Report of District Superintendent

To the Twenty-third Annual Assembly of the

Pilgrim Holiness Church, Kentucky District,

convened at Aspen Grove, Ky., August 2 - 5, 1932:

I wish to submit the following report as District Superintendent:

This has been a year of inspiration and activity for us all on the District. God has been gracious to us in giving life and sustenance and a willing mind. We praise God for the good health, generally among our people. A few have had to drop out on account of sickness. One of our number, who was a familiar figure among us for many years has gone to her reward, Sister Martha Fanning. She labored and died in the mountains of Kentucky, and leaves a bright testimony besides her works.

The financial strain has not dampened our zeal for the Lord. We have put forth an effort to take new territory all along the line. The enemy has opposed, but we have won by God's grace. While we have avoided high-pressure, we have put all the enthusiasm in our power into the work. We have prayed for a vision. Pastors have worked uncomplainingly and with a sacrificing spirit. None have gotten rich in this world's goods, but we trust that we have come to the end of another year with a richer experience.

We have visited most of the churches three times during the year and some more, as circumstances required. Our work is growing in proportion, Praise the Lord! We have organized six new churches this year and each one has a good pastor and is moving on to victory. Pray for these fine new churches and their pastors. We have a number more that will be attended to as soon as we can get to them. We are establishing new missions as the opportunity affords. We have recently secured a building, got the deed to it, and are ready to go to work at Poplar Plains. A two-story building, given to us free of charge.

We have built a new church and parsonage combined at Coal Creek, Tenn. We have finished and dedicated a fine structure at Jamestown, Tenn. We have recently laid the cornerstone for our fine new church at Elizabethtown, Ky.

We had one of the finest and most constructive Ministerial Conventions at Hitchins, Ky., we have ever had in the District.

We have organized a District Young People's Society and held our Convention; have begun to publish a Young People's Paper—"The Young People's Messenger." All officers are elected and ready for a great time next year.

The District Bulletin has proved a blessing to all. It has cost a lot of good hard work, but we are getting joy out of the results.

We have received for support from the District Budget, \$491.17, for revivals held, \$200.00, for traveling expenses, \$56.73, making a total of \$747.90. We want to thank each pastor and minister for their hearty co-operation in a year of strenuous labor for the Master.

GENERAL PROCEEDINGS

ASPEN GROVE, KY., AUGUST 2, 1932.

The Twenty-third Annual Assembly of the Kentucky District was opened by the District Superintendent, reading from the twelfth chapter of Romans. Prayer was offered by Rev. J. M. Walton.

Minutes of the previous Assembly were reviewed by the Secretary, followed by roll call of Ministers and Deaconesses.

Motion made and carried that the Assembly Bar shall include the first seven seats.

The following committees were appointed—Resolutions, Statistical, Ways and Means, Reception and Auditing.

Rev. and Mrs. J. M. Walton, W. H. Marsh, Rev. and Mrs. H. H. Bolender, Rev. and Mrs. M. M. Benner and son and a large delegation from Tennessee were presented to the Assembly.

At this time General Superintendent Rees, and Rev. and Mrs. C. L. Slater arrived, and Brother Rees took the chair.

By motion the time of the morning sessions was placed from nine-thirty to twelve o'clock, and the afternoon sessions from one-thirty to four-thirty.

Reports from the Carrollton and Clinton churches were read and accepted.

Rev. C. E. Johnson, Rev. Chas. Merritt, Rev. Hensley and Rev. Barton were introduced to the Assembly.

Reports of the Dalesburg and Fairview churches read and accepted.

Announcements were made and an offering taken for the expenses of the dining room.

After singing the Doxology, the benediction was pronounced by Brother Rees.

AFTERNOON SESSION, AUGUST 2, 1932.

Session opened by singing, prayer and a stirring message from Brother Rees. The business was continued.

Minutes of the last session were read and approved.

Verbal report of the Inez church was given. Moved and carried to accept this report; also the others from this church when sent in.

On motion, the following new churches were accepted into our district: Eastern Avenue (Covington), South Portsmouth, Wheelwright, Garvin Hill, Monticello, and New Taxwell, Tenn.

Reports from Jamestown, Normal and Olive Hill churches were read and accepted.

Reports of the Pinson Fork church read, and motion made and carried to leave this report on the table until the District Superintendent has a chance to wait on the pastor in regard to tithing.

Special song sung by Rev. L. Steele was enjoyed by the Assembly.

Report of the Ways and Means Committee. Moved to accept the first recommendation presented. Motion carried.

