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## JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS Owosso, Michigan, August 9, 1954

#### FIRST SETTING

The first sitting of the 54 Annual Conference of the Michigan Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at 9:00 a. m., August 9, 1954 at Owosso Bible College Park Tabernacle, Owosso, Michigan.

The Conference was called to order by Rev. R. C. Hawkins, Conference Superintendent. Rev. Paul Trissel led the conference in the singing of "When the Roll is Called Up Yonder" and "You may Look for Me." Rev. G. V. Skinner was at the piano. Rev. P. H. Emlinger led in the opening prayer. Rev. Hawkins then presented Rev. L. W. Sturk, General Superintendent, as the presiding officer of the Conference. Rev. Sturk addressed the conference using the subject "Misunderstandings". He stated that most of the heartaches that come to God's people, come through misunderstandings. He gave three reasons why we shouldn't judge one another.

A. Every servant standeth or falleth before his own master.

- B. There is coming a day of judgment. Every one will then stand before the judgment seat of Christ.
- C. We do not know the motives of the hearts of men.

II. Practice the law of expedience.

III. If you are to get along with the brethren, then love the brethren.

The first order of business was the calling of the roll by Conference Secretary, Rev. G. V. Skinner. It was moved that we substitute delegates where the regular alternates are absent. This motion was amended that after this conference year, no delegates unless they are elected by their respective church shall be seated in the Conference.

It was moved and carried that we have the hours of the conference sittings the same as in the past, 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon; 1:30 to 5:00 p.m., and 7:00 to 9:00 p.m.

Rev. Alton Finney, who for the past 4 years was the superintendent of the Idaho-Washington District and Mr. Darwin Ray of Rockford, Michigan were introduced to the Conference.

Rev. R. C. Hawkins, District Superintendent read his report. The Conference Secretary responded to Rev. Hawkins' farewell address. He expressed the gratefulness of this Conference, both Ministerial and Lay, and wished Rev. and Mrs. Hawkins family "God's Speed".

It was moved and carried that we accept this report and the response.

It was moved and carried that we, as a Conference, take a love offering for Rev. and Mrs. Hawkins in appreciation of their services rendered this Conference.

Rev. Hawkins gave a word of appreciation for the offering and their kindness to them.

It was moved and carried that all ministers be allowed seat within the Conference Bar.

The Chair called for verbal reports from the two Assistant Superintendents. Both reports were accepted. Rev. Hawkins gave a word of appreciation to these men for their work. Rev. and Mrs. J. H. Morningstar, Rev. and Mrs. J. C. Brillhart were introduced to the Conference. It was moved and carried that these visitors be given a seat within the Conference Bar.

Rev. A. F. Osborn, Conference Treasurer, reported. It was moved carried that we accept this report.

Miss Carr, Dean of Women of Eastern Bible College, was introduced to the Conference.

It was moved and carried that we adjourn. Rev. Sturk dismissed with prayer.

#### SECOND SETTING

The second sitting convened at 1:30 p.m. with Rev. D. Wayne Brown leading in the singing of "Leaning on the Everlasting Arms". Rev. C. E. Moran led in prayer.

The minutes of the previous sitting were read and approved.

Rev. and Mrs. W. E. Sexton of Jackson and Rev. and Mrs. Richard Miller of California were introduced to the Conference

The following reports were read and accepted as follows:

Conference Sunday School Secretary, Carl Messer. An award was presented to the Battle Creek Second Sunday School for the highest percentage gain and to the Monroe Sunday School for the highest numerical gain. Thirty-four Sunday Schools received awards for a gain of six percent or over. A rising vote of thanks was given Rev. Messer in appreciation for his fine work.

Reporting also was Cebert Walker, Conference Young People's Treasurer. His report included a resume of the Youth Camp.

Rev. W. L. Surbrook, Treasurer, Owosso Bible College, read his report which was accepted by the Conference.

Rev. Alvin Jackson, from Proton, Ontario and Rev. Floyd McCallum were introduced to the Conference. It was moved and carried that Rev. Jackson have a seat in the Conference Bar.

