JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

FIRST SITTING

Owosso, Mich. July 28, 1948

The first sitting of the 48th Annual Conference of the Michigan District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at 1:00 P. M. July 28, 1948 at Seminary Park Tabernacle, Owosso, Michigan.

The Conference was called to order by Rev. R. C. Hawkins, District Superintendent. Rev. G. V. Skinner led the congregation in the singing of "My Faith Looks Up to Thee" and "Guide Me, O Thou Great Jehovah." Miss Evelyn Farah was at the piano. Rev. A. S. Joppie offered the opening prayer of the conference.

Rev. Hawkins introduced Dr. L. W. Sturk, the General Superintendent, who gave a general report and brought greetings from other General Officials. He read a scripture lesson from Exodus 14: 10-12, 15, 19 and 20. He exhorted as to the necessity of our "Going Forward" spiritually, aggressively, separately from the world and unitedly. Two verses of the old song "Leaning on Jesus" were sung.

Dr. Sturk introduced Rev. H. T. Mills and Dr. W. L. Surbrook, members of the General Board, and requested that we honor them by asking them to be seated on the platform during the entire conference.

The Secretary called the roll. It was moved and carried that Mrs. Mary Fisher be seated as delegate from Flint First and Mrs. Garnet Ford from Lapeer Road Churches.

Attention was called to Standing Rule No. 12 fixing the conference bar. Inasmuch as the seats were rearranged, it was moved and carried that we fix the bar to include the platform and the first ten seats of the middle four sections.

District Superintendent, Rev. R. C. Hawkins, read his report and the same was accepted by the conference.

Moved and carried that the schedule of hours be: 9:00 to 12:00 in the morning, 1:30 to 4:30 in the afternoon and 7:00 to 9:00 in the evening.

The following visitors were introduced to the conference: Rev. Earl Sorrell from Ohio, Rev. Gordon Truesdale of the Nazarene Church, and Rev. and Mrs. R. J. Rummage from Iron Mountain.

The Traverse Heights Church was presented to the Conference. It was moved and carried that this conference accept the Traverse Heights Church with its pastor and delegate.

Upon the recommendation of the District Council it was moved and carried that Dr. and Mrs. W. L. Surbrook, Rev. and Mrs. R. J. Rummage, Rev. M. T. Cockman from North Carolina, Rev. Earl Sorrell from Ohio, Rev. Norval Rickner from Ohio be accepted as members of this conference.

District S. S. report by Rev. C. R. Hendrick.

Dr. Sturk told of an interesting experience while he was in Barbados. After singing a chorus we were adjourned by expiration of time.

SECOND SITTING

The Second Sitting convened at 7:00 P. M. July 28, 1948.

The congregation was led in singing "Take the Name of Jesus With you" by Rev. G. V. Skinner. Rev. Miss Ila Bruce presided at the piano. Rev. M. L. Goodman, pastor of the local church read the

These additions completed the roll.

The following reports were read and approved:

The Auditing Committee reported the books of the Treasurers of Bible Holiness Seminary, the District, and the District Young People's Society to be correct.

Rev. E. C. Swanson gave a testimony and a little report of the National Youth Convention. He told of his desire for spirituality among our Young People. He then read his report which was accepted by the conference.

Dr. Sturk gave a word of appreciation to the Pilgrim Holiness Youth.

Mrs. Fast gave a verbal report of the work of the Missionary Societies. This report was accepted.

The Resolution Committee then reported. Resolution No. 1 was adopted. In accordance with this resolution the time for the Bible School service shall be the first Sunday afternoon of the camp.

Resolution No. II. It was moved and carried that this resolution be referred to the committee asking for suggestions for a District Paper.

Resolution No. III was read and discussed. It was moved and carried that we extend the time until the matter before us be settled. The motion as carried was amended to set the time until 9:30. Another reading of this resolution was called for. It was moved and carried that this Resolution be referred to the committee for redrafting.

Resolution No. IV was read and discussed. Moved and seconded that we have this resolution mimeographed and before the first sitting in the morning and be distributed among the delegates.

Adjourned by expiration of time. Rev. E. F. Ewers dismissed with prayer.

THIRD SITTING

The third sitting convened at 9:00 A. M. July 29, 1948.

