Standing Rules

1. Assembly Year

The Assembly year shall close with June 30, and complete reports must be in the hands of the District Secretary by July 20th following. All reports must be reviewed by the local board and the church before being forwarded to the District Secretary. All reports received after July 20th shall be omitted from the yearly report.

2. Funds

Each church shall raise for the General Budget the equivalent of \$1.00 per member, and for Foreign Missions \$2.00 per member. They shall also raise for District Budget the equivalent of \$1.65 per member.

3. Bible School Debt Fund

Each church shall raise for the General Budget the equivalent of \$3.00 per member per year plus \$12.00 per year for all licensed and ordained ministers. All monies raised for Bible School Debt Fund plus other Bible School offerings shall be sent direct to the Bible School Treasurer, Rev. H. T. Mills, ,1020 South Washington Street, Owosso, Michigan.

4. Ministerial Tithes

One half of all ministerial tithes shall be turned to the support of the District Superintendent.

5. District and General Funds

All monies raised in the local church for district or general funds shall be sent to the District Treasurer who shall forward general funds to the General Treasurer.

6. District Officials Salaries

District Superintendent's salary is fixexd at a minimum of \$2,000.00 and maximum of \$2,200.00. District Secretary \$50.00 per year and District Treasurer at \$50.00 per year.

7. Pastors Camp Meeting Offering

Inasmuch as our pastors are expected to support and attend the annual camp meeting, each church shall provide a regular pastor's offering for the two Sundays of the camp and that the pastors be privileged to attend the entire camp meeting.

JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

Owosso, Michigan, August 15, 1938.

The first session of the Michigan District Assembly of the Pilgrim Holiness Churches was opened at 10:00 a. m. Monday, August 15, 1938 by congregational singing led by T. H. Hoos with Gaylord Skinner at the piano.

Prayer was offered by Albert Kridler.

Scripture reading of Fifth Chapter of Ephesians by J. C. Brillhart. District Superintendent W. H. Joppie addressed the assembly expressing his regret that General Superintendent W. L. Surbrook could not be present and appealing to the brethern to carry on the work of the assembly in a spirit of peace and asked to be corrected as to

He also called attention to the fact that some of the pastors working in the small churches would not be making reports appearing as favorable as some of the older and larger charges but he asked that these reports be received kindly by the assembly.

The roll was called and corrected.

Motion was made seconded and carried that regularly appointed delegates from Ecorse be replaced by Mrs. Leroy Bruce.

Motion was made, seconded and carried that in the absence of the regular delegate from Applegate, that Mrs. H. T. Mills be the delegate.

Motion was made, seconded and carried that Mrs. Iva Paine be named the delegate from Grand Rapids.

Motion was made, seconded and carried that Mrs. Skinner be named delegate in place of Mr. Stinson.

Motion was made, seconded and carried that in the absence of one of the regular delegates from Detroit, Mrs. D. F. Price be named a delegate.

Motions were made, seconded and carried that the following be received into the assembly and given the privileges of the assembly:

LEROY BRUCE, GLEN VAN CLEVE C. B. HOLSTEIN, LILLIAN LASH.

Motion was made, seconded and carried to fix the assembly bar as the first eight seats in the three middle sections of the tabernacle.

The Auditing Committee reported having audited the books of H. T. Mills, treasurer of Bible Holiness Seminary and found them to be correct. Also that they had audited the books of B. E. Manker, district treasurer and found them to be correct.

Motion made, supported and carried to accept the report of the Auditing Committee.

District treasurer's report for the year ending August 1, 1938, was read by B. E. Manker.

Moved, seconded and carried that the report be accepted as read. Bible Holiness Seminary treasurer's report was read by H. T. Mills. Moved, seconded and carried that the report be accepted as read.

Moved, seconded and carried that District Superintendent W. H. Joppie's report be heard at this time:

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S ANNUAL REPORT:

To the 38th Annual Assembly of the Michigan District, Greetings:

It is through the goodness of our God and Saviour Jesus Christ that we are permitted to gather on the "hill top" once more as an assembly. Many have been the blessings and battles of the past year and as we review the past with some regrets because of our inefficiencies and human frailties, we still have cause to rejoice in Him who causes us to triumph through his grace, and though we live in a restless world, God gives his people peace.—Amen!

