JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

The Thirtieth Session of the Annual Assembly of the Pilgrim Holiness Churches, Michigan District, convened in the Pilgrim Holiness Church, Lansing, Michigan, April 22 to 27, 1930.

FIRST SITTING

Wednesday Morning, April 23, at 8:30 o'clock.

The first sitting opened with song service led by Sister E. F. Ewers. Rev. C. E. Cliff, district superintendent, read the Scriptures and gave suitable comments. Prayer was offered by Rev. P. F. Elliott.

The roll was called by the secretary.

By motion the conference bar was fixed to include the first six seats in the front of the church.

It was moved and supported that Paul E. Haines and Myrtle Haines transfer to the Pennsylvania District be accepted. Motion carried.

Brother J. S. Hayton, a minister from the Ohio District was brought forward and introduced to the Assembly. He was given a place within the conference bar.

Brother and Sister Hiles, our missionaries from British Guiana, South America, were brought forward and introduced to the Assembly. Brother and Sister Hiles gave their testimonies. It was moved and supported that Brother and Sister Hiles have a place within the conference bar. Motion carried.

Moved and supported that our District Superintendent appoint the committees, and that no person shall be appointed on more than one committee. Some discussion followed after which Brother Kulp offered an amendment to the motion, providing for the striking out of the portion relating to, no person serving on more than one committee. The motion as amended carried.

Committee on Ministerial Convention—A. M. Frink, L. W. Sturk, J. C. Brillhart, James Thompson, Albert Kridler.

It was moved and supported that we have two sittings each day; the morning sitting to begin at 8:30 and close at 12:15, and the afternoon sitting to begin at 2:30 and close at 5:00. This motion carried.

By motion the time for the election of officers was set for 9:30 Thursday morning.

There was a motion made and supported that the ministers be given three minutes in which to report, that the delegates be given five minutes and the deaconesses be given two minutes. Motion carried.

It was moved by Brother Kulp and supported by Brother Manker that a committee be appointed to draft a paper indicating the duties of our District Superintendent for the coming year.

There was a motion made and supported that we give Brother Cripps a rising vote of thanks for the beautiful flowers presented by him to the Assembly. Motion carried.

The following persons were appointed by the District Superintendent

Rev. A. W. Cripps, licensed minister, reported. Report accepted.

Rev. Kennedy of the Free Methodist church was brought forward and introduced to the assembly. He was invited to have a place within the conference bar.

Rev. C. E. Cliff, pastor of the Detroit church, reported.

Mrs. Wm. Clark, delegate from the Detroit church, reported. These reports accepted.

There was a motion made by Brother Kulp and supported by Brother Sturk that hereafter the pastors shall include the amount of their house rent in their reports. Some discussions followed. The motion carried.

Reports were then taken up.

Rev. A. C. Doehring, pastor of Muskegon church, reported.

Mrs. Sprowl, delegate from Muskegon church, reported. These reports accepted.

Sophia Doehring, licensed minister, reported. Report accepted.

Mrs. A. C. Doehring, deaconess, reported. Report accepted.

Rev. E. F. Ewers, pastor of the Jackson church, reported.

Mrs. E. F. Ewers reported her ministerial work and also gave a report of the Jackson church. These reports accepted.

It was then moved and supported that Rev. B. O. Shattuck of Cincinnati, Ohio, be invited to take a place within the conference bar. Motion carried.

Rev. B. E. Manker, District Treasurer, gave a report for a period of five months. Report accepted.

Rev. T. M. Fast, pastor of the Pigeon church, reported.

Mrs. T. M. Fast, deaconess, reported. These reports accepted.

Rev. A. M. Frink, pastor of the Lansing church, reported.

Sister Murphy, a delegate from the Lansing church, reported. These reports accepted.

Rev. A. T. Harris, pastor of the Ellsworth and Phelps churches, reported.

John Docter, delegate from the Ellsworth and Phelps churches reported. These reports accepted.

The sitting adjourned by expiration of time.

SECOND SITTING

Wednesday Afternoon, April 23, 2:30 o'clock.

The roll was called after which there was a motion made and supported that the calling of the roll be dispensed with for the remainder of the Assembly. Motion carried.

The minutes of the previous session were read and approved.

Brother Don Price of the Pennsylvania District was brought forward and introduced to the Assembly and by motion, Brother Price was given a place within the conference bar.

Mrs. Ethel Smith, acting as delegate of the Flint Second Church, reported. Reports accepted.

Nathan Hawks, pastor of the Hastings City Mission, reported. Report accepted.