Rev. G. V. Skinner led in the singing of "I Need Thee Every Hour." Rev. L. R. Neff, Assistant Superintendent, led in prayer. Dr. Sturk presented an urgent prayer request for Dr. Harold D. Dieter, President of Allentown Bible Institute, who is seriously ill. He spoke on the subject of "Christian Unity." The scripture reading was from John 17: 20-22. Following the message we sang two verses of the song "When We All Get to Heaven."

It was moved and seconded that we dispense with the roll call.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

The order of business for the day was tabled that we might hear a resolution with reference to Resolution No. II. The Resolution was: Be it resolved that the following individuals bring us a suggestion for a District Bulletin, Dr. W. L. Surbrook, Rev. R. C. Hawkins, R. C. Hendrick, Mrs. T. M. Fast. It was moved and carried that we amend the resolution to include the Young People's Executive Secretary, Rev. E. C. Swanson.

A motion prevailed to lift from the table Resolution No. IV dealing with the division of the District. By motion the General Superintendent was requested to bring to us what the Indiana District is doing in regard to this matter.

Rev. and Mrs. Nathan Hawks of the Church of the Nazarene and Rev. Phillip Overstreet, General Evangelist, were introduced to the Conference.

It was moved and seconded that Resolution No. IV be tabled for another year. It was carried.

Adjourned by expiration of time.

FOURTH SITTING

The fourth sitting of the 1948 Conference convened at 1:30 P. M., July 29. After singing "Draw Me Nearer", Rev. C. V. Holstein led in prayer. Dr. Sturk told the story of a key to one of our churches in Barbados.

The minutes of the previous sitting were read and approved.

The Resolutions Committee reported again to the Conference with reference to Resolution No. III. The Resolution as amended to have the conference following the Camp rather than preceding it was carried.

The following resolutions were passed: No. 4, 5, 6 and 7 (as amended).

The following visitors were introduced to the Conference, Rev. and Mrs. James Cobb of Grace Methodist Church in Flint, Rev. Charles Sheldon, pastor of Drummond Island, Rev. J. L. Schell, Rev. Chrystal I. Gemberling, World Evangelization Service, and Mr. Gane from Flint. Upon request Rev. Schell favored us with a special song.

The Ways and Means Committee reported. Resolution No. 1 was passed.

Rev. L. R. Neff reported for the Educational and Examining Committee. Report accepted.

Dr. Surbrook was requested to speak concerning the "Seminary Harvest Ingathering."

It was moved and passed that the order of business for the evening, 7:30, be the election of officers.

Rev. William Bartlette, Superintendent of the Temperance Educational Council, was introduced to the conference and gave a report of the work they were doing in the state of Michigan.

It was moved and passed that we send greetings to Rev. and Mrs. Roy Wilkinson in Bernalillo, N. Mex.; also that condolences be sent from this conference to Rev. T. H. Myers, and greetings to Rev. J. R. Thompson.

Adjourned by expiration of time.

FIFTH SITTING

The Fifth Sitting convened at 7:00 P. M. July 29, 1948.

Rev. A. F. Osborn led in a good season of prayer. After singing "Rock of Ages" the Minutes of the last sitting were read and approved.

The order of business being the election of officers, Rev. Hawkins chose the following tellers: Paul Wilcox, A. L. Walker, Howard Woods, Charles Jones, Bob Nelson, G. G. Beckwith and A. W. Lacey.

The election of officers was as follows:

District Superintendent, Rev. R. C. Hawkins

Assistant Superintendent, Rev. L. R. Neff

District Secretary, Rev. D. F. Price

District Treasurer, Rev. A. F. Osborn

The ballots were cast for the five advisory members of the District Council. Tellers were excused to count the ballots.

Dr. L. W. Sturk favored us with a special song entitled "Stand by Me."

Dr. W. L. Surbrook was elected to the Examining and Educational Board.

It was moved and carried that we extend the time until the completion of the election.

Rev. H. T. Mills was elected as District Trustee.

Ballots were cast for Trustees of Bible Holiness Seminary. The tellers were asked to bring the report to the next sitting.

It was moved and carried that we rescind the former motion and adjourn by expiration of time.

SIXTH SITTING

The sixth sitting of the Conference convened at 9:00 A. M. July 30, 1948.