Our district has been wonderfully blessed with revivals the past year. The revival spirit is on. Our brethern have been holding forth in halls, churches, tents and on the streets; good results have been witnessed. This is as it should be. We depend on revivals to enlarge our constituancy.

Several new preaching points have developed during the year, which we hope will become churches. Two new openings near Flint; one near the "Soo"; in Allegan we are trying to get our feet down and Kalamazoo we have a district tent going with prospects for a new church. In Lansing we have organized a new church with 18 or 20 members; beside this we hold regular quarterly meetings in four independent missions who are very friendly toward us.

We have had a wonderful year for Sunday School work. Many schools have doubled and some even trebled their records. There is unusual enthusiasm in this work among us.

A new church was dedicated, a beautiful structure, a credit to our people and district and Brother Kreider surely did a splendid work supervising the structure.

A new parsonage was purchased by our Eaton Rapids church; several churches were redecorated; there is a general appearance of prosperity on this line that is gratifying indeed.

Our whole district sympathizes with the brethern of Grand Rapids church having lost their beautiful structure by fire. We hope and pray that God will grant them a new and larger open door.

The Lord has wonderfully helped us during the financial pressure the past year; in spite of the times we have forged ahead and though the building program is large, we feel we can handle the situation very well. Our people have a mind to work and give. Besides this a new parsonage for the District Superintendent was purchased with reasonable terms so it can easily be handled. This is a great convenience to the superintendent as is much appreciated. We feel our district is now equipped second to none and is the pride of our people.

There is a crying need for expansion on home missionary lines and we need a home missionary at once, and adequate finance provided to take care of this department. We hope this assembly will take an advanced step on this line. It has been a great pleasure to labor with our brethern. Though the work is strenuous, our spirit has often been refreshed by the kindness and love of the brethern.

We herewith present our statistical report: Miles traveled 22,868. 18 annual meetings. 31 special business meetings. 60 church board meetings. 8 district council meetings. 2 general board meetings in Indianapolis. . 3 executive school board meetings. 2 school board meetings 6 special committee meetings. 1 revival. 32 seekers, 127 sermons. 146 family visits. 14 anointed for healing. 1 funeral.

Motion was made, seconded and carried that the report of the District Superintendent be accepted.

The Statistical Committee report was read by T. H. Hoos. Attention was invited to certain apparent error.

Motion was made, seconded and carried to accept the report subject to the correction of these errors.

The committee on resolutions submitted the following recommendations:

1. We recommend that at least one of the Young People's Zone Rallies each year, within each zone, be devoted to Sunday School interests, and that all superintendents and teachers of the zone be present and given an active part, we further recommend that we hold a State Sunday School convention in conjunction with our annual Ministerial Convention, and that two sessions be devoted to the interests of Sunday School work. We further recommend that all superintendents and teachers be present, and that entertainment for convention day be granted them the same as ministers.

On motion made and carried, the resolution was adopted.

2. Inasmuch as all our pastors are expected to support and attend the annual camp meeting. It is resolved, that each church shall provide the regular pastor's offering for the two Sundays of the camp and that the pastor be privileged to attend the entire camp meeting.

Be it further resolved, that this resolution be placed with the standing rules on the front page of the minutes.

On motion made, seconded and carried this resolution was adopted.

Motion was made, seconded and carried to fix the time for sessions of the assembly as follows: 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 m.; 1:00 to 5:00 p. m. 7:30 to 9:00 p. m., with the exception of today when the afternoon session shall convene at 2:30.

Motion was made, seconded and carried to have election of officers at 2:30 p. m. today.

Rev. Joseph Bush of Detroit, and Rev. R. F. Wilson of Jackson were introduced to the assembly.

On motion, second and carried the session adjourned until 2:30 p. m.

