## JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

#### FIRST SITTING

Owosso, Michigan, August 1, 1946

The first sitting of the 46th Annual Conference of the Michigan District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at 8:30 A. M., August 1, 1946 at Seminary Park Tabernacle, Owosso, Michigan.

The conference was called to order by Rev. J. R. Thompson, District Superintendent, who requested Rev. Edgar Haskins to direct the congregational singing. Rev. Henry Alexander was at the piano.

Prayer was offered by Rev. C. E. Cliff and Rev. E. F. Ewers.

Scripture lesson from Psalm 139 was read by Assistant District Superintendent, Rev. M. L. Goodman.

Rev. Clare Elkins sang, "I Had No Song 'Till Jesus Found Me." Rev. J. R. Thompson introduced Rev. L. W. Sturk, General Superintendent, presiding officer of the conference. He addressed the conference and used the subject, "My Heart's Desire for our Church." His remarks were based on Acts 2: 1-4. He spoke from the following outline:

A spiritual church An united church An unworldly church A soul saving church

A loyal church

His message was well received and timely in its appeal.

The District Secretary called the conference roll and completed the same with a few additions.

All members of the conference and delegates were requested to come within the conference bar fixed by standing rule No. 12.

Moved and seconded that the time for sittings be fixed as 9:00 A. M. to 12 M., 1:30 P. M. to 5:00 P. M. and 7:00 P. M. to 9:00 P. M. Carried.

The District Superintendent submitted his report. See page 14 Motion was made to accept the report by a rising vote of thanks, and that in appreciation of Rev. J. R. Thompson's seven years of service, a love offering be taken with which he and his wife may purchase some personal article by which to remember the conference. Carried.

Moved and seconded that the hours for meals be fixed as follows: Breakfast, 7:30 A.M.; Lunch, 12:15 P.M.; Dinner, 5:30 P.M. Carried. The District Statistician reported. The report was accepted.

Moved and seconded that all resolutions to be presented by the Committee on Resolutions and the Committee on Ways and Means be mimeographed and circulated among the members of the conference and delegates before presentation.

Moved and seconded that the matter be referred to the Resolutions Committee. Carried.

The District Superintendent presented eight new churches for acceptance into the District.

The churches, pastors, and delegates were as follows: Iron Mountain. Rev. H. B. Kreider, Mrs. John Tachick; Frankfort, Rev. Charles Jones, Mrs. Charles Jones; Saginaw, Rev. John Bare, Mr. Floyd Yarger Hope, Rev. A. W. Lacey, Mr. Ashley Mills; Willow Run, Rev. Herbert Diller, Mrs. J. Morningstar; Morrice, Mr. Roy Jones, Mrs. Roy Jones; Clio, Rev. M. T. Cockman, Mrs. Elmer Sinkey; Luther, Rev. C. E. Morgan, Mr. Lewis Heyd.

Moved and seconded that these churches be received and that the pastors and delegates be welcomed by a rising vote. Carried.

Moved and seconded that the pastors of the new churches be extended the courtesy of the conference and the privileges of the bar. Carried.

The sitting was adjourned by expiration of time.

### SECOND SITTING

The second sitting convened at 1:30 P. M. August 1, 1946. After congregational singing, prayer was offered by Rev. J. C. Brillhart.

Rev. L. W. Sturk read the scripture from I John 2: 20, and talked on the subject "Unction."

Moved and seconded that the reading of the minutes of the previous sitting be omitted. Carried.

Upon completion of the roll, a motion prevailed to dispense with further call of the same.

The reception committee presented the following to the conference: Rev. and Mrs. Lloyd Smith from the Central District. Rev. Amos Hoover from the Ohio District, Rev. and Mrs. M. T. Cockman from North Carolina

After the visitors were introduced, they responded with a brief testimony.

The District Superintendent was authorized to appoint a committee of two to bring resolutions considered still in force before this body for further consideration, the same, if accepted to be placed in Standing Rules.