Brother Rees lets us know that preachers who do not push the Advocate and tithing are not going to find any place in the Pilgrim Holiness Church.

The second recommendation of the Ways and Means Committee is accepted.

Rev. Clough and family of Madisonville church were welcomed into the Assembly and given seats within the Bar.

Report of Rush church read and Assembly votes to reject this report and notify them of the cause.

Soldier church reports were read and accepted.

Duet by Brother and Sister Walton entitled, "I Feel the Joy."

Motion made and carried that the next morning session open at nine o'clock and that the first business be the election of officers.

Session adjourned. Benediction by Brother Slater.

WEDNESDAY MORNING, AUGUST 3, 1932.

Session opened with devotional service conducted by General Superintendent Rees.

Minutes of the last session were read and accepted with one correction.

Report of the District Superintendent read and accepted.

Several visiting brethren are presented to the Assembly and welcomed within the Conference Bar.

The Assembly proceeded with the election of officers. Tellers appointed were L. A. Williams, Alec. Rice, Leonard Bowling and Jos. Millson.

The election resulted as follows: District Superintendent—R. W. Wolfe; Assistant Superintendent—Denver Musser; District Secretary—Jenny V. Vincent; District Treasurer—E. E. Leadingham. Other members of the District Council—L. A. Williams, C. E. Posey and P. O. Carpenter. N. B.—After the Assembly Brother Williams took a pastorate in the Indiana District and M. M. Benner was chosen to fill his place on the District Council.

Motion made and carried that the District Council act as the Camp Meeting Board.

S. W. Simmons was re-elected on the Examining Board.

J. M. Walton elected to the Educational Board. J. T. Johnson elected to fill Bro. Stickeleather's place on that Board.

J. T. Johnson, John McNurlin and C. E. Posey elected as Board of Trustees.

The present Home and Foreign Missionary Boards are re-elected.

The District Council is given the right to appoint a District Home Missionary.

By request Brother Slater sings, "Give Me Jesus."

At this time Brother John McNurlin proceeds to take up an offering to pay the balance on Brother Wolfe's car.

Message by Brother Slater in regard to the Advocate.

Motion made and carried to extend the time of adjournment for ten minutes.

Benediction pronounced by Brother Rees.

AFTERNOON SESSION, AUGUST 3, 1932.

After a rousing song service and prayer, General Superintendent Rees gave a short account of his trip to the West Indies.

Minutes of the morning session were read and approved.

The Ways and Means Committee presented a recommendation in regard to Foreign Missions. It was heartily adopted, followed by a talk from Brother Slater agitating the Foreign Missionary work. The Assembly unanimously

agrees to stand by our missionary program as outlined by Brother Slater.

Mrs. Laney and Rev. Floyd Hitchcock were introduced to the Assembly at this time.

At this time General Superintendent Rees had to leave and District Superintendent Wolfe took the chair.

Trio by the Qualls family—"Sunshine."

Report of the Coal Creek Mission was read and accepted, followed by a stirring message on Home Missionary work, by Brother Lucas.

Motion made and carried that we call our district "The Kentucky-Tennessee District."

Resolutions Committee reports: The resolution in regard to the care of reports is adopted by the Assembly. The next resolution was referred to the committee for redrafting.

A piano solo was rendered by L. A. Williams.

Reports of Prestonsburg, Maysville and Covington churches were read and accepted.

Rev. H. H. Bolender and wife from the Kansas District are gladly accepted back into the Kentucky District.

M. M. Benner is appointed to act on the Examining Board, temporarily. P. O. Carpenter and C. E. Glass to act on the Educational Board, also temporarily.

Session adjourned.

Benediction by Brother Wolfe.

THURSDAY MORNING, AUGUST 4, 1932.

Assembly opened with singing. Prayer led by Brother Creamer. Scripture lesson from Philippians, second chapter, read by the District Superintendent.

A duet was sung by Mrs. Creamer and daughter.

Brothers Utter, Hancock and Myers were introduced to the Assembly.

Minutes of the last session were read and approved, followed by the roll call.

Motion made and supported to rescind the former action in regard to the Rush church and to receive their reports.

Motion made and supported to rescind the action regarding the reports from the church at Pinson Fork and to accept their church reports.

The Resolutions Committee again reports and a resolution is accepted with amendment.

Moved to defer the reading of the resolutions until the committee can go over them together.

Reports from Ashland Heights and Aspen Grove churches read and accepted.

Report of G. W. Rose read and accepted. Moved to re-consider this report. Carried. It was voted to reject this report.

Special song by R. D. Brown.