The order of service being Ordination, Rev. G. V. Skinner opened the service by leading the congregation in the singing of "My Hope Is Built." Rev. Hawkins requested the candidates for Ordination to come forward. The candidates were as follows: John Bare, Bob Nelson, and Miss Nettie Lee Nichols. The Ordination Committee came to the platform as the song "A Charge to Keep" was sung.

Scripture Readings were as follows: II Tim. 4: 1-8 by Rev. M. L. Goodman; I Tim. 3: 1-7 by Rev. A. C. Doehring; Matt. 25: 21 by Dr. W. L. Surbrook.

Rev. R. C. Hawkins, District Superintendent, followed in prayer. Dr. Sturk delivered the message. His scripture was from Ruth 2: 1:

1. The parting of the ways.
2. Gleaning in the fields of Boaz.
3. Rich reward at end of the day.

He spoke of it not being so much the quantity of our work but our faithfulness. That if we are to succeed we must be faithful to the trust left us and also to the Church who gives us this trust.

Rev. C. V. Holstein was elected as Trustee of Bible Holiness Seminary. Ballots were cast for the Camp Meeting Committee.

It was moved and carried that the six receiving the highest number of votes be elected to the Committee.

Request that Rev. and Mrs. Paul Trissel sing. In the absence of Mrs. Trissel, it was requested that Rev. Ruth Alexander sing. She sang, "All That Thrills My Soul."

Those Ministers elected to the Camp Committee were Howard Rogers, J. A. Hiatt, James Cunningham, G. V. Skinner, Carl E. Messer, R. Kyle Ballard.

The Educational and Examining Board reported and recommended the following:

Song Evangelist, J. L. Schell

Second year Licentiate, Phillip Overstreet

Due to the absence of John Maes from the Ordination service he shall be granted a Fourth Year License. This report was accepted.

Resolutions No. 8, 9, 10 and 11 were accepted.

It was moved and carried that we meet at 1:00 P. M.

Adjourned by expiration of time.

SEVENTH SITTING

The Seventh Sitting of the Conference convened at 1:00 P. M. July 30, 1948.

The opening song was "What a Friend We have in Jesus." Rev. C. R. Hendrick led in prayer.

It was moved and carried that Standing Rule No. 25 be, "Our District Superintendent shall be given a two-week vacation with pay."

The committee appointed to submit plans for a District Paper reported.

The report reads:

"We, your Committee appointed to draft recommendations for the Conference on the matter of a District paper, wish to submit and recommend the following:

1. That the paper shall be called the "Michigan Pilgrim."
 2. That it shall be published quarterly.
 3. It is to be a four-page paper.
 4. The paper is to be financed and shared equally between the District, the District Sunday School, Missionary Department, the Young People's Society, and the Bible College.
- Further the Committee recommends that the District Council shall select the editor and complete the staff.

It was necessary that Dr. Sturk be excused that he might keep his appointment with the Tennessee Conference. Rev. Hawkins took the chair.

The Ways and Means Committee reported. Resolution No. 2 was passed. Resolution No. 3 was passed with its amendment.

It was moved and carried that the District Treasurer send a financial statement each three months to the ministers. This shall be Standing Rule No. 26.

Moved and carried that we send a word of appreciation to the Argus Press for their publicity given us during this Conference.

Moved and carried that we give a rising vote of thanks to the Statistical Committee and that we pay the chairman \$25.00.

Moved and carried that the Council read and approve the Minutes of the last two sittings.

Motion to adjourn. The benediction of the Conference was pronounced by Dr. W. L. Surbrook.

EDITOR'S NOTE: Wayne Brown was received into the Conference by the Council, a letter of transfer being received by the California District. Rev. Brown is an ordained minister.

The Conference Minutes were approved by the Council in a special meeting.

REPORT OF THE DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT - 1948

To the 48th Annual Conference of the Michigan District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church—

Christian greetings in the name of our ever-living Lord and Saviour! With inexpressible thankfulness to God, we have gathered together in Seminary Park Tabernacle not only to do business for God's glory, but also to share in the preciousness of his Presence and blessing as well as the fellowship of those of kindred faith. In our individual lives, we have been kept by the power of God to victorious Christian living. Our Church shines as a light in a dark world. Our God has ever been near this year to guide us and sustain us in the life-conflicts that confront the Christians in this Laodicean age. Our hope only shines brighter as the darkness of despair settles deeper over a hopeless world. Thus, there are exultant reverberations of heavenly glory in the deep of our souls on this blessed day.

