# JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

## FIRST SITTING

Tuesday Morning, April 3, 9:00 o'clock

The first sitting opened with song service led by Rev. S. I. Emery, Scripture reading by Rev. A. M. Frink. The General Superintendent called on Rev. Ewers, Rev. Shattuck and Rev. Brillhart to lead in prayer.

The roll was arranged by the secretary.

A motion provided that the first eight seats constitute the conference bar.

A substitute motion offered we have six seats instead of eight seats. Motion was carried.

It was moved and supported we have preaching service at night. Motion carried.

It was moved and supported that the time of the A. M. sittings be 8:30 - 11:45. Motion carried.

It was moved and supported we have P. M. sittings from 2:00 to 4:30. Motion carried.

It was moved and supported that we ask our District Superintendent to appoint the various committees. Motion carried.

It was moved and supported that the several visiting brethren and sisters be brought forward and introduced to the Assembly. Motion carried. Those introduced were: Brother and Sister McAninch, Brother and Sister Pease, Brother and Sister Mudge.

It was moved and supported we grant these visitors a seat within the conference bar with the privilege of the floor. Motion carried.

It was moved and supported we recess until two o'clock. Motion carried.

After recess the song service was followed by a season of prayer after which the chairman called for the reading of the various committees appointed in the A. M. sitting.

By motion Brother and Sister Sickler were granted an honorary place within the conference bar with the privilege of the floor. Motion carried.

It was moved and supported that we set the time for the election of officers Thursday A. M. at 9:00 o'clock.

A substitute motion offered that we set time Thursday P. M. at 2:00. Substitute motion carried.

It was moved and supported we recess 'till 3:30. Motion carried.

After recess the Assembly proceeded to business.

Several Ohio brethren were brought forward and introduced to the Assembly.

It was moved and supported to give the brethren from Ohio a place within the conference bar with privileges of the floor.

The committee on Foreign Missions presented several resolutions. (See pages 12 and 13 for resolutions adopted.)

The Committee on Ministerial Convention presented recommendations. (See pages 12 and 13 for resolutions adopted.)

A motion prevailed that we consider the matter of changing the Assembly date at this time. Carried.

It was moved and supported we change the date of our assembly to follow our Camp date immediately.

Motion to extend time. Carried.

Further discussion followed.

The motion to change the date of Assembly until Camp time carried.

It was moved and supported that the Superintendent appoint committees at the beginning of the Camp so that they have material on hand when Assembly convenes. Motion carried.

It was moved and supported that our fiscal year close July 31. Motion carried.

Motion to adjourn carried.

## SECOND SITTING

Wednesday Morning, nine o'clock

The song service was led by Brother Lounds, prayer by Brothers Cliff, Ewers and Lounds. Minutes of the previous sitting were read and approved, after which Brother Surbrook addressed the Assembly for thirty minutes on matters very pertinent to the interests of our church.

The District Superintendent gave his annual report. (See page 16 for report in full.)

It was moved and supported that we grant Brother Frink the extra money collected by him during the year amounting to \$100.13. Carried.

Sister Lash reported for Rest Cottage. (See report on page 17.)

By motion Sister Lash was given a rising vote of thanks for her untiring labors for the church during the past year.

The Committee on Resolutions submitted their report offering several resolutions. (See pages 12 and 13.)

The resolutions dealing with Rest Cottage were re-read and presented for consideration.

The matter of closing Rest Cottage was discussed at length.

Time was extended ten minutes by motion.

It was moved and supported we defer the matter of the closing of Rest Cottage until a future time to be set by the General Superintendent.

## THIRD SITTING

Wednesday Afternoon, two o'clock

The devotional services were directed by General Superintendent W. L. Surbrook, prayer by H. T. Mills.

It was moved and supported we hear a report from Sister Strong about Brother Kulp and that the District Superintendent name three persons to draft a letter of love to him. Motion carried.