A number of visiting brethren were welcomed into the Assembly.
Reports of Cottageville, Eastern Ave., and Fourth Street Missions read and accepted.
Reports of the Stewart Chapel church read and accepted.
A song, "The Homecoming Week", was sung by Brother Joe Callender.
Session adjourned.

THURSDAY AFTERNOON SESSION, AUGUST 4, 1932.

Song service was led by Brother Paul Finch. Brother Merritt led in prayer.

Song, "Honey In the Rock", sung by Brother McCain.

Minutes of the last session were read and approved.

Reports of the Erlanger church were read and accepted.

Resolutions Committee again reports. On motion, Resolution No. 23 is revoked. Moved and carried to revise Resolution No. 24. Moved to accept the next resolution; carried.

Moved and supported that all resolutions not approved by the committee be rejected.

Moved and supported to adopt the next two resolutions (Nos. 25 and 26).

Reports of Elizabethtown and Cloverport churches read and accepted.

Report of Leonard Bowling was read by the Secretary and accepted.

Report of Latonia church read and accepted.

Song by the Qualls family, followed by Brother Callender singing "Zion's Hill."

Reports of Falmouth and Liberty churches read and accepted.

The report of District Treasurer was read and accepted by vote of the Assembly.

Reports from Hitchins church were read and passed upon.

A partial classification of ministers was given and the candidates for ordination were passed upon.

All reports not read as yet are to be turned into the Secretary without being read.

Session adjourned.

FRIDAY MORNING, AUGUST 5, 1932.

The song service was led by Brother Brown. Scripture lesson read from II. Corinthians, sixth chapter, by Brother Walton. Prayer by Brother Glass.

Minutes of previous session approved as read.

Report of the Statistical Committee was heard.

The following persons were appointed on the Editing Committee by the Chair: L. T. Wallingford, Mrs. C. E. Posey, Jenny V. Vincent.

Since all of the churches have not paid for their last year's Minutes, it is moved and supported that the Secretary write them in regard to this matter.

Moved and carried that the price of the Minutes (25c) be included in the copy.

The time of the next Assembly was referred to the District Council.

By motion it is agreed that the District Superintendent make out a list

of provisions needed for the Camp and Assembly, and that each church bring with them some of these provisions.

The Auditing Committee reported that they had examined the books and find them correct.

Motion made and carried that Rev. E. P. Qualls be received back into the Kentucky District.

A song—"A Beautiful Life", sung by the Qualls family.

The Resolutions Committee presents a resolution which was adopted.

Motion made that the District Council place the date of the District Ministerial Convention. Carried.

Motion made and carried to accept the Owenton Mission into the District.

A rising vote of thanks is given to our District Superintendent, and to the Kitchen Committee for their faithful services, after which the Assembly stood with bowed heads in thanks to Almighty God for His gracious Presence in our midst.

The session adjourned with handshakes, thus bringing to a close one of the most blessed Assemblies the Kentucky District has ever known. To God be all the glory!

Recommendations of the Ways and Means Committee

No. 1. Since the General Church Board requests that money for Foreign Missionary work be collected under its own head, it therefore becomes necessary to formulate a new system in regard to our District and General Budget. So we as a Ways and Means Committee wish to recommend to this Assembly that we raise twenty-five hundred dollars for the District and General Budget to be proportioned as follows:

General Budget	25 %
District Superintendent	50 %
Incidentals	10 %
Home Missions	10 %
Secretary	5 %
Treasurer	5 %

No. 2. In order to raise our District and General Budget, we recommend that each ordained and licensed minister be assessed twelve dollars per year, same to be paid monthly.

We further recommend that each member be assessed three dollars per year, same to be paid monthly.

No. 3. We recommend that we as an Assembly adopt the system of raising Foreign Missionary money requested by the General Church Board as follows: That each church have a weekly prayer service, and that a Missionary Rally be held monthly on the Lord's Day, and at the service an offering be taken for Foreign Missions, same to be forwarded to the District Treasurer.

RESOLUTIONS

Resolution No. 1: Resolved, that each Sunday School throughout the District adopt the birthday offering plan, said offering to go toward the support of Bethel Orphan Home, located at Kingswood.

Resolution No. 2: Resolved, that no pastor hold revivals off his charge without making satisfactory arrangements with his local church board, and then not more than two revivals during the conference year, provided said church is supporting him.

Resolution No. 3: Resolved, that no person be granted license to preach or renewal of credentials who does not believe in and practice the Bible doctrine of tithing.

Resolution No. 4: Resolved, that this Assembly provide a way to help evangelize the colored population of the Kentucky District.

