STANDING RULES

1 Assembly Year

The Assembly year shall close June 30 and complete reports must be in the hands of the District Secretary by July 20th following. All reports must be reviewed by the local board and the church before being forwarded to the District Secretary. All reports received after July 20th shall be omitted from the yearly report.

2 Funds

Each church shall raise for General Budget the equivalent of \$.50 per member per year for General Administrative Expense, \$.60 for General Home Missions, plus \$1.90 per member for Foreign Missions. They shall also raise for District Budget the equivalent of \$1.65 per member.

3 Bible School Debt Fund

Each church shall raise for the Bible School Debt Fund the equivalent of \$3.00 per member per year, plus \$12.00 per year for all licensed and ordained ministers. All monies raised for the Bible School Debt Fund plus other Bible School offerings shall be sent to the Bible School Treasurer, Rev. H. T. Mills, 1020 South Washington Street, Owosso, Michigan.

4 Ministerial Tithes

One half of all ministerial tithes shall be turned to the support of the District Superintendent.

5 District and General Funds

All monies raised in the local church for district and general funds shall be sent to the District Treasurer, who shall forward general funds to the General Treasurer.

6 District Officials Salaries

The District Superintendent's salary is fixed at a minimum of \$1,800.00 plus 2 cents per mile for traveling expenses. District Treasurer \$50.00 per year and District Secretary \$50.00 per year.

7 Pastor's Camp Meeting Offering

Inasmuch as our pastors are expected to support and attend the annual camp meeting, each church shall provide the regular pastor's offering for the two Sundays of the camp, and that the pastors be privileged to attend the entire camp meeting.

8 Examining Board

The District Superintendent shall be chairman of the Examining Board by virtue of his office.

9 Camp Meeting Expense

Churches are to be rated according to their financial strength and part of the Camp Meeting expense is to be raised among the churches of the district. All money raised for this purpose shall be in the hands of the District Treasurer not later than thirty days prior to camp meeting.

JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

FIRST SITTING

The first sitting of the Fortieth Annual Assembly of the Michigan District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church was opened at 9:00 A. M., August 12th, 1940. Congregational singing was led by Rev. Russell Mohl with Rev. Gaylord Skinner at the piano.

Prayer was offered by Rev. B. O. Shattuck.

Rev. M. L. Goodman, district secretary, read a letter of greeting from the General Superintendent, Rev. W. L. Surbrook.

It was moved and seconded that the letter be included in the minutes. The motion was carried.

The Scripture lesson, Ephesians 2, was read by Rev. Calvin Hendricks.

In accordance with the request made by the General Superintendent, Rev. J. R. Thompson, district superintendent, took the chair to preside over this Assembly. He gave a short message asking the help of the Lord and the co-operation of this Assembly to make this meeting one in which the Spirit of Holiness might prevail, referring to Hebrews 12:14 and Hebrews 2:11.

Moved and seconded that the time for sittings be fixed at 9:00 to 12:00, 2:00 to 5:00 and 7:00 to 9:00. The motion was carried.

Moved and seconded that Rev. Ed. Boone be invited within the Assembly bar with full privileges of the floor.

Brother Paul DeGrand Champ was introduced to the Assembly.

The Auditing Committee reported that they had audited the books of the Treasurers of the Bible Holiness Seminary, the Michigan District, and the Michigan District Young People's Organization and found them to be correct.