Rev. T. M. Fast and Rev. John Hight were appointed to this committee. At their request these gentlemen were excused from the conference to begin their work.

The report was accepted.

The Auditing Committee found that the books of the Treasurers of Bible Holiness Seminary, the District, and of the District Young People's Society to be correct. Their report was accepted. A letter recommending the transfer of Rev. Amos Hoover from

the Ohio District to the Michigan District was read and accepted.

Rev. Jason Felter from the Pennsylvania-New Jersey District was received into the Michigan Conference.

A motion prevailed making the order of business of the seven o'clock sitting the election of officers.

The District Treasurer's report was read and accepted by motion. The District Young People's Treasurer's report was read and accepted.

The report of the District Secretary of Missions was read and accepted.

The resolution Committee presented the following resolutions:

#### Resolution No. 1

Inasmuch as it has been a conference recommendation for several years that our ministers receive two weeks vacation with pay, therefore, be it resolved, that this recommendation become a standing rule.

## Resolution No. 2

Inasmuch as there seems to be a general feeling among our people

that our camp would benefit spirtually if it were separated from the District Conference. Therefore, be it resolved, that the District Conference be held in the spring in conjunction with the ministerial convention.

#### Resolution No. 3

Inasmuch as our General Conference elected all their general officers without elimination of names receiving but few votes, therefore be it resolved that this conference follow the same procedure in the election of all district officers, except those nominated by the District Council as provided by the manual.

#### Resolution No. 4

Inasmuch as many people attend camp the last Sunday that cannot come at any other time, be it therefore resolved, that ample time be given the camp evangelist to bring an evangelistic message in conjunction with the Bible School service.

#### Resolution No. 5

Be it resolved, that a yearly report of each missionary society be printed in the annual conference minutes.

The resolutions were received and taken up separately.

Resolution No. 1 was adopted.

Resolution No. 2 was tabled. Resolution No. 3 was adopted.

Resolution No. 4 was referred to the committee that a report might be brought back at a later sitting.

Resolution No. 5 was adopted.

The sitting was adjourned.

#### THIRD SITTING

The third sitting convened at 7:00 P. M. August 1, 1946.

After congregational singing prayer was offered by Rev. M. L. Goodman.

The General Superintendent read Acts 4: 33 and spoke briefly on the subject, "Great Grace."

Rev. Wm. Bartlette of the Free Methodist Church was introduced to the conference.

The minutes of the previous sittings were read and approved.

Rev. H. B. Kreider gave his report, which upon motion, was received by a rising vote of thanks.

The election of officers being the order of the day, the District Superintendent appointed the following tellers: Henry Alexander, Carl Messer, Charles Denniston, W. N. Miller, L. N. Nelsen and Harold Rickner.

The conference engaged in a season of prayer asking the Lord to lead in the selection of its officers.

Rev. R. C. Hawkins—District Superintendent, Rev. A. C. Doehring—Assistant District Superintendent, Rev. D. F. Price,—District Secretary, Rev. A. F. Osborn, District Treasurer.

Resolution No. 9 of 1945 minutes was adopted by motion.

The time was extended for one and one-half hours.

The sitting was adjourned with prayer.

#### FOURTH SITTING

The fourth sitting convened at 9:00 A. M. August 2, 1946.

Following singing and prayer Rev. L. W. Sturk talked on the subject: "Spiritual Freedom."

Minutes of the third sitting were read and approved.

Moved and seconded that five names be placed on the ballot in the voting for the five councilmen to be elected. Carried. Moved and seconded that the tellers be excused to count the votes for councilmen that we might proceed with other business. Carried.

The secretary read the names of Rev. A. S. Joppie, Rev. A. C. Doehring and Rev. L. R. Neff as nominees for the Examining and Educational Board.

Moved and seconded that three more tellers be appointed. Carried. The District Superintendent appointed Rev. Calvin Hendrick, Rev. H. L. Robinson and Rev. Orville Smith.

Report of the tellers showed that Rev. L. R. Neff was elected to serve on the Educational and Examining Board.

