JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

FIRST SITTING

Owosso, Michigan — August 2, 1945

The first sitting of the 45th Annual Conference of the Michigan District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at 8:30 A. M., August 2, 1945, at Seminary Park Tabernacle, Owosso, Michigan.

The Conference was opened with singing led by Rev. Clare Elkins. Rev. Ila Bruce was at the piano.

Prayer was offered by Rev. B. O. Shattuck.

Scripture lesson from Ephesians 3 was read by Rev. M. L. Goodman.

Rev. J. R. Thompson, District Superintendent, introduced Rev. W. L. Surbrook, General Superintendent, as chairman of the conference.

At the call of the roll by the district secretary, a few minutes were taken to complete the same.

Moved and seconded that Mrs. Vernon Draggoo be seated as a delegate from Coleman. Carried.

A motion carried that Standing Rule No. 12 be amended to provide that the conference bar be fixed as "The first ten seats in the three middle sections of the tabernacle and the platform."

Moved and seconded that the hours for the sittings be fixed the same as last year.

The report of the District Superintendent was called for, and read by Rev. J. R. Thompson, District Superintendent. See page 12.

Motion prevailed to accept the report

Rev. A. C. Doehring read the statistician's report, which was accepted by motion.

Rev. G. E. Stace read the auditor's report showing that the books of the district treasurer, treasurer of Bible Holiness Seminary, and young people's society were correct. Accepted by motion.

Rev. A. F. Osborn read the treasurer's report. Moved and seconded that the report be accepted. Carried.

Rev. H. T. Mills read the treasurer's report for Bible Holiness Seminary. Motion prevailed to accept this report.

Rev. Nelson Miller read the treasurer's report for the district young people's society. This report was accepted.

Resolutions were submitted by the committee on resolutions. (The resolutions which were adopted are to be found in this journal on page 15.)

Moved and seconded that the ministerial delegates for the general conference be elected from the floor and that the lay delegates be elected from a list prepared by the council. Carried.

Moved and seconded that at 11:45 A. M. Rev. Wm. Bartlette, Executive Secretary of the Prohibition Party of Michigan be invited to address the conference. Carried.

A resolution was submitted by the Ways and Means Committee. (The resolutions which were adopted are to be found on pages 15 and 16.)

Rev. Wm. Bartlette, Executive Secretary of the Prohibition Party of Michigan addressed the conference on the subject of the promotion of the cause of temperance education through the Prohibition Party of Michigan.

He recommended that the ministers open their churches for Rev. J. W. Farr, of Oakland, California, who is touring Michigan during September. Rev. Bartlette told of the activities of youth in some Michigan localities in the interest of temperance, and urged that more be done by the churches to warn youth, by way of education, of the dangers of alcohol.

Motion prevailed to recess until 2:00 P. M.

FIRST SITTING (Continued)

The conference re-convened at 2 P. M. and was called to order by Rev. W. L. Surbrook, general superintendent.

A season of prayer lead by Rev. E. F. Ewers and Rev. A. S. Joppis, was a time of blessing to the conference.

A resolution was submitted by the Committee on Ways and Means. (The

adopted resolution will be found on page 15.)

The committee on memorials to the General Conference submitted resolutions, which are recorded separately by General Polity Committee.

Motion prevailed to recess until 4 P. M.

The conference re-convened at 4 P. M. and was called to order by Rev. W. L. Surbrook.

Motion was made and seconded that Rev. Harold Kotesky and Rev. Albert Lacey be accepted into the conference. Carried.

Moved and seconded that the report of the board be accepted and approved. Carried.

Moved and seconded that the first order of business at the session at 7 P.M. be the election of officers. Carried.

Motion to adjourn prevailed.

SECOND SITTING

The second sitting of the 45th Annual conference of the Michigan district of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at 7:00 P. M., August 3, 1945, in the tabernacle at Seminary Park, Owosso, Michigan.

After congregational singing, prayer was offered by Rev. J. C. Brillhart.

