In Memoriam

ANNA E. HINES

JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

FIRST SITTING—WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON, JUNE 27, 1962

The Twelfth Session of the Northern Indiana Conference convened at Frankfort, Indiana, at 1:30 P.M., June 27, 1962. Rev Estel Eckart called the session to order.

Rev. Marlin Boss led the congregation in singing "Leaning on the Everlasting Arms." Rev. Bertha Schoeff offered prayer.

The scripture lesson, Phil. 2:1-16, was read by Rev. Gilbert Noel.

District Superintendent Rev. R. E. Nibarger welcomed the members and visitors of the conference. Due to the delayed arrival of General Superintendent Dr. W. H. Neff, Rev. R. E. Nibarger took the chair.

The roll call of ordained ministers was read by District Secretary Carl R. Reed.

The roll call of the ordained deaconesses was read.

The roll call of the lay delegates by the District Secretary followed immediately.

The Conference bar was cleared according to standing rule of the Conference—the three center sections back to the center aisle, including the sound control booth and the platform.

The Chairman announced the hours of conference sittings as governed by standing rule, namely: 8:30 to 11:30 a.m.; 1:30 to 4:30 p.m.; and 7:00 to 9:00 p.m.

The Conference Statistician, Rev. Wilbur Pottenger, read his report. It was voted to receive his report.

Dr. W. H. Neff, General Superintendent, was introduced at this time and spoke briefly on "Four Things That Make a Good Conference": 1. Clear Thinking, 2. Earnest Prayer, 3. Spirit of I Cor. 13—Heaven Sent Godly Love, 4. Guidance of Holy Spirit.

The Reception Committee presented Rev. C. Ross Brown, from the Canadian Standard Church of America. Rev. Brown is transferring to the Northern Indiana Conference. A motion carried that he be given an honorary seat in the Conference bar.

The Reception Committee introduced Rev. Lewis Jones from the Miami Reserve Conference at this time.

Recommendations of the Examining Board for the licensing of ministers, deaconesses and song evangelists was read by Rev. Ernest Carroll. A motion prevailed to approve the recommendations.

The Chairman called for the report of the District Superintendent, Rev. R. E. Nibarger. After the reading of his report, a motion carried to receive his report by a standing vote of approval.

Due to the death of Rev. D. W. Lacy's father, his report as Assistant District Superintendent was read by the District Secretary. A motion was carried to receive his report.

The report of the Auditing Committee was read by Rev. Paul Isgrigg, chairman. Upon proper motion and second, it was voted to receive his report.

Rev. Lester Henry, District Treasurer read the District financial report for the year ending April 30, 1962. A motion to receive the report carried.

The Report of the Camp Meeting Treasurer, Rev. Lester Henry, was read at this time and a motion prevailed to receive this report.

In the absence of Rev. Ray Martin, Jr., Promotional Secretary of the Sunday School Committee, this report was read by Rev. Wayne Preusz. A motion carried that we accept the report with deep appreciation for the fine work of the secretary and his committee.

The report of the Shoemaker Memorial Home was read by Rev. E. V. Halt, Treasurer. A motion carried to receive his report.

Rev. Ernest Carroll submitted his report as Treasurer of the Group Hospitalization Insurance. A motion prevailed to receive this report.

The Reception Committee presented Rev. Adams, pastor of the First Church of the Nazarene in the City of Frankfort at this time. Other guests presented to the Conference were Miss Campbell from West Virginia and Rev. Ovid Stultz from the Wesleyan Holiness Church along with a group from his congregation who are uniting with this Conference. A motion carried that Rev. Stultz and Miss Campbell be given honorary seats within the bar. Rev. Chester Todd of the Southern Indiana District Conference and Margie Hundley, Song Evangelist, transferring from the Nazarene Church at Indianapolis, to this Conference, and John Hundley, minister transferring from the Indianapolis Nazarene Church to this Conference were also introduced at this time.

After various announcements, the sitting was adjourned with prayer by Rev. Marlin Boss.

SECOND SITTING—WEDNESDAY, 7:00 P.M., JUNE 27, 1962

The Second Sitting was opened by Rev. Estel Eckart and Rev. David Smith led the congregation in singing "I Am Thine O Lord."

Rev. Ovid Stultz led the Conference in prayer.

The Chairman requested the reading of the minutes of the last sitting and the minutes were approved as read.

The report of the Educational Board was read by the District Secretary and a motion carried that the report be accepted.

Rev. O. D. Williams gave the report of the Resolutions Committee.

Item No. 3, placing Zoning Committee in the listing of Standing Committees, carried.

Resolution deleting Resolution No. 41, Page 48, 1961 Minutes, which provided for renaming Richmond Church, carried.

Item No. 7, revising Resolution No. 58, Page 50, 1961 Minutes (death notices of members of minister's family), carried.

Item No. 13, revising Resolution No. 86, Page 52, 1961 Minutes, carried. (Posting of Camp property.)

Resolution deleting Resolution No. 21, Page 45, 1961 Minutes, carried. (The Home Missionary set up.)

Item No. 5, placing Home Missionary work under District Superintendent and Council, carried.

Item No. 2, revising Resolution No. 49, Page 49, carried. (Adjustment to conform with action of General Conference).

Item No. 8, Resolution No. 71 providing for procedure of ministerial candidates in submitting questionnaire to Educational Board, carried.

Item No. 9, providing for proper record of those carrying Local Ministers' license, carried.

Item No. 10, providing for change of name of the McCarty Street Church, carried.

Item No. 1 was presented and it was moved and seconded to adopt.

A motion was made to amend Item No. 1 to delete the word "churches" and read "sanctuary" and also delete the phrase "This applies to all departments."

A motion was made to substitute the following: Whereas the ministry of the Word and prayer is most important ministry of the church, be it therefore resolved that no slides or movies be shown on any regular meeting night of the church; but may be shown on any other night; and that the slides and movies be limited to those presented by the Departments of our church. The motion to substitute lost.

The amendment to the Resolution No. 1 was lost.

The Resolution No. 1 under "Local Church" was adopted.

A motion to adjourn carried, and after several announcements, the General Superintendent dismissed the Sitting with prayer.

THIRD SITTING—THURSDAY, 8:30 A.M., JUNE 28, 1962

The Third Sitting of the Conference was called to order by Rev. R. E. Nibarger, who requested Rev. Ervin Powers to lead the congregation in singing "What a Friend We Have In Jesus."

With the congregation standing, Rev. F. J. Goins led in prayer.