Conference Statistician, Rev. J. H. Koteskey reported. His report was accepted.

The following reports were read and accepted:

Michigan Pilgrim Editor and Treasurer, Rev. L. R. Neff.

Owosso Bible College Alumni Association, Rev. V. L. Draggoo, Treasurer.

The Conference Secretary presented the following Ministerial transfers, namely; Rev. Howard Rogers, Mrs. Howard Rogers, Rev. Floyd Mc Callum, Rev. Eugene Friesen, Rev. Robert Price, Rev. Roger Bassett and Rev. Alton Finney,, Rev. Roy Webster and Rev. Wm. Eversdyke. These were accepted as recommended by the Conference Council.

It was moved and carried that we receive two new churches into the Conference, namely; Ferndale with the delegate and Battle Creek Second with the delegate.

The next order of business was the election of officers. Rev. R. C. Hawkins appointed the following tellers; Gene Erickson, Wayne Greve, Ted Neeley, Willard Gilroy, Ernest Klein and Lawrence W. Neff. Rev. Neff again reported for the Examining and Educational Board, which report was accepted.

After announcements Conference adjourned. Rev. B. O. Shattuck dismissed with prayer.

#### THIRD SETTING

The third sitting of the conference convened at 7:00. Rev. G. V. Skinner led in the singing of "The Solid Rock".

First order of business was the Ordination Service. Rev. Skinner led in the singing of "A Charge to Keep I Have". The following scriptures were read: II Tim. 4: 1-8 by Rev. H. C. Rickner; I Tim. 3: 1-9 by Rev. E. C. Swanson to the candidates, Rev. Earnest Thomas, Rev. and Mrs. Robert Ackerman and Rev. and Mrs. Meredith House. Rev. R. C. Hawkins led in prayer.

Rev. Sturk then addressed the candidates using the subject "How to succeed in the Christian Ministry". He exhorted them to be sure of their standing with the Lord and of their calling. He warned them of the necessity of being humble and avoiding the sin of criticism. He charged them to be loyal to their calling and to their church.

Rev. A. F. Osborn offered prayer in behalf of Rev. Thomas, Rev. Hawkins in behalf of Rev. Ackerman, Rev. Hendrick in behalf of Mrs. Ackerman, Rev. Swanson in behalf of Rev. House and Rev. Sturk in behalf of Mrs. House.

It was moved that we extend the time until 10:00. This motion was amended to read that "we extend the time until we elect a Superintendent". The motion as amended was carried.

Rev. Wm. N. Miller was elected Superintendent.

After announcements, Rev. W. L. Surbrook dismissed with prayer.

#### FOURTH SETTING

The fourth sitting of the Conference convened at 9:00 a.m., Tuesday, August 10, 1954. Rev. Allen LaRose led in the singing of "We'll Work Till Jesus Comes". Rev. Alton Finney led in prayer. Rev. Sturk ask that members of the conference stand and quote different verses of scripture. He then led in the singing of "How Firm a Foundation".

Ballots were cast for the First Assistant Superintendent. Rev. E. C. Swanson was elected.

Rev. A. S. Joppie was elected Second Assistant Superintendent.

Rev. R. C. Hawkins read the nominations for Conference Secretary, namely: Rev. G. C. Skinner, Rev. H. C. Rickner and Rev. D. Wayne Brown,

Rev. Skinner was elected.

The Conference Secretary read the nominations for Conference Treasurer, Rev. A. . Osborn, Rev. G. E. Stace and Rev. C. E. Messer. Rev. A. F. Osborn was elected Treasurer. Dr. and Mrs. L. C. Philo of Oklahoma were introduced to the Conference and given a seat within the Conference Bar.

A word of appreciation to the Conference was expressed by Rev. Draggoo for the good spirit of cooperation and fellowship shown during the Ministerial Convention held at Alma in February.

It was moved and carried that we put four names on the ballot for the four Council Members. After the ballots were cast, tellers were excused to count these ballots.