The hour of election of officers having arrived the Assembly proceeded to same.

It was moved and supported we allow Brothers Persinger, Robinson, Meulman and Ferris, who are serving as pastors, to vote in this election. Motion carried.

By motion the District Superintendent appointed the tellers as follows: Brothers Hayton, Thompson, Swanson, Stace, Skinner, and Phipps.

Voting for District Superintendent resulted in the election of A. M. Frink.

The first balloting for Assistant Superintendent resulted in no election.

The second balloting resulted in the election of L. W. Sturk.

The Assembly gave Brother Sturk a rising vote of thanks for services rendered for the past twelve years as District Secretary.

Balloting for District Secretary resulted in the election of Brother J. R. Thompson.

Balloting for District Treasurer resulted in the election of Brother B. E. Manker.

Three members of the Council were elected as follows: Brothers Cliff, Brillhart and Shattuck.

Brother Emery's resignation from the Board of Examiners was accepted.

It was moved and supported that Brother Dafoe be elected by acclamation to succeed himself in the office of District Trustee for the term of 1934-1939.

Motion to extend the time until five o'clock. Carried.

The following members were elected to serve on the Examining Board: A. M. Frink elected for five-year term; B. O. Shattuck elected to fill the Emery vacancy.

It was moved and supported that each pastor name one person to provide a nomination for lay delegate to the General Assembly out of which nine persons are to be elected. Motion carried.

It was moved and supported that each pastor write the name of a suitable person and turn it in to the secretary. Motion carried.

Adjourned by expiration of time.

## FOURTH SITTING

Thursday Morning, nine o'clock

The devotional services were led by Brother Goodman, prayer by Brothers Shattuck and Sickler.

Brother Surbrook gave a report of the work of the general church.

The minutes and roll were given by the Secretary.

Brother J. F. Woods was brought forward and introduced. By motion Brother Woods was given a place within the conference bar and a seat on the platform.

A letter of invitation was read from the Alma Booster Club inviting our next Assembly to their city.

Motion to instruct secretary to answer these men.

It was moved and supported we elect out of the twenty-nine names submitted by the pastors nine persons who are to serve as delegates to the General Assembly.

Original motion amended providing that we put nine names on ballot instead of one and the nine receiving a majority of the whole be declared elected. Motion carried.

The District Council presented twenty-six names of ministers out of which thirteen are to be elected as delegates to the General Assembly.

It was moved and supported that we declare thirteen receiving highest number elected. Carried.

It was moved and supported we have five alternate ministerial delegates and five receiving highest number following the thirteen be alternates. Motion carried.

It was moved and supported we add Brother Chatfield to this list. Carried.

Brother and Sister Shearer and daughter from Ohio were brought forward and introduced to the Assembly and by motion were given a place within the bar and Brother Shearer was given a seat on the platform. Carried.

It was moved and supported that the order of the day be postponed and that we hear the Bible Holiness Seminary report at this time. Motion carried.

Brother Frink added to the Committee on Statistics Kenneth Phipps and Gaylord Skinner.

It was moved and supported that all our Michigan missionaries on the field be sent a letter, also a copy of the Assembly Minutes. Motion carried.

A motion prevailed providing we defer the Bible Holiness Seminary report until after the B. H. S. board meeting.

The Committee on Resolutions presented several resolutions. (See pages 12 and 13.)

The Committee to correspond with Brother Kulp, Sister Brown and Missionaries was appointed by the District Superintendent as follows: Brothers Mills, Dafoe, Dagg, Loew, Grumbly, Tuttle, Watson, Greenman, W. R. Cox. Alternates, Brothers Steinman, L. Hoffman, McCurdy, Miller, A. Wood.

Moved to adjourn.

