

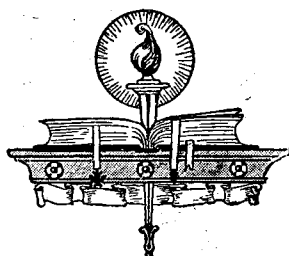

STANDING RULES

1. Conference Year.

The Conference year shall close June 30th, and complete reports must be reviewed by the local boards and forwarded directly to the District Statistician, Rev. A. C. Doehring, 725 Grand Avenue, Owosso, Michigan, by July 15th. All reports received after July 15 shall be omitted from the yearly report.

2. Funds.

Each church shall raise for the general budget the equivalent of \$.50 per member per year for general administration expenses; \$.60 for general home missions, plus \$1.90 per member for foreign missions. They shall also raise for district budget the equivalent of \$2.65 per member.

3. Bible School Fund.

Each church shall raise for the Bible School Fund the equivalent of \$1.50 per member per year, pastor included at same rate. All monies raised for the Bible School Fund plus other Bible School offerings shall be sent to the Bible School Treasurer, Rev. H. T. Mills, 1020 S. Washington Street, Owosso, Michigan.

4. Ministerial Tithes.

One half of all ministerial tithes shall be turned to the support of the District Superintendent.

5. District and General Funds.

All monies raised in the local church for district and general funds shall be sent to the District Treasurer, who shall forward general funds to the General Treasurer.

6. District Officials Salaries

The District Superintendent's salary is fixed at a minimum of \$2250.00 per year, plus 3 cents per mile for traveling expenses. District Treasurer shall receive \$60 per year and the District Secretary shall receive \$60 per year.

7. Pastors Camp Meeting Expense

Inasmuch as our pastors are expected to support and attend the Annual Camp Meeting, each church shall provide the equivalent of the pastor's regular offering or salary for the two Sundays of the Camp, and that the pastors be privileged to attend the entire Camp Meeting.

8. Examining Board.

The District Superintendent shall be chairman of the Examining Board by virtue of his office.

9. Camp Meeting Expense.

Churches are to be rated according to their financial strength and part of the Camp Meeting expense is to be raised among the churches of the district. The District Council shall pro-rate the expense among the churches. The ministers' wives and their children sixteen years old and under shall be entertained free of charge.

All money raised for Camp Meeting expense should be in the hands of the District Superintendent not later than thirty days prior to the Camp Meeting.

10. Resolutions.

Inasmuch as many resolutions are presented to this committee without signature:

Be it, therefore, resolved, that no resolution be presented to this assembly except it be signed.

Be it further resolved, that this resolution be made a standing rule of this assembly.

JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

FIRST SITTING

The first sitting of the 42nd Annual Conference of the Michigan District of the Pilgrim Holiness Churches convened at 8:30 a. m., July 29th, 1942 at Seminary Park, Owosso. Congregational Singing was led by Rev. C. V. Holstein, with Rev. Ronald Evans at the piano. Scripture reading was from Phil. 2:1-16 with comments by Rev. T. M. Fast.

Prayer was offered by Rev. E. F. Ewers.

Rev. C. E. Cliff, assistant superintendent, who had presided, introduced and surrendered the chair to General Superintendent, Rev. W. L. Surbrook, who read scripture from first Peter 5 and used as his subject, "Ministerial Responsibilities discussing subject under the following three divisions; Devotion, Doctrine and Duty. The need for all ministers of the Word to maintain private prayer life as well as to have family worship was stressed, also that the ministers conduct should be such as to create confidence in his sincerity and christianity.

Rev. Surbrook urged that the doctrines of the church be taught and that our pulpits should be guarded against preachers of false doctrines. He made a plea for the practice of the rules of our church as outlined in our Motto, namely: In Essentials, Unity; in Non-Essentials, Liberty; In All Things, Sharity.

Under the heading of "Duties" of Christian workers the need for sociability, hospitality and courtesy was stressed. He also warned of the danger of being harsh in times of misunderstanding when love and friendliness are much needed.

The roll was called by the secretary.

Motion prevailed to seat Mrs. Sophie Bryant as a delegate from the First Church in Flint.

The Conference bar was fixed as the first ten seats in the three center sections of the tabernacle, the platform included.

Rev. D. F. Price was chosen to assist the Secretary.

The hours of sittings were fixed as 9:00 A.M. to 12:00 noon, 2:00 P.M. to 5:00 P.M. and 7:00P.M. to 9:00 P.M.

The District Superintendent read his annual message and report. Motion prevailed that same be accepted.

TO THE FORTY-SECOND ANNUAL CONFERENCE OF THE PILGRIM HOLINESS CHURCH OF THE MICHIGAN DISTRICT:

Greetings in the Name of our Lord!