The Secretary read the nominations for the Examining and Educational Board; E. C. Swanson, H. T. Mills, and C. R. Hendrick.

After ballots were cast, tellers were excused to count.

Nominations for Conference Trustees were as follows: Lloyd Thompson, M. L. Goodman, and W. L. Silvers. Tellers were again excused to count.

Rev. R. C. Hawkins appointed the following tellers: Allen LaRose, Harry Pyscher, Vaughn Drummond, Philiip Fisher, James Witmer, Robert Betts, H. B. Krieder and William Lyons.

Rev. R. C. Hawkins read the nominations for the Trustees of Owosso Bible College as follows: M. L. Goodman, E. C. Swanson, A. S. Joppie, C. Walker, D. Wayne Brown, H. C. Rickner, M. C. Kittle, J. H. Koteskey and A. F. Osborn.

The tellers reported that Rev. H. T. Mills was elected to the Examining and Educational Board. There was no election for the Conference trustees and ballots were cast again.

Invitations for the Ministerial Convention were from the Monroe, Laning 1st, and Munising churches. The Conference, by standing vote, agreed to go to Monroe.

Rev. M. L. Goodman was elected Conference Trustee.

Moved and carried that we have 800 copies of the Conference Journal printed.

The secretary read the nominations for Camp Meeting Board, namely; Wayne Greve, Earnest Thomas, V. L. Draggoo and Ernest Klein. Also the nominations for Church Extension Board, H. C. Rickner, E. C. Schram and E. C. Swanson.

After announcements the conference recessed until 1:30.

#### FIFTH SETTING

The fifth sitting of the Conference convened at 1:30 p.m. Rev. Loren Brecheisen led in the singing of "Blessed Assurance", "Heavenly Sunshine" and "Oh, say But I'm Glad". Rev. M. C. Kittle led in prayer. The conference was then favored with a special song by "The Brecheisens", after which Rev. Betz gave a word of testimony.

The tellers reported that there were four elected as Advisory Members of the Conference Council, namely: G. E. Stace, M. C. Kittle, M. L. Goodman and H. C. Rickner. It was also reported that M. L. Goodman had been elected to the Board of Trustees of Owosso Bible College. It was moved and carried that we vote on the remaining fourhighest. Ballots were cast and A. S. Joppie and E. C. Swanson were elected.

It was reported that there was no election for the church extension Board.

Ballots were again cast for the Church Extension Board and E. C. Schram was elected.

Regarding the Sunday School Board, the chair ruled that the Council shall name a promotional secretary from among the three elected.

It was moved and carried that the Council make nominations for the Sunday School Board.

The Nominations were: G. E. Stace, E. C. Schram, W. D. Phillips, A. C. Doehring, W. Walker and John Hiatt.

Mr. and Mrs. Harley Lintz of Tulsa, Oklahoma were introduced and welcomed to the Conference.

Mrs. Ewers reported for Memorial Committee. The report was accepted after which Mrs. M. L. Goodman sang "Safe in The Arms of Jesus". All stood in appreciation for this life that had been lived and in appreciation of Rev. H. T. Mills.

Nominations for the Camp Board were, Wayne Greve, Ernest Thomas, V. L. Draggoo and Ernest Klein. Ballots were cast and V. L. Draggoo and Ernest Thomas were elected.

The tellers reported that, W. Walker had been elected to the Sunday School Board for three years, W. D. Phillips for two years and G. E. Stace for 1 year.

Rev. E. C. Schram, secretary, reported for the Resolutions Committee.

The following resolutions were passed: Regarding, Ministerial Convention, Resolutions from the previous Journals to be put in the Standing Rules, and regarding the Conference sessions.

The next resolution regarding a building Committee was amended so as to delete the words "unless they have been drawn by a registered architect". It was then moved and carried that we refer this entire resolution as amended to the committee for redrafting.

After the reading of the resolution concerning a Camp Ground, Rev. E. C. Swanson secretary of the Camp Meeting Ground Committee, reported. It was moved and carried that before proceeding further, we hear the resolution from the Conference Council regarding Owosso Bible College. Mimeographed copies were distributed among the delegates. Rev. Calvin Holstein and Rev. Nathan Hawkes of the Nazarene Church were introduced to the Conference.