The Secretary read the nominations for Trustees of Bible Holiness Seminary. From them the following were elected:

H. T. Mills, J. C. Brillhart, G. E. Stace.

Report of tellers showed the following to have been elected as advisory members of the District Council:

Rev. L. R. Neff, Rev. A. S. Joppie, Rev. M. L. Goodman, Rev. G. E. Stace, Rev. C. E. Cliff.

Report of tellers showed that Loren Swanson was elected to the office of District Trustee.

Moved that 1945 resolution No. 9 relative to the District Home Missionary Work be brought before the conference for reconsideration. Seconded and carried.

Moved and seconded that Resolution No. 9 be amended to provide that four instead of two nominees be made by the District Council for the Home Missionary Representative. Carried.

Moved and seconded that Resolution No. 9 as amended be adopted. Carried.

Moved that action to adopt Resolution No. 9 be rescinded to make possible further discussion on the subject.

The time for the next sitting was set for 1 P. M. This sitting was adjourned by expiration of time.

#### FIFTH SITTING

The fifth sitting convened at 1:00 P. M., August 2, 1946.

After congreational singing, Rev. R. C. Hawkins, District Superintendent elect led in prayer.

Rev. L. W. Sturk briefly addressed the conference.

Resolution No. 9 was brought up for reconsideration. The Resolution was adopted.

Resolution No. 8, relative to the convening of District Conference at 10 A. M. on Wednesday before Camp meeting was considered. Moved and seconded that this resolution be adopted. Carried.

Motion was made to amend Resolution No. 8 to provide that District Conference convene at 1:00 P. M. on Wednesday before the camp meeting. Seconded and carried.

Resolution No. 8 was adopted as amended.

Resolution No. 10 relative to the pension plan was considered. Motion was made and seconded to defer for one year action on the pension plan referred to in the resolution, and that we continue with our own ministerial retirement plan. Carried.

Resolution No. 11 was adopted. Carried.

Resolution No. 12 was next considered, and was adopted.

Resolution No. 13 was adopted.

Moved and seconded that we hear from the Special Committee appointed to review resolutions formerly passed and to present those which may still be in force. Said resolutions when passed are to be placed in Standing Rules. Carried.

The following resolutions were adopted by motion:

Whereas, the conference appreciates the efficient and faithful manner in which Rev. L. W. Sturk, our General Superintendent, has presided over this conference; Therefore be it resolved, that a rising vote of thanks be given him, also that he be presented with a love offering of \$50.00.

Rev. L. W. Sturk announced that he must leave to make train connections. Rev. J. R. Thompson, District Superintendent took the chair.

Resolution No. 15 was read and adopted by motion.

Whereas ,the conference appreciates the good work done in the dining room and kitchen:

Be it resolved, that a rising vote of thanks be given the workers in these two departments.

Moved and seconded that the street addresses of our churches be listed in the minutes. Carried.

Moved and seconded to excuse the district council that it might bring in nominees for the Home Missionary Representative. Carried. At the request of the conference, Miss Ruth Alexander sang, "I've Found the Love of Jesus." Her brother, Rev. Henry Alexander accompanied her.

From the list of nominees presented by the District Council for home missionary representative, Rev. H. B. Kreider was elected to this office. Rev. Howard Rogers was elected to serve as advisory member.

A roll call of the pastors was ordered to determine the required number of 1946 minutes.

The Committee on Memorials submitted a memorial to Mrs. I. N. Polmonteer, which was read by the District Secretary. Moved and seconded that this memorial be received and that a copy be printed in the conference journal. Carried.

Moved and seconded that the secretary send greetings to the following: Rev. and Mrs. W. L. Surbrook, Mrs. Harry Woods, Rev. W. H. Neff, Mrs. Anna Lounds, and Rev. B. B. Ferris.

Moved and seconded that the District Council be authorized to take care of any unfinished business of this conference. Carried.

The minutes of the fourth sitting were read and approved.

