JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

Owosso, Michigan, August 13, 1951

FIRST SITTING

The first sitting of the 51st Annual Conference of the Michigan Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at 9:00 A. M., August 13, at Owosso Bible College Park Tabernacle, Owosso, Michigan.

The Conference was called to order by Rev. R. C. Hawkins, District Superintendent of the Eastern District. Rev. D. Wayne Brown led the conference in the singing of "Leaning on the Everlasting Arms" and "Constantly Abiding". Rev. G. V. Skinner was at the piano.

Rev. C. R. Hendrick, District Superintendent of the Western District, read the scripture lesson using the 4th chapter of Ephesians.

Rev. Hawkins brought a prayer request to the conference concerning the sudden illness of Rev. A. H. Wilson, thus not enabling him to preside at this Conference. Rev. H. T. Mills led in the opening prayer of the conference. Rev. Sturk had been contacted and he requested that Rev. Hawkins act as chairman during Rev. Wilson's absence.

Rev. Hawkins requested that Rev. Mills, a member of the General Board, along with Rev. J. R. Thompson, former District Superintendent and General Board member, to be seated on the platform throughout the conference.

The first order of business was the calling of the roll by Conference Secretary, Rev. G. V. Skinner. The roll was corrected and completed.

The chair called the attention to the standing rule No. 10 as fixing the conference bar. The delegates were asked to move within designated bar.

It was moved and carried that we have the hours of the Conference sittings the same as in the past; 9:00 A. M. to 12:00; 1:30 P. M. to 5:00 P. M. and 7:00 P. M. to 9:00 P. M.

The reports of Rev. C. R. Hendrick, Western District Superintendent and Rev. R. C. Hawkins, Eastern District Superintendent, were read and accepted.

It was moved and carried that the District Secretary act as reporter of this Conference and Camp Meeting to the Advocate.

The following reports were read, corrected and accepted:

Chairman of the Auditing Committee, Rev. Wilbert Walker.

Conference Treasurer, Rev. A. F. Osborn.

Conference Statistician, Rev. H. C. Rickner.

Along with this report, a letter was read from Mrs. Mary Gaylord.

Conference Young People's Treasurer, Rev. H. C. Rickner.

Examining and Educational Board, Rev. L. R. Neff, Secretary.

Michigan Pilgrim, Rev. L. R. Neff, Editor.

A vote of thanks was given Rev. Neff in appreciation of his publishing the Michigan Pilgrim.

Conference Sunday School Secretary, Rev. Carl Messer reported.

An award was presented to the Lapeer Sunday School for having the highest percentage gain and to Detroit First for the highest numerical gain. Also reporting were the:

Conference Missionary Treasurer, Mrs. Lila Manker.

Alumni Treasurer, Rev. H. C. Rickner.

Committee on Memorials, Mrs. Ella Ewers, Chairman.

After the reading of the memorials all joined in the singing of "In The Sweet By and By."

It was moved and carried that the Conference stand and with bowed heads, Rev. B. E. Manker led in prayer in behalf of our boys who are in the service of our country. The Conference all joined in the singing of, "What A Friend."

The Conference Secretary read the recommendations of the Conference Council for Ministerial transfers.

The Chair requested all those outside of the Conference Bar to please move within the Bar.

Rev. K. J. Phillips, Pastor of Detroit 1st, was introduced to the Conference.

Adjourned by expiration of time. Rev. V. L. Draggoo dismissed with prayer.

SECOND SITTING

The second sitting convened at 1:30 P. M. Monday, August 13, 1951, with Rev. Herbert Diller leading in the singing of "When I See the Blood." Miss Ila Bruce was at the piano. Rev. Diller then led in prayer. The scripture lesson from Colossians 3:12-17 was read by Rev. W. D. Phillips.

Rev. Hawkins asked that Rev. Hendrick act as Chairman during this session. Rev. Hendrick brought word that Rev. Wilson was resting better at the noon hour.

Moved and carried that we dispense with the Roll Call.

The minutes of the previous sitting were read and approved.

The Chair ask that Rev. B. O. Shattuck, Former District Superintendent, be seated on the platform.

Mrs. Hubert Hartman was seated as delegate for Owosso inasmuch as the alternates were unable to be present.

Moved and carried that the three new churches namely, Fayette, Flushing and Chesaning be presented and accepted into this conference, and that the pastors with the delegates be seated in the Conference Bar.

The Secretary read a letter of greeting from Rev. H. S. Bennett now in Africa.

Rev. W. D. Phillips, Secretary of the Ways and Means Committee, reported. After the reading of the entire four resolutions, Resolution No. 1 regarding Ministerial Tithes was carried.

The Chair requested that Rev. W. L. Surbrook, former General Superintendent be seated on the platform.

Moved and carried that we interrupt the report of the Ways and Means Committee long enough to hear the report of the Treasurer of Owosso Bible College, Rev. W. L. Surbrook. The report was read and accepted.

Rev. C. E. Moran and Rev. Otho Jennings were introduced to the Conference.

Resolution No. II regarding Owosso Bible College was read and accepted.

Resolution No. III regarding Parsonage Utilities was read and accepted with its amendment.

Resolution No. IV regarding salaries was read and accepted with its amendment.

It was moved and carried that after the reading of the resolutions from the Conference Resolutions Committee we would recess for 5 Minutes. Rev. E. C. Swanson, secretary reported for the Resolutions Committee.

On convening, Rev. G. V. Skinner led in the singing of "Amazing Grace."

Resolution No. I on Editorials was again read and passed.

The following resolutions were read and accepted.

No. II regarding a certified public accountant.

No. III regarding Church Deeds.

No. IV regarding a committee looking into Conference Division as provided by the General Church.

No. V regarding Election of District Superintendents.

No. VI regarding the deleting of paragraph "E" page 17.

Moved and carried that Miss Ruth Alexander favor us with a special song.