Second Session

The second session of the Michigan District Assembly of the Pilgrim Holiness Churches was opened at 2:30 p. m. by song service led by A. F. Osborn, followed by scripture reading of Ephesians 6, by W. H. Joppie. Prayer was also offered by W. H. Joppie. Roll was called. The minutes were read and approved. Moved, seconded and carried that the chair appoint tellers. The following were named: G. V. Skinner, Kenneth Phipps, Lester Nelsen, Russell Mohl and J. F. Meulman.

Rev. Half of Lapeer County, was introduced to the assembly.

Moved, seconded and carried that those who did not for a good reason get their reports in to the district secretary, as required by last assembly action, be permitted to vote at this assembly.

The assembly proceeded to election of officers with the following results:

- W. H. Joppie was elected District Superintendent on the first ballot.
- C. E. Cliff was elected Assistant District Superintendent.
- J. R. Thompson was elected Secretary.

District Superintendent announced that the council requested authority to appoint Treasurer. On motion made, seconded and carried the authority was given to appoint the Treasurer.

The chair announced the appointment of A. S. Joppie as District Treasurer.

- It was decided by common consent to vote for three council members on one ballot.
- J. C. Brillhart, S. I. Emery and M. L. Goodman were elected as advisory members of the District Council on the first ballot.

Moved, seconded and carried that C. E. Cliff be given the privilege of making nominations for the Educational and Examining Board member.

L. C. Philo was elected a member of the Educational and Examining Board on the first ballot.

A song by Sr. W. L. Surbrook, "I'm On a Shining Pathway" proved a real blessing to the assembly.

On motion made, seconded and carried the rules were suspended and George DeFoe, H. T. Mills and George Lounds were elected by acclamation to the office of District Trustees.

On motion ,supported and carried the time of this session was extended for the election of Bible Holiness Seminary Trustees.

S. I. Emery, J. R. Thompson and D. F. Price were elected to the office of Trustees of Bible Holiness Seminary.

The chair appointed D. F. Price and L. R. Neff to write an article for the Advocate reporting this camp meeting and assembly.

Third Session

The third session of the 38th Michigan District Assembly of the Pilgrim Holiness Churches was opened at 7:30 p.m. with song service lend by Kenneth Phipps follower by prayer by L. R. Neff.

The minutes of the second session were read and approved as corrected.

A. S. Joppie because of other duties, offered his resignation as treasurer of the district. Upon motion made, seconded and carried his resignation was accepted.

It was moved, seconded and carried that the regular rules of order be suspended and the District Council submit to this assembly three nominees for the office of District Treasurer. The council submitted the following nominees for treasurer: A. F. Osborn, L. R. Neff, and D. F. Price. A. F. Osborn was elected to the office of District Treasurer.

It was agreed that each pastor should nominate one person from his church as a lay delegate to the general assembly and that the chair appoint a committee of three men to select twelve persons from that number for submission to the assembly; the five receiving the highest number of votes to be the delegates and the three the next highest to be the alternates.

The balloting resulted in the election of the following: Lay delegates, George Dagg, Arthur Elliott, Oliver Phipps, Ida L. Christiansen and Esther Nelsen. Alternates: Fred Schmidt, Alton Hornstra, Charles Ewing and G. Quick. (Tie vote on third alternate; therefore four.)

The committee of three appointed to select ten names as nominees for lay delegates used the plan of choosing two persons from each zone; therefore submitted twelve names. Motion was made, seconded and carried to revise the minutes to read 12 instead of ten.

Motion was made, seconded and carried to extend the time of this session.

The election of ministerial delegates brought the following results: Delegates, J. C. Brillhart, S. I. Emery, M. L. Goodman, A. S. Joppie, George Lounds and L. C. Philo. Alternates, L. R. Neff, D. F. Price and H. T. Hoos.

Invitations were extended to the ministerial convention by Jackson, Sault Ste. Marie, Battle Creek and Alma. The assembly determined by balloting to accept the invitation from Battle Creek.

On motion which was seconded the session adjourned.