The memorial service was conducted by Rev. Russell Wooten. Rev. E. E. Crowder read the Scripture lesson and tribute was paid to the ministers of the conference whom God had called home during the past year. Rev. Ernest Carroll spoke on the ministry and activities of Rev. Anna Hines and Rev. Retta Baughman. Rev. Baughman was one of the oldest members of our conference. Rev. Glen Raney told of the consecrated life and labors of Rev. W. B. Fuggett. Rev. Ernest Batman spoke of the active life and homegoing of Rev. Sarah Plunkett. Rev. Vard Van Briggles told of the zeal, burden and fervent prayer life of Mrs. C. I. Wilson, wife of one of our ministers. Rev. E. E. Crowder paid tribute to Mrs. Area Montgomery and told of long years of devoted service to the Lord and her victorious Christian life. Rev. Russell Wooten reported the homegoing of Rev. Estella Henderson, who has lived for many years in Wisconsin.

The silent prayer of the standing congregation was concluded with the singing of "Blest Be the Tie that Binds."

As soon as the Conference bar was closed, General Superintendent, Dr. W. H. Neff took the chair, and addressed the conference on "Defining Your Objectives." He gave three goals that every pastor must have to succeed in the right way. (1) An increase in church membership, (2) Financing of all the church interests, and (3) Spiritual growth should be the objective of every pastor as well as a real revival in his church.

The minutes of the last sitting were read and approved.

The Reception Committee presented Rev. and Mrs. Gibbs, returned missionaries who are transferring to the Michigan District. Rev. Paul Keys from the Frankfort Pilgrim College, and Rev. Mark Storey, District Superintendent of the Southern Indiana District, were received and welcomed to the Conference and a motion carried to give them honorary seats in the Conference bar.

Rev. James Hertel, President of Frankfort Pilgrim College, reported briefly on the school.

Rev. G. W. Noel reported for the Ways and Means Committee.

Recommendation No. 1, Page 52, 1961 Minutes, changing the division of the District Budget was adopted.

A motion to amend Recommendation No. 6, Page 53, 1961 Minutes, that "all money mailed in one check by the local treasurer to the district treasurer monthly, except Youth money, which comes in quarterly" was lost.

Recommendation No. 6, regarding sending in all funds to Conference Treasurer, was adopted.

Recommendation No. 2, providing for the District Superintendent's salary and traveling expense, was adopted.

Recommendation No. 9, Page 53, 1961 Minutes, revising the Home Missionary Loan Fund, was adopted.

Recommendation No. 12, Page 54, 1961 Minutes, regarding a change in the Old People's Home assessment, was adopted.

A motion to extend the time was carried.

Recommendation under "Camp Meeting" regarding raising the assessment, was lost.

The General Superintendent closed the session with prayer.

FOURTH SITTING—THURSDAY, 1:30 P.M., June 28, 1962

After the calling of the Fourth Sitting to order, Rev. Estel Eckart introduced Rev. William H. Smith, who led the congregation in singing, "Holiness Forevermore."

Rev. Walter Black read the 5th Chapter of I Thess. for the Scripture lesson.

Rev. Howard Barefoot led the Conference in prayer followed by the congregation singing "He Abides."

At the conclusion of the singing, several testified and Rev. Area Montgomery expressed his thanks for kindnesses shown him during the illness and death of his wife.

General Superintendent Dr. W. H. Neff took the chair.

The minutes of the last sitting were read and approved.

The report of the Memoirs Committee was read and a motion prevailed to receive this report.

The Reception Committee introduced Rev. Pegram, Superintendent of the Wisconsin District, who was welcomed to the Conference.

The Reception Committee also introduced Rev. Orville Mann of the Southern Indiana District and a motion prevailed to seat Bro. Mann in the Conference bar.

The Educational Board asked to revise the report previously given. By a prevailing motion the privilege was granted.

The Resolutions Committee presented further reports as follows:

Resolution No. 12, Revising.

Resolution No. 35, Page 48, 1961 Minutes, defining the words "Centrally located" as follows: Inasmuch as our district parsonage has been sold and there is some confusion regarding the central location, same shall be defined as the geographical center of our district.

A motion was made to table the Recommendation No. 12, lost.

A motion was made to defer action on the Recommendation No. 12 until it is decided whether or not the conference wishes to have the district parsonage located in Indianapolis. A vote was taken regarding the Indianapolis location and the motion lost to place the District parsonage in the Indianapolis area.

A motion was then made to refer this matter of locating a District parsonage to the District council for final decision. Motion carried.

Resolution No. 11, regarding financial standing of students seeking license, was carried.

Resolution No. 14, concerning a Youth project, was presented and motion to adopt carried.

The Resolution regarding No. 42, Page 48, was presented.

A substitute motion to the above recommendation was presented: That this conference vote to deed the property to the Zone as requested by the General Board.

A motion was made to refer the substitute motion to the District council and the Resolutions committee. This motion carried by a standing vote.

The session was adjourned with prayer by Rev. O. D. Williams.

FIFTH SITTING—THURSDAY, 7:00 P.M., June 29, 1962

The Fifth Sitting of the Conference was called to order by Rev. Estel Eckart. Rev. George Blice led the congregation in singing "He Lives" and "The Sweet By and By." Rev. Edward Kirkpatrick offered prayer.

Rev. Paul William Thomas conducted the Foreign Missionary hour. Bro. Thomas presented the work in the Philippine Islands.

The minutes of the last sitting were read and approved.

The General Superintendent introduced the evangelists of this District to the conference.

A motion was made that we give the conference an opportunity to express their vote on whether or not the District parsonage stay in Frankfort. Motion carried.

The vote was taken and the Chairman stated that it seemed about 40% to 50% in favor of Frankfort.

Estel Eckart, Rev. Randall Schenkel, Rev. George Blice, Rev. Eugene Schenck, Rev. Mendle Adams, and Rev. Howard Barefoot.

Ballots were cast for the election of Assistant District Superintendent. The Chairman requested that the conference have silent prayer, seeking God's guidance in the election.

Rev. D. W. Lacy was elected Assistant District Superintendent on the first ballot.

The nominations from the District Council for District Secretary were read: Rev. Ernest Carroll, Rev. Wilbur Pottenger and Rev. Carl R. Reed. Ballots were cast resulting in the election of Rev. Carl R. Reed.

The nominations from the District Council for District Treasurer were read by the District Secretary: Rev. Lester Henry, Rev. Carl Roark and Rev. Thurman Preusz.

Ballots were cast resulting in the election of Rev. Lester Henry.

Ballots were then cast for the Advisory Members of the District Council.

A motion was made that we extend the time to continue the discussion of the Resolution regarding the Frankfort Pilgrim College. Motion lost.

A motion was made that the mimeographed sheets concerning this Resolution be distributed to the Conference at this time. Motion carried.

The sitting was adjourned by expiration of time after various announcements were made. Rev. G. W. Noel dismissed the sitting with prayer.

SIXTH SITTING—FRIDAY, 8:30 A.M., JUNE 29, 1962

Rev. Estel Eckart opened the Sixth Sitting of the Conference and requested Rev. Mendle Adams to lead the congregation in singing "My Faith Looks Up To Thee," and "I Love To Tell The Story."

Rev. Warren Posey read I Thess. 4 for the scripture lesson.

Prayer was offered by Rev. Samuel Hawn.