A motion prevailed to dispense with the roll call.

Rev. W. L. Surbrook, general superintendent, read the scripture from Ephesians 3:1-6.

The minutes of the first sitting were read and approved.

Moved and seconded that the order of the day be postponed long enough to receive an ordained minister and a licensed deaconess into the conference. Carried.

Rev. Grace A. Schneider, an ordained minister, and Miss Virginia N. Johnson, a licensed deaconess, both from the Kansas district, were introduced to the conference.

Moved and seconded that these two ladies be received into the conference. Carried.

On motion, seconded and carried, the district superintendent appointed the following as tellers: K. W. Phipps, Paul Trissel, L. N. Nelsen, Russel Barkman, Carl Messer, Edgar Haskins, Vernon Draggoo and Henry Alexander.

The conference engaged in a season of prayer imploring the Lord to lead in the selection of its officers.

Rev. J. R. Thompson was elected to the office of district superintendent.

Rev. M. L. Goodman was elected to the office of assistant district superintendent.

Rev. D. F. Price was elected to the office of district secretary.

Rev. A. F. Osborn was elected to the office of district treasurer.

The time for adjournment having arrived, a motion prevailed to extend the time of this sitting for one hour. Carried.

The conference was favored with a special song, "He Lifted Me Out," by Rev. Clare Elkins.

The district superintendent appointed Gaylord Skinner, John Hiatt and Ellsworth Swanson as additional tellers.

Rev. B. O. Shattuck, Rev. A. C. Doehring, Rev. A. S. Joppie, Rev. L. R. Neff and Rev. C. E. Cliff were elected as advisory members of the council.

Rev. H. T. Mills was elected as district trustee by vote of acclamation.

Rev. R. C. Hawkins was elected advisory member of this committee. On motion, the conference recessed to meet at 8:30 August 5.

ORDINATION SERVICE

The order of the day at 7:00 P. M., August 3, 1945, being ordination service, the following candidates took their place on the front seat before the altar: Ministers: Ida L. Christiansen, John Cliff, Paul Holman, C. A. Hoos and Clara Sherman; Deaconess, Aleta Sinky.

The chair requested Rev. G. V. Skinner to lead the singing. "I Need Thee Every Hour," was chosen as the congregational hymn.

Rev. A. F. Osborn lead in prayer.

Scripture lessons were read by the following brethren: Rev. B. O. Shattuck, Titus 3, 1-11; Rev. C. E. Cliff, II Tim. 4, 1-8; Rev. J. R. Thompson, I Tim. 3, 1-13.

Rev. J. R. Thompson announced his committee appointments.

The proposed plan for the Pilgrim Minister's retirement fund was explained by Rev. J. R. Thompson, district superintendent.

Moved and seconded that the secretary write a letter of appreciation to the Argus Press for the publicity given our conference and camp meeting Carried.

Rev. Mrs. T. M. Fast, home missionary secretary, gave her report of home missionary activities.

Moved and seconded that the report be accepted. Carried.

Moved and seconded that Sister Fast be granted the privilege of having home missionary meetings provided that there is no conflict with any other meetings of the conference. Carried.

Moved and seconded that standing rule No. 6 of 1944 shall read "plus five cents a mile for traveling expenses" instead of three cents a mile. Carried.

Moved and seconded that all unfinished business of this conference be taken care of by the district council. Carried.

Moved and seconded that there be 500 copies of the minutes printed. Carried.

Moved and seconded that the secretary be instructed to have the minutes printed and the council to set the price on same and pay the cost. Carried.

Moved and seconded that the district council read and approve the minutes of the last sitting of this conference. Carried.

The district superintendent, Rev. J. R. Thompson, in closing the conference, pledged his continued earnest efforts on behalf of the district work and asked the loyal support of all the brethren.