It was moved and carried that the first order of business on Tuesday morning be the election of officers.

Miss Alexander then sang, "When We See Christ," after which we adjourned by expiration of time, Rev. B. O. Shattuck dismissing with prayer.

THIRD SITTING

The Third sitting of the Conference convened at 7:00 P. M. Monday, August 13. Rev. Paul Wilcox led in the singing of, "At The Cross."

Rev. Hawkins was in the chair and he reported that Rev. A. H. Wilson was still a very sick man but that he could feel the prayers of the Conference. Rev. A. C. Doehring led in prayer followed by the singing of "My Jesus I Love Thee."

The Minutes of the previous sitting were read and approved.

Moved and carried that the Ministerial Convention be held at Houghton Lake, Michigan.

Rev. B. O. Shattuck gave a word of encouragement to the Conference. He commented on the fine gains numerically, financially and most of all, the gain Spiritually. He assured each minister of his prayers and exhorted all to stay prayerful and spiritual in this day. The Conference joined in the singing of "Onward Christian Soldiers."

Rev. E. C. Swanson again reported for the resolutions Committee.

Res. No. VII regarding the election of the Assistant Superintendent was carried.

Res. No. VIII regarding the mimeographing of the resolutions that concerned finances was also carried.

Res. No. IX with its amendment regarding Editorial changes was carried.

The Ordination service followed with Rev. R. C. Hawkins in charge. Rev. G. V. Skinner led in the singing of "A Charge to Keep" and Rev. L. R. Neff led in prayer. After the prayer the congregation sang, "Rock Of Ages."

The following scriptures were read:

Rev. A. C. Doehring—I Tim. 3.

Rev. D. F. Price—II Tim. 4:1-8.

Rev. C. R. Hendrick—Titus 3:1-11.

Rev. A. S. Joppie, using Matt. 3:1, brought a timely message and charge to the candidates namely, Eldon B. Nelson, James King, Leroy Bruce, Clyde Marshall, Nicholas Fair, Gerald Marquardt and Wm. Watkins.

Rev. Joppie pointed out four things that this Conference was entrusting each young man with. They were:

1. The Doctrines of our church.
2. To conserve the work of God.
3. To study God's word.
4. The expecting them to be a success.

While the Conference gave the right hand of fellowship, "Blest Be the Tie", "I'll Go Where You Want Me To Go", "Where He Leads", "Glory To His Name" and "Oh, How I Love Jesus", were sung.

Adjourned by the expiration of time with the singing of the Doxology. Rev. C. L. Walker dismissed with prayer.

FOURTH SITTING

The fourth sitting of the Conference convened at 9:00 A. M., August 14, 1951. With Miss Ila Bruce at the piano, Rev. John L. Maes led in the singing of "I Will Sing the Wondrous Story". Rev. J. R. Thompson led in prayer. There was a good spirit on the conference and after some rousing testimonies, Rev. Hendrick reported that Rev. A. H. Wilson was improved.

The minutes of the previous sitting were read and approved.

By common consent the first order of business was set aside that we may hear Res. No. 11 from the Resolution Committee.

Resolution No. 11 was read and passed as substituted. It provided for a love offering from the conference to Rev. A. H. Wilson to be taken at this hour.

It was moved and carried that we leave the center section of the tabernacle vacant during the election. The East District and West moving to the respective sides of the tabernacle.

Rev. C. R. Hendrick, chairman appointed the following tellers:

East—John Jordon, Bob Nelson, Ronald Evans, H. Robinson.

West—F. Fairfield, C. Marshall, H. Diller, Woodrow Johnson.

Rev. H. T. Mills was requested to preside at the blackboard.

Rev. A. F. Osborn reported that the love offering for Rev. A. H. Wilson amounted to \$134.42.

The Chair requested that Rev. W. L. Surbrook act as chairman during the election of the District Superintendents. Rev. Surbrook requested that he might be excused from the Conference after the election that he might attend a funeral.

Ballots for the Superintendent were cast.

Election of officers:

Rev. R. C. Hawkins, Eastern District Superintendent.

Rev. C. R. Hendrick, Western District Superintendent.

Rev. A. C. Doehring, Eastern District Assistant Superintendent.

Rev. G. E. Stace, Western District Assistant Superintendent.

While some of the ballots were being counted, Rev. Hawkins introduced Rev. Joseph Jackson to the Conference. Also he introduced Rev. H. B. Krieder who is entering the Evangelistic Field.

Rev. G. V. Skinner was elected as Conference Secretary.

Nominations from the Council for Conference Treasurer were: A. F. Osborn, H. C. Rickner and D. F. Price.

Ballots were cast and Rev. A. F. Osborn was elected.

Ballots were cast for Advisory Council Members from each Dist.

Rev. D. F. Price was elected from the Western District.

Rev. M. L. Goodman was elected from the Eastern District.

Ballots were cast for the last advisory Council Member elected at large. Rev. Howard Rogers was elected.

Moved and carried that we recess until 1:30.

On reconvening Rev. M. DePeal led in the singing of "He Brought Me Out". Rev. R. C. Hawkins was in the chair and he ask that Rev. K. J. Phillips come forward and lead in prayer. All joined in the singing of "I Will Praise Him".

Rev. Hawkins conveyed Rev. A. H. Wilson's heartfelt thanks for the love offering.

The minutes of the previous sitting were read and approved.

Nominees for Educational and Examining Board from the Conference Council were: Rev. L. R. Neff, Rev. A. F. Osborn, Rev. J. R. Thompson.

Rev. L. R. Neff was elected.

Nominees for Conference Trustee from the Council were: H. T. Mills, B. R. Sult and W. L. Surbrook. Ballots were cast.

Moved and carried that this Conference send greetings to Rev. Bennett, Mrs. Walter Gaylord, The General Superintendent, Rev. L. W. Sturk, Miss Orpha Case and Rev. and Mrs. Wilkinson, and The Argus Press. Also that a letter of thanks on behalf of this Conference be sent to Jennings and Lyons for kind services rendered to Rev. A. H. Wilson.