District Superintendent Rev. R. E. Nibarger introduced Rev. Pegram, Superintendent of the Wisconsin District who presented the work of the Church Extension in Wisconsin during the past year and the need of more churches.

General Superintendent Dr. W. H. Neff took the chair.

The Conference bar was cleared after which the minutes of the last sitting were read and approved.

The results of the balloting in the last sitting for the election of advisory members of the District Council. Members elected were Rev. Ernest Carroll, Rev. O. D. Williams, Rev. Guy D. Mowery and Rev. Gilbert Noel.

A motion was made to leave the election open for the voting of the fifth member of the District Council. Motion withdrawn.

A motion was made that we vote on the four highest names remaining on the first ballot for the fifth member of the District Council, Motion carried.

There being no election on the first ballot, it was moved that we vote on the two highest names. Motion withdrawn. There was no election on the second ballot.

Bro. Babb asked to withdraw his name from the ballot. A motion prevailed to vote on the two highest, Rev. F. J. Goins and Rev. Ray Martin, Jr.

Rev. F. J. Goins was elected as the fifth member to the District Council.

The District Secretary read the nominations for the two members of the Examining Board: Rev. Guy D. Mowery, Rev. B. H. McBride, Rev. F. J. Goins and Rev. Elton Call.

Ballots were cast and Rev. Guy D. Mowery and Rev. F. J. Goins were elected as members for a 3-year period on the Examining Board.

The District Secretary proceeded to read the names of the nominations for one member to the Educational Board for a 3-year period: Rev. R. D. Perry, Rev. Creston Eckart and Rev. Donald Washburn.

Rev. R. D. Perry was elected as a member of the Educational Board.

The nominations for three Trustees of Frankfort Pilgrim College of Northern Indiana District were then read by the District Secretary: Rev. O. D. Williams, Rev. G. W. Noel, Rev. Donald Washburn, Rev. Ernest Carroll, Rev. D. W. Lacy and Rev. Carl R. Reed.

A motion was made to set aside the Resolution No. 67, page 51, in the Minutes regarding the procedure of nominating candidates for Trustees for the Frankfort Pilgrim College. The motion lost.

Ballots were cast for the election of Trustees to Frankfort Pilgrim College.

District Secretary Carl Reed read two appointments by the District Council: District Statistician, Rev. J. W. Pottenger and Group Hospitalization Secretary-Treasurer, Rev. Ernest Carroll.

At this time invitations were accepted for the Ministerial Convention in 1963, which were as follows: Lebanon, Kokomo, Anderson and Logansport. By a standing vote it was elected to go to Lebanon, Indiana.

The result of balloting for Trustees of the Frankfort Pilgrim College was as follows: Rev. O. D. Williams, 2 years; Rev. D. W. Lacy, 3 years; Rev. Carl R. Reed, 1 year.

The Resolutions Committee proceeded with its report.

A Substitute Resolution (No. 15 in Committee Report) was presented for No. 42, Page 48.

A motion was made to amend Paragraph No. 3 of the above substitute Resolution to read "a period of 8 years instead of 5 years. Motion lost.

A motion was made to amend the Substitute Resolution in Par. 3 to delete the words "for a period of 5 years" and read thus "Be It Further Resolved that the Northern Indiana Conference shall be granted Camp and Conference privileges of the dormitories, kitchen and cafeteria on a rental basis."

A motion prevailed to extend the time of this session.

The above amendment carried by a standing vote.

The Substitute Resolution No. 15 was carried by a standing vote.

The sitting was adjourned by expiration of time after various announcements were made.

SEVENTH SITTING—FRIDAY, 1:30 P.M., JUNE 29, 1962

The Seventh Sitting was called to order by Rev. Estel Eckart and the congregation was led in singing "The Sweet By and By" by Rev. Wayne Preusz.

Rev. Duane Tulowitzky led the conference in prayer.

General Superintendent Dr. W. H. Neff took the chair.

The following Resolution, No. 16, was presented by the Resolution Committee: Whereas the Supreme Court has ruled to ban certain prayers in the New York public schools and whereas this may set a trend more atheistic in nature than the mere separation of church and state, we recommend that this conference instruct the District Secretary of Northern Indiana to write the Representatives to Congress of this District requesting that provisions be made for prayer in our public schools.

A motion was made that this Resolution be referred to the Secretary for redrafting. Motion carried.

A motion prevailed that the District Youth Conference have the Minutes of the District Youth Conference in the hands of the District Secretary by the first day of the district conference.

Rev. John Sheets reported on the costs of further surgery and room coverage under the Group Hospitalization Plan.

A motion was made to approve the Committee appointments of the District Superintendent as read by the District Secretary. (See Official Directory—Boards and Committees).

A motion prevailed that the Council be authorized to care for any unfinished business.

Rev. Area Montgomery expressed his deep appreciation to Dr. W. H. Neff for his splendid leadership as he presided over the conference and that we express our thanks and appreciation by a standing vote.

District Superintendent Rev. R. E. Nibarger reported on the placements of the pastors for the coming year.

The minutes of the Seventh Sitting were read and approved.

The sitting was adjourned with prayer by Dr. W. H. Neff.

REPORT OF THE DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

To General Superintendent, Dr. W. H. Neff, Delegates, Pastors, Evangelists and friends of the Twelfth Annual Conference of the Northern Indiana District, Greetings.

We meet today with great appreciation and gratitude for the mercy and grace of our God which has been with us since we last met here last fall.

We extend a hearty welcome to our General Superintendent, Dr. Neff, and to each one present. We trust that God will direct us in all things and that His presence will encourage us to walk not in the ways of men, but in the light of His word.

I feel that we have some of the finest and most loyal ministers found anywhere, also a cooperative and devoted laity, who have stood by and helped to make this Conference what it is, and deserve a great share of credit for what accomplishments may have been made these past ten months.

In the light of our Conference year being only ten months long, I feel that God has helped us in many ways to reach our achievements; however, I feel we must strive to reach a higher percentage in all Departments of our church.

I personally want to thank God for our good Assistant District Superintendent, Rev. D. W. Lacy, for his counsel and assistance, not only as Assistant Superintendent, but also on the various boards and committees upon which we have been called to labor.

The Sunday School Promotional Secretary, Rev. Ray Martin, Jr., and the Sunday School Board have worked hard to help every Sunday School to reach their goal and spread the gospel to the constituency of their field.

The District Young Peoples President, Rev. William Babb and his Committee have been a great blessing in the work of our District.

The Youth Camps Director, Rev. E. C. Gafford and the staff of workers have proven to be a great blessing and have left a great impression upon the lives of our children.

The District Council and all of the Committees and Boards have worked untiringly in their respective fields and show a good report even if the year was short and filled with many duties outside of their regular field.

Our Ministerial Convention and Youth Conference, which were held at Kokomo Church were owned and blessed of the Lord and a wonderful spirit of cooperation was manifested in these services. To God be all the Glory and Praise for His presence with us. It certainly has been a great privilege to work with these men of God, who I feel are more interested in God's work over and above their own personal welfare.