Moved and seconded that the District Secretary write the Argus Press and express the appreciation of this conference for the publicity given to our activities. Carried.

On motion the conference adjourned and was dismissed with prayer.

#### DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the Forty-sixth Annual Conference of the Michigan District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church

Greetings:

Shall we pause this morning to magnify the God of our salvation, exalt the name of His dear Son, Jesus Christ, and honor the blessed Holy Spirit. We shall do well to join with the Psalmist and declare, "I will bless the Lord at all times: his praise shall continually be in my mouth. Rejoice in the Lord, O ye righteous: for praise is comely for the upright. O clap your hands, all ye people; shout unto God with the voice of triumph. Great is the Lord, and greatly to be praised in the city of our God, in the mountain of His Holiness. God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble." It is through His grave and divine providence that we have met this morning to confer on business in the interest of God's Kingdom and the Church. As certainly as we have had the help of God in the past we can expect to have his aid and blessing in this conference.

The past year has been a time of blessing and divine leadership in the midst of battles and problems, and for these blessings we all rejoice. It is true that the war ended as far as shot and shell is concerned, but this did not silence the devil and his forces of evil; they are still arrayed against the people of God, but by the grace of God

our people have overcome and are forging ahead.

We regret the loss of the wife of Rev. I. N. Polmonteer. Mrs. Polmonteer was a patient sufferer and after months of suffering God saw best to take her to everlasting bliss where there is no suffering.

Our Churches: It is interesting to note the spirit of progress the churches are manifesting. It is clear there is a spirit of earnestness demonstrated by the laity over the entire district. Some may be dropping out, but others are coming to our ranks filling this gap, and are helping push the work of the Lord. Despite the decline in religious activities in many sections, the work in this district is showing a growing interest in every department. The interest in the Sunday School activities has grown until the work in this department is of outstanding note in the state and with this growing interest we have not yet reached the top.

Improvements have been made on much of the church property over the district. The church at Bellaire, under the leadership of Rev. G. V. Skinner, saw the need for a new parsonage and as a result of their interest and labor have a beautiful parsonage. Rev. Miss Ila Bruce and her noble people at Traverse City, with a vision and a mind to work have launched a new project at Traverse Heights and are now in the work of constructing a new church building in this new subdivision of the city. Rev. L. R. Neff of the Elm Park Church, Flint, and his good people, would have constructed a new church building if materials had been available. The church in Owosso have purchased a new location and they are planning to build a new church in the near future. Honorable mention could be made of all churches if time would permit. One outstanding thing is evident—the churches of the district are on the move forward.

Our Ministers: I am happy to say that my personal feeling of our ministers is that they rank high in the ministerial field. The messages given out by the pastors and evangelists of the Michigan district give evidence of an intelligent effort to make their ministry and message effective. Our pastors are not only proving their sterling worth by their scriptural and intelligent messages given from time to time, but they are also proving their worth by their able leadership in every problem which faces the church. The Michigan district is blessed and favored with ministers of merit that have the courage of Joshua and the faith of Paul. With a staff of leaders as we have, the future is promising.

Our Newly Organized Churches: God has favored the district with eight newly organized churches this year. All these were not started