It was reported that Rev. H. T. Mills was elected District Trustee.

Nominations for Trustees of Owosso Bible College were read by the Secretary. They were M. L. Goodman, H. C. Rickner, E. C. Swanson, C. V. Holstein, A. S. Joppie and H. W. Rogers. Ballots were cast.

Moved and carried that we excuse the tellers to count the ballots.

The Chair appointed the following tellers to help: Leroy Bruce, W. Walker, C. Jones, A. H. Williams.

Ballots were cast for the Camp Board.

Moved and carried that the two receiving the highest number of votes be declared elected for three years and the next highest to fill in the unexpired time of Rev. Ballard.

The Chair appointed the following tellers to count these votes. M. DePeal, A. Lacey, R. Dean and L. Silvers.

Moved and carried that we interrupt the elections long enough to hear from the Resolutions Committee regarding the next election. Resolution No. 13 regarding the Council nominating twelve names from which four shall be elected for the committee referred to in resolution No. 4.

The nominations from the council were as follows: A. S. Joppie, L. R. Neff, J. H. Koteskey, W. N. Miller, John Maes, L. N. Nelson, H. C. Rickner, D. W. Brown, H. T. Mills, W. D. Phillips, E. C. Swanson and John Hiatt.

The tellers reported that M. L. Goodman, A. S. Joppie and E. C. Swanson were elected as Owosso Bible College Trustees.

Before the ballots were cast for the Conference Division Committee, it was moved and carried that the four highest be declared elected. Rev. H. T. Mills, Rev. A. S. Joppie, Rev. John Hiatt, Rev. W. N. Miller were elected.

Tellers reported that Rev. J. L. Maes and Rev. D. W. Brown were elected to the Camp Meeting Board for three years. Rev. H. C. Rickner was elected to serve the unexpired time of Rev. Ballard.

Resolution No. X regarding remuneration to the District S. S. Secretary and the Editor of the Michigan Pilgrim was passed.

Resolution No. XII regarding Y. P. Executive Committee meetings quarterly was passed.

Resolution No. XIV concerning Church Extension was passed.

Resolution No. XV regarding thanks to the District Superintendents for presiding at the conference was passed.

Moved and carried that we give \$150.00 to each District Superintendent as a love offering. This amount to be taken out of the Superintendent's fund.

Resolution No. XVI, an appreciation was passed.

Moved and carried that we have 800 copies of the Conference Journal printed.

The motion prevailed expressing appreciation for the flowers brought to the tabernacle platform during Camp and Conference.

Rev. Hawkins and Rev. Hendrick expressed their thanks to the Conference for their good spirit and cooperation during the Conference.

Rev. Hendrick read the Committee appointments.

Moved and carried that we have the names of the churches read who paid their budgets in full.

Adjourned from the Fifty-First Conference with the singing of the Doxology.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Rev. C. R. Hendrick

To the Fifty-First Annual Conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Church of the Michigan District:

I bring greetings to you from all our people of the Western District, and a brief personal report.

Once again I would like to say that I have enjoyed perfect fellowship and complete cooperation of my co-superintendent, Rev. R. C. Hawkins. The District Council has been very helpful and much appreciated as they have helped us to chart the course for this year.

Plans for strengthening our smaller churches last year have in some instances come to fruition this year, and the results are that pastors have received much needed raises in salary and some have been able to pay their first budget money into the district and general church. I have also had the privilege of dedicating new additions to some of these. Bellaire church, where Rev. and Mrs. J. R. Thompson are pastoring, did fine work and we were greeted with an overflow crowd at the dedication service. On a return trip we found the enlarged building comfortably filled. Hastings' church, under the leadership of God and pastor, Rev. Mrs. B. E. Manker has just completed remodeling and have one of the finest auditoriums in the district. This church is going forward in a very gratifying way. The Frankfort church has also taken decisive steps forward in completing the work on the belfry, and the purchase of a fine eight room parsonage. Rev. and Mrs. Fairchild seem to have gotten hold of things there. Cheboygan, where Rev. and Mrs. Ackerman are pastors has purchased a fine church building and they are moving it to a good location. We have hopes that this will be the making of that church. God bless the sacrificing spirit of these people. At Muskegon, where Rev. and Mrs. Price are pastoring, the church has purchased fine property consisting of a church, a large parsonage and a five room bungalow which is being used for Sunday School purposes. This was an excellent buy as the location is good, and gives room for expansion which was sorely needed there. I was delighted to take in twenty-one members the day we re-dedicated the buildings, along with a beautiful Hammond organ.

It has been my privilege to be with all our churches for a week-end or Sunday, visiting several the second and third time besides presiding at all annual meetings except one. I have found a good spirit of evangelism in our churches and several have a fine aggressive program in operation.

Of the home missionary projects under our supervision, the report is good. Republic and Michagamie have made good progress. The indebtedness on the church property has been liquidated, and their Sunday School has topped the sheet several times this year. Rev. and Mrs. Walker are faithful workers. The Heights' pastor, Rev. and Mrs. John Maes have started a Sunday school at Higgins Lake where things look very promising. The Conservation Department gave us a deed to a very desirable piece of property there consisting of approximately two and one half acres. At present they are worshipping in a nice little building which we hope to buy and place on this beautiful sight. Our prospects at Niles looks a little discouraging at present, since the people in charge of the community building have asked us to vacate, which leaves us without a place to worship.

Again this year we are going to present to you a fine new church. Rev. and Mrs. Polmonteer have certainly been led of the Lord in their labours at Fayette. These people were granted permission by the council to go to Fayette last conference. This conference they come to us with an organized church consisting of twenty-four fine members, and have under construction a beautiful church building and parsonage

which is more than half way completed. They hope to be able to move into both before cold weather. These buildings are being constructed of cinder blocks, located in one of the most picturesque places in Michigan. May the blessings of God be on these good home missionary people.

