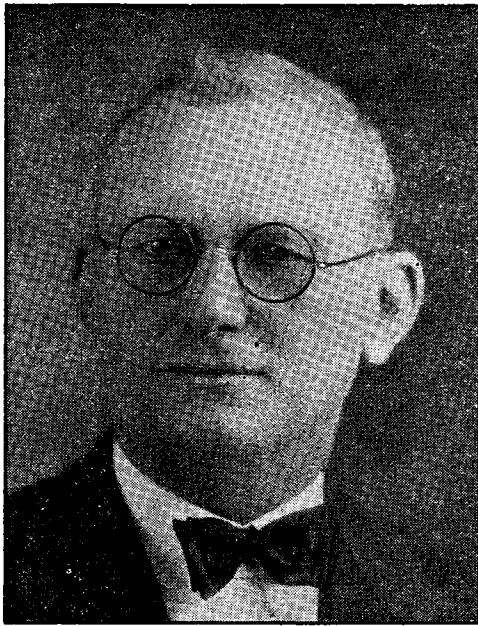

REPORTS

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Dearly Beloved:

After a year and two weeks labor on the Oklahoma and Texas Territory as District Superintendent, I am glad to give this my first year's report of the work.

First. I want to thank God for giving me a year of victory, also for giving me health and strength the past year, so that I was able to keep all appointments.

Second. I want to thank God for the co-operation of the District Council. Bros. Beltz and Haltom and now since Bro. Beltz has been transferred to the Iowa and Missouri District, Bros. Posey and Bottenberg have been added as associate Councilmen. Our Council meetings have been times of waiting on God, sweet fellowship and perfect harmony in planning and transacting of all the District business.

Third. I have so appreciated our loyal pastors, they have stood by me in our undertakings for God., they have labored faithfully, they have been a great encouragement to me, and have sent in no letters of complaint.

We have a small number of churches covering a large territory but have taken no backward steps. We thank God for the gain that has been on all lines. We have now 10 organized churches in the District. Two new churches have been organized this year, namely, Plainview, Texas and Sweetwater, Texas. The Plainview church was organized last winter, then we held a two weeks tent meeting for them this spring in which souls were saved and some new members were added to the class. Our tent was then taken to Sweetwater, Texas where Bros. Ingram and Ponder and Party held a three weeks home missionary meeting. I was with them the last week of the meeting, at the close of which our last new church was organized.

Our membership on the District last year were 214. The membership now is 262.

We have traveled over 10,968 miles this year in the District work. Attended two General Board meetings at Indianapolis, four school board meeting of Colorado Springs Bible training school, have made 44 visits to the churches, and held seven revivals on the district. Besides the District work we held our quota of meetings off the District. Attended and assisted in the Colorado Springs Camp this last June. We also thank God for our mid-winter Preachers convention that was held in our Pleasant View church. Also helped in two Camp meetings at Hopeton, Okla.

I have traveled 258 times, prayed in 150 homes, held 12 revivals in Pilgrim Holiness churches. we had 90 professed regenerations and 105 sanctifications, and dealt with 132 souls personally, and anointed 55 for healing, officiated at one funeral, and secured 10 subscribers of the P. H. Advocate. I received as salary from the general board and District \$750 for the year and two weeks, and I am paid in full. I strictly tithed into the Pilgrim Holiness church, also give offerings to the same. The Lord has favored wife and I to be in the home of Brother and Sister Andrew Haltom this year, and they have given us a two-room apartment free which has meant at least a \$100 gift to us and the District. I feel grateful to God and to Brother and Sister Haltom for this gift, and this has enabled us to help our pastors on small charges more.

We believe that the Lord has helped us on the District in a most wonderful way this year. The first part of the year we had to help the smaller churches, and a few need some more help in the near future, but the Lord is opening up new fields for us to enter, I am trusting that the Lord may soon open the way for us to enter these prospective places.

It seems to me that we have not had much progress, but I am trusting the Lord for greater things this year. I trust that the General board will feel led to mother us another year. We have and do appreciate what the General Board has done for us as a District.

RESOLUTIONS ADOPTED BY THE ASSEMBLY

1. We recommend that the following funds: District Superintendent, Home Missions, and Miscellaneous, all be one fund, and that each church be apportioned as in the previous year, plus the Pastor's tithe. That the loan from the Home missionary fund to the District Superintendent be cancelled from the assembly year 1935 and 36. The amount is \$82.29.

2. We recommend that resolution No. 3 be changed to read thus: That the District Superintendent tithe his ministerial income from the District into the District Treasury for Home Missions.

3. Since there has been no provision made for the traveling expense of the Superintendent, other than free will offerings and since the district is so large that it will mean a lot of traveling; Be it resolved that a liberal love offering be given him at each quarterly visit to our churches, same to be over and above the amounts apportioned each church and the Minister's tithe. Be it also further resolved that he be paid a minimum of 2½ cents per mile, that the free will offerings be applied on the same and the balance paid from the Home mission fund.

4. Inasmuch as prayer is so important in carrying out the great commission; Be it resolved that each church have a Missionary Prayer Meeting each month, and that the Pastors urge their people to pray especially for our home and foreign missionary work.

5. Since the Bible teaches us that faith without works is dead; Be it resolved that in addition to our Missionary prayer meetings that each church or Sunday School take an offering each month for home missions, and also an offering for the General budget and foreign missions and that the amounts specified by our General Board, namely \$1.00 per member for General Board, and \$2.00 per member for Foreign Missions be our goal.

6. Whereas it is so expensive to buy new tents and we must conserve the one that we have; Be it resolved that each time the tent is used for established churches the sum of \$5.00 be sent to the district treasurer, and that \$15.00 for the use of it during the district camp; Also that each Sunday School with an attendance averaging over 75 pay 20 cents per week, and the Schools with an attendance under this amount 10 cents per week into the tent fund.

7. In order that we may conserve the Lord's money and give our churches the advantages of evangelistic meetings; Be it resolved that we as pastors and churches consult our Superintendent in slating evangelists and where it is possible and practical they be slated for two or more consecutive meetings which would keep down traveling expenses.

8. Inasmuch as there are such great blessings derived from a ministerial and Christian's Worker's Convention; Be it resolved that

during the year we have a three day Convention on the District. The Council shall be the Committee to set the time and place and prepare the program.

9. Be it resolved that each church on the District give a percentage of its offerings for the upkeep of the District and General Church after the Pastor has had first consideration.