this year, but this year they developed to the place where they were ready to enter the church. Iron Mountain which was opened as a new project two years ago, organized with twenty-two members, of which seventeen were charter members. This field is a very promising field and opens an entirely new section to the Pilgrim Holiness Church. They have just closed a very gracious meeting lately where God wonderfully blessed in giving salvation to many. The closing service of this meeting was a time of salvation with fourteen seekers at the altar of prayer. We are praying that out of this meeting will come the establishing of a Camp meeting for this northern section. work at Frankfort was organized this year into a promising church. Charles Jones is the pastor and is doing a good work. Luther, a new section to our church, was opened this year by Rev. Clifford Morgan moving into this community. This work was organized into a Pilgrim Holiness Church with a goodly number of members and this place like the others holds a promising future for our church. These people owned a neat church building and a comfortable parsonage. This is the second church Rev. Morgan has brought to our district in five years. Hope, a lovely rural section in the northern end of Midland county, invited the Pilgrims into their community and expressed a desire to be affiliated with us. On our first visit there we found a very creditable group of people who really loved God. They were ready to organize soon after our first meeting with them, and in August, 1945 they organized with a group that is a credit to any district. These people constructed a beautiful cinder block church which is attractive and they have plans to build a parsonage as soon as material is available. Rev. A. W. Lacey is the pastor and is doing a work which will stand until Jesus comes. Saginaw was organized this year. Saginaw is an industrial city and is large enough for several strong Holiness churches. Our work is located on Mershan street in a good residential district. Rev. John Bare, formerly of Flint, is the pastor and is doing a splendid work. This is a good field and the church should be self-supporting in a short time. Willow Run was organized this year. We suffered some reverses there when the bomber plant closed, due to the ending of the war, but conditions are looking brighter and our work ought soon to be in a stronger condition. Rev. and Mrs. Diller have been pastoring here for some time but feel they should move this year. Morrice is another work opened to the church. Mr. Guy Jones opened the work there and soon had a group large enough to organize a Pilgrim Holiness Church. Mr. Jones had to leave the work here due to the illness and death of his wife. Clio. a new work to the district, also organized into a Pilgrim Holiness Church, with fourteen charter members. This work is as promising as any that ever came to the church. These people are leaders and have their hearts and interest in a good spiritual work. At present they are in the process of erecting a portable tabernacle to worship in. After Rev. Doehring of Flint held several prayer meetings there, the Home Missionary Department of Bible Holiness Seminary took the work over as a project of the school, and placed it under the supervision of Rev. Cockman. It soon grew and developed to the place of organization. This church is already self-supporting and they are planning a strong program for the future.

Our Future: Michigan is a great state! With her network of beautiful highways the most remote places can easily be reached by automobile. With her winding streams, wooded acres, towering hills studded with evergreens, with her more than seven thousand inland lakes, plus the Great Lakes, which all but surround her; the loping deer, the shining black bear and the roving wolves all add to her natural beauty. Her people are noble, thrifty and aggressive. The people of this state have opened and developed her natural resources until she has become one of the leading industrial sections of this great United States of America. With all of this she affords one of the greatest opportunities to the expansion of the church. We thank God today for sixty organized churches in Michigan but there is room

for five times that many. Whole sections of agricultural importance. of mining interest, and resort developments are places where new work could be established. The state is planning to develop waste sections of the Upper Peninsula, which will mean that thousands of people will move into these areas. Many of these people are unchurched but can be reached if the proper effort was to be made. A business man wrote one of our ministers saying he did not understand why the church neglected the Upper Peninsula with her open door. Shall we step in while the door is open? It is a challenge. Shall we meet it? I say we can, and I believe we will by the leadership of the Holy Spirit. It will mean sacrifice and a very laborious effort, but we have ministers who are interested and anxious to move forward for God, laymen who have a vision and willingness to labor for God till the sun sets for the last time at the close of life's day. What greater satisfaction could the people of the Michigan district have than to hear the shouts of victory from new converts as a result of a little extra effort to reach these neglected people? What we own here will end with life but what we do for God is everlasting. Let us seek to gain that which is everlasting; "Let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith."