This has been another year of expansion, and demands have been placed upon us that will call for sacrifice. A new administration building for our Bible College is nearing completion. This building, like everything else, has been under inflationary conditions, but if we will meet the challenge that will be ours when the Ways and Means Committee present their resolution to us, we can pay for it with "inflationary dollars." Only God knows what Owosso Bible College has meant and does mean to the Kingdom and the Pilgrim Holiness Church. One man speaking of other schools said, "Our schools do not seem to turn out the preachers that Owosso College does." How true this is, can be seen in the fact that this year alone, no less than four graduates will go into churches in the Michigan District to enter the calling for which God and Owosso Bible College has prepared them. Let us rise unitedly and as one, in full support of the debt retirement resolution to be passed by this conference.

As we take our places in conference this year, we notice with sadness a few seats that are empty, and we are reminded that life is transitory. Our beloved brother, Rev. T. H. Hoos has finished writing his glowing page in history and has gone to claim the crown that should rest easily upon his head. His faithfulness and sacrifice will not be forgotten. Rev. Gaylord and Rev. Ewers, who have also gone to be with Him who gave all, will be greatly missed. May God rest their souls . . .

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Rev. R. C. Hawkins

To the fifty-first Annual Conference of the Michigan District: "Grace be to you and peace from God the Father, and from our Lord Jesus Christ who gave himself for our sins, that he might deliver us from this present evil world according to the will of God and our father: To whom be glory forever and ever."

It has been a real privilege and pleasure again this year to labor for you and with you. No finer people live on earth than the ministers and members of the Pilgrim Holiness Church. Especially I have enjoyed working this year with my efficient co-laborer, Reverend C. R. Hendrick, along with all those who labor only for God's glory.

The year that has just closed has seen two soldiers of the Cross from the Eastern District of the Michigan Conference translated to heavenly glories. They are—Reverend E. F. Ewers, a Pilgrim pioneer who mightily blasted sin and the devil for more than a half century, and Reverend Grace Lamb from Croswell, who, too, has served the Kingdom for many years. "Precious in the sight of the Lord is the death of his saints."

An undeclared war, and uncertain international situation, and a tragic inflationary spiral coupled with loose morals, drunkenness and debauchery that is so prevalent today, is constantly complicating the work of God more and more. However, God has promised to be with us right down through the end. Thus, our church is to hold aloft the banner of "Holiness unto the Lord" until he comes. With this in mind our Michigan Pilgrims refuse to go on the defensive but rather are on the offensive against sin for God and the cause of Holiness. The venturing faith, deep determination, and aggressive action of our fine consecrated ministers and devoted laymen have enabled us to make consistent gains in all the major departments of our Conference. Our membership gain this year is more than half the total of any other District for the last five years. Our Sunday School and youth work is on the march. Daily vacation Bible Schools, Junior churches and departmentalized Sunday Schools reveal a growing appreciation for the worth of a child and the value of getting him to God while he is a child. This is one of the most heartening signs on our church horizon. Revival fires have rather freely burned in many Pilgrim hearts and in a number of churches this year with good results. May such fires ever burn in all of our hearts and may genuine Holy Ghost revivals characterize our church until Jesus comes.

At a considerable financial sacrifice to himself, the Reverend T. M. Fast has led the Ecorse Pilgrims out of dark days into a light of progress that shines more and more. Reverend H. C. Rickner and his good people at Kingston are setting a notable record in Sunday School work, with thirty-five consecutive months gain over the previous year. All other phases of this church are growing proportionately.

Detroit First, under the capable leadership of Reverend K. J. Phillips, is making unusual progress. The same is true of Detroit Greeley, where Reverend LeRoy Bruce is so effectively laboring. Reverend H. W. Rogers, and his fine church in Port Huron, have taken in thirty new members this year and continue to progress excellently in all other aspects of the work. Honorable mention could be made of many others, for most of our ministers and churches really mean business and are diligently working at the job.

The following material improvements have been made in the Eastern District of our Conference:

Ann Arbor—Reverend Raymond Dean, Pastor—Tile floor in the church building.

Bay City—Reverend P. H. Emlinger, Pastor—Building a very beautiful fireproof church building that is 40 feet by seventy feet. They are already worshipping in the basement.

Breckenridge—Reverend C. E. Morgan, Pastor—Built an unusually fine superstructure on their basement church. The size of this building is also forty feet by seventy feet.

Brightmoor—Reverend Wilbert Walker, Pastor—Purchased an Episcopal church and re-modelled it into an exceptionally fine church. This is practically all paid for.

Clio—Reverend W. L. Silvers, Pastor—Modernized the parsonage.

Detroit First—Reverend K. J. Phillips, Pastor—Installed new pews in the church.

Detroit Greeley—Reverend LeRoy Bruce, Pastor—Erected a very beautiful superstructure over their basement church.

Detroit Third—Reverend M. E. DePeal, Pastor—Began the construction of a new auditorium.

Dearborn—Reverend Ruth Alexander, Pastor—Completely redecorated the church building and purchased a new parsonage.

Dryden—Reverend C. L. Walker, Pastor—Began construction of a lovely fireproof auditorium.

Flint Brown Street—Reverend W. D. Phillips, Pastor—Building a forty by forty addition to the church building and re-modelling the entire structure. This will be one of our finest churches.

Flint, Hill Road—Reverend William Watkins, Pastor—Enlarged the basement and erected a beautiful brickcrete superstructure over the entire basement.

Flint, Pasadena Avenue—Reverend Russell Barkman, Pastor—Erected a lovely forty by sixty fireproof church building that is almost perfectly located and ideally built.

Wayne—Reverend N. N. Fair, Pastor—Completely remodelling entire church.

