Rev. W. O. Bottenberg presented Rev. L. W. Sturk, General Superintendent, to the Conference. Rev. Sturk spoke on Christian Unity, based on the text St John 17: 20, 21. God blessed this fine message to the hearts of the people.

The secretary was called upon to read the Conference roll. The Conference bar was fixed, and the time for sittings was 10 to 12 a.m. and 2 to 5 p.m. The ordination service to follow the completion of business.

The report of the Auditing committee was given and accepted by the conference.

The District Treasurer gave a splendid report, which the Conference accepted by due action.

A partial report was given by the Examining board. It was moved and seconded the report be accepted. Carried.

Rev. Dan Copeland lead the conference as they sang the songs, "Where He Leads I'll Follow" and "A Charge to Keep I Have."

Rev. W. O. Bottenberg read from the fourth chapter of II Timothy. Bro. Brown lead the conference in prayer. Rev. Sturk read from II Kings the second chapter and spoke on "The Call of Character and Service". God's presence was felt in a wonderful measure in this service. Surely God needs men and women who will give themselves in service to Him.

Following the ordination service Bro. Brown presented a certificate of award to Bro. Bottenberg for the largest Sunday School gain during the past year, for the St. Louis Church.

### REPORT OF THE RESOLUTION COMMITTEE

1. Be it resolved that each of our resolutions remain in effect from year to year except when revoked by the District Conference.

2. Be it resolved that each pastor be permitted to conduct two revival meetings away from his own charge during each conference year, if it can be planned so as not to conflict with the local church work.

3. Be it resolved that the Conference year close June 30th. All Church and Minister's reports shall be sent to the District Statistician by July 8th, so that they may be compiled before the Conference. The District treasurer shall close his books on July 8th, therefore money must be mailed to the District Treasurer in time to be included in the annual report. By action of the District Conference all churches who pay their Budgets in full will be counted as star churches.

4. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent appoint all committees. All the above appointments shall be announced at this conference and their names be printed in the Minutes.

5. Be it resolved that we have a Sunday rally as was provided in the previous General Conference and two sacred pictures or banners be provided by the District and given, one for gain in at-



tendance above the previous quarter, and other given on the largest percentage of gain over the previous quarter. That only schools who report regularly shall be eligible. The eligibility of such schools shall be left to the discretion of the Sunday School Secretary and Sunday School Board Chairman.

6. Be it resolved that the telephone numbers of all ministers be added to the conference roll in our Minutes.

7. Be it resolved that the District council elect a District Sunday School Board of four, including the District Superintendent. The duties of the District Sunday School Board, in harmony with the Manual of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, shall be as follows:

1. The District Sunday School Board shall arrange for an annual Sunday School convention to be held at the time of the Christian workers Convention and that the morning services of one day be devoted for that purpose.
2. To promote and encourage the Sunday School work throughout the district.
3. To present an annual report to the District Conference which shall include the following:
  - (a) A statement of the work accomplished during the year.
  - (b) A statement of the general condition of the Sunday School work on the District.
  - (c) To recommend to the District Conference through the ways and means Committee the amount considered necessary to finance the district Sunday School work.
4. If for any reason there is a vacancy on the District Sunday School Board the District Superintendent may fill the vacancy by appointment.
5. To have published each quarter, a District Sunday School sheet showing the attendance of each Sunday School on the district for the month, the preceding month, and the attendance for the same month a year ago as well as the average attendance for the year. This sheet to be sent to each pastor and he make it his duty to see it reaches the reporter.

8. Resolved that inasmuch as we see the need of increasing the attendance in our Sunday School be it resolved that we ask our churches to sponsor and conduct Daily Vacation Bible Schools, and send a report of same to annual Conference. Be it further resolved that we ask our District Sunday School Board to give all the assistance possible in giving information and securing supplies.

9. Be it resolved that no church or evangelist arrange his revival so as to conflict with the district camp and conference.

10. Resolved that the District Secretary shall issue Credentials to those entitled to them within two weeks from date of Conference.

11. Be it resolved that each Church of the District make a quilt, or comfort, or donate other items of bedding to the Camp Meeting.

12. In as much as this is actually the third Annual Conference of the North Central District, rather than the Sixteenth Annual Conference, Be it resolved that this Conference be called the Third Annual Conference of the North Central District, formally a part of the Central District, which was organized in 1936.

13. Be it resolved that this conference wire Greetings to the following who are ill at this time: Mrs. L. W. Sturk; Mrs. Maxine Bebermeyer; Rev. E. Puffer; and Rev. Edward Boone.