Dr. W. L. Surbrook read the proposed Constitution and By Laws of Owosso Bible College, after which the Conference Secretary read a resolution from the District Council recommending the adoption of the same, as follows:

Whereas a resolution was adopted in our last Conference asking that our Conference Council with the College President negotiate with the other Conferences in our Zone for the purpose of incorporating O.B.C. as a Zone College;

And whereas the College Trustee Board has tentatively approved and presented a plan in the form of a Constitution and By-Laws showing how our College would thus be governed;

And whereas our Conference Council had a joint meeting with the Councils of all the other Conferences in our zone, and unanimously approved and agreed to present this Constitution and By-Laws to each of the forth-coming annual Conferences; for ratification;

Therefore, be it resolved, that we tentatively adopt this proposed Constitution and By-Laws, as amended, and reserve the right to consider any amendments from any source on the same before it shall be declared effective.

Adjourned by expiration of time.

#### SIXTH SETTING

The sixth sitting of the Conference convened at 7:00 p.m. Mr. Lloyd Thompson led in singing "At the Cross". Dr. L. C. Philo led in prayer.

The Secretary read transfers from California for Richard Miller and from Ohio for Paul Eversole. It was moved and carried that these be accepted into the conference as recommended by the Council.

It was moved and carried that this Conference petition the Board of Trustees to add the following to the Articles of Incorporation of Owosso Bible College. This property is held "in trust for the use and benefit of the ministry and membership of the Pilgrim Holiness Church in the United States of America, subject to the Manual and usage of such church, as from time to time revised and authorized".

It was moved and carried that we adopt the resolution as amended.

The following request was brought before us and carried. "Be it resolved that at the Board of Trustee meeting of Owosso Bible College in September 1954 they be requested to give an easement to the Michigan Conference for the use of District Purposes.

All the congregation stood and sang the Doxology.

By request, Rev. Sturk favored us with a special song, "Stand By Me".

It was moved and carried that we adopt for discussion the resolution of Rev. Hendrick regarding a tabernacle.

It was moved and carried that we table this proposition until we hear from the Ways and Means Committee.

Rev. E. C. Schram again reported for the Resolutions Committee. The following resolutions were passed: The wife's position in the Ordination service, Two Children's services a day, and a resolution calling for the dropping of the addresses of Ministers from the Apportionment page of the Journal.

It was moved and carried that we extend the time to 10 o'clock.

The committee brought back a re-wording of the resolution pertaining to resolution No. 15 page 27 of the Journal. This was passed.

Rev. W. N. Miller, Conference Superintendent, read his committee appointments.

Rev. R. Dean reported for the Ways & Means Committee. The following resolutions were passed; concerning, Editorial changes, Salaries, administration fund and a love offering for Rev. Sturk.

Rev. Hendrick re-read his resolution the tabernacle fund.

The resolution was amended as follows. "Where the resolution reads tabernacle, it shall read 'camp site, tabernacle or Youth Camp'".

The amendment was amended calling for the deleting of the words "Youth Camp".

Wesleyan Church ARCHIVES The amendment with its amendment was carried.

The main resolution was amended to make it a penny a day rather than a penny a meal.

It was moved and carried that we again amend the main resolution so to provide that the Council be responsible for providing charts and thermometers mentioned in the resolution. The resolution with amendments was carried.

Rev. R. C. Hawkins expressed a word of appreciation to Rev. D. F. Price for the publicity given the Camp and Conference over his radio program. He also expressed an appreciation for the good spirit shown throughout the conference. He exhorted all to be loyal to Rev. Miller, the newly elected Conference Superintendent.

Rev. R. Dean read another resolution concerning a love offering for Mrs. Sturk, which was passed.

Rev. Schram reported the following resolutions which were passed, Appreciation vote for Carl Messer, Rising vote of thanks to Rev. Hawkins, and a vote of thanks to the Argus Press and D. F. Price.