The conference was closed with prayer.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the Forty-fifth Annual Conference of the Michigan District of the
Pilgrim Holiness Church

Greetings:

Through the grace and abundant mercies of God we have met to-day to confer on business pertaining to the Kingdom of God and the Church. The year through which we have come has been a stormy one, because of the devastating blow of this horrible war which has sent the world reeling with distress, fears, and sorrows. As a hen gathereth her chicks under her wing, just so God has overshadowed His own by His wing through this time of trouble. Great is the debt we owe to God for His unlimited help and favors. Certainly the promise that He would never leave nor forsake His own has been verified again.

The effects of the war have reached much deeper into our ranks this year, taking about all the young men. This has worked a hardship on the young people's work that only God can help to overcome.

Some from the battle fronts have already returned to carry with them scars and injuries for life, which will constantly be a reminder of the horrors of this terrible struggle. Some who were prisoners of war for several months have been liberated and have returned home in direct answer to the prayers of parents. One young man, a prisoner of war for several months, whom we have known from boyhood, said to me, "It makes me love God better and appreciate the prayers of the Christians more, having passed through this experience." He also said, "God always provided food or stopped the hunger pains when I became distressed."

Another one of our minister's sons has fallen in battle. Rev. H. S. Bennett's son, known to us as Freddie. Freddie worked on the camp grounds several years during camp. He was a very willing worker. He gave his life for his country the day after our camp closed last August. Freddie is gone but not forgotten.

The passing of Mrs. C. V. Holstein was a sad loss among us. Mrs. Holstein was a godly wife and a model mother. She was loved and appreciated by all who knew her.

Our Ministers — Because of the national emergency which has brought on added problems, and in some cases, distressing conditions, the burdens of the ministry have been greatly increased. In spite of this condition, the ministers of the district have not only proven their willingness to face distress and unsolved problems, but their ability, by the help of God, to forge ahead, holding high the Banner of King Emmanuel, enriching the saints by their God given messages and at the same time swinging the red light of danger, warning the judgment bound traveler of the judgment to come. Michigan is blessed with a spiritual ministry! Her pastors and evangelists are ministers who are not afraid to venture and face the storm. With a staff of ministers with an unsoiled record, the Michigan District should advance on every front. It is to be regretted that some of our men are forced to retire from active work because of ill health. Let us pray that God will speedily restore them to good health and to their place at the front of the Battle.

Our Churches — It, indeed, is gratifying to note the interest shown in the churches over the district. There has been some earnest praying and as a result God has blessed the Churches until the members have rejoiced as they have worshipped together. We have every reason to believe that the spiritual tide is constantly rising, which is an evidence that the Church is not backslidden nor backsliding. Because of the advance in spiritual life, God has enabled the churches in the district to advance numerically. We have enjoyed a small gain this year in membership, also a noticeable gain in our Sunday School attendance. Several churches have purchased buses which is proving to be very advantageous in Sunday School work. Needed repairs have been made in many churches and some have had to enlarge because of the increase in attendance, while others have plans to build or enlarge. Honorable mention could be made of all the churches in the district but space does not permit. It is evident that the churches are not second rate, but give evidence of a

Spiritual development, a vision and determination to forge ahead, carrying out the great commission placed upon her by her risen Lord.

Our Church Extension Work — Like the older churches the work in this field has also been hindered some because of the war, but this department of the Church work is very encouraging and many more new works could be opened if young men with a call were available. However, I am happy to say that the workers in this branch of church work are proving that new works can be opened by the help of God. Our ministers in this field are Godly, and self-sacrificing, giving their attention to the interest of the Kingdom instead of plans they might have.

Our Laymen — The ministers have just reasons to be proud of the laymen. The churches are made up of laymen who carry a burden and vision in the work of the Lord. They are clean, intelligent people who love spiritual things. Much of the success of the church work can be attributed to the willingness of laymen to pray and give liberally to the work of the Church.