I have made every effort afforded me to expand in Church Extension. I have made contacts and efforts in Gary, East Chicago and the Calumet area as well as Attica, Peru, Mishawaka, Hartford City and other points of interest. In Mishawaka a lady has offered us a lot on which to build. In Indianapolis a group of fine people located on West Minnesota Street voted to unite with us in the process they and the McCarty Street Church decided to merge. This gives us a new location in the City, where we have long needed a Church. They are pastored by Rev. Estel Eckart.

The North Central Church, of Indianapolis, and Rev. Raymond Dodd, the pastor, decided to sell their church and God gave us more than had been invested. They are temporarily occupying the McCarty Street property but are very anxious to get started with a new building as well as location.

Property Improvements

Huntington is beginning work on their new Sunday School Annex.

Richmond, Highland View are hoping to get into their new Parsonage Church soon. Finance from the District has been loaned them to get their plans under way. A loan has already been made to finish the church and repay the District.

Fulton installed new automatic gas furnace in the parsonage.

North Judson did extensive finishing work on their new church, installed new pews and completed the decoration of the church.

Fairmount is remodeling parsonage by adding two bedrooms. The church has also been painted.

Frankfort, Woodside has added a nursery and two restrooms to their church.

Green Township remodeled the parsonage kitchen and redecorated.

Warren Park, Indianapolis, remodeled basement and are now planning to enlarge or build a new church.

Lapel changed the comfort and looks of their church by buying new pews.

Marion, First added new front porch and steps and sidewalks to their parsonage.

Marion, Grant Street remodeled parsonage by finishing the upstairs into two bedrooms.

Marion, South installed new hot water heating system in their church.

Muncie, 18th Street has added again to their church in order to accommodate their needs and also dedicated their church, school and parsonage.

Tipton installed new heating plant, new floors and bath in parsonage.

Richmond installed new church sign and remodeled entrance and stairway in the church.

Indianapolis, Central installed a new automatic forced-air gas furnace in the parsonage.

Indianapolis, Brookside redecorated the basement and Sunday School rooms.

Upland has new plaster and ceiling in their church.

Frankfort, Pilgrim Chapel has a new ceiling and new church pews. The auditorium has also been redecorated.

Recommendations

I would like for this Conference to set a goal of at least 7% increase in church membership and Sunday School attendance for the coming year. This may seem like a small amount but in an over-all picture it would be an appreciated gain.

Inasmuch as we desire to get into new areas and also to help some of our already organized churches, that need new buildings as well as locations, I feel that we should at least establish one new church and relocate at least one church or more this coming Conference year. I would further suggest that we use available funds as a revolving fund to carry this out.

In the field of Church Extension I also suggest that we re-enter into a pledge and card system suggested on Page 53, Paragraph 9.

Inasmuch as Camp Meeting is a very inspiring and encouraging factor in our church life, I recommend the new share certificate to be presented at this Conference and Camp Meeting as suggested in Paragraph 6, Page 55 in our Journal.

Realizing that we are living in an age when public demands are different in regards to places of worship, let each of us pledge ourselves to reach the lost about us with a spiritual and Scriptural program as the Holy Spirit directs us.

Personal Report

It is with all humility and gratitude unto God for all His benefits that I present to you my personal report.

I have made 140 calls to our churches, held 36 board meetings including 8 annual meetings. Many annual meetings were held in the month of May and not reported in this report. I have made 23 business trips, attended 7 Zone Meetings, preached 123 times, with approximately 125 seekers, 2 joint Council meetings with Southern Indiana, visited 8 Camp Meetings and a number of Revivals, attended 17 various committee meetings, gave 17 days labor on Camp Ground, preached 4 funerals, attended 4 others, attended Indoor Camp Meeting and 4 Indoor Camp Board Meetings, 3 District Meetings with our General Superintendent, Rev. M. H. Snyder at Anderson, Logansport and South Bend, 6 Council Meetings, 2 College Board Meetings and 3 Executive Board Meetings of the Frankfort Pilgrim College and other meetings in the interest of the school, burned 3 mortgages—2 at Elwood, 1 on Church and the property purchased for a parking lot. At Nappanee we were able to dedicate the par-

sonage and burn the mortgage. At Muncie 18th Street we also dedicated the new church, parsonage and school building.

I have received my salary in full and my mileage for 10 months, which was 23,499 miles.

We wish to thank every Pastor, member and friend that has helped us to show a gain in church membership and also in our Sunday School.

May God direct us even in a greater way this coming year, to reach more of the lost about us and keep ready for his coming.

REPORT OF THE CONFERENCE SUNDAY SCHOOL BOARD

The Conference Sunday School Committee submits the following report to the 12th Annual Conference of the Northern Indiana District.

The Sunday School Committee met at the beginning of the conference year and made plans for the forthcoming year.

The committee toured the district, setting up Sunday School Institutes in each zone, securing workers from the Editorial Department at headquarters for workshops on the Sunday School work. Those helping were A. D. Peisker, John Blann, Olive Evans and Audrey Moorefield.

The District cooperated in the Sunday School Revival with the General church, using the Loyalty Crusade.

In addition to the regular duties of the Promotional Secretary, we have printed 9,750 Revival announcements for our pastors and 10,000 absentee cards.

At the General Conference we received a ribbon for a 10.9% gain in our district during the past quadrennium.

Our gain for the past year was 127 numerically. This is seventeen consecutive years that the churches that are in Northern Indiana District have shown a gain in the Sunday School, for which we are very grateful to God and to those pastors and workers who have labored so faithfully in this area of God's Kingdom.

REPORT OF THE RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE

Local Church

1.

Due to an increasing tendency toward religious entertainment, this conference goes on record as opposed to the use of lantern slides and movies in our churches. (This applies to all departments).

2.

Delete the first sentence and the first two words of the second sentence.

It should read—"Any local church wishing to do so may pay from unspecified general church extension funds that part of The United Stewardship Fund that pertains to General Church Extension which is 30% of that fund.

Zone Work

3.

Be it resolved that the district zoning committee be a standing committee listed in the minutes with the present standing committees.

District

5.

We recommend that the disposition of all home missionary work be placed under the District Superintendent and council.

7.

Upon the death of a conference minister or (a member of his family) the conference secretary shall notify the zone chairman, who shall inform the pastors of his zone.

8.

The questionnaire prepared by the Examining Board must be filled in by each applicant for conference license and sent to the chairman of the Examining Board. A duplicate copy is to be sent to the District Superintendent.

The recommendation of applicant for ministerial license shall be mailed to the Secretary of the Educational Board at least two weeks prior to the first meeting of such Board.

9.

The record of study of the Local Preacher's ministerial course shall be sent to the Secretary of the Educational Board and students, who are studying for the ministry and who do not have a record with the Ministerial Study Course Agency, shall send a record of study to the Secretary of the Educational Board. Such records may be obtained from the school in which their work is being taken, two weeks in advance.