## FIFTH SITTING

Thursday Afternoon, three-thirty o'clock

The report on balloting for Ministerial Delegates to the General Assembly was read revealing election of the following persons: S. I. Emery, George Lounds, J. C. Brillhart, E. Boone, B. E. Manker, M. L. Goodman, R. W. Chatfield, C. E. Greenman, Lillian Lash, J. S. Hayton, T. H. Hoos, Sister Surbrook, E. F. Ewers. Alternate Ministerial Delegates: E. Ritenbergh, P. F. Elliott, Bertha Keinbaum, Ruth Bowman and M. F. Schweitzer.

Several visiting brethren were brought forward and introduced to the Assembly and by vote given a place within the conference bar. Carried.

Invitations were extended by several churches for Ministerial Convention.

It was moved and supported to vote on each church separately. Carried.

The voting resulted in fixing Alma as the place of the Ministerial meeting, April 2-4, 1935.

Time extended fifteen minutes by motion.

The Committee on Resolutions offered some recommendations. (see page 13.)

## SIXTH SITTING

Friday Morning, eighth-thirty o'clock

The devotional service was led by Brother Ritenburg, prayer by Brother Lounds. The minutes of the previous sitting were read and approved.

Brother Surbrook addressed the Assembly briefly on General Church interests.

The time having arrived for consideration of Bible Holiness Seminary interests the Chairman asked Brother Mills to speak. Brother Mills addressed the Assembly on matters of vital interest to the school.

Brother Surbrook asked Brother Manker to read his report again, inasmuch as we were tired when report was given yesterday. Motion to adopt this report carried.

Brother Surbrook asked Brother Sturk to lay before the Assembly the whole financial situation facing us. Brother Sturk spent 35 minutes presenting this matter.

Brother Surbrook then addressed the Assembly 20 minutes outlining the Board's proposition. It was moved and supported we assess our preachers \$1.00 per month for next year and do our best to get this within 90 days. Much discussion followed, several persons offering certain amounts on this debt fund. Motion carried.

Seventy-nine persons stood agreeing to give \$12.00 each for the coming year.

Moved and supported laymen pay equivalent to 25 cents per month each and pay in 90 days if possible. Vote taken. Carried by standing vote.

Time extended by motion fifteen minutes.

Brother Mogle, U. B. pastor, was brought forward and introduced.

Sitting adjourned.



## SEVENTH SITTING

Friday Afternoon, two-fifteen o'clock

The devotional service was led by Brother Hoos.

Brother Boone favored the Assembly with a song.

It was moved and supported that Brother Rathwell, pastor of the Second Pilgrim Holiness Church of Port Huron be given a place within the Assembly bar.

Brother Surbrook addressed the Assembly briefly relative to the Trust Fund Money for Bible Holiness Seminary indebtedness.

It was moved and supported that we take from the table the matter of the Rescue Home.

Resolutions dealing with the closing of Rest Cottage were re-read and presented for consideration.

Request for vote by ballot on this issue, the balloting resulting in 78 for closing and 21 for continuing.

It was moved and supported that the Rescue Board and Council dispose of the Rescue Home property and disperse the proceeds of the same. Carried.

Several resolutions were presented by the Committee. (See pages 12 and 13.)

Sitting adjourned.

---

## EIGHTH SITTING

Saturday Morning, nine-thirty o'clock

After devotional service the Minutes of the previous sitting were read and approved. Several resolutions were presented. (See page 11)

Inasmuch as our present membership will allow one more lay delegate to General Assembly, moved we let the first alternate be declared a regular delegate. Carried. First alternate, Brother Steinman.

Statistical Committee gave their report. Received subject to correction.

The Committee on Home Missions presented a resolution. (See page 13.) Adopted.

Sisters Ewey and Hazlewinkle were brought forward and introduced to the Assembly.

Moved and supported as a District we appeal to our churches and ask each Sunday School to give ten cents per week for a tent for Home Mission Funds. Carried.

Moved and supported we set aside one prayer meeting night a month for each church to take a donation of provisions for our pastors. Carried.

Moved and supported District Secretary notify each church of above action. Carried.