Resolution No. 5: Resolved, that all resolutions be retained from year to year, unless revoked or revised by special act of the Assembly.

Resolution No. 6: Whereas, in times past, certain candidates have been passed upon by the Assembly for credentials, who could not afterwards be located, therefore, be it resolved that all persons applying for license or ordination, apply in person to the examining board, unless applicant is sick or otherwise unable to apply in person, and that in such case some member of the Assembly certify as to their character and location.

Resolution No. 7: Resolved, that each pastor read all resolutions of this Assembly at a time best suited for the occasion, in order that our people may be informed and made acquainted with our plans and rules governing the churches of the Kentucky District.

Resolution No. 8: In order to aid the District Superintendent to render the most profitable and desirable service to the District, be it therefore, resolved, that the District Council outline the duty of the District Superintendent.

Resolution No. 9: Be it resolved, that we as a District set for our goal, at least one church in every county in the state of Kentucky, and that we

never stop until this is done or Jesus comes. This will give us at least one hundred and twenty-one churches.

Resolution No. 10: Since it is a matter of importance for the pastors of the District to attend the Assembly and Camp, be it, therefore, resolved that the pastor's support at the church where he is serving as pastor, shall continue over the two Sundays he is attending said Assembly and Camp.

Resolution No. 11: Resolved, that each church in the District take a special offering for the support of the District Assembly and send to the Assembly by their delegate.

Resolution No. 12: Whereas, owing to the growth of the District, making it difficult for the District Superintendent to get over it; be it resolved, that he make not more than three trips over the District during the Assembly year.

Resolution No. 13: Resolved, that no church elect a delegate to our District Assembly who will not agree to stay through the entire Assembly.

Resolution No. 14: Be it resolved that the books of the local churches be closed at the end of the month prior to the month in which the Assembly convenes.

Resolution No. 15: Whereas the Manual provides that Local Preachers report only to their local churches, and whereas they have no voice in the District Assembly, be it resolved that they be exempt from special taxation.

Resolution No. 16: Whereas our young people are not being reached by the Gospel, be it resolved that this Assembly organize a District Young People's Convention, to be held annually, delegates to be sent from each local society, and workers be secured for said convention.

Resolution No. 17: Whereas the District Superintendent's salary has been decreased to \$1,250.00, be it resolved that each church take a free-will offering to help defray his traveling expenses.

Resolution No. 18: Whereas, some come to the Assemblies with their reports uncompleted, we therefore resolve, that when a church delegate or pastor, present when name is called and not having reports completed, shall not be called again to read their report unless a reasonable excuse be given.

Resolution No. 19: Whereas in some cases it becomes necessary to correct reports, be it resolved, that the delegates bring the church record books to the Assembly.

Resolution No. 20: Be it resolved that the District Superintendent and the Home Missionary Board appoint a man to be known as Evangelist of Church Extension Work, who shall go into new fields in the state of Kentucky, hold revivals and organize churches when favorable. The District is to furnish him with a tent and he is to be responsible to those who appoint him.

Resolution No. 21: Seeing the careless way the reports are handled, be it resolved that said reports receive such attention that they may be handed into the Secretary as though they belong to God's work.

Also: that each pastor see that all reports of his church be correct and balanced before they are sent to the Annual Assembly, and that two com-

plete sets of reports be filled out, one set to be turned over immediately to the Statistical Committee and the other set to be read to the Assembly.

Resolution No. 22: Whereas: the present financial system conflicts with Resolution No. 23, be it resolved that said Resolution No. 23 be dropped from our Minutes.

Resolution No. 23: Whereas, the District Superintendent's salary has been changed from \$1,300.00 to \$1,250.00, be it resolved that Resolution No. 24 be revised to suit the present system.

Resolution No. 24: Be it resolved: That each church send to the Assembly next year, two dish towels, one quilt or heavy blanket, one sheet and one pillow case.

Resolution No. 25: Be it resolved: That Resolution No. 2, adopted by the present Assembly, be revoked and the following resolution be adopted in its place: Be it resolved, That each minister of the Kentucky-Tennessee District pay his assessment, which is twelve dollars per year, by monthly payments of one dollar per month, and that failure to do so each month will call for the action of the District Council concerning said minister.

Resolution No. 26: Be it resolved: That all money received by the District Superintendent for revivals for the first six months of this year be given him and the same to be applied on his back salary.

Resolution No. 27: Be it resolved: That the District Secretary be authorized to notify immediately, the ministers not attending this Assembly, concerning Resolution No. 25.