It was moved and carried that we send letters of greetings to F. H. Harmon, Myrtle Bosma, Rev. and Mrs. Eldon Nelson, Mrs. Mary Gaylord and Rev. and Mrs. Roger Bassett, Mrs. Harry Woods, and G. C. Avery.

It was moved and carried that the Conference Council take care of all unfinished business.

After announcements the 1954 Conference was adjourned by expiration of time. Rev. Sturk dismissed in prayer.

#### SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT R. C. HAWKINS

To the Fifty-Fourth Annual Conference of the Michigan District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church:

Greetings to you in the name of Jesus our Saviour, Sanctifier, and Coming King !

With the hallowed memory of an excellent Camp still fresh in our minds, we meet together in His name to do business for the church. During these perilous days of the end time we Pilgrims have a place of service and duty that both multiplies our responsibilities and enhances our opportunities. May God, Himself, make us adequate for this hour.

This past year we have experienced the loss of one who is sorely missed. Mrs. H. T. Mills quietly left this earth and made a triumphant entry into the glory world a few months ago.

Because of circumstances beyond the control of those in power, it became necessary to close down the "Living Word" program. A complete statement is available to this Conference at the proper time, if requested.

This has been another year of gains and victory. Revival fires have burned brightly on the altar of a number of our churches. Consequently, gains have been made again in all departments of our work. Although these gains are not large, they are a continuation of a steady stream of constant progress that has marked the efforts of our Conference for more than a decade. Elkhorn has bought the Watertown Methodist Church and is remodeling it.

Ellsworth has built a lovely addition to their church.

Flint Brown Street has made considerable improvements on both the church and parsonage.

Flint Lippincott finished their beautiful new brick church.

Flint Second has completed and dedicated a lovely, new brick church.

#### CONFERENCE RESOLUTIONS

- 1. Whereas the date of our Ministerial Convention is at the same time as our National Youth Week, Be it resolved that Standing Rule No. 19 be made to read: The Ministerial Convention shall begin on the second Tuesday in February.
- 2. Whereas it was ruled in a conference past that all resolutions which were to be continued beyond the conference year in which they were passed must be placed in the Standing Rules, therefore, be it resolved that Resolution 6, Page 24 and Resolution 1, Page 26 of the 1953 Minutes be placed in the Standing Rules.
- 3. Be it resolved that the hours of the Conference sittings be listed in the Standing Rules, and read as follows: The hours of Conference sittings shall be from 9:00 a.m. to 12 noon; 1:30 p.m. to 5:00 p.m.; and 7:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m.
- 4. Be it resolved that Standing Rule No. 15 be revised to read as follows: The Conference Council shall appoint a Conference Building Committee composed of three members who have experience in the work of acoustics, architecture, and construction. All Churches and Church Board must have the approval of said committee; before the purchase of building sites, or the erecting of building, or improvements in excess of five hundred dollars.
- 5. Whereas the minister's wife makes a vital contribution to her husband's work, Therefore we recommend that the wife of the candidate be given an honorary seat with the candidate during the Ordination Service.
- 6. Be it resolved that we have children's meetings during the afternoon and evening services.
- 7. Whereas the listing of pastor's addresses in the Church Apportionment Directory (page 1) is an unnecessary duplication, and since the Ministerial Directory (page 5) gives a more complete list; therefore, be it resolved that we omit the address column on page 10 of Pastor's and put in its place a list of the number of Conference Journals to be mailed to each church.
- 8. Whereas the Camp Meeting of 1951 there was an offering received for the remodeling of the present tabernacle and camp site, Therefore be it resolved that this money be set aside in a fund known as the Tabernacle and Camp Site Fund and that said money be used for nothing but the purpose of remodeling or erecting a new tabernacle or purchase of a camp site.

Be if further resolved that whereas our need is becoming greater every year, that a plan designated, "Tabernacle and Camp Site Plan", be launched to extend over a period of three years, and unless earlier success justiles that the council be instruced to bring to the Conference of 1957, for approval, plans for the site, construction, and cost.