14. Be it resolved that we express our appreciation to the following by rising and saying "God Bless You": Rev. J. C. Williams; Rev. L. W. Sturk; Rev. Armour Peisker; Rev. W. L. Surbrook and family; Mr. and Mrs. Frank Salvador; Rev. and Mrs. W. O. Bottenberg; Rev. Ellis G. Maness; Rev. Calvin Bebermeyer; Rev. and Mrs. Ben Bebermeyer Rev. P. E. Brown; Mrs. Cleo Turner; and all those who so graciously assisted in the dining room, to the Warrenton Pilgrim Holiness Church and their friends, for their fine cooperation and hospitality during our Camp and Conference.

### REPORT OF THE DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

To the 1952 Conference of the North Central District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, in session at Warrenton, Missouri, Greetings. As we bring this report to you, we have gratitude in our heart to God, for His wonderful blessings, for His guidance during the past year, for all the accomplishments of the district, and we have just enjoyed a gracious Camp Meeting. Doctor Surbrook was certainly at his best as Evangelist, his Wife and Daughters were a blessing in the services. The Salvadors singing under the anointing brought joy to our hearts on many occasions.

We are glad to inform you that we have substantial gains in Membership, Sunday School Attendance, and finance. All churches of the North Central District have paid their budget in full, but one. Special Offerings were taken for General Sunday School activity, Self-Denial at Thanksgiving, and Church Extension at Easter.

We have covered the District three times, twice visiting each church, and conducting a service, and once with Rev. L. W. Sturk, General Superintendent in four Zone Meetings. Brother Sturk was a great blessing to our people, preaching each night, and the meetings were well attended.

We had a very fine Young People's Convention at the Des Moines Church, Rev. and Mrs. P. W. Thomas were the Special workers, and Rev. Calvin Bebermeyer was in charge. We had a fine meeting in St. Louis Church in interest of the Program of Evangelism, and Rev. and Mrs. P. W. Thomas with Rev. E. V. Halt were the engaged workers.

Two new churches have been organized, and we wish to present them to this conference; Weatherby, Missouri where Rev. and Mrs. E. C. Ryburn have been pastoring, and Grand River, Iowa where Rev. and Mrs. W. C. Houck pastor. The Grand River Church is just a partial organization.

We have conducted short meetings in Council Bluffs, and Pacific Junction, Iowa with the Salvadors in charge of the Music. We also worked with the Salvadors in a Revival at Des Moines, held one week Revivals at Grand River, Weatherby, and Warrenton. God has given us many precious Souls. Revival efforts have been launched in each of our churches, and good reports come to us concerning them.

Hannibal has re-decorated their Church, Eddyville has com-

pletely liquidated their debt. Des Moines has re-decorated, Pacific Junction has redecorated, Weatherby has purchased lots for a parsonage, Kansas City has purchased lots and have re-decorated,, Webster Groves has a nice saving for a new church building and St. Louis has made some improvements.

We have traveled many miles seeking to find a suitable Camp Ground location, and I think the Council will soon be able to make some announcements concerning the matter. We attended the Superintendent's Conference in January at Indianapolis, and made a short visit to the National Youth Convention at Frankfort, Indiana. This has been a great year, we have enjoyed it with its many responsibilities.

### REPORT OF THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

We, the Ways and Means Committee, present the following recommendations:

1. That each member of voting age pay \$1.20 per month budget. This budget of \$1.20 includes 55c District budget, 45c General budget, 15c for Camp Meeting expense, and 5c for Owosso Bible College. This budget is to be sent to the District Treasurer the first of each month.

2. The District Council shall meet at the close of this Conference to determine the District Superintendent's salary, provide for his expenses, and help him plan his work for the year. We further recommend that the Council determine the amounts of salary to be paid to the Secretary, Treasurer, and Statistician.

3. The Superintendent at each visit to the churches shall take a special offering for the purpose of assisting the churches in raising their budget. This offering is to be sent directly to the District Treasurer who shall receipt the churches for the same.

4. The District Treasurer shall set aside \$25.00 per month to apply toward the purchasing of a District Camp ground.

5. The District Treasurer shall set aside at least \$100.00 each year for General Conference expenses.

6. Inasmuch as the Pension plan for preachers has been passed by the General Conference, therefore, be it resolved that we encourage all of our pastors and evangelists to cooperate with this plan.

7. That each church pay the Camp Meeting registration amount for their pastor and wife, also delegates with their traveling expense. The travel expense to be determined by the local church board.

8. That the District Council be given full authority to decide on the location and purchase price of a Camp Ground, adding improvements and facilities at their discretion. That they be empowered to borrow money if necessary to accomplish same.

9. Be it resolved that each church pay its offering to deputational workers of the Owosso Bible College, Foreign Missions and

Church Extension through the District Treasurer, so that the District will receive credit for the same.

10. Be is resolved that each pastor shall give one day's work in preparing for the annual camp meeting and conference or send \$5.00 to the district treasurer not later than 10 days prior to the opening service, to pay for the labor needed.
