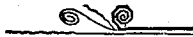

JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

First Session

Wednesday Morning, March 24, 8:30

The first business session of the twenty-sixth Annual Assembly of the Pilgrim Holiness Church of the Michigan District convened in the Pilgrim Holiness Church, Lansing, Mich., Wednesday, March 24th at 8:30 A. M.

Rev. C. E. Cliff, Dist. Supt., conducted the devotional services after which Rev. W. R. Cox, General Supt., took the chair. Brother Cox addressed the Assembly after which the business was taken up.

The roll was called as listed with the secretary.

It was moved and supported that Brother Allen Dotson be granted a place within the Conference bar with a privilege to vote. Carried.

By motion Brother Clemens and Brother Wm. Clark were granted a place within the Conference bar.

Moved and supported that the first six seats along the front of the Church constitute the Conference bar. Carried.

Moved and supported that the Assembly convene each morning at 8:30 and adjourn at 12. Carried.

Moved and supported that we adopt the rules laid down in our Manual to govern the business of this Assembly. Carried.

Moved and supported that the Dist. Supt. C. E. Cliff appoint the various committees. Carried.

Moved and supported that the last fifteen minutes of each morning session be given to Bro. Cox to address the Assembly. Carried.

Moved and supported that those who are to have charge of a meeting at the Reo Motor Plant today be excused at 11:20. Carried.

Reports were then taken up.

The following reports of preachers and delegates were read—Rev. E. F. Ewers, Sr., E. F. Ewers, Brother Huth, Rev. John Orkney, Brother Arlie Osborne, Rev. T. G. Alldaffer, Sr., T. G. Alldaffer, Sr., Sprunger, Rev. Leon Brown, Sr., Leon Brown, Rev. B. O. Shattuck, Brother Henry Post, Rev. A. T. Harris, Sr., Geo. Haywood, Sr., Bertha White.

These reports all accepted.

It was moved and supported that the order of the day Friday morning at 9 o'clock be the election of officers. Carried.

Motion to adjourn. Carried.

SECOND SESSION

Thursday Morning, March 25th, 8:30

Rev. C. E. Cliff opened the second session with songs. Prayer was offered by Brothers Emery and Osborne.

Rev. W. R. Cox took the chair and the Assembly proceeded with business. The roll was called after which the minutes of the previous session were read and approved.

Moved and supported that we have an afternoon session today from 2 to 3. Carried.

By motion the time of adjournment for the morning session was set at 12:15.

A. M. Frink, Rev. Geo. Lounds, Sr. Smith, Brother Louis Brown, Rev. F. H. Harmon, Brother Oscar Mills, Rev. P. F. Elliott, Rev. L. W. Sturk, Rev. Geo. B. Kulp, Sr. Cora McCormick, Sr. P. F. Elliott, Rev. R. Woodcock, Rev. M. F. Earley, Sr. A. M. Frink.

The Secretary read the reports of the following persons who were absent—Milford Cool, Paul and Myrtle Haines.

Above reports accepted.

Moved and supported that the Sturk Brothers favor the Assembly with a special song. Carried.

Moved and supported that the Secretary draft a letter to Mrs. Lew Standley expressing our sympathy for her in her recent bereavement. Carried.

Rev. C. E. Cliff, Dist. Supt., gave his report for the past year. Report accepted.

The Auditing committee gave their report—Rev. B. O. Shattuck, Dist. Missionary Treas. reported. Report accepted.

The report of the auditing committee was accepted.

Rev. Cox then addressed the assembly on the subject, "A Listening Ear."

Assembly adjourned by expiration of time.

THIRD SESSION

Thursday Afternoon, March 25, 2 o'clock

The Assembly met in session again at 1 o'clock P. M. to continue business. Reports were again taken up. Rev. Bernard Kraatz, unstationed preacher, reported. Report accepted.

Moved and supported that Brother Geo. B. Kulp be elected Honorary chairman of the Assembly. Carried.

Moved and supported that Bro. E. E. Wood be invited to take a seat within the Conference Bar. Carried.

Rev. August Doehring, pastor Pigeon Church, reported. Report accepted.

Sr. Claudia Forshee, delegate from the Pigeon church, reported. Report accepted.

It was moved and supported that Brother Elliott, Methodist minister, be brought forward and introduced to the Assembly. Carried.

Rev. El Boone, reported. Report accepted.

Moved and supported that Rev. Stuben Cox, Supt. Nazarene Church, Mich. Dist., be brought forward and introduced to the Assembly. Carried.