Monroe—Reverend J. A. Hiatt, Pastor—Completed the first unit of their new church. This is the finest basement I have ever seen. They are now raising money and buying material to finish the superstructure according to plan.

Owosso—Reverend M. L. Goodman, Pastor—Built the most beautiful church in Owosso and certainly one of the finest in our movement. This large brick building is ideal in many respects.

Saginaw—Reverend J. I. Bare, Pastor—Built a sizable addition to the church building and completely re-decorated the entire structure.

Utica—Reverend F. D. Reed, Pastor—Modernized the parsonage.

Willow Run—Reverend J. H. Morningstar, Pastor—Enlarged and modernized the church building.

Two new churches have been organized in my District this year. Last April the group at Chesaning were organized with fifteen charter members. Reverend Melvin Farrand is successfully laboring here. About a month ago the Hopson Mission was organized into a Pilgrim Holiness Church with twenty-five charter members. Reverend B. B. Taylor is effectively laboring here.

All in all this is one of the best years the Michigan District has ever had. With "perilous times" upon us and trouble on every hand, now is the time for us to give to a poor world the glorious message that we have. With courageous effort born of unwavering faith in God, we triumphantly march into the new year determined by the grace of God to do exploits for God.

That which follows is my personal report.

CONFERENCE MEMORIALS

Rev. Grace Lamb

Rev. Grace Lamb was born in Grant Township, St. Clare County, August 7, 1877. She went to Heaven Oct. 24 at 5 P.M., from the "Crowe Convalescent Home" at Fort Wayne, Indiana at the age of 73 years, 2 month and 17 days. She was saved and sanctified in her early years and called to preach the Word of God. In the year of 1912 she responded to the call to be Matron of Bible Holiness Seminary, Owosso, Michigan. She served there for 14 years. She also served in Kingswood Holiness College, Kingswood, Kentucky for two years. After that she served in Frankfort, Indiana as matron of the Pilgrim College for five years. For the past 18 years she has been the Associate Pastor in Fort Wayne Tabernacle.

She is survived by one sister, Mrs. Lester Cole, of Jeddo, Michigan and 24 nieces and nephews. She was a good preacher, matron and teacher. She was firm, but kind. One said when they went to her for council, she would reply, "Mind God." She was loved by all who knew her. July 4, 1950 she went to Indianapolis, Indiana, to visit some missionaries and rest a while from the cares of the work in Fort Wayne. For sometime she had been trusting the Lord alone for her body and seemed to be gaining almost daily. A short time after going to Indianapolis however, her body was again overtaken with disease to the extent that it was necessary to remove her to the Robert Long Hospital in Indianapolis. For eight weeks she hovered between life and death in the hospital being under an oxygen tent most of that time. Every conscious moment was spent in prayer, not for her own body as one would suppose, but for the souls of the lost and dying and for the up-building of the Kingdom. A young lady whose name was Carol Smith writes us that she was with Sis. Lamb for four years from the very start of her blindness until she was totally blind. She said "never once did He fail to come to her rescue." One Saturday as Carol walked into her hospital room, she said "Sing 'Your Roses May Have Thorns'" and when she heard Carol's voice, she said "Carol, Praise God I've had a few thorns but a great many roses."

On October she returned to Fort Wayne, to the Crowe Nursing Home, where her many friends and fellow pastors paid her their last tribute. On the last Sunday she lived she sent for a couple to come and see her. They went to her. She knew their voices. She asked one of them to pray. She said, "I won't be here long, but the way is still bright." She died at 3:15 P.M. on October 24, 1950. Funeral services were held on Thursday, Oct. 26 at the Trinity Gospel Church, Fort Wayne, Indiana, Rev. W. J. Van Dree officiating. Rev. and Mrs. Everett Shelhamer singing. Funeral services were also conducted at the Jeddo Church at Jeddo, Michigan where she was a member, on Thursday October 27, 1950. The pastor, Rev. D. Wayne Brown officiated. Interment was in the Croswell cemetery. "Blessed are the dead which die in the Lord, From henceforth; yea, saith the Spirit, that they may rest from their labours; and their works do follow them." Rev. 14:13.


Rev. Thomas H. Hoos was born in Tiffin, Ohio, August 7, 1879. He went to Heaven from "University Hospital" Ann Arbor, Michigan, June 27, 1951 at 3:30 A.M., at the age of 71 years, 11 months and 10 days. He was united in marriage to Miss Carrie Crumpen, August 7, 1905. To this union was born four children, three sons, Charles, John and Robert. One daughter, Elizabeth and thirteen grandchildren. Bro. Hoos was saved at 17 years of age. He spent 52 years in active ministry. Thirty-six years of that time was preaching in the Pilgrim Holiness Church. He held nine different pastorates in the State of Michigan. He was treasurer of the District Conference for eight years. One of his comforting thoughts during his sickness was that all four of his children were saved and

serving the Lord. He was a kind faithful husband and father, a good pastor and preacher. His faithful wife and eldest son were by his side when he died. His last days in the hospital up to the day of surgery (20 days) were filled with service for his Saviour. He would read the Bible to patients and attendants and prayed with several patients. He was a faithful servant for the Lord seeing many saved and sanctified under his ministry in Michigan and elsewhere. Funeral services were held in the Pilgrim Holiness church at Hastings. Rev. L. W. Sturk had charge, preaching from Psalms 115 and the 15th verse, "Precious in the sight of the Lord is the death of His Saints." He was assisted by Rev. Hawkins, Rev. Hendricks, Rev. J. R. Thompson and Rev. Johnson. Singing in charge of Rev. Skinner and wife. Burial took place in Woodland Cemetery.