Fourth Session

The fourth session of the 38th Michigan District Assembly of the Pilgrim Holiness Churches was opened at 9:00 a.m. with song service led by Kenneth Phipps and T. H. Hoos at the piano. Scripture reading of the second chapter of Ephesians by W. H. Joppie. Prayer was offered by J. C. Brillhart.

The minutes were read and approved.

The following recommendations were submitted by the Resolutions Committee:

1. Be it resolved that we organize a Camp Meeting Association of which the District Council is the board of directors and the membership thereof shall be continuous. Said members shall con-

Be it further resolved that the District Superintendent present the matter of Camp Membership in each church in the district.

Upon motion made and seconded these resolutions were adopted.

The following resolutions was read:

Be it resolved that whereas the Michigan District of the Pilgrim Holiness Churches has no place on its report blanks for our local churches to report the work done by their Missionary Societies, that provision be made for the same.

On motion made and seconded this resolution was adopted.

The following resolution was read:

Be it resolved that the District Council publish complete rates for rooms and meals on future camp meeting bills.

On motion made, seconded and carried the resolution was adopted.

It was moved, seconded and carried that greetings be sent to the following, and the District Superintendent appoint a committee to do this: B. B. Ferris, George B. Kulp, G. E. Ritenburgh.

Also that a memorial be written of Mrs. Emma Brown who recently passed from this earth to her reward.

The chair appointed Sisters Heins, Ewers and Morningstar as such committee.

The following resolutions were submitted by the Ways and Means Committee:

- 1. Whereas our District Treasurer does not have adequate funds to meet the expense of the General Assembly, be it therefore resolved that each pastor raise the equivalent of 20c per member, this amount to be forwarded to the District Treasurer by September 6, 1938.
- 2. Inasmuch as there is a growing interest among us for district home missionary work, we recommend that standing rule No. 2 be changed so that the last clause read as follows: The equivalent of \$1.65 per member.

On motions made, seconded and carried the resolutions were adopted.

On motion made, supported and carried the meeting was adjourned.

Fifth Session

The fifth session of the 38th Michigan District Assembly was opened at 1:30 p.m. with song service lead by Russell Mohl with Gaylord Skinner at the piano. Prayer was made by August C. Doehring.

Moved, seconded and carried that the council be authorized to review and approve the minutes of the fourth and fifth session of this assembly.

Moved, seconded and carried that the secretary be authorized to have these minutes printed, and to determine the number of copies to be printed.

Moved, seconded and carried that the district council be authorized to approve the general budget as it comes from the General Assembly.

Moved, seconded and carried that our Michigan brethern be employed to work on the grounds during the General Assembly.

Moved, seconded and carried that the chair appoint a home missionary committee.

The chair announced the appointment of the following to serve as Camp Card Committee: J. R. Thompson, D. F. Price, A. C. Doehring, George Lounds and Bernard Kraatz.

The Committee on Greetings and Memorials reported and the report was accepted.

The following resolution was read:

- 1. Whereas, there is an apparent demand for a stationing committee, be it resolved that Section 52 be annulled and the following adopted to be known as Section 52. The council shall constitute the stationing committee for the purpose of stationing pastors. The general officer in charge of the assembly shall act as chairman of this committee when present. No pastor shall be called or retained who does not give evidence of the sanctified life and who does not preach and teach our cardinal doctrines as set forth in the articles of faith. When a council member's name is being considered, he shall absent himself from this body.
- 2. Each local church assembly delegate or delegates shall sit with said council to present their requests from the local church.
- 3. The aforesaid delegate shall bear to the station committee a request from the local church signed by the presiding officer and the church clerk indicating first and second choices. Such request shall state the result of balloting by the local church.
- 4. The final decision of the stationing of all pastors shall be left to the station committee.
- 5. The ministers term of office as pastor of a church shall continue until the following district assembly. The local church shall be granted the privilege of a recall of pastor for a period of one, two or three years providing said recall is ratified by the stationing committee.
- 6. No pastor shall be dismissed between assemblies except his life and character are not in harmony with the word of God and the church manual. In case of accusation the procedure in the same shall be in accordance with Section 168, paragraphs 1 and 2 of the manual.
- 7. We recommend that each charge support its pastor and that he devote his entire time to the same; that the local church board meet with the District Superintendent and pastor who in conference shall agree upon a minimum amount for his support, this amount to include food, clothing, books, rents and unexpected incidentals. (Section 65.)
- 8. We recommended that each church calling a pastor pay transportation charges on household goods and the car fare of the pastor and his family; if there be no parsonage that the local church board provide a suitable house for him.