Our Future — Despite all the obstacles and hindering elements that may obstruct the course of the church, the future is promising for the spiritual people. The clouds may be gathering more densely than at any time in the past, because of powerful influences against her, but with God in the midst, He will help her and that right early. This is, in my opinion, the secret of success. Much depends upon the one who directs her course. If only man manages and directs her work she is destined to a fatal crash. If God is to manage and charter her course she is ordained to success in spite of all organized efforts and forces against her. "If God be for us, who can be against us?" I believe the great need of the district to-day is an anointed ministry. This is an age of program but there is no substitute for the old fashioned anointings that have marked the ministry of all ages. God has blessed Michigan with ministers who seek after God, ministers who do not hesitate to give God's message to the people and hold the standards of the Bible and the church. With this staff of ministers, the future is bright for the work of the church in this district.

A Word of Appreciation — It has been a pleasure to work as your servant for the past six years. I am indeed grateful for the splendid cooperation I have enjoyed, the tolerant spirit of my brethren in the ministry and the lay men as well, and the kindness I have been given over the district. I have the highest respect for the Godly council with which you have surrounded me and have certainly enjoyed the counsel given me from these good men. I have enjoyed working with President Mills at the Seminary. I have always found him to be open and frank as to what he has to say; also, that he has a very cooperative spirit in the work of the Lord. The Seminary with its splendid staff of instructors has always been ready to cooperate with the church work in the district. The feeling in my heart is that I have always been afforded the best help that anyone could ask for and I am deeply indebted to you.

STANDING RULES

1. Conference Year

The Conference year shall close June 30, and complete reports must be reviewed by the local boards and forwarded directly to the District Statistician, Rev. A. C. Doehring, 1506 Bennett Ave., Flint, Mich., by July 15. All reports received after July 15 shall be omitted from the yearly report.

2. Funds

Each church shall raise for the general budget the equivalent of \$.50 per member per year for general administration expense; \$.60 for general home missions; plus \$1.90 per member for foreign missions.

They shall also raise for the district budget the equivalent of \$4.50 per member, divided as follows:

Home missions, .85 % (\$3.82 ½); district expense, .08 % (36c); ministerial relief, .05 ½ % (24 ¾ c); General Conference delegates, .01 ½ % (6 ¾ c).

3. Bible School Fund

Each church shall raise for the Bible School Fund the equivalent of \$1.50 per member per year, pastor included at the same rate. All money raised for the Bible School Fund, plus other Bible School offerings, shall be sent to the Bible School Treasurer, Rev. H. T. Mills, 1020 So. Washington St., Owosso, Mich.

4. Ministerial Tithes

One-half of all ministerial tithes shall be turned to the support of the district superintendent

5. District and General Funds

All monies raised in the local church for district and general funds shall be sent to the district treasurer, who shall forward general funds to the general treasurer.

6. District Officials' Salaries

The district superintendent's salary is fixed at a minimum of \$3,000.00 per year, plus 5 cents a mile for traveling expenses. The district treasurer shall receive \$250.00 per year and the district secretary shall receive \$150.00 per year.

7. Pastor's Camp-meeting Expense

Inasmuch as our pastors are expected to support and attend the Annual Camp Meeting, each church shall provide the equivalent of the pastor's offering or salary for the two Sundays of the camp, and the pastors should be privileged to attend the entire Camp Meeting.

8. Examining and Educational Board

The district superintendent shall be chairman of the Examining and Educational Board by virtue of his office.

9. Camp Meeting Expense

Churches are to be rated according to their financial strength and part of the camp meeting expense shall be raised among the churches of the district. The district council shall prorate the expense among the churches. Recognized ministers of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, their wives and children sixteen years old and under shall be entertained free of charge for camp and conference.

10. Resolutions

Inasmuch as many resolutions are presented to this committee without signature:

Therefore, be it resolved, that no resolution be presented to this conference until it has been typewritten and signed.

Be it further resolved, that this resolution be made a standing rule in this conference.

11. Conference Bar

The first ten seats in the three middle sections of the tabernacle and the platform are fixed as the conference bar.