Rev. Edwin Freeman Ewers was born January 29, 1866 on a farm four miles south of Dansville, Mich. He went to Heaven from his home in Owosso, Michigan, November 3, 1950. He was united in marriage to Miss Ella E. Shaw, October 23, 1889. To this union were born three children, one daughter, Flossie, and two sons, Paul and Silas. Silas went to be with Jesus at the age of 1 year and 3 months. The others survive. Bro. Ewers was saved in the spring of 1893 and was sanctified in 1895. He entered God's Bible School in 1901 at Cincinnati, Ohio. His ministry covered a period of over 48 yrs. Pastoral activity took him to Phelps and Ellsworth, Owosso, Detroit First and Second churches, Jeddo, Jackson, Durand, Pontiac, Pigeon, Michigan and elsewhere in other states. "Precious in the sight of the Lord is the death of His Saints." Ps. 116:15.

One outstanding characteristic of Rev. Ewers was his love for and devotion for God. God was always first in his life. He was an ardent seeker after the will of God. His love for the Bible was very distinct, and one could readily see how much he used it by looking at its pages. Thumb and pencil marks spoke of how often he studied it. He always believed it was the only safe guide to Heaven.

This man had a sweet spirit. He believed and practiced St. Paul's injunction, "Be ye kind, tender-hearted forgiving one another even as God for Christ's sake hath forgiven you." During the first world war, when patriotism was at its highest, he was falsely charged and brought into court. Wicked men were hurling charges of wrong against him of which he was not guilty, but all during the trial his spirit remained calm and tender. At the close of the trial the very first man he went to was the man who made the charges that brought him into court, saying to him "God bless you, I am praying for you," then turning to the officer of the court he said the same thing. Those men were tendered by his Christ-like spirit and said, "Now Rev. you have suffered enough." His sweet spirit convinced them he was not guilty.

He loved his church and was always interested in praying for and doing things that would aid the church in its fight against sin. The standards of the church were not grievous to him as he always found delight living up to the standards held. He opposed sin and the Devil to the end. He laid off his armor in honor because of a spotless character here upon earth waiting for that glorious resurrection morning when we all shall meet on the fair banks of glad deliverance never to part again. He kept the faith to the end and now is safe in the arms of Jesus.

Rev. Walter Gaylord

Rev. Walter Gaylord was born October 25, 1912 in Brome Count, New York and went to Heaven October 7, 1950 at 8:15 P.M., from the home of Mr. and Mrs. Albert Hammerstrom, Kent City, Michigan. He was united in marriage to Miss Mary Loew, March 18, 1939 at Burnips, Michigan. Both are members of the Pilgrim Holiness Church in the State of Michigan. In 1947 Rev. Mr. and Mrs. Gaylord went to Africa as missionaries, serving under the National Holiness Missionary Society, where they spent nearly 3 years in service. Walter was taken very ill and the Doctor advised him to immediately return by air for further medical treatment in the States. After an operation for months he seemed better; then suddenly his health began to fail again. Everything was done for his comfort. Many prayers were offered in his behalf, but God in His providence called Walter to higher service. He carried a great burden for the lost during his sickness. He pled for the Komos Valley men: old men whom he loved so well.

Bro. Gaylord not only prayed for the Africans, he prayed and wept for unsaved loved ones, and neighbors. His sick room was a place of prayer. His home-going was triumphant. God's saints die well. The funeral was held Oct. 10, 1950 at 2:00 P.M. at the Methodist Church in Kent City, Michigan. There were several ministers who took part in the funeral. The pastor of the church took charge—Rev. F. A. Webb read some scripture, Rev. M. L. Goodman, Pastor of the Owosso Pilgrim Holiness Church, where Walter was a member, preached the funeral sermon, he chose for his text II Cor. 5:1 "For we know that if our earthly house of this Tabernacle were dissolved, we have a building of God, an house not made with hands, eternal in the Heavens." Others who took part were Rev. A. S. Joppie of Grand Rapids, Rev. J. H. Koteskey, pastor at Burnips, Michigan, the men's quartet of the Owosso P. H. Church and Rev. and Mrs. D. F. Price sang. Rev. H. T. Mills former President of Owosso Bible College, spoke of his intimate acquaintance and contacts with the deceased. He was followed by Dr. G. R. Warner, Secretary of the National Holiness Missionary Society, who spoke of the good work that Bro. and Sister Gaylord had done. There were 30 ministers present.

Bro. Gaylord was a man of integrity, honest, upright and with the smile he carried, would win the heart of most any sinner. His every day life told he was a Godly man.

CONFERENCE RESOLUTIONS

1. Church Budget.

Be it resolved that Standing Rules No. 2 and No. 3 be combined to read as follows:

Each church shall raise for the General Budget the Equivalent of \$5.50 per member, and for the Conference Budget the equivalent of \$9.50 per member; the conference Budget to be divided as follows: Conference Home Missions \$2.00; Conference Home Missions Loan Fund \$1.25; Conference expense \$.50; Owosso Bible College Debt Retirement \$3.00; Owosso Bible College \$1.50; Ministerial Relief \$1.00; General Delegate Expense \$.25.

Vacations.

Be it resolved that Standing Rules No. 18 and No. 21 be combined to read as follows:

It is recommended that our churches grant their pastors a two-week vacation with pay. The District Superintendents shall be given a two-week vacation with pay.

Election of Officers.

Be it resolved that Standing Rules No. 20 and No. 22 be combined to read as follows:

In electing District Officers, all shall be elected by open ballot except those nominated by the Conference Council as provided by the Manual. There shall be no elimination of the names of Candidates before an election.

Parsonage Utilities.

Be it resolved that Standing Rules No. 12 and No. 24 be combined to read as follows:

The local church shall provide good modern heating and cooking facilities for the Parsonage, the type to be suitable to the locality where the parsonage is situated. The Conference shall provide the same for the District parsonages.

2. Be it resolved that all treasurers' books of the District Conference and Owosso Bible College be audited annually by a certified public accountant so that a report from the auditor can be given to the Conference when called for.

Be it further resolved that the council secure an auditor.