Be it further resolved that this plan be adopted for financing this project, and placed in the standing Rules:

(a) That each member of the Conference be ask to contribute one cent per day for the three year period.

(b) That a penny bank appropriate for this project be given to every member of the conference along with complete instructions, information as to goal, and plans for the honouring through the Michigan Pilgrim the churches who have reached the 100% mark at the end of each year.

(c) That a chart of instructions with a thermometer be supplied each pastor and that it be placed in a conspicious place, and where so desired, that these charts be supplied for Sunday School Classes, and Y. P. S. That a Master Chart with place for name of churches and thermometer be placed at Camp Meeting, and that one-free-will offering be received at each of these. The Conference Council shall provide for the supplying of the charts and thermometers.

(d) That the Conference Superintendent promote this through letters to the pastors, graphs detailing proposed schedule of success etc. And that the Conference Superintendent shall speak of this upon his visits to churches, ministerial gatherings, Sunday School Conventions, etc.

9. In appreciation of the effecient work performed by the Sunday School Promotional Secretary, Rev. Carl Messer, Be it resolved that a standing vote of thanks be extended to him.

10. Be it resolved that a rising vote of thanks be given to Rev. Hawkins for his presence in the Conference in the midst of pressing duties in his new field of labor.

11. Be it resolved that a vote of appreciation be sent to the Argus Press for advertising given us.

Be it further resolved: that a rising vote of thanks be given to Rev. D. F. Price for advertising the Camp Meeting by means of his Radio Program "The Family Altar."

12. Be it resolved that a Committee of six be appointed as a Ministerial Convention Committee by the Conference Superintendent.... that two be appointed for three years, two for two years, two for one year, and that two shall be appointed each year respectively.

13. Be it resolved that the afternoon service of the last day of the Ministerial Convention be the concluding service of the Convevntion.

14. The Michigan Conference Church Extension Policy, Constitution and By-Laws.

15. Be it resolved that we have one Conference, one Conference Superintendent, a First Assistant Superintendent and a Second Assistant Superintendent, Conference Sercretary, Conference Treasurer and four advisory members all of which will make up the Conference Council.

#### **RESOLUTIONS OF THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE**

#### 1. EDITORIAL CHANGE

Whereas in the recent General Conference action was taken to raise the General Budget to \$6.00 per year per member; therefore be it resolved that the editing committee be instructed to make the necessary change in standing rule No. 2 to comply with this action.

2. STANDING RULE NO. 10

Whereas the cost of living and the cost of transportation is continually rising and whereas the General Board in the light of this increased remuneration of the General Officials; therefore be it resolved that standing rule No. 10 be amended to read:

The District Superintendent's salary shall be set at \$4,250 per year, plus 6 cents per mile for traveling expenses.

The Conference Treasurer shall receive \$500.00 per year.

The Conference Secretary shall receive \$350.00 per year.

The Conference Sunday School Secretary \$150.00 per year.

The Conference Statistician \$75.00 per year.

Be if further resolved that all District Officials shall receive 6 cents per mile for miles traveled in the interest of the District.

#### 3. ADMINISTRATION FUND

Whereas in the recent General Conference recognition was given to the rise in traveling rates and the necessity of raising the administrative part of the budget; and whereas in the past year there has been added expense to the administration fund of our District; and whereas there was action taken in the last annual Conference to merge a part of our budget known as the 50 cents per member for District expense with the Administration Fund; and whereas this 50 cents per member for District expense was left out of standing rule No. 2, therefore, be it resolved that we add to our Conference budget \$1.00 per member per year for the Administration Fund.

4. Whereas, we as a Conference wish to express our appreciation to our General Superintendent, Rev. L. W. Sturk, Be it resolved that a love offeroffering of \$50.00 be given Mrs. Sturk.

5. We further recommend that a representative of Owosso Bible College visit the churches annualy and conduct a service in the interest of the college assisting the pastor in the raising of the College budget.