12. Committees

The district superintendent shall appoint all committees.

13. Ministerial Retirement Fund

Each church shall provide the equivalent of \$1.00 per member, per year; also each licensed or ordained minister and each licensed or ordained deaconess shall pay \$2.00 per year into the Ministerial Retirement Fund.

RESOLUTIONS: WAYS AND MEANS

No. 1

The following change in the standing rule No. 9 of the district minutes: "Recognized ministers of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, their wives and their children sixteen years old and under shall be entertained free of charge for the camp and conference."

No. 2

Be it resolved, that the church shall raise for the district budget the equivalent of \$4.50, per member, divided as follows: District Home Missions 85% District expense 8%, Ministerial Relief 5 ½ %, General Conference delegates 1 ½ %.

No. 3

Be it resolved, that the 18% in the Ministerial retirement fund be transferred to the district home missions fund. The same to be used for the support of our church extension man.

No. 4

Be it resolved, that standing rule 9 on page 17 be retained in the minutes.

DISTRICT RESOLUTIONS

No. 1

Be it resolved, that the local church provide good modern heating and cooking facilities for the parsonage, the type to be suitable to the locality where the parsonage is situated.

No. 2

Whereas the conference appreciates the efficient and faithful manner in which Rev. W. L. Surbrook, our general superintendent, has presided over this annual meeting;

Therefore, be it resolved that a rising vote of thanks be given him also that he be presented with a love offering of \$50.00 Carried.

No. 3

Where as the conference appreciates the willing and efficient service of Rev. J. R. Thompson, our district superintendent;

Therefore, be it resolved that a rising vote of thanks be given him. Carried.

No. 4

Whereas the conference appreciates the good work done in the dining room and kitchen;

Be it resolved that a rising vote of thanks be given the workers in these two departments. Carried.

No. 5

Whereas many of our boys and girls have been called into the service of our country, and many are at this present moment being sacrificed on the battlefields of war offering their lives for our freedom and for the principles for which the Pilgrim Holiness Church stands,

Be it resolved that we as a conference pause, and that prayer be offered by our general superintendent on behalf of our loved ones in service, and for their parents. Carried.

No. 6

Be it resolved that the church extension man of the District give an annual report to the conference. Carried.

No. 7

Whereas our Brother Sylvester has done much needed work about the grounds, be it resolved, that we give him a gift of \$15.00 as an expression of our appreciation of his labors.

No. 8 (1943 No. 5)

Whereas there is a great demand throughout the church for a ministerial retirement fund, be it resolved, that each church provide the equivalent of \$1.00 per member per year; also that each licensed or ordained minister, and each licensed or ordained deaconess pay \$2.00 per year beginning currently.

Be it further resolved, that payments from this fund be pro-rated to ministers or their widows according to their active years of service in the Michigan District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church.

Be it further resolved, that the district council appoint a committee to draft by-laws governing this fund, the same to be presented to the next annual conference for its approval.

Be it further resolved, that the district council appoint a secretary and treasurer to handle this work and that his name and address be placed in the official directory of the district minutes.

No. 9

Whereas the growth of the Church depends largely upon the extent of home missionary activity, and whereas this work is of such vital importance to the life and development of the church;

Therefore, be it resolved, that the district council nominate two men to be presented to this conference; one to be elected to give his full time to church extension work, who shall be directly amenable to the district superintendent and indirectly amenable to the district council; and that the district council nominate two men, one to be elected as an advisory member. These, together with the district superintendent, shall constitute the district home missionary committee.

They shall supervise the opening of new fields within the bounds of the district, and have the general oversight of the home missionary work. The home missionary committee shall be under the jurisdiction of the district council, and shall render a quarterly report of the work being done to the council.

Be it further resolved that the church extension man be paid a minimum of three thousand dollars per year plus his traveling expenses at five cents a mile. All monies raised by him are to go into the district home missionary fund.

Moved and seconded that the resolution be adopted. Carried.
