Kansas District in which Young People's Societies are not organized, or have no services in their behalf, endeavor to organize a chartered Young People's Society (as suggested by our General Church).

9. We recommend that the District Young People's Committee arrange for Youth Conventions to be held throughout the state.

10. Resolved that the Sunday School Committee be appointed and announced by Thursday of camp.

11. Resolved that a Sunday School promotional service be held during camp.

12. Resolved that each Sunday School cease counting fifteen minutes before the close of the Sunday School Class session; thereby placing all Sunday School counting on an equalized basis.

13. Resolved that the Sunday School committee be appointed for a three year term; and that one member be appointed each year.

14. Resolved that the District authorize the Promotional Secretary's trip to the National Sunday School Convention annually—Pilgrim when possible and N.S.S.A. otherwise.

15. We resolve that a Sunday service during Camp be known as Sunday School hour, and that a free will offering be received for the District Sunday School promotion program.

SPECIAL RESOLUTION

1. Be it resolved that a rising vote of thanks be given to Rev. Howard K. Busby for the efficient way in which he conducted the conference.

2. Be it resolved that a rising vote of thanks be given to our beloved District Superintendent Rev. H. K. Busby for his labors of love for Christ and the Kansas District.

3. Be it resolved that a vote of thanks be given Gilbert Sherman, A. E. Whittington, and Francis Hobbs, for their labors on the camp ground throughout the year.

4. Be it resolved that a rising vote of thanks be given to the camp workers: Rev. S. I. Emery, Rev. Jason Felter, the singing Paveys; to the cooks: Sister Claude Overholt, Sister Woolard; to the children's workers; Willis Snyder and his assistants.

5. Be it resolved, we express our thanks to Sister Bertha Busby and her Sunday School Class for providing the camp with several new steel cots. And to Sister Busby personally for the honey.