6. Inasmuch as the percentage for Conference Expense fund is inadequate, we recommend that the salaries of the Conference Treasurer, Conference Secretary, Statistician, Sunday School Secretary and the Editor of the Michigan Pilgrim be paid from the Administrative Fund.

#### STANDING RULES

#### No. 1 -- Conference Year

The Conference year shall close June 30, and complete reports must be reviewed by the local boards and forwarded directly to the Conference Statistician, Rev. J. H. Kotesky, North Branch, Michigan, by July 15. All reports received after July 15 shall be omitted from the yearly report.

#### No. 2 -- Church Budget

Each church shall raise for the General Budget the equivalent of \$6.00 per member, and for the Conference Budget the equivalent of \$10.00 per member; the Conference Budget to be divided as follows: Conference Church Extension \$2.00; Conference Church Extension Loan Fund \$1.25; Owosso Bible College Debt Retirement \$3.00; Owosso Bible College \$1.50; Ministerial Relief \$1.00; General Delegate Expense \$.25. Administration Fund \$1.00.

#### No. 12 -- Credentials

The Conference Superintendent shall have read Sections 99, 100 and 101 of the Manual instructing all Conference Licentiates that hereafter they shall appear before the District Examining Board at Conference time before their credentials shall be granted.

#### No. 13 -- Camp Meeting Funds

The Conference Treasurer shall submit an itemized report of Camp Meeting Funds as recorded in the 1945 Conference Journal, page 13. This report to appear in the minutes.

#### No. 14 -- Appointment of Committees

The Conference Superintendent shall appoint all committees. The Standing Committees are to be appointed to include new men where possible and to avoid the duplication of men on several committees.

#### No. 15 -- Building Committee

The Conference Council shall appoint a Conference Building Committee composed of three members who have experience in the work of acoustics, architecture and construction. All Churches and Church Boards must have the approval of said committee. before the purchase of building sites, or the erecting of buildings or improvements in excess of five hundred dollars.

#### No. 16 -- Burial Benefits

All actively engaged pastors, evangelists and the ministers of the Conference shall be enrolled in the Ministerial Benefit Association as well as their wives. Cost of membership and calls shall be paid from the treasuries of the department that employes them. Complete resolution appears in Standing Rule No. 20 of the 1947 minutes.

#### No. 17 -- Vacations

It is recommended that our churches grant their pastors a two-weeks vacation with pay. The Conference Superintendent shall be given a twoweek vacation with pay.

#### No. 18 -- Missionary Reports

A yearly report of each missionary society shall be printed in the Conference Minutes.

#### No. 19 -- Ministerial Convention

The Ministerial Convention shall begin on the second Tuesday in February.

#### No. 20 -- Camp Meeting Board

Be it resolved that a Camp Meeting Board of six members be elected in the following manner; 2 members to be elected for 3 years; the next two elected, are to serve 2 years and the last two elected for 1 year. Following this two members shall be elected annually for a 3 year term. Board duties: Secure all manual workers for Camp and Conference; Supervise grounds and buildings; Purchase good and necessary equipment for Camp and Conference; Have charge of all advertising. Whereas the Camp Board Members are pastors, and whereas much of their time must be devoted and their minds occupied with the many duties connected with the manual working of the camp, and therefore are not free to attend and enjoy the camp services. Therefore be it resolved that after any member of the Camp Board has served for a period of three years, he shall not be re-elected to the Camp Board until at least three years have expired. The Conference Council shall provide nominations from which board members shall be elected.

#### No. 21 -- Recall of Pastor

Be it resolved that the second week of May shall be designated as the time for the churches of our Conference to vote on the recall of the pastor.

#### No. 22 -- Retiring Superintendent

Be it resolved that whenever there shall be elected another Conference Superintendent, that the Conference take steps to fill the pastorate left vacant by the recommending of the retiring superintendent to that church as a pastor. The Conference Council may also recommend him to the field of evangelism.

#### No. 23 -- Ordination Service

Be it resolved that the order of business on the first night of the Conference be the Ordination Service.