On motion, seconded and carried the resolution was adopted.

The following resolution was read:

Be it resolved, that our missionary funds, both for home and foreign be raised under a unified budget, namely missions.

Be it further resolved, that the General Officers be paid from the above mentioned budget, except the General Treasurer, who shall draw 50% of his salary from the publication department as business manager.

Be it further resolved ,that this unified budget shall be apportioned by the General Board to our district according to their financial strength. The districts in turn will apportion to their local churches on the same basis.

Be it further resolved, that the said budget be divided between the home and foreign missionary work at the ratio of two-thirds for foreign missions and one-third for home missions.

Be it further resolved, that when people outside of our church wish to stipulate funds for certain interests that the same shall be received and applied as stipulated.

Be it further resolved, that our foreign and home missionary representatives represent their respective departments and all funds raised shall be pro-rated as above mentioned.

On motion, seconded the resolution was adopted.

Moved, seconded and carried to adopt the following resolution:

Be it resolved that Section 100 shall be changed to read: A District Council may be of varying sizes. A district with less than fifty churches shall have seven members on its council, consisting of the district superintendent, and five elective members from which said council shall select a district secretary and a district treasurer. Five members shall make a quorum.

The Examining Board submitted a list of names and recommended that licenses to be granted:

On motion, seconded, the recommendation was adopted.

The Examining Board also recommended the following for ordination: Gaylor V. Skinner, Russell Mohl, Emmer Stace, Kenneth Phipps and Mel T. Rothwell.

On motion, seconded, the recommendation was adopted.

On motion, seconded and carried a fifteen minutes recess was declared.

The assembly convened after recess and the chair announced the committee appointments for 1939.

The council's recommendation to license Rev. Joseph Bush and Eileen Gorton and to ordain Mel T. Rothwell, Gaylord Skinner, Kenneth Phipps, Emmer Stace and Russell Mohl was read.

On motion seconded and carried the recommendation was adopted. The following resolution was read:

Resolved that our publication department be instructed to publish and circulate a brief manual of the Pilgrim Holiness Church containing the Historical, Doctrinal and Governmental (as it relates to the local church) contents of the complete manual.

On motion, seconded and carried, the resolution was adopted.

The next order of business was the ordination service which opened by congregation singing "A Charge to Keep I Have," followed by prayer by Rev. W. H. Joppie.

Scriptures were read and brief addresses given to the candidates for ordination by:

M. L. Goodman reading from 1 Tim. 3.

- J. C. Brillhart reading from Titus 3.
- C. E. Cliff on "Spiritual Aspect of Ministers."
- J. R. Thompson, "The Work of the Ministry."

The candidates for ordination were Mel T. Rothwell, Gaylord V. Skinner, Kenneth Phipps, Elmer Stace and Russell Mohl.

Rev. W. H. Joppie, district superintendent gave the charge and they were ordained by the laying on of hands.

On motion seconded and carried a rising vote of thanks was given to our district superintenden for the splendid way in which he has carried on the work of the assembly.

On motion seconded and carried an offering was taken for Clifford Morgan who has had the misfortune of having his gospel tent destroyed in a storm.

On motion, seconded and carried, a rising vote of thanks was given Rev. and Mrs. H. T. Mills for the good work done by them in the interest of the camp, especially in the way of entertaining the preachers who came to Owosso to help in the building of the new dormitory.

On motion seconded and carried a rising vote of thanks was given to Rev. and Mrs. E. C. Swanson for the good meals they prepared during the camp and assembly.

The closing prayer was offered by Rev. C. E. Cliff and on motion seconded and carried the assembly adjourned.