Sister Sophia Doehring, reported. Report accepted.
Brother Emmett Varnote, reported. Report accepted.
Brother Don Price reported. Report accepted.
Brother Kulp then raised an offering for the expenses of the Assembly.

The Assembly adjourned by expiration of time.

FOURTH SESSION

Friday Morning, March 26th, 8:30

The Fourth Session was opened by C. E. Cliff, Dist. Supt, with songs and prayer by Brother A. M. Frink. Brother Cox then took the roll was called after which the minutes of the previous session were read and approved. A few minutes were spent in silent prayer for Divine Guidance in the matter of electing the officers. The Assembly then proceeded to elect the various officers.

The tellers were named by the Dist. Supt. as follows—Emmet Varnote, Don Price, James Thompson, Bernard Kraatz.

It was moved and supported that Brother Alton Joppie be invited to take a place within the Conference Bar with the privilege to vote. Carried.

Rev. C. E. Cliff was elected District Superintendent. Rev. P. F. Elliott was elected Assistant Superintendent. Rev. L. W. Sturk was elected secretary, Rev. A. T. Harris was elected Treasurer, brothers B. O. Shattuck, A. M. Frink and W. E. Posey were elected to serve as councilmen on the District Board.

Rev. P. O. Shattuck was elected to serve as District Missionary Treasurer.

Rev. A. T. Harris was elected to serve as Statistical Secretary.

Rev. E. F. Ewers was elected District Trustee. Term of office 1926-1931.

Rev. S. I. Emery was elected to serve on the Board of Examiners. Term of office 1926-1931.

Rev. C. E. Chu was elected to serve on the Board of Directors of Rest Cottage. Term of office 1926-1931.

It was moved and supported that we continue this session until 12:30. Carried.

It was moved and supported that Brothers S. Cox and Star of the Nazarene Church have a seat within the Conference Bar. Carried.

Moved and supported that we have a business session this afternoon from 2 to 3. Carried.

A motion to adjourn carried.

FIFTH SESSION

Friday Afternoon, March 26th, 2 o'clock

The session was opened immediately for business with Brother Cox in the chair. The roll was called after which the minutes of the previous session were read and approved.

Moved and supported that Brother Wigman of the Nazarene church be brought forward and introduced to the Assembly. Carried.

The Assembly then proceeded to elect four trustees for Bible Holiness Seminary. The result of the balloting was that Brothers B. O. Shattuck, Geo. B. Kulp, S. I. Emery and E. F. Ewers were elected to said office. Term 1926-1929.

It was then moved and supported that the District Council serve as a Nominating Committee to nominate persons to serve as delegates to the General Assembly. Carried. The District Council was excused to make said nomination.

In the absence of the regular Secretary W. E. Posey was named secretary pro tem. It was moved and supported that Sr. Posey favor the Assembly with a special song.

The District Statistician, Rev. A. I. Harris, then gave his report. It was moved and supported that this report be accepted. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that a committee be appointed to draft a Report blank which would be generally accepted. Motion withdrawn.

Moved and supported that Sister Early favour the Assembly with a special song. Carried. Sister Early refused because of not having a song book.

Moved and supported that our B. H. S. quartette sing. They sang two selections to the delight of all.

The District Council then came in and presented the following recommendation—We recommend that the Assembly vote for Delegates to General Assembly promiscuously then the twenty-eight persons receiving the highest number of votes shall serve as nominees. The fourteen then receiving the highest number of votes on the second balloting shall be declared elected.

Moved and supported that the above recommendation be accepted. Carried. The Assembly then proceeded to the election.

While the tellers were counting ballots the Assembly proceeded to other business.

The Committee on Resolutions offered some resolutions.

The Committee on Home Missions offered the following recommendation.

We, the committee on Home Missions, do hereby recommend that an offering be taken on the basis of one dollar per member per year in all our Churches over the District for Home Missions; said sum to be raised in quarterly offerings and forwarded to our District Treasurer and specified "For Home Missions."

We further recommend that our General Supt. take fifteen minutes to stir our preachers relative to aggressive Home Missionary work over our District, said talk to be given at the time this matter is before the Assembly.

These recommendations were accepted by the Assembly.

SIXTH SESSION

Saturday Morning March 27th, 8:30

The sixth session was opened by the Dist. Supt. Brother C. E. Cliff, by songs, and prayer by Brother Woodcock. Brother W. R. Cox, General Supt. took the chair and the Assembly proceeded to business.

By motion the calling of the roll was dispensed with. The minutes of the previous session were read and approved.