My Personal Appreciation: Having felt for several months that God would permit me to do so, I am closing my work as district superintendent at this conference. I wish to express my deep appreciation to my ministerial brethren and laymen for their kind support and cooperation in the work of the Lord during these seven years of labor in the district work. When I was elected superintendent I followed a man of strong Christian character, a man whose life was an example, I had nothing to fear in following this man, no wounds to heal, no trouble to straighten out. The district was ready to move forward. I have had great kindness shown me and in many cases the load was made lighter by kind words or a helping hand from my brethren of the district. I have been surrounded by a Council which has bent every effort to aid me in my work. The men of this Council have been kind and very charitable and I have always felt secure when I turned to them for help. The comittiee on church extension work has always been ready to cooperate and every time we met I had a deeper appreciation for them. It has also been a pleasure to be affiliated in a small way with the Seminary. I have found the instructors ready to cooperate in every project of the district and the students always showed a willingness to do their part. When the church took me in thirty-three years ago I had a deep feeling of appreciation and it has been a pleasure to labor for the church these years. I have a heart feeling of gratitude to the Michigan District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church. The church does not owe me any thing but I have debts to pay to the church of my choice, the Pilgrim Holiness Church, for the favors given me in these thirty-three years. I am stepping down but I shall always be found ready to do any work I am asked to do-however small. My prayer is that God will bless you and advance the work of the district in every department. ### STANDING RULES

#### 1. Conference Year

The Conference year shall close June 30, and complete reports must be reviewed by the local boards and forwarded directly to the District Statistician, Rev. H. C. Rickner, Munising, Mich. by July 15. All reports received after July 15 shall be omitted from the yearly report.

#### 2. Funds

Each church shall raise for the general budget the equivalent of \$.50 per member per year for general administration expense; \$.60 for general home missions; plus \$1.90 per member for foreign missions.

They shall also raise for the district budget the equivalent of \$4.50

per member, divided as follows:

Home missions .82 per cent; District Expense .09 per cent; Ministerial relief .07 per cent; General Conference delegates .02 per cent.

#### 3. Bible School Fund

Each church shall raise for the Bible School Fund the equivalent of \$1.50 per member per year, pastor included at the same rate. All money raised for the Bible School Fund, plus other Bible School offerings shall be sent to the Bible School Treasurer, Rev. H. T. Mills, 1020 So. Washington Street, Owosso, Michigan.

#### 4. Ministerial Tithes

One-half of all ministerial tithes shall be turned to the support of the district superintendent.

#### 5. District and General Funds

All monies raised in the local church for district and general work shall be sent to the district treasurer, who shall forward general funds to the general treasurer.

## 6. District Officals' Salaries

Each church shall provide the equivalent of \$1.00 per member, per year; also each licensed or ordained minister and each licensed or ordained deaconess shall pay \$2.00 per year into the Ministerial Retirement Fund.

## 7. Pastor's Camp-meeting Expense

Inasmuch as our pastors are expected to support and attend the Annual Camp Meeting, each church shall provide the equivalent of the pastor's offering or salary for the two Sundays of the camp, and the pastors shall be privileged to attend the entire Camp Meeting.

#### 8. Examining and Educational Board

The district superintendent shall be chairman of the Examining and Educational Board by virtue of his office.

#### 9. Camp Meeting Expense

Churches are to be rated according to their financial strength and part of the camp meeting expense shall be raised among the churches of the district. The district council shall pro-rate the expense among the churches. Recognized ministers of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, their wives and children sixteen years old and under shall be entertained free of charge for camp and conference.

#### 10. Resolutions

No resolution shall be presented to this conference until it has been typewritten and signed.

### 11. Conference Bar

The first ten seats in the three middle sections of the tabernacle and the platform are fixed as the conference bar.

#### 12. Committees

The district superintendent shall appoint all committees.

#### 13. Ministerial Retirement Fund

The district superintendent's salary is fixed at a minimum of \$3,000.00 per year, plus 5 cents a mile for traveling expenses. The district treasurer shall receive \$250.00 per year and the district secretary shall receive \$150.00 per year.

## 14. Stoves for Parsonages

The local church shall provide good modern heating and cooking facilities for the parsonage, the type to be suitable to the locality where the parsonage is situated.

15.

The district superintendent shall have read Sections 99, 100 and 101 of the manual instructing all district licentiates that hereafter they shall appear before the district examining board at conference time before their credentials shall be granted.

### 16. Ministers' Secular Work

Be it resolved that those ministers doing secular work turn one-half of their tithe to the District Budget.