Brother Gregory, acting as delegate of the Hastings City Mission reported. Report accepted.

Rev. S. I. Emery, evangelist, reported. Report accepted.

Rev. Albert Kridler, reported. Report accepted.

Mrs. Albert Kridler reported. Report accepted.

Rev. Geo. Kulp, evangelist, gave his report. Brother Kulp also gave a short account of Sister Kulp's translation. This report was follow-

ed by a season of singing and shouting. This report was accepted.

Rev. H. B. Krieder, pastor of the Second Church of Detroit, reported.

Mrs. Walter Miller, acting as delegate from the Detroit Second church, reported. These reports accepted.

Sister Cora McCormick, deaconess, reported. Report accepted.

The committee on outlining the work of the District Superintendent for the coming year, presented the following recommendation: We recommend to this Assembly that our District Superintendent visit the smaller churches of the District at least three times a year, and the larger churches at least twice a year. We further recommend that the District Superintendent, in conjunction with the District Council, supervise the Home Missionary work in the District, arranging for tent meetings and other evangelistic services for the purpose of extending our work over the District. By motion this recommendation was accepted.

Brother Boone favored the Assembly with a special song entitled, "I Wonder How They Live at Home."

Sister Parker, deaconess of the Lansing Church, reported. Report accepted.

L. W. Sturk, pastor of the Flint First Church, reported.

Nellie Dafoe, acting as delegate from the Flint First church, reported.

Lillian Lash, licensed minister from the Flint First church, reported. These reports were accepted.

Sister A. M. Frink, licensed minister, reported. Report accepted.

Rev. J. E. Strong reported.

Sister J. E. Strong, reported verbally. These reports accepted.

Brother J. W. Smith reported. Report accepted.

Rev. Milton Sweitzer, pastor of the Applegate church, reported.

Brother J. H. Walker, delegate from Applegate church, reported. Reports accepted.

The sitting adjourned by expiration of time.

THIRD SITTING

Thursday Morning, April 24, 8:30 o'clock.

The third sitting opened with song service led by C. E. Cliff, followed by prayer by Brother B. O. Shattuck; after which Brother Rees addressed the Assembly briefly on "The Importance of Preaching a Gospel That Will Establish Our People in Grace."

The hour having arrived for the election of its District officers, the assembly proceeded to same. The following tellers were appointed by the District Superintendent: James Thompson, T. Fast, Goy Miller, H. M. Dafoe.

It was moved and supported that Brother Kulp, the senior member of our conference, have an honorary seat on the platform for the remainder of the session. Motion carried.

The Assembly proceeded to the election of the District Superintendent. Rev. C. E. Cliff was elected on the second ballot. Rev. A. M. Frink was elected Assistant Superintendent on the first ballot. L. W. Sturk was elected to serve as District Secretary.

The auditing committee reported that the books of the District Treasurer, B. E. Manker, from October 28, 1929 to March 31, 1930, had been audited and found correct. Signed, Nellie Dafoe, Carl Hightower, committee.

Rev. B. E. Manker was elected to serve as District Treasurer.

The Assembly then proceeded to the election of three advisory members to serve on the District Council.

It was moved and supported that Brother Hoos check up on the blackboard.

On the first balloting Rev. S. I. Emery was elected to above said office. Rev. J. C. Brillhart was elected to serve as second advisory

member of the Council. Rev. James Thompson was elected to serve as third advisory member of the council.

It was moved and supported that the number of persons serving on the Board of Examiners be reduced to five. Motion carried.

It was moved and supported that the District Council nominate persons for election to the Board of Examiners. The following persons were nominated by the Council: P. F. Elliott, L. W. Sturk, A. C. Doehring, J. C. Brillhart. Out of these nominees, J. C. Brillhart and L. W. Sturk were elected. J. C. Brillhart's term, 1930-1935, L. W. Sturk, 1928-1933.

The Assembly proceeded to elect one man for the Board of Trustees for the District, to fill the place left vacant by the expiration of term of office of J. E. Strong. J. E. Strong was elected to succeed himself in this office, term 1930-1935.

Rev. E Boone was elected to fill the place on the Board of Trustees of Bible Holiness Seminary left vacant by the resignation of B. O. Shattuck. Rev. C. E. Cliff, A. M. Frink and P. F. Elliott were elected to succeed themselves in the office of trustees of Bible Holiness Seminary. Term 1930-1933.

The sitting adjourned by expiration of time.

FOURTH SITTING

Thursday afternoon, April 24, 2:30 o'clock

Song service was led by Brother Hoos. Prayer was offered by Brother S. I. Entery. General Superintendent Rees addressed the Assembly briefly on "The Necessity of Saving Time in our Business Sessions."