10.

We recommend that the name of the "McCarty Street Pilgrim Holiness Church" of Indianapolis shall be changed to the "Drexel Gardens" Pilgrim Holiness Church."

11.

Whereas some students of Frankfort Pilgrim College, who are preparing for the ministry have been delinquent in their accounts with the College; and, whereas such students appear before the Educational and Examining Board, we recommend that the administration of the school be requested to give a list of such students to the Examining Board which may be used in consideration of recommendation for license and ordination.

Camp Meeting

13.

The Camp property shall be posted with "private property, no trespassing" signs to prevent unlawful traffic and trespassing on grounds when not in use.

Youth Work

14.

Whereas the youth organization desires a project for this year and whereas they feel the need of Home Missionary activities, and whereas the youth organization is currently paying rent on a tent for youth activities during camp meeting, we, therefore, recommend that the District Youth Organization be granted the privilege of having for their project this year the purchasing of a tent and chairs to be used:

1. To start new churches in prospective communities. Such work shall be approved by the District Council.

2. For youth activities during youth camps and the district camp meeting.

School Zone

15.

BE IT RESOLVED that the trustees of the Northern Indiana Conference shall be authorized to deed the school property to the trustees of Frankfort Pilgrim College with the provision that in the event that the school ceases to operate as a Bible College at the present location that jointly the Northern Indiana Conference and the Southern Indiana Conference shall have the first right to re-purchase the above property. In the event that the Southern Indiana Conference does not choose to repurchase, this privilege shall be granted to the Northern Indiana Conference.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the property be evaluated at the time of the transfer and if repurchased, an evaluation shall be made at that time and the purchase price shall be the difference between these two evaluations.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Northern Indiana Conference shall be granted Camp and Conference privileges of the dormitories, kitchen and cafeteria on a rental basis.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Frankfort Pilgrim College shall make satisfactory settlement with leasees of cottages located on college grounds.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the College shall make satisfactory settlement with the Conference regarding College property which is located on the Conference grounds.

We recommend that a copy of this action shall be sent to the Secretary of the Southern Indiana Conference.

Miscellaneous

16.

Whereas the Supreme Court has ruled to ban certain prayers in the New York public schools and whereas this may set a trend more atheistic in nature than the mere separation of church and state we recommend that this conference instruct the District Secretary of Northern Indiana to write the Representatives to Congress of this District requesting that provisions be made for prayer in our public schools.

RESOLUTIONS IN EFFECT FROM PREVIOUS CONFERENCES

Local Church

17.

The annual business of the local church shall close on April 30 each year and the district treasurer shall hold his books open until May 15.

18.

The pastor shall meet with his church at the earliest date after the close of conference, for the purpose of familiarizing his people with the actions of this conference.

19.

Each church shall provide a parsonage with telephone and other utilities also shall be furnished.

20.

Where churches and parsonages are located in cities, the address of the church and parsonage shall appear in the Minutes, and where parsonages are equipped with phone, the name of the pastor and Pilgrim Holiness Church shall be listed in the phone book.

21.

In case the parsonage is not equipped with heating facilities, window shades, kitchen and bathroom floor coverings, provision shall be made for the same by the local church.

22.

Inasmuch as there seems to be considerable confusion in the placing and calling of pastors due to the diversity of methods and procedures being used and insisted upon by the churches, therefore, be it resolved that a form of procedure to serve as a guide, for the calling of pastors be established as follows:

- a. Let all of the meetings pertaining to the recalling of a pastor be held during the second full week in May.
- b. If the pastor resigns, or is not recalled, the result of the meetings should immediately be forwarded to the Superintendent by the church secretary.
- c. If the pastor is recalled, he can have the legal time established by the manual (15 days) to accept or reject the call and he shall then immediately inform the Superintendent of his decision.
- d. In the event the pastor is leaving, the Superintendent shall present either in person, writing, or through an authorized representative the list of available ministers with recommendations that naturally fall within the jurisdiction of the Superintendent.
- e. It shall be the privilege of the local board of the church to immediately call a man on the basis of the Superintendent's recommendation without having a trial message.
- f. In the event the board and church desire a trial message, the board shall make a choice of a candidate. If two or three candidates are chosen, they should be designated as first, second, and third choice.
- g. After the trial message of a candidate, there shall be a vote on the candidate within a reasonable length of time.
- h. Let all ministers leaving their present charge consider their ministry to a church as ending according to the manual—the Sunday following conference, and all moving shall take place the following week.

23.

Any church calling a minister for a trial sermon shall pay, at least, his traveling expense.

24.

Each pastor shall be responsible for a record of all names and addresses of the subscribers to the Pilgrim Holiness Advocate in the vicinity of his pastorate, and shall endeavor to secure subscriptions equivalent in number to his membership roll.

25.

Each pastor shall prepare carefully a calling list of all homes connected with the church and Sunday School, listing addresses by city, street, and number, and he shall give such calling list to his successor on the field.

26.

The Sacrament of the Lord's Supper shall be observed at least once each quarter by our local churches. We further recommend that each church shall have a baptismal service each Conference year for those who qualify and desire the rite of baptism.

27.

Each church shall send the names of its lay delegates to the District Secretary not later than June 1.

28.

All funds raised by the local church for district and general interests must be sent to the District Treasurer. These said funds are to be specified for the particular interests for which they are raised.

29.

Whereas there has been no official method of tabulation of attendance of

branch Sunday Schools and the mother churches, be it resolved that this method be adopted:

- a. The attendance at the mother church should be recorded in the usual manner.
- b. All persons attending the branch Sunday School shall be counted, including the members of the mother church.
- c. These figures of attendance shall be reported separately.

30.

No church shall call an evangelist outside of our church without the approval of the District Superintendent.

31.

Each pastor shall be granted a two weeks' vacation with pay, and the pastor's salary shall be continued during Camp Meeting and while busy with other district duties.

32.

Before new construction or major remodeling of church buildings or parsonages is begun, plans, specifications, and financial appraisalment must be approved by the District Council or by a committee appointed by the same.

33.

Whereas the district records indicate that several of our church properties are not deeded according to the manual, be it resolved that this conference request each local board to the district to check the wording of their property deed, and urge these churches whose deeds are faulty to have them recorded according to the requirements of the 1958 manual. "Section 230, Par. 3."

Zone Work

34.

Inasmuch as the Zone Meetings have been beneficial in advancing the spiritual, educational, and doctrinal interests of the Conference they shall be continued.

35.

In order to facilitate better organization and fall rallies, we recommend that the officers of the zone, except those provided for in the manual, be elected in the last rally before District Conference, and to take office immediately following conference.

36.

Each zone shall elect its own youth secretary and treasurer.

37.

A committee of three men, appointed by the District Superintendent, shall determine the boundaries of the zones; any changes made shall be verified by the Conference.

Conference

38.