Under the leadership of Rev. E. C. Swanson, the Young People's Work is forging ahead. Hundreds of sanctified Pilgrim Youth gloriously attest the fact that the Devil does not have all the young people. Let

DISTRICT RESOLUTIONS

No. 1 BIBLE SCHOOL SERVICE

Be it resolved that one full service of our District Camp Meeting be given in the interests of Bible Holiness Seminary; that the Conference set the date for this meeting for 1949.

No. 2 DISTRICT PAPER

Be it resolved that the following individuals bring us a suggestion for a District Bulletin, Dr. W. L. Surbrook, Rev. R. C. Hawkins, R. C. Hendrick, Mrs. T. M. Fast, and Rev. E. C. Swanson.

No. 3 YOUNG PEOPLE'S CONVENTION

Be it resolved that the Young People's Convention be the First Friday night of the Camp, Saturday and all day Sunday. Further, that the Conference convene Monday following the Camp Meeting.

No. 4 BIBLE HOLINESS SEMINARY TREASURER

We recommend that the name of the president be deleted from standing rule No. 4 thus reading: "All money raised for the Bible School shall be sent to the Treasurer of Bible Holiness Seminary, 1020 S. Washington Street, Owosso, Michigan."

No. 5 ELECTIONS

We recommend that District Resolutions No. 10, page 18 of the 1948 Minutes be printed as standing rule No. 24 of our Conference Minutes.

No. 6 PASTORAL CHANGES

Be it resolved that the second week of May shall be designated as the time for the churches of our Conference to vote on the recall of the pastor. We further recommend that each pastor shall answer within 15 days after receiving an official call.

No. 7 CAMP MEETING COMMITTEE

Whereas we feel the need of a Camp Meeting Committee, be it resolved that the District Council nominate twelve men to the Conference, six of whom shall be elected to form a Camp Meeting Committee, who shall be amenable to the District Council.

The duties of the Camp Meeting Committee shall be:

1. Secure all manual workers for the Camp and Conference.
2. Supervision of camp grounds and buildings.
3. Purchase of food and necessary equipment for Camp Meeting and Conference.

No. 8 HOME MISSIONARY COMMITTEE

We recommend that Zone Home Missionary Committees be comprised of at least three Ministerial members, a chairman, who is to be the first man elected, two additional members and the Young People's Zone Chairman, to work with the District Superintendent in Home Extension work.

We further recommend that the respective Zones shall follow the same pattern as the District Young People's Societies Organization.

We further recommend that the pastors of each Zone organize at the same time the first Young People's Zone Rally is held in their respective Zone.

No. 9 APPRECIATION

Whereas the conference appreciates the good work done by the

Camp Meeting Committee in preparing the Campus and building, we recommend that a rising vote of thanks be given to them.

No. 10 APPRECIATION

Whereas, the conference appreciates the efficient and faithful services rendered by our General Superintendent, Dr. L. W. Sturk; Be it resolved that a rising vote of thanks be given him, also that he be presented with a love offering.

No. 11 APRECIATION

Whereas the conference appreciates the good work done by the dining room, kitchen and ground workers; Be it resolved that a rising vote of thanks be given the workers in these three departments.

RESOLUTIONS OF THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

No. 1 DISTRICT BUDGET

Be it resolved that Standing Rule No. 3 be made to read as follows: Each Church shall also raise monthly or quarterly for the District Budget the equivalent of \$4.50 per member, divided as follows: Home Missions 84 percent; District Expense 12 percent; General Conference 4 percent.

No. 2 FUEL FOR PARSONAGE

Be it resolved that the District buy the coal for the District parsonage for the coming year.

No. 3 BIBLE SCHOOL FUNDS

Inasmuch as some members of the Conference feel that the budget should not be increased and there exists an urgent need of Bible School funds; the committee recommends that all pastors invite the Bible School president to arrange for a Bible School service in their churches in the near future, at which time an offering shall be taken for the Bible School. Said offering shall not apply on the regular School Budget.

STANDING RULES

No. 1 CONFERENCE YEAR

The Conference year shall close June 30, and complete reports must be reviewed by the local boards and forwarded directly to the District Statistician, Rev. H. C. Rickner, 310 Birch St., Munising, Michigan by July 15. All reports received after July 15 shall be omitted from the yearly report.