#### No. 24 -- Certified Public Accountant

Be it resolved that all treasurers' books of the Conference and Owosso Bible College be audited annualy by a certified public accountant so that a report from the auditor can be given to the Conference when called for.

#### No. 25 -- Young People's Executive Committee Business Meeting

Inasmuch as there is need of more intensive young people's activities during the Conference year, therefore be it resolved that the Conference Young People's Executive Committee hold quarterly business meetings.

#### No. 26 -- Camp Meeting Sunday School Session

Be it resolved that on the two Sundays during Camp Meeting that there be a Sunday School session beginning at 9:30 until 10:15 following the testimony meeting; and that said session be arranged and supervised by the Sunday School Committee.

Be it further resolved that a credit card be given to all in attendance, and that each card be signed and returned by the pupil to their local church Sunday School Secretary for the attendance record and reports to the Conference.

#### No. 27 -- Election of Officers

Inasmuch as most religious bodies follow the order of having election immediately after Conference reports, and, inasmuch as many Conferences of the Pilgrim Holiness Church follow this same order, therefore, be it resolved that election of officers be immediately following Conference reports.

#### No. 28 -- Youth Convention

Be it resolved that there be a separate Youth Convention; the time to be set by the Executive Youth Committee and the Conference Council.

#### No. 29 -- Administrative Fund

Inasmuch as the Conference Expense Fund has not been adequate to meet the need, be it resolved that the Conference Expense Fund and Conference Superintendent's Fund me merged and be called the Administrative Fund.

#### No. 30 -- Church Extension

Inasmuch as the present Conference Church Extension Department is not producing the number of new churches that we are capable of producing, and whereas the establishing of new churches is necessary for a steady and healthy growth for any Conference, and whereas there appears to be a definite weakness in our present policy of raising funds for Church Extension Work;

Therefore, be it resolved that the Michigan Conference adopt the Church Extension Fellowship which reads as follows:

#### CHURCH EXTENSION FELLOWSHIP OF PILGRIM HOLINESS CHURCH, MICHIGAN CONFERENCE

Holding the conviction that God would have us further the cause of Christ by establishing new churches within our Conference Borders, I subscribe the following:

- (a) I will pray for the leading of the Lord in the work of the church Extension Board.
- (b) I will be alert for any possibilities of new churches and will inform the Board.
- (c) I recognize that the first financial obligations in the opening of a new work are the most difficult to meet and will therefore be responsible for two units, (\$5.00) per unit, to total \$10.00 for the Church Extension Fellowship.
- (d) I assume this obligation for not more than two new works in any one Conference Year. Said works to be approved by the Church Extension Board.
- (e) I will try to secure other members for the Fellowship.
   (f)I understand this agreement may be terminated any time I deem it necessary by notifying the Church Extension Board.

Be it further resolved that a Church Extension Board of three be elected by the Conference from nominations presented by the Conference Council; one for three years, one for two years, one for one year and one each year following. The Conference Superintendent shall by virtue of his office be chairman of the Church Extension Board. The Conference Treasurer shall also be a member by virtue of his office.

Be it further resolved that this Board shall be amenable to the Conference Council.

#### No. 31 -- Tabernacle and Camp Site Financing

- (a) Each member of the Conference shall be ask to contribute one cent per day for the three year period.
- (b) A penny bank appropriate for this project will be given to every member of the Conference along with complete instructions, information as to goal and plans for honouring through the Michigan Pilgrim, the churches who have reached the 100% mark at the end of each year.

- (c) A chart of instructions with a thermometer will be supplied each pastor and be placed in a conspicious place, and where so desired, these charts will be supplied for Sunday School Classes, and Y. P. S. A Master Chart with place for names of Churches and thermometer will be placed at Camp Meeting, and one free-will offering will be received at each of these. The Conference Council shall provide for the supplying of the charts and thermometers.
- (d) The Conference Superintendent shall promote this through letters to the pastors, graphs detailing proposed schedule of success etc. And the Conference Superintendent shall speak of this upon his visits to Churches, Ministerial Gatherings, Sunday School Conventions, ect.