We recommend that our district conference shall convene on the fourth Wednesday of June at 1:30 P.M.

39.

The minister who fails to get his annual report to the Conference Statistician by May 25 shall be referred to the Examining Board.

40.

Whereas the lay delegate represents the local church in Conference, and since he is not sufficiently informed and does not have time to consider the forthcoming resolutions, we recommend that the reports of the Ways and Means and the Resolutions Committees be mimeographed and mailed to each delegate and pastor at least ten days prior to conference.

Further, we recommend that all proposals for these committees be submitted to the respective chairman of each committee not later than May 1.

41.

We recommend that a joint committee meeting of the Ways and Means Committee and the Resolutions Committee be called by the chairman of the Resolutions Committee for the preparation of the reports.

42.

Inasmuch as most ministers and pastors are present for conference, and the same are responsible for the church's response to such appeals, and inasmuch as the conference evening crowds, as a rule, are larger than the afternoon crowds of camp meeting, therefore, the departmental days shall be Church Extension on Wednesday night and Foreign Missions on Thursday night of conference, and Frankfort Pilgrim College Days at 2:30 p.m. the last Saturday of Camp.

43.

Only ministers and lay delegates shall be given entertainment during conference. Ministers' wives and children will be issued workers tickets. For all other entertainment the same rates shall prevail at as Camp Meeting.

44.

We shall have a brief memorial service instead of the morning devotional service on the second day of conference. We further recommend that we have a picture of each deceased with a brief account of his ministerial activities in the subsequent issue of the Conference Journal.

The Conference Secretary shall gather needed information of each of our ministers by sending out a questionnaire. This information is to be kept up to date by making the needed additions at the close of each annual conference.

45.

All auditing material shall be sent to the Auditing Committee by the Monday preceding conference.

46.

When a man is inadvertently placed on more boards and committees than he can well serve, the conference council shall make proper adjustments in such committees.

47.

The conference secretary, at his earliest convenience shall inform the chairman of the special committees of their respective duties.

Within three months said committees and boards are required to formulate plans to meet the desire of this conference.

48.

When an applicant cannot be present at annual conference, such applicant must comply with the direction of the Manual, Section 156, Paragraph No. 1.

49.

Whereas it is of considerable interest to the Educational and Examining Boards to know the ministerial activities in which the candidates for conference license have been engaged during the year.

We recommend that a copy of the unstationed ministers' report be filled out in duplicate and one copy be sent along with recommendation to the chairman of the Examining Board.

50.

The Educational and Examining Boards shall meet for the purpose of examining all candidates for conference license Monday prior to conference.

The candidates shall appear as follows:

- a. Monday, 1:30 to 5:00 p.m.—First Year Ministerial, Deaconesses, and Song Evangelists. (Names from A to M).

- b. Monday, 7:00 to 9:00 p.m.—First Year Ministerial, Deaconesses, and Song Evaneelists. (Names from N to Z).
- c. Tuesday, 8:00 to 11:30 a.m.—Second Year Ministerial.
- d. Tuesday, 1:30 to 5:00 p.m.—Third and Fourth Year Ministerial.
- e. Wednesday, 8:00 to 11:00 a.m.—Final Meeting.

Any candidate who fails to appear on schedule will automatically have his license suspended for the ensuing year, unless in the judgment of the Education and Examining Boards an exception should be made.

According to the ruling of General Superintendent, Rev. R. G. Flexon in 1959 Conference, any candidate who fails to appear according to schedule and who has not been excused by the Educational and Examining Boards will cease his ministerial standing at 10:00 a.m. Wednesday and will thus not have voice or vote in the conference.

51.

Whereas the Manual outlines the duties and prerogatives of the Educational and Examining Boards, and whereas commitments to candidates embarrass candidates and embarrass and hinder these Boards in the performance of their duties, be it therefore resolved that no such commitments be made.

52.

Every church board and pastor shall be more careful about the recommendation of candidates for conference license. All candidates who may be in question, if in the judgment of the local board such candidates have possibilities, the recommendation shall be made with reservations.

All recommendations shall be mailed to the chairman of the Examining Board.

53.

Inasmuch as the responsibility for the executive of all conference action rests primarily on its entire ministry, be it resolved that this conference instruct its examining board to recommend for their first district license only those who give evidence of intentions to take a permanent place in our ministry.

54.

The District Ministerial Convention shall convene on the second Thursday of February and continue through Friday.

55.

The duties of the Conference Sunday School Board, in harmony with the manual of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, shall be as follows:

- a. The Conference Sunday School Board, together with the district superintendent shall arrange for Sunday School institutes to be held in the respective zones during the year.
- b. To promote and encourage the Sunday School work throughout the conference.
- c. To encourage each local church to conduct a summer Vacation Bible School.
- d. The Conference Sunday School Board shall work in conjunction with the General Sunday School Secretary in promoting the annual Rally Day, and make available material for an annual Sunday School revival from Easter to Mother's Day.
- e. To have published each month a Conference Sunday School sheet showing the attendance of each Sunday School in the conference for the month, except July. This sheet is to be sent to each pastor and posted on the bulletin board.

- f. To present an annual report to the conference which shall include the following:
 1. A statement of the work accomplished during the year.
 2. A statement of the general condition of the Sunday School work in the conference.
 3. To present a proposed budget to the council.

56.

The council shall direct the conference treasurer to take care of expenses incurred by the conference Sunday School Board within the limits of the proposed budget.

57.

Whereas a program for lay visitation and personal soul-winning is greatly needed in our district, be it resolved that we adopt the following plan to be known as "Personal Soul-Winning and Lay Visitation Plan."

- a. That a committee of not more than three be appointed by the District Superintendent and ratified by the Conference, whose work will be:
 1. To lay out a course study.
 2. To appoint committees and instructors in each zone and advise in organizing classes.
 3. To gather information and give reports on progress and accomplishments.
- b. Be it further resolved that:
 1. There be an intense effort on the part of the pastor to attend all classes, and that he enlist as many of the laity of his church as possible.
 2. A certificate of accomplishment be given to all who finish the course.

Be it resolved that at some time during the period of instruction or immediately thereafter, the pastor of each church will organize in his or her church a group of soul-winning and lay visitation and set up files and records recommended by the committee, and that these be kept as permanent records of the church.

58.

The camp meeting shall begin on the first Friday of August.

59.

All who have a deposit on a camp meeting room must notify the Rooms Superintendent the last Friday of July the date they intend to arrive. Those failing to do so will forfeit their room rights.

Anyone who leaves the district forfeits his right to hold a room.

Each renter must bring his own bedding.

60.

No lease is to be bought or sold without the sanction of the proper agent signing the same and a carbon copy of this contract to be kept in the agent's file, the same to be the property of the camp meeting board.

Furthermore, no person is allowed to own two leases and any person who buys a lease must build within three years or the camp board, at its discretion, may repossess the lot by refunding the purchase price.

61.

We recommend that a Camp Ground Development Committee of five be appointed by the council for planning and executing a long range development program for the present camp grounds.