Moved and supported District Council employ some individual or individuals to do Home Missionary work in District during coming year. Carried.

Time extended to 12 by motion.

The District Secretary presented the names of those recommended for license, ordination, and reward of credentials. Motion to adopt the report in its entirety carried.

The letter drafted for Brother Kulp and Sister Brown read and approved.

Sitting adjourned.

## NINTH SITTING

Saturday Afternoon, one-thirty o'clock

Prayer by Brother J. F. Woods.

Minutes of the previous sitting were read and approved.

It was moved and supported we print three hundred copies of the Minutes as the Ohio and Indiana brethren print theirs. Carried.

It was moved and supported that we print memorials for the General Assembly in the Minutes. Carried.

It was moved and supported that pastors raise an offering equivalent to ten cents per member one-half within thirty days and one-half within sixty days to pay the deficit on the minutes account. Carried.

It was moved and supported we have a committee to edit the minutes and that Brother Thompson appoint said committee. Carried.

The report of the Auditing Committee was read and approved.

The District Treasurer's report was read and received by motion.

Brothers Thompson, Sturk and Mills were appointed to edit the Minutes.



## MEMORIALS FROM MICHIGAN DISTRICT ASSEMBLY TO GENERAL ASSEMBLY

---

### Michigan Memorial No. 1.

Whereas there has been no provision made in our church for the care and support of our aged ministers, and whereas there are those now within our ranks who are very deserving of help; Therefore Be It Resolved that the General Assembly shall assess every Ordained and Licensed Minister in the homeland between the ages of 20 and 60, \$3.00 per year to create a fund for this purpose.

This assessment shall be paid annually to the District Treasurer who in turn shall send the same to the General Treasurer, who shall through the counsel and advice of the Executive Council invest these funds in Government Bonds, or some other creditable securities as may be selected and determined by the Executive Council.

The General Treasurer shall have custody of all such funds, but payments to worthy individuals or gifts from the same shall only be made as directed by a majority vote of the Executive Council.

### Michigan Memorial No. 2.

Whereas our church has provided a Probationary period for our membership, and whereas some districts have been embarrassed and humiliated by receiving new ministers from other organizations, therefore, Be It Resolved that all ministers coming into the Pilgrim Holiness Church from other societies or denominations shall be held on probation for a period of two years.

Be It Further Resolved that all ministers being thus received shall be eligible to serve the Church as pastors, or evangelists and shall have a vote in his district Assembly, but shall not be eligible to hold a district office until after he has been a member of the Church for three years; and he shall not be eligible to hold an office in the General Church until after he has been a member for five years.

### Michigan Memorial No. 3.

Whereas our Manual, Section 174, provides that unless one who received a Church letter places it in another church within 60 days it becomes void, but makes no provision as to how long a minister may keep his credentials after ceasing to be a member of our Church or any other; therefore Be It Resolved that when any minister in our Church fails to deposit his letter with another of our Churches or with some other organization within 60 days his credentials become void and are to be taken up by the District Council with which he was last registered.

### Michigan Memorial No. 4.

Be It Resolved that the question on our report blank be changed from "How many subscribe to the Advocate", to "How many families subscribe to the Advocate".

### Michigan Memorial No. 5.

Whereas, some of the Presidents of our Bible Schools are not ministers and have no vote in our Assemblies, and whereas so much of the voting and the work of the Assembly has such a vital importance to the schools; Therefore Be It Resolved that each of the Presidents of our schools shall be a delegate to his District Assembly and the General Assembly by virtue of his office.

#### **Michigan Memorial No. 6.**

Resolved That no minister coming to us from another denomination shall have membership in any of our District Assemblies, be placed on any of our Pastorates, or be granted credentials of any kind from the Pilgrim Holiness Church, until after they have become members of the Pilgrim Holiness Church.