The Assembly immediately proceeded to elect the remaining officers of the District.

Rev. S. I. Emery was elected to serve on the Board of Trustees, Rest Cottage Rescue Home, term of office 1930-1935. ,

It was moved and supported that the District Secretary be instructed to cast a ballot for Mrs. Geo. Dafoe, Howard Mills and Carl Hightower to serve as our standing auditing committee for the coming year. Motion carried.

A committee was appointed, consisting of Rev. C. E. Cliff, and E. F. Ewers, to look over the list of ministers from which our ministerial delegates are to be elected.

Reports were then taken up. Rev. P. F. Elliott, pastor of Owosso church, reported.

D. B. Curtis, delegate from Owosso church, reported.

Sister P. F. Elliott, deaconess, reported. These reports accepted.

It was moved and supported that our ministerial delegates be chosen from persons actively engaged in the Michigan District. Some discussion followed. The motion carried.

There was a motion made and supported that the ministers be permitted to nominate persons from which the lay delegates to our General Assembly shall be chosen. The following persons were nominated: Geo. Dafoe, Mrs. Ralph Heins, D. B. Curtis, Geo. Dagg, D. W. Loew, Mrs. Sprowl, Ida Doehring, John Docter, Howard Mills, Mrs. Nathan Hawks, Mrs. C. E. Cliff, Mrs. H. B. Krieder, Harley Johnson, H. J. Boone, and Geo. Quick. Out of this list of nominees the following persons were elected: Geo. Dafoe, Geo. Dagg, H. J. Boone, Mrs. C. E. Cliff, Howard Mills, Mrs. Ralph Heins, D. B. Curtis.

A motion was made and supported providing that the three receiving the next highest number of votes be declared the alternate lay delegates to the General Assmbly. D. W. Loew, John Docter and Ida Doehring were thus appointed to this place.

FIFTH SITTING

Friday morning, April 25, 8:30 o'clock.

The fifth sitting opened with a song service and prayer led by Rev. J. C. Brillhart, after which Brother Rees addressed the Assembly briefly on "The Necessity of Digging and Growing Deep in Our Christian Experiences so as to be Able to Stand the Storms."

The minutes of the previous session were read and approved.

The Assembly proceeded to the election of the ministerial delegates to the General Assembly. The following persons being elected: George Lounds, J. C. Brillhart, J. E. Strong, P. F. Elliott, B. E. Manker, E. Boone, E. F. Ewers, S. I. Emery, T. H. Hoos, Jas. Thompson, A. C. Doehring, J. D. Sturk, Mrs. J. E. Strong, Mrs. A. D. Luke, Mrs. Geo. Lounds.

The alternate ministerial delegates were determined to be T. M. Fast, Mrs. A. M. Frink, H. M. Dafoe, Mrs. P. F. Elliott, and A. Kridler.

The committee on resolutions presented several recommendations (see page -----)

The following committee was appointed by motion of the Assembly to work with Brother H. J. Boone in arranging the financial system provided by resolution No. 2.

The report of the Treasure of Bible Holiness Seminary was heard after which it was moved and supported that L. W. Sturk, president of Board of Trustees of Bible Holiness Seminary and George B. Kulp, present the interests of the school. Forty minutes were given to said interests after which Brother Kulp raised an offering amounting to about \$2,500.00 in pledges for the school.

The committee on resolutions presented several recommendations. (See page -----).

The committee on Home and Foreign Missions offered several recommendations. (See page -----).

Reports were again taken up.

Delegates from the Chief Church reported. Report accepted.

Rev. H. M. Dafoe, pastor of the Crowell and Jeddo circuit reported.

The delegate from the Crowell and Jeddo circuit reported. Reports accepted.

Rev. E. Boone, pastor of the Grand Rapids church, reported.

Martha Koutz, delegate from the Grand Rapids church, reported. Reports accepted.

The sitting adjourned by the expiration of time.

SIXTH SITTING

Friday afternoon, April 25, 2:30 o'clock.

The sitting opened with song service led by Brother H. M. Dafoe. Prayer was offered by Brother Ewers, followed by season of testimony.

Brother Rees gave a short talk on the "Qualifications of a General Officer." He also stressed the thought of our need of a new financial system.

It was moved and supported that we recommend the new financial system proposed through our committee on resolutions to the coming General Assembly.

It was moved and supported that our new financial system be put into operation at once. Motion carried.