Further, we recommend that these plans for development be submitted to the combined council and camp meeting board for approval.

62.

Because of the evil influence of obscene literature and many T.V. programs that promulgate vulgarity and hinder spirituality, be it resolved that we as a conference are opposed to the same, and that we strongly urge Pilgrims to use all possible legal and moral persuasion to curb such evil influences. We recommend that our people not have television.

63.

Inasmuch as the school maintains a trailer court for the students, therefore, we recommend that all student trailers be parked in the school trailer court.

64.

A Thanksgiving Harvest Day for the school shall be observed. Such day shall be made for the various zones to bring in canned goods and produce for the school.

65.

The pastor who fails to meet his district budget shall be requested to appear before the District Council giving an explanation.

66.

This conference goes on record as interpreting I Peter 3, where it speaks of the wearing of gold to mean all rings, including wedding and class rings. (See Manual: Section 77, Paragraph 1.4).

67.

The Conference Council shall continue the publication of the "Pilgrim Voice."

68.

The District Council shall present six names from which three trustees of Frankfort Pilgrim College may be elected. The District Superintendent by virtue of his office shall be the fourth member of the Board of Trustees.

69.

Each pastor shall inform his people that legislation protects their employment rights and also protects them against discrimination in their place of employment when they refuse to work on Sunday. The Conference also goes on record as opposed to the growing tendency of Sunday shopping and we will do all within our power to encourage legislation against same.

70.

This conference goes on record as being opposed to the legalized liquor traffic in all forms. We recommend that our ministers and lay members lend their support to encourage legislation in favor of prohibition by returning such questionnaires as they receive to proper legislators.

71.

The District Treasurer shall be a member of the Ways and Means Committee.

72.

Whereas the district council generally lacks the proper and necessary information relative to ministers of other districts and denominations desiring membership in our district, be it resolved that the same be required to answer a questionnaire supplied by the district council.

73.

Whereas the minister's wife makes a vital contribution to her husband's work, therefore we recommend that the wife of a candidate for ordination be given an honorary seat with the candidate during the ordination service.

74.

Immediately following the Conference the Secretary shall mail to each pastor an itemized postal notice of the financial requirements of the church for the year including general church assessments.

75.

Six hundred copies of the Conference Minutes shall be provided within 30 days after the Conference adjourns. Each church must send in the money with its order.

76.

Whereas, the General Board of the Pilgrim Holiness Church has authorized the Pilgrim Pension Plan, Inc., to make loans of pension funds to local Pilgrim Holiness Churches under such conditions as require active participation on the part of the Pilgrim Holiness Districts.

Therefore, Be it resolved by the Annual Conference of this district that the District Council, District Trustees, and all District Officials be, and they are hereby authorized, to do and perform any and all acts required of them in the consummation of authorized loans to local Pilgrim Holiness Churches of this district, subject, however, to the limitations and conditions set out in said Resolution of the General Board of the Pilgrim Holiness Church authorizing said loans.

77.

Each individual shall feel a responsibility, during Camp and Conference, for the protection of personal and camp property, and each is to be a committee of one to help keep all conduct in an orderly manner.

Camp Meeting

78.

Conference ministers, their wives, and their dependent children shall be granted workers tickets for their meals during camp meeting and those physically able shall be assigned their respective duties and all failing to fill their assignment shall have their workers tickets forfeited.

79.

The Camp Meeting Secretary shall issue no workers tickets to laymen except such as are authorized by the department superintendents.

80.

The Camp Meeting Board shall prepare workers tickets with proper rules printed on the back of the same.

81.

The Camp Meeting Board shall appoint a Cottage Committee, which shall be in charge of the erection of cottages. All cottages must be erected according to blueprints and approved by said committee.

82.

The Chairman of the Cottage Committee shall be in charge of all contracts concerning lots and cottages, and all correspondence concerning the same shall be directed to the Cottage Committee Chairman.

83.

The Camp Meeting Board shall be authorized to secure a part-time caretaker for the Camp Grounds.

REPORT OF THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

Local Church Financial

1.

We recommend that the Conference budget consists of 10% of all money raised by the local church and Sunday School except that raised for missions, United Stewardship Fund, revivals, building funds, and all funds raised for specified conference interests. Building fund purposes shall be interpreted to include rent on parsonages and church and money paid on contracts of the same.

2.

We recommend that the conference budget be prorated as follows: Conference Fund, 60%; Old People's Home, 2%; Frankfort Pilgrim College, 17%;

Home Missions, 14%; General Conference, 3%; and Evangelists' Pension Plan, 2%; and Camp Meeting, 2%.

3.

We recommend that each church raise 10 cents per member per month for District Home Missionary Work and Church Extension, money to be paid to the Conference Treasurer.

4.

We recommend that each church pay the Frankfort Pilgrim College at the rate of 1% of the monthly gross receipts of the local church treasury where said gross receipts are less than \$250.00 per month, and those churches with a monthly gross income of \$250.00 or more shall pay an amount equal to 2% of such gross income. Said payments to be made each month through the Conference Treasury.

5.

We recommend that one-half of the Mothers' Day Sunday School offering be sent to the district treasurer specified district Sunday School expense.

6.

Whereas there seems to be a need of clarification as to the proper procedure for sending in funds to the Conference Treasurer, we recommend that ALL funds raised in ALL departments of the local church for District and General interest must be:

1. Transferred to the account of the local church treasurer.
2. All money mailed in one check by the local treasurer to the district treasurer monthly.

District Financial

1.

We recommend that our conference stenographer be paid \$40.00 and that the secretary be authorized to secure additional helpers at the same rate.

2.

We recommend that our District Superintendent be paid a salary of \$110 per week plus utilities, not to exceed \$400 per year, and traveling expense. (Traveling expense shall include overnight lodging and meals when traveling for district work.)

3.

We recommend that our Assistant Superintendent be paid at the rate of \$12.00 per day plus mileage for each day's service, also district telephone expense.

4.

We recommend that the Conference Secretary be paid \$200.00 for his services for the year.

5.

We recommend that the Conference Treasurer be paid \$600.00 for his services for the year.

6.

We recommend that the Conference Statistician be paid \$100.00 for his services for the year.

7.

We recommend that the editor of the Pilgrim Voice be paid \$125.00 for his services for the year.

8.

We recommend our Secretary-Treasurer of our Group Insurance Program be paid \$75.00 for his services for the year.

9.

Inasmuch as we have a Home Missionary Loan Fund to aid with the establishing of new churches, and whereas there are some churches who are delinquent in payment of said loan, we urge those who have loans to bring their payments up to date.

We further recommend that each pastor with the assistance of the District Superintendent secure new pledges of \$5.00 per call, there will not be over two calls per conference year. On-half of the amount raised by each call shall be an outright gift to the church for which the call is made; the other half shall be made available as a loan which will be repaid to the conference. The payments made on the loan shall go into a loan fund which will be established and administered by the conference council. The rate of interest shall be 4%.