3. Whereas some local church properties are not deeded according to the Pilgrim Holiness Church Manual:—therefore Be it resolved that upon the first visit of the District Supt. he shall check all local church property deeds with the local board and steps necessary shall be taken to correct mis-deeded properties.

4. Whereas—the action of the last General Conference has restricted a divided Conference to four years,—Be it resolved that this conference form a committee of seven members consisting of the two District Supt., the District Treasurer and four members elected at large who are not members of the District Council. Said committee shall present to the next Conference studied details leading towards a permanent division.

5. Substitute for Para. A. Page 17.

The delegates of each district shall elect a District Superintendent to serve their respective fields.

6. We recommend that paragraph "E" be deleted and paragraph "F" to be known as "E".

7. Substitute "B" page 17.

The delegates of each district shall elect an assistant Supt. from their respective districts.

8. Be it resolved that mimeographed copies of all resolutions pertaining to finances be sent to all pastors immediately following the Conference.

9. Regarding making Conference resolutions become standing rules. Page 17, No. 2. The last half of the first paragraph—

No. 3 regarding the camp board.

No. 6. regarding recall of pastor—page 18.

No. 13 in full.

No. 15 as amended "Be it resolved that the order of business on the first night of the Conference shall be the Ordination Service.

10. Whereas our District S. S. Secretary and the Editor of the Michigan Pilgrim spend many hours each month in the work of their office, be it resolved that the District Council be authorized to remunerate them from District Funds.

11. Whereas our presiding officer was stricken ill while in our Conference we therefore recommend that a love offering be received from this Conference for him at this time.

12. Inasmuch as there is need of more intensive young people's activities during the Conference year, therefore be it resolved that the Conference Young People's Executive Committee hold quarterly business meetings.

13. Be it resolved that the District Council shall nominate twelve names, six from each district from which shall be elected the committee of four referred to in resolution No. 4.

14. The Michigan Conference Church Extension policy, Constitution and By-Laws.

15. Whereas the Conference appreciates the efficient and faithful services rendered by our District Superintendents in presiding over the Conference, be it resolved that a rising vote of thanks be given them.

16. Whereas the Conference appreciates the good work done by the Camp Meeting Board in preparing the Campus and buildings, we recommend that a rising vote of thanks be given them.

17. Whereas our present Conference comprises approximately seventy-two churches we therefore recommend that we shall have one conference, and one council, with two districts.

Each district shall have a full time District Superintendent with full authority in his respective district.

In view of General Conference action, our Conference shall be divided on Highway Routes 27 North of Lansing to St. Ignace and 127 South of Lansing. That the divided areas be known as Eastern District and Western District. All towns and cities including their suburbs located on this boundary line shall be in the Western District. Inasmuch as Upper Michigan lies mostly West of this recommended division, we consider this part of the state to be included also in the Western District.

The following rules would apply:

A. The Delegates of each district shall elect a District Superintendent to serve their respective fields.

B. The delegates of each district shall elect an assistant Supt. from their respective Districts.

C. We recommend that the Conference Council consist of nine members as follows: Two District Superintendents, Two Assistant Superintendents, Conference Secretary, Conference Treasurer, three advisory members, one elected at large and one from each District.

D. We recommend that the District Superintendents alternate in presiding at the Council Meetings unless otherwise required by emergencies.

E. We recommend that the District Superintendents be members of the Camp Meeting Board by virtue of their office.

18. Whereas there is a grave need for seating and tables on the grounds, therefore, be it resolved that adequate provision for such be made.

19. We recommend that the trustees of each local church shall investigate the insurance coverage upon all local church property, and that the Trustees recommend to the local church board an increase in their insurance where necessary.

20. Be it resolved that on the two Sundays during camp meeting that there be a Sunday School session beginning at 9:30 until 10:15 following the testimony meeting; and that said session be arranged and supervised by the Sunday School Committee.

Be it further resolved that a credit card be given to all in attendance, and that each card be signed and returned by the pupil to their local church Sunday School Secretary for the attendance record and reports to the Conference.


21. Be it resolved that this Conference authorize the District Council to enlarge the Tabernacle.

22. We recommend that the local Missionary Societies of the respective zones meet at least once a year for their promotional work. Such meeting shall be arranged for and organized by the chairman of the Zone Home Missionary Committee.

23. We recommend that Zone Home Missionary Committees be comprised of at least three Ministerial members, a chairman, who is to be the first man elected, two additional members and the Young People's Zone Chairman, to work with the District Superintendent in Church Extension work.

We further recommend that the respective Zones shall follow the same pattern as the District Young People's Societies Organization.

We further recommend that the Pastors of each Zone organize at the same time the first Young People's Zone Rally is held in their respective Zone.



RESOLUTIONS OF THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

1. Whereas the matter of the Conference regulating the ministerial tithe has been in the past subject to too much discussion and some dissatisfaction, and, whereas, the support of the District Superintendents is beyond question a necessary part of our conference financial program:

Therefore, be it resolved that Standing Rule No. 5 on page 19 of the Conference Journal be changed to read:

"The local church treasurer shall send to the Conference Treasurer along with the monthly budget, the equivalent of 10 per cent of the pastor's salary for the District Superintendent's fund.

Also, ministers doing secular work shall turn one-half of their tithe to the Conference budget."

All other licensed and ordained ministers shall turn 10 per cent of their ministerial income to the District Superintendent's fund.

2. Whereas the present income of the debt retirement fund is inadequate, therefore, be it resolved that the debt retirement fund be raised to \$3.00 per member.

We further recommend that a representative of Owosso Bible College visit the churches annually and conduct a service in the interest of the school assisting the pastor in the raising of the school budget.

3. Inasmuch as there is not a uniform method in providing all utilities for the parsonages, therefore, be it resolved that all churches in the Michigan Conference provide the utilities for the parsonages. Furthermore be it resolved that this be a Standing Rule in the Conference. This is also to include the two District parsonages.