SEVENTH SITTING

Saturday morning, April 26, 8:30 o'clock

Service of song was led by Brother Cliff. Prayer was offered by

Brother Strong. Brother Rees took the chair. Special song was rendered by Sturk Brothers.

Minutes of previous session were read and approved.

Our District Treasurer read a report revealing the fact that we have a District debt of \$737.35.

It was moved and supported that the Treasurer give an itemized report of the Home Missions and other funds for the past year.

The District Statistician, Rev. A. T. Harris gave his report. It was accepted by the Assembly.

A rising vote of thanks was given to our Statistician for the splendid work done in compiling the various reports.

It was moved and supported that A. T. Harris be appointed statistician for the coming year. Motion carried.

The matter of the District debt was taken up again and discussed at length.

The place for the next annual assembly was determined to be Battle Creek.

Sister Remy favored the Assembly with a special song entitled "Face to Face."

Brother Rees addressed the Assembly briefly on our Publishing Interests. He said in part "success is impossible without a church paper. Nothing will hold a church together like a church paper. We need subscriptions that will bring in sufficient income to meet expense of publishing our paper." The pastors of our District and others promised to get over four hundred new subscriptions to the Advocate in the coming year.

The place for our next ministerial convention was determined to be Flint Third Church. The committee on ministerial convention recommended that the date of said convention be June 10, 11, 12.

The committee on resolutions presented several recommendations. (See page -----).

It was moved and supported that the District Secretary be given five minutes to present the matter of the District Superintendent's salary.

It was moved and supported that a committee of three be appointed to classify our churches and send letters to our pastors explaining our new financial system. L. W. Sturk, B. E. Manker, and H. J. Boone were appointed to serve on said committee.

It was moved and supported that any pastor who does not understand the new system be privileged to call upon any member of the committee for an explanation. Carried.

It was moved and supported that a committee of four, consisting of L. W. Sturk, E. F. Ewers, H. M. Dafoe, and B. E. Manker, edit and publish the Minutes. Motion was carried.

It was moved and supported that we extend a hearty vote of thanks to the Lansing church for their generous hospitality during this assembly. Carried.

Sitting adjourned by expiration of time.

EIGHTH SITTING

Saturday Afternoon, April 26, 2:30 o'clock.

Rev. E. Boone was appointed secretary pro tem. By motion the reading of the minutes of last session was dispensed with.

Reports were taken up.

RESOLUTIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS ADOPTED BY DISTRICT ASSEMBLY

1. We recommend that our District Superintendent visit our smaller churches at least three times a year and that he visit the larger churches at least twice a year.

2. We do further recommend that the District Superintendent, in conjunction with the District Council supervise the Home Mission work in the District: arranging for tent meetings and other evangelistic effort for the purpose of extending our work.

3. We do further recommend that we strictly adhere to the Manual relative to the matter of our District Superintendent holding business meetings with the churches. See Section 99 and Section 90, Paragraph 3.

4. Resolved that the Ministerial Examining Board meet at 9:00 a. m. upon the opening day of the assembly; all candidates to be present for examination.

5. We do recommend that each Pastor devote at least ten days of his time in Home Missionary enterprise, gratis, under the supervision of the District Superintendent and District Council.

6. We further recommend that the District Superintendent make careful investigation when holding quarterly meetings and confer with the pastors with regards to openings that may present themselves for such work.

MEMORIALS TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY

1. We further recommend that our General Boards be correlated, or united into one General Board, consisting of: General Superintendents, Assistant Superintendents, General Secretary, General Treasure and five members representing each of our general church interests.

2. We further recommend that the following take the place of section 104, page 49 in the manual: Each local church shall consult with the District Superintendent in choosing a pastor, and if in the judgment of the District Council a local situation has become such as to demand intervention in order to protect the life and interests of the church, the District Superintendent in conjunction with the District Council shall be authorized to assist in the appointment of a pastor or changing pastors.

3. We do further recommend that the financial system adopted by our district classifying our churches according to their income as per statement sent out to our pastors, be adopted by our General church and made a part of our manual.

1. We recommend that the following be substituted for Section 28 page 22, in our Manual: There shall be a General Assembly composed of all General Officers and members of the General Council and General Boards; District Councils, a Ministerial Delegation and a Lay Delegation to be selected at the District Assemblies immediately preceding the General Assembly. The Ministerial Delegation shall be selected at the ratio of one to ten from all ordained and licensed ministers and deaconesses, the same to be chosen from those actively and regularly engaged in the work. The Lay Delegation shall be chosen from the Local Churches of each District at the ratio of one to every two hundred members or fractional part thereof, no District to have less than one.