No. 2 GENERAL BUDGET

Each church shall raise for the general budget the equivalent of \$4.00.

No. 3 DISTRICT BUDGET

The churches shall also raise for the District Budget the equivalent of \$4.50 per member, divided as follows: Home Missions 84 percent; District Expense 12 percent; General Conference, .04 percent.

No. 4 BIBLE SCHOOL FUND

Each church shall raise for the Bible School Fund the equivalent

of \$2.00 per member per year, pastor included at the same rate.. All money raised for the Bible School Fund, plus other Bible School offerings shall be sent to the Treasurer of Bible Holiness Seminary, 1020 S. Washington St., Owosso, Michigan.

No. 5 DISTRICT MINISTERIAL RELIEF FUND

Each church shall provide the equivalent of \$1.00 per member, per year; also each licensed or ordained minister and each licensed or ordained deaconess shall pay \$2.00 per year into the District Ministerial Relief Fund.

No. 6 DISTRICT AND GENERAL FUND

All monies raised in the local church for district and general work shall be sent to the District Treasurer, who shall forward general funds to the General Treasurer.

No. 7 MINISTERIAL TITHES

One half of all ministerial tithes shall be turned to the support of the District Superintendent. Also that those ministers doing secular work shall turn one half of their tithe to the District Budget.

No. 8 PASTOR'S AT CAMP MEETING

Inasmuch as our pastors are expected to support and attend the Annual Camp Meeting, each church shall provide the equivalent of the pastors offering or salary for the two Sundays of the camp and the pastor shall be privileged to attend the entire Camp Meeting.

No. 9 EXAMINING AND EDUCATIONAL BOARD

The District Superintendent shall be chairman of the Examining and Educational Board by virtue of his office.

No. 10 CAMP MEETING EXPENSE

Churches are to be rated according to their financial strength and part of the Camp Meeting expense shall be raised among the churches of the District. The District Council shall prorate the expense among the churches. Recognized ministers of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, their wives and children sixteen years old and under shall be entertained free of charge for camp and conference.

No. 11 RESOLUTIONS

No resolution shall be presented to this conference until it has been type-written and signed.

No. 12 CONFERENCE BAR

Th first ten seats in the three middle sections of the tabernacle and the platform are fixed as the conference bar.

No. 13 SALARIES

The District Superintendent's salary is fixed at a minimum of \$3500.00 per year, plus 5 cents a mile for traveling expenses. The District Treasurer shall receive \$250.00 per year and the District Secretary shall receive \$150.00 per year.

No. 14 STOVES FOR PARSONAGES

The local church shall provide good modern heating and cooking facilities for the parsonage, the type to be suitable to the locality where the parsonage is situated.

No. 15 CREDENTIALS

The District Superintendent shall have read Sections 99, 100 and 101 of the Manual instructing all district licentiates that hereafter they shall appear before the District Examining board at Conference time before their credentials shall be granted.

No. 16 CAMP MEETING FUNDS

The District Treasurer shall submit an itemized report of camp meeting funds as recorded in 1946 Conference Journal, Page 18. This report to appear in the Minutes.

No. 17 APPOINTMENT OF COMMITTEES

The District Superintendent shall appoint all committees. The Standing Committees are to be appointed to include new men where possible and to avoid the duplication of men on several committees.

No. 18. BUILDING COMMITTEE

The District Council shall appoint a district building committee, composed of two ministers and one layman, who have experience in the work of acoustics, architecture and construction. This committee shall council and advise the board of local congregations concerning the construction and disposition of property and the selection of building sites.

No. 19 BURIAL BENEFIT

All actively engaged pastors, evangelists and ministers of the District shall be enrolled in the Ministerial Benefit Association as well as their wives. Cost of membership and calls shall be paid from the Treasuries of the department that employs them. Complete resolution appears in Standing Rule No. 20 of the 1947 Minutes.

No. 20 VACATIONS

It is recommended that our churches grant their ministers a two-weeks vacation with pay.

No. 21 MISSIONARY SOCIETY REPORTS

Be it resolved that a yearly report of each missionary society be printed in the conference minutes.

No. 22

In electing district officers, all shall be elected by open ballot except those nominated by the District Council as provided by the Manual.

No. 23 DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT VACATION

Our District Superintendent shall be given a two-week vacation with pay.

AUDITING COMMITTEE REPORT