The findings of the tellers showed that the following men were elected to serve as Ministerial Delegates to the General Assembly: W. E. Posey, Geo. Lounds, A. T. Harris, H. N. Dufoe, A. Kiddler, S. I. Emery, E. F. Ewers, J. E. Strong, A. M. Frink, James Thompson, J. D. Sturk, T. H. Hoos, A. Doehring, B. E. Manker.

It was moved and supported that the next four persons who have received the highest number of votes be named as alternate ministerial delegates to General Assembly. Carried. This would make the following persons serve: Chas. Rice, Mrs. E. F. Ewers, Don Price and E. E. Wood.

Moved and supported that the Assembly elect the lay delegates to the General Assembly in the following manner—the five persons receiving the highest number of votes shall be declared elected. Motion lost.

The Assembly proceeded to vote for lay delegates as provided for in the recommendation offered by the District Council.

The tellers were excused and the committee on resolutions offered further report.

The tellers then gave their findings relative to the election of lay delegates to the General Assembly. Because so many persons were voted for who were not eligible, it was moved and supported that we ballot again for lay delegates to General Assembly. Carried.

The tellers were again excused and other business was taken up. Sister Emma E. Brown, matron of Rest Cottage gave her report.

Moved and supported that the place for our next Annual Assembly be determined by secret ballot. Carried. An amendment was offered to the above that the matter be voted on at once.

The tellers gave the following findings on the balloting for lay delegates to the General Assembly. Sister Cliff, Ida Doehring, Bert Heins, Brother Huth, and D. C. Haines were elected. The alternates were: D. Loew, Allen Dotson and William Golden.

The Assembly then proceeded to vote for the place for the next Annual Assembly. The result was that Battle Creek received 32 votes and Owosso received 30, giving it to Battle Creek.

Brother Cox then presented the Advocate. There was a ready response to the call for greater effort to secure subscriptions and the ministers and others present promised to take over seven hundred subscriptions in the coming year. Amen.

Moved and supported that we have an afternoon session today from 2 to 5. Carried.

The District Council then offered the following recommendation. We, the District Council recommend to this Assembly that Bernard Kraatz, Sophia Doehring, Claudia Forshee, Arthur P. Fisher, and Chas. Rice be ordained to the ministry. We further recommend that Sister M. F. Early be ordained to do Deaconess Work.

We further recommend that Mrs. Frank Elliott, Sister William Davidson be licensed to do deaconess work. We further recommend that Alton Joppie, Alex Hoos, Ruth Bowman, Mary Loew, Allen Dotson and Wm. Clark be licensed to preach.

The above recommendations were accepted by motion.

Moved and supported that the minutes of this Assembly be published. Carried.

An amendment was offered to the above that the work of publishing the minutes be left in the hands of the secretary. The motion as amended carried.

It was moved and supported that the minutes be sent out to the pastors over the District, a bill accompanying same and that the pastors over the District, a bill accompanying same and that the pastors take an offering to be sent to the Dist. Sect. to pay for same. Carried.

The following recommendation was offered by the Dist. Council.

We recommend that our District Superintendent hold two quarterly meetings in each church over the District during the year. Each Church however is to hold its quarterly meetings regularly and in

each quarterly meeting an offering shall be taken for the District Supt. said offering to be forwarded to the District Treasurer.

The Dist. Supt. shall spend the time formerly spent in holding quarterly meetings extending our work into new fields over the District.

We further recommend that our District Supt. shall receive in remuneration an amount equivalent to what he received last year.

By motion this recommendation was accepted.

Session adjourned by expiration of time.

SEVENTH SESSION

Saturday Afternoon, March 27th at 2 o'clock

The Assembly proceeded immediately to business with Brother W. R. Cox in chair. By motion the roll call and reading of minutes of previous session were dispensed with.

The committee on resolutions offered some recommendations which were accepted.

Moved and supported that our Assembly be held two weeks later next year. Carried.

Moved and supported that a camp meeting committee be appointed to arrange for camp meeting prior to the opening of same. Carried.

Moved and supported that this Camp Meeting Committee consist of five persons and that it be appointed by the District Council. Carried.

The Dist. Supt. appointed L. W. Sturk and W. E. Posey to serve on a committee with himself to draft report blanks to present at our next General Assembly.

Rev. T. H. Hoos who had served in the office of Dist. Treas. for the past eight years expressed his appreciation for the co-operation of our people in aiding him to perform the duties incident to his office.

It was moved and supported that this body express its appreciation to Brother Hoos for the excellent service he has rendered with a rising vote of thanks. Carried.

A motion to adjourn carried.