10.

We recommend that our Sunday School Promotional Secretary be paid \$100.00 for his services for the year.

11.

We recommend that the standard mileage rate be fixed at six cents per mile.

12.

We recommend that each church raise .25 cents per member per year for the operating expense of the Old People's Home.

13.

We recommend that the Treasurer's report, which is sent to the pastors, be a complete report of the giving of the local church, and shall include departmental offerings.

Camp Meeting

1.

We recommend that the District Superintendent appoint a committee of three, one of whom shall have a knowledge of real estate values, to appraise each cottage to be rented, and to set up an equitable schedule of rental fees.

Be it further resolved that the rental fees set by the committee will go into effect at the beginning of the next rental schedule on the part of the cottage owner.

Be it further resolved that any cottage owner who charges rent in excess of the ceiling price set by the committee, will automatically forfeit his right to rent the cottage.

Be it further resolved that the cottage owner shall have the right to appeal to the district council in case he feels that the rental fees set by the rental committee is unfair to his interests.

2.

We recommend that any person accepted as a worker by the camp committee shall be required to pay a registration fee for the camp meeting of \$1.00.

3.

We recommend that the Camp Meeting Board pass on all improvements or construction not entailing an expense of more than \$1,000.00.

4.

Inasmuch as provision has been made to secure a caretaker for the camp meeting ground, and, due to the cost of maintaining roads, sewer and utility service, we recommend a system of charge be made to help cover the cost.

We recommend a charge of \$5.00 a year for each person keeping an automobile on the camp grounds. We also recommend a fee of \$12.50 a year be paid by all persons renting or living in their own cottage three months or longer throughout the year.

We further recommend that all persons who use cottages during camp meeting only, pay a fee of \$1.00 a year.

We also recommend a charge of \$25.00 a year be made for all House Cars and Trailers parked over a period of three months on the camp ground. In case anyone fails to comply with these regulations, the Camp Board is to

see that their utilities are cut off. These fees shall be paid to the caretaker not later than January the first of each year.

5.

We recommend that immediate steps be taken by the Camp Meeting Board to secure Public Liability insurance for our Camp.

6.

Inasmuch as the camp meeting is not included in the budget, and there is no special assessment for the support of the camp, and, in view of the fact that the camp faces rising costs with diminishing income, we recommend that the Camp Meeting Board present a plan for yearly pledges to be solicited from the churches for the support of the Camp.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON MEMOIRS

It has been our privilege to have had our General Superintendent, Rev. William H. Neff, with us this year presiding over our conference. In these critical days you may be assured, Bro. Neff, along with our other leaders, that our prayers will follow you.

We wish to express our appreciation for the work of our District Superintendent, Rev. R. E. Nibarger and also for the untiring and faithful work of our District Council and committees.

We appreciate the youth of our district and the interest that was shown in their conference held at the Purdum Street Pilgrim Holiness Church in Kokomo, Ind. Rev. J. D. Abbott presided and also gave a wonderful message in the evening to the youth on the subject "How Old Are You?"

Also we are grateful for the interest that was shown for our first District Youth Banquet which was held at Marion, Indiana, in honor of the Seniors. 57 seniors were honored and a total of 271 were present. We commend the planning committee for their good spiritual program which was enjoyed by all.

We are a privileged people to have such a wonderful tabernacle and campus in which we can meet and have freedom of worship and take care of the business of our great church. Let us ever be thankful for these blessings!

DISTRICT YOUTH CONFERENCE JOURNAL

The Pilgrim Holiness Youth Conference of the Northern Indiana District, held at the Kokomo Purdum Street Church, convened at 2:00 P.M., Saturday, May 26, 1962. "He Keeps Me Singing" was sung by the congregation conducted by Rev. George Blice. Rev. William Babb, District Youth President, opened the meeting and welcomed the Conference to the Kokomo Church. The District Superintendent, Rev. R. E. Nibarger, led the Conference in prayer. Rev. Babb introduced Rev. J. D. Abbott, General Secretary of Sunday School and Youth of the Pilgrim Holiness Church. Rev. Abbott then addressed the Conference reminding it of its responsibility to youth.

The ministry of the church to her youth is to help them know Christ, find their place in life, and obtain a moral foundation. The church should entrust youth with responsibility. The teaching of the truth must seem sensible to youth. The Christian life needs to be related to living. Words and expressions demand meanings which can be focused in the minds of young people. Cliches are meaningless.

In summary, the church can help youth be satisfied in Christ, find the right mission, make adequate preparation for marriage and home life, find the eternal values of the Bible, and become trained leaders in church and community circles. The great task of the church is for youth.

Rev. Abbott followed his address by praying over the Conference. He then presided at the meeting.

The roll was called by the secretary.

Motion carried to seat the delegates of the roll as read and augmented. The roll included 27 pastors, 25 local presidents, and 49 delegates.

Motion carried to establish the voting bar to include the first ten benches and the platform.

The report of the District Youth President was given by Rev. William Babb and accepted.

The report of the District Youth Treasurer was submitted by Rev. Elvin M. Powers. It was accepted.

By the decision of the chair, the reports of the Zone Leaders were omitted due to the limit of time.

Report of the District Youth Statistician, Rev. Ernest Batman, was read and accepted.

The Policy Committee report was given by Mr. Wayne Overmyer. The following resolutions were accepted.

1. Be it resolved: that statistical reports be forwarded to the District Youth Statistician within ten days following the close of the church year.
2. Be it resolved; that the Journal of the District Youth Conference be placed in the back of the District Conference Journal with a title page prefacing such.
3. Be it resolved; that resolution No. 4, page 29, be amended to read as follows: Each Youth Committee under the direction of the Zone Youth Leader shall recommend nominees for Zone Youth Leader to the District Council. The Zone Youth Committee shall consist of the Zone Youth President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, and each local pastor and youth president.
4. Be it resolved; that resolutions Nos. 4, 5, and 8 become Standing Rules.

Resolution No. 4 as amended above.

Resolution No. 5. Be it resolved; that the District Youth President be a member of all Youth Boards and Committees by virtue of his office.

Resolution No. 8. Be it resolved; that the District Youth Treasurer and Secretary be members of the Youth Camps Committee by virtue of their office.

Motion carried to accept the report of the Home Missionary Project Committee. Rev. Glen Raney read the report.

Motion carried that the Youth Executive Committee work with the District Home Missionary Committee to organize and formulate definite plans for a Youth Home Missionary Project. The project is to be presented to and in each Zone at the first Zone meeting in the fall of 1962.

Motion carried that the resolution concerning the District Youth Financial Program become a standing rule. The resolution is as follows: Be it resolved: that we recommend that the Youth Conference budget be paid according to church membership as follows:

25 members or under	\$.50 per month
26-50 members	1.00 per month
51-75 members	1.50 per month
76-100 members	2.00 per month
101 or more	2.50 per month