Through God's love and mercy we are assembled this morning from every section of Michigan for this conference. There are many reasons for which we should praise God. While the past year, as far as the world is concerned, was dark and without much promise, we, as a church have been favored by the wonderful, abiding presence of God. The effects of the war have been felt more keenly during the past year because a number of sons of Pilgrim ministers and laymen homes have been called to the service of our country. Although this sacrifice has added sorrow to their portion, these fathers and mothers have retained an exceptional measure of faith and courage, and have kept marching steadily on.

The year has been a period of blessings from God. While the Lord has been pleased to take Mrs. A. T. Harris, wife of the Rev. A. T. Harris, and Mrs. Anna Heines, a long time friend of the church

and licensed Deaconess, home to heaven, He has mercifully spared the lives of our other ministers and their wives to carry on His blessed work in Michigan. After closely observing the work of the ministry of the Michigan District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, I can gratefully say that God has given us ministers of the Gospel who are a credit to the church. The preaching of our Michigan ministers is thoroughly Scriptural, definitely orthodox, and attractively sane.

Our pastors have lived honorably and just in their fields of labor, and have thereby gained the friendly confidence of business men and the respect of our sister churches. The laymen of the Pilgrim Holiness Church are clean, Godly and intelligent; among the very best to be found anywhere, in any church. The work of our efficient ministers and the exemplary lives of our faithful laymen have been greatly used of God to make the past year one of rich blessing and steady advancement. A number of very fruitful revivals have been enjoyed among our churches and have added strength and courage to the work as a whole. Many of our churches have taken advantage of the prosperous times and have either reduced or liquidated the debts on church properties. By redecorating and remodeling, a number of the churches have greatly improved their properties. The Merrill, Lansing First, Ellsworth and Battle Creek churches have completed remarkable improvements and the Greely Ave. Pilgrim Holiness Church of Detroit has finished a new basement church which is a credit to them and to us, also the faithful folk at Whigville have constructed a beautiful basement church we can be proud of.

Our Home Missionary Work

God is blessing every home missionary project in the district. He has enabled us to accomplish some worthwhile gains in this particular field, but we have not yet reached the top. As a district we should double our effort to carry the Gospel to all sections of the state where Holiness is not preached, that we might establish well-organized churches wherever possible. The Upper Peninsula is ripe for the Gospel. The work we have in this neglected area is growing and God is putting His sanction upon it, but we should not stop with that which we have; we should open new fields in this needy part of the state.

That spoken in respect of the Upper Peninsula is equally true of the lower Peninsula. There is ample room in which to preach Holiness below the Straits. There are several open doors for young men who have the call of God upon them, and who have a real passion for souls. To enter this field will require sacrifice and tireless effort, but I believe the God-called minister is equal to the task. The future may be somewhat unpredictable, but as a church we must not shrink because the thunder rolls, the lightning flashes and the storm threatens, but we must carry the fight to the front. I further believe that God has given sufficient courage to the Pilgrim Holiness Church to penetrate every needy section with the Gospel message. There are those among the ministers and laymen who have the spiritual stamina and dauntless courage of a Joshua or a Daniel, and with such sterling Christian character within our ranks, we can march bravely on with the message of glad tidings to a lost world.

We should not only be home-missionary-minded but foreign as well. If we are to maintain a strong foreign missionary front, we must constantly be on the job opening up new churches in the home land. This will increase the flow of revenue into the church treasury with which to foster our heavy foreign program. The Pilgrims of the Michigan district are missionary-minded and have a vision. This is evidenced by the way they have responded to the call of missions. Some

churches have gone far beyond the specified budget, giving liberally to church extension and thereby proving their vision and interest in God's work. My prayer is that God will help us to continue the good work, and engender in us a greater urge to press on while the opportunity is before us. The need is imperative. We should have three additional tabernacles at once. The portable tabernacle is far superior to tents. These, by a little added expense, may be used the year around. Tents can be used only in favorable weather. If we had three more tabernacles and three house-cars we could place three teams of workers in the field and in a short time we would have several well-established churches. The investment made by the church in home missionary fields in the past is proof of this. Two years ago, Rev. John Dean and his wife took over the work at Scottville and today we own a lot with a neat church building in that busy, little city, and the prospects are good for the future. Rev. Clifford Morgan felt the call of God on his heart to go to Coleman, and after two years of conscientious labor he has established there an organized church with a beautiful little church building. The indebtedness on the building is less than three hundred dollars.

Rev. Paul Hollman has been at Munising for about a year, and now is preaching to a Sunday night crowd that fills the hall. Our work at Dryden is another example of that which God wants to do for us if we will enter the doors He opens. Rev. Nelson Miller and wife are stationed in Dryden, and while the work there is only three years old, the church owns two large lots and has a fund of one hundred dollars toward a building. This work is self-supporting. These young men with their wives are doing a praise-worthy work and what God has helped them to do, He will likewise help others. I urge this conference to place all the resources possible back of the church extension work.