#### **Michigan Memorial No. 7.**

Resolved, That we recommend to the General Assembly, that a Committee be appointed to draft an article of faith on the Atonement and also on the Resurrection he same to be inserted in our Manual under the heading: General Statement of Belief.

#### **Michigan Memorial No. 8.**

Resolved, that no minister coming to us from another denomination, be stationed on any of our pastorates betwee, or at our District Assemblies without the consent of the District Council.

#### **Michigan Memorial No. 9.**

Since our delegation to the General Assembly is so large Be It Resolved that we recommend to the General Assembly that we cut our delegation fifty per cent.

#### **Michigan Memorial No. 10.**

Whereas the Pilgrim Holiness Church neither believes in, nor practises infant baptism, and Whereas the Scriptures nowhere teach such doctrine, therefore Be It Resolved that we drop the words, "Baptism of Children", in Section 22, Article 13, page 19, in the Manual, and insert the words, "Dedication of Children", instead.

### **RESOLUTIONS**

---

No. 1. Be it resolved that since the Zone Rallies of the Pilgrim Holiness Young People's Societies of the Michigan District, have been a blessing to all who have been privileged to attend, that these Zone Rallies be continued through the coming Assembly year.

No. 2. Resolved that this Assembly provide a committee of three to draft a constitution and by-laws for a Young People's Organization, the same to be submitted to the District Council for approval and if approved, presented to the General Assembly.

No. 3. Owing to the fact that the Pilgrim Holiness Church has an institution for erring women at Terre Haute, Indiana, which is doing splendid work in that field, and is being cared for by the General Church, the District Council of the Michigan District and also the Board of Trustees of Rest Cottage have recommended the closing of Rest Cottage at Grand Rapids.

Be it therefore resolved that by vote of this Assembly that we carry out the recommendation of the Boards mentioned in closing this institution and making disposition of the property.

No. 4. Resolved that all the surplus funds received from the sale of the Rest Cottage property, above the indebtedness on said property, be turned into the debt fund for Bible Holiness Seminary.

No. 5. Whereas, the Assembly has already provided for a monthly Missionary Rally, and whereas, the needs for our world-wide Foreign Missionary work is so great, therefore be it resolved, That the church shall take a monthly Foreign offering at the above Missionary Rally.

No. 6. Be it resolved, That each licensed and ordained minister of our District devote one-half of his (or her) ministerial tithe to the support of our District Superintendent, the same to be forwarded to the District Treasurer once a month.

No. 7. We recommend that the churches continue to give the District Superintendent an offering at each visit, when added to the one-half tithe of all ministers not to exceed \$100.00 per month which is to be the District Superintendent's salary plus \$300.00 for traveling expenses. That all in excess of this amount go to the District Expense Fund. By this resolution the Superintendent's salary and expenses are fixed at \$1,500.00 per year.

No. 8. We recommend that our District raise equivalent to 40 cents per member to be used for expenses of the Delegates to General Assembly, for fare equalization. Same to be raised and forwarded to District Treasurer not later than August 15.

No. 9. In accordance with the budget laid down by our General Boards, we recommend that each church raise equivalent to \$2.00 per member a year to care for our General Foreign Missionary work, and \$1.00 per member to care for our General Budget, same to be sent in monthly.

No. 10. Whereas, we as a Missionary Church desire more information and greater zeal for the spread of the gospel in other fields, Resolved, That we as a District arrange for a deputation worker from the Foreign field to be sent to the churches in June or there about.

No. 11. Resolved, That the Michigan District go on record for having a weekly Foreign and Home Missionary Prayer Meeting in each local church for the next year.

No. 12. That each local church have one service out of each month for a Foreign Missionary Rally, the date and service to be determined by the pastor.

No. 13. Whereas, our Michigan District has opportunity of accomplishing great things for God in the many cities and communities without a holiness work, we recommend that the churches of the District raise the equivalent of \$1.00 per member this year, this money to be used for establishing new churches in pioneer fields.