#### 17. Camp Meeting Funds

The district treasurer shall submit a report of Camp Meeting funds under the following items: Receipts; Cash on hand; Received in Church Assessments and Cash Offerings; Received in Dining Room; Received from Lunch Stand; Received from Incidentals and Total Receipts. Disbursements: Paid for Camp Evangelists; Paid for Camp Workers; Paid for Provisions for Dining Room; Paid for Provisions for Lunch Stand; Paid for Fuel, Water and Electricity; Paid for Incidentals, and Balance. This report to appear in the Minutes.

## 18. Appointment of Committees

The district superintendent shall appoint all committees. The Standing Committees are to be so appointed to include new men and avoid the duplication of men on several committees.

## 19. Building Committee

The district council shall appoint a district building committee, composed of two ministers and one layman, who have experience in the work of acoustics, architecture and construction. This committee shall counsel and advise the board of local congregations concerning construction and disposition of property and the selection of building sites.

Also that this committee shall be consulted before a local church shall construct or remodel their properties when there is more than \$500.00 involved. That the action of this committee shall be reviewed by the district council.

#### 20. Burial Benefit

Each local church in the Michigan district shall enroll its pastor and wife in the Ministerial Benefit Association, and pay the expense of their membership, and each call that comes thereafter, from the church treasury.

All general full-time evangelists and their wives, receiving their principal support from their meetings shall be enrolled in the Ministerial Benefit Association, said membership and each call that comes thereafter shall be paid by the church of which he is a member.

Also that the district superintendent and his wife shall be included, the expense to be paid from the ministers' one-half tithe fund.

The ministers employed in our educational institutions and their

The ministers employed in our educational institutions and their wives to be included in this action and the expense be paid from the Bible School treasury.

18

Our home missionary pastors are included in this action, the expense to be paid from the home missionary treasury.

The retired elderly ministers and their wives are included in this action, the expense to be paid from the minsterial relief fund.

## 21. Vacations

It is recommended that our churches grant their ministers a two weeks' vacation with pay.

### 22. District Conference

The District Conference shall convene Wednesday, 10 A. M., preceding the camp meeting.

## DISTRICT RESOLUTIONS

#### No. 1

Inasmuch as it has been a conference recommendation for several years that our minsters receive two weeks' vacation with pay: Therefore, be it resolved, that this recommendation become a standing rule in our minutes.

#### Resolution No. 3

Inasmuch as our General Conference elected all their general officers by open ballot; without dropping the names of those receiving but few votes, therefore, be it resolved, that the same procedure be followed by this conference in electing district officers except those nominated by the District Council as provided by the manual.

#### Resolution No. 5

Be it resolved that a yearly report of each missionary society be printed in the Conference Minutes.

### Resolution No. 8

Inasmuch as there has been such overcrowded conditions with our conference and young people's convention crowding in upon each other; Therefore, be it resolved that our district conference convene Wednesday morning at 10 o'clock preceding our district camp meeting. Furthermore be it resolved, that this resolution become a standing rule.

#### Resolution No. 10

Whereas the Michigan District has a ministerial retirement fund now in operation; Therefore be it resolved, that this plan be continued.

## Resolution No. 11

Inasmuch as there seems to be a desire among our people to change the time of our Bible School service;

Therefore be it resolved, that the service be held the first Sunday afternoon of our camp meeting, to work in cooperation with the Young People's Convention.

## Resolution No. 12

Be it resolved that a committee be appointed by the District Council to plot the entire camp ground as to sections for tenting, house trailers and parking.

Be it further resolved, that a certain section designated by this committee be divided into lots for lease to individuals for the purpose of building cottages. A list of restrictions is to be formulated by the District Council.

#### Resolution No. 13

Whereas nine millions of our youth every year are learning to drink intoxicating beverages, and whereas liquor industrialists are increasing this program continuously, and whereas the public schools are not providing adequate instruction in alcohol education,

Be it resolved, that this body endorse the work of the Temperance Education Council in the schools and churches, and

Be it further resolved, that all support as far as possible be afforded.