4. Be it resolved that Standing Rule No. 11 page 19 of the Conference Journal be changed to read: The District Superintendent's salary is fixed at a minimum of \$3,750.00 per year, plus five cents per mile for traveling expenses. The Conference Treasurer shall receive \$350.00 per year, and the Conference Secretary shall receive \$250.00 per year, and the Conference Statistician \$75.00 per year.

STANDING RULES

No. 1. Conference Year

The Conference year shall close June 30, and complete reports must be reviewed by the local boards and forwarded directly to the Conference Statistician, Rev. H. C. Rickner, Kingston, Michigan by July 15. All reports received after July 15 shall be omitted from the yearly report.

No. 2 Church Budget

Each church shall raise for the General Budget the equivalent of \$5.50 per member, and for the Conference Budget the equivalent of \$9.50 per member; the conference budget to be divided as follows: Conference Church Extension \$2.00; Conference Church Extension Loan Fund \$1.25; Conference Expense \$.50; Owosso Bible College Debt Retirement \$3.00; Owosso Bible College \$1.50; Ministerial Relief \$1.00; General Delegate Expense \$.25.

No. 3. District and General Fund

All moneys raised in the local church for district and general work shall be sent to the Conference Treasurer, who shall forward general funds to the General Treasurer.

No. 4. Ministerial Tithes

The local Church Treasurer shall send to the Conference Treasurer along with the monthly budget, the equivalent of 10 per cent of the pastor's salary for the District Superintendent's fund.

Also, ministers doing secular work shall turn one-half of their tithe to the conference budget.

All other licensed and ordained ministers shall turn 10 per cent of their ministerial income to the District Superintendent's fund.

No. 5. Pastors at Camp Meeting

Inasmuch as our pastors are expected to support and attend the Annual Camp Meeting, each church shall provide the equivalent of the pastor's offering or salary for the two Sundays of the Camp and the pastor shall be privileged to attend the entire Camp Meeting.

No. 6 Examining and Educational Board

The District Superintendents shall be chairmen of the Examining and Educational Board by virtue of their office.

No. 7 Camp Meeting Expense

Churches are to be rated according to their financial strength and part of the Camp Meeting expense shall be raised among the churches of the District. The District Council shall prorate the expense among the churches. Recognized ministers of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, their wives and children sixteen years old and under shall be entertained free of charge for camp and conference.

No. 8. Resolutions

No resolution shall be presented to this Conference until it has been type-written and signed.

No. 9. Conference Bar

The first ten seats in the three middle sections of the tabernacle and the platform are fixed as the Conference Bar.

No. 10. Salaries

The District Superintendent's salaries are fixed at a minimum of \$3750.00 per year, plus 5 cents a mile for traveling expenses. The Conference Treasurer shall receive \$350.00 per year, the Conference Secretary shall receive \$250.00 per year and the District Statistician \$75.00 per year.

No. 11. Parsonage Utilities

The local church shall provide good modern heating and cooking facilities for the Parsonage, the type to be suitable to the locality where the parsonage is situated. All churches in the Michigan Conference are to provide the utilities for the parsonages. The conference shall provide the same for the District Parsonages.

No. 12. Credentials

The District Superintendents shall have read Sections 99, 100 and 101 of the Manual instructing all district licentiates that hereafter they shall appear before the District Examining Board at Conference time before their credentials shall be granted.

No. 13. Camp Meeting Funds

The Conference Treasurer shall submit an itemized report of Camp meeting funds as recorded in the 1946 Conference Journal, page 13. This report to appear in the minutes.

No. 14. Appointment of Committees

The District Superintendents shall appoint all committees. The Standing Committees are to be appointed to include new men where possible and to avoid the duplication of men on several committees.

No. 15. Building Committee

The Conference Council shall appoint a Conference Building Committee, composed of two ministers and one layman, who have experience in the work of acoustics, architecture and construction. This committee shall council and advise the board of local congregations concerning the construction and disposition of property and the selection of building sites.

No. 16. Burial Benefit

All actively engaged pastors, evangelists and ministers of the Conference shall be enrolled in the Ministerial Benefit Association as well as their wives. Cost of membership and calls shall be paid from the treasuries of the department that employs them. Complete resolution appears in Standing Rule No. 20 of the 1947 Minutes.

No. 17. Vacations

It is recommended that our churches grant their pastors a two-week vacation with pay. The District Superintendents shall be given a two-week vacation with pay.

No. 18. Missionary Society Reports

A yearly report of each missionary society shall be printed in the Conference Minutes.

No. 19. Election of Officers

In electing District Officers, all shall be elected by open ballot except those nominated by the Conference Council as provided by the Manual. There shall be no elimination of the names of Candidates before an election.

No. 20. Ministerial Convention

The Ministerial Convention shall be held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in February.

No. 21. Young People's Officers

Be it resolved that we elect a Young People's President and Vice-President for the Eastern District and Young People's President and Vice-President for the Western District with one Treasurer and one Secretary for the Conference.

No. 22. Camp Board

Be it resolved that a Camp Meeting Board of six members be elected in the following manner; 2 members to be elected for 3 years; the next two elected, are to serve 2 years and the last two elected for 1 year. Following this: two members shall be elected annually for a 3 year term. Board duties: Secure all manual workers for Camp and Conference; Supervise grounds and buildings; Purchase good and necessary equipment for Camp and Conference; Have charge of all advertising.

No. 23. Recall of Pastor

Be it resolved that the second week of May shall be designated as the time for the churches of our Conference to vote on the recall of the pastor.

No. 24. Retiring Superintendent

Be it resolved that whenever there shall be elected another District Superintendent, that the Conference Council take steps to fill the pastorate left vacant by the recommending of the retiring superintendent to that church as Pastor. The Conference Council may also recommend him to the field of evangelism.

No. 25. Ordination Service

Be it resolved that the order of business on the first night of the Conference be the Ordination service.
