**MINUTES OF THE EIGHTEENTH ANNUAL CONFERENCE
OF THE OKLAHOMA-TEXAS DISTRICT**

FIRST SITTING

The first sitting convened at Hopeton, Oklahoma, July 31, 1944 at 8:30 A. M. District Superintendent, Rev. D. R. Close, presided.

Mrs. Grace Nelson led the Conference in singing, "Standing on the Promises" and "Ere the Sun Goeth Down." Rev. J. H. Fortner led in prayer. Rev. D. R. Close gave an inspiring message on II Timothy 4.

The roll call of Ministers and Delegates was taken.

It was moved and seconded that the first four rows of seats constitute the Conference Bar. Carried.

Rev. E. C. Gafford from the Kansas District and Rev. Marion Hill from the Rocky Mountain District were received into the Oklahoma District.

Rev. Scott Clark, Colorado Springs, Colorado, was granted an honorary seat within the Conference Bar.

The report of the Examining Committee was read and accepted.

The District Superintendent's report was read and accepted.

The District Treasurer's report was read and accepted.

The recommendations of the Ways and Means Committee were read and accepted.

The recommendations of the Resolutions Committee were read and accepted.

The Memorial (Condolence) Committee's report was read and accepted.

J. H. Fortner and W. P. Haltom were elected as additional members of the District Council.

Marion Hill was elected as a member of the Educational Board, 1944-47.

J. H. Fortner was elected on the Bible School Board.

Marion Hill, C. J. Meyers and E. C. Gafford were elected to the Sunday School Board.

The report of the Statistical Committee was read and accepted.

Motion made and seconded we pay the District Secretary \$10.00 for his work. Carried.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

We respectfully submit the following report on the state of the District and of our labors for the past year to the Annual District Conference of the Oklahoma District convened at Hopeton, Oklahoma.

This past year has been one of continuous fellowship among the Pilgrims of the District. God has blessed us with revivals this past year. While we have not seen the results from revivals that we would have liked to have seen, yet we can say that God has visited us. I sincerely believe that each church and pastor did their best to have God's blessings upon the services. We must have revivals or we perish. This year has been one of advancement

for nearly all our churches and we can truly say our people as a whole are better established with the years.

The cooperation of our people to the program of the church is to be greatly commended. It has been a pleasure to work with the District preachers and their churches. We have as fine a people in Oklahoma as we could wish to work with.

Our district home missionary program is going forward with God's blessings. Last year a splendid response was given to the cause of home missions. We could not make any advancement last fall due to the lack of workers. This spring we were able to get Brother and Sister Gafford for a new work in Henryetta. Sister Caroline Nelson and Dorothy Hill helped us in this meeting. These girls are good workers. They know how to pray and carry a burden and get blessed and also to be friendly with the people and make themselves generally handy around a home missionary meeting. We are glad to see our young people come back to us from the school with a desire to help in God's work. We are glad to get a nice group to organize in Henryetta. We should have, under the leadership of the Lord, a good church in a few years. Henryetta is a good town which derives its support from a zinc smelter, glass plant, and coal mines.

Sister Wilson put up one of the tents in Bethany where there is a real need for a live Holiness Church with the blessing of God upon it. We believe much good was accomplished in this meeting and considerable interest was manifested. Brother R. R. Sharp is now carrying on and we hope to have a Pilgrim church in Bethany by next year.

We are planning a tent meeting in Enid after camp meeting. Caroline Nelson will help in this meeting.

We are trusting that this next year will again be one of advancement on the home missionary front. It seems that we are getting the right program, and if we have, let us do all we can to keep it going. We are getting a fine group of preachers on this district that are interested in the Oklahoma District. We greatly appreciate this, as it makes it much easier for our churches and people, when we know we have a group that is interested in the advancement of the District.

This spring the General Board placed Texas back with Oklahoma. We have a fine group of preachers and churches coming home again. We want a unity to prevail between the two where there will be no feeling of separation. Our Texas Brethren have a vision for that end of the field. We are trusting God to bless us as we work together. Our problems and our successes and failures are now one. We give the Texas preachers and churches a royal welcome as we now labor under the title of the Oklahoma-Texas district. We trust that some day we may be known as the Southwestern District.

We have preached 114 times, held 3 revivals, dedicated 13 children, preached 2 funerals and held 12 business meetings with the churches, either a board meeting or church meeting. I presided at the Pacific Northwest Conference last year, attended 2 Bible School Board meetings and one executive committee meeting of the School Board. I also attended one meeting of the General Home Missionary Committee meeting and one General Board meeting in Indianapolis. We have traveled in district work 5521 miles and approximately 8100 miles in the interest of the church, a total of 13,621 miles. We have received \$135.25 for travel expense; and for telephone, telegram, and stationery \$73.00. We have received from the District \$540.00 in salary and from the General Church \$668.00. My ministerial tithe is paid into the District Treasury.

RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE

Standing Resolutions

1. We recommend that the fiscal year close June 30th, and that the pastors preach their farewell sermon the Sunday following camp.
2. Inasmuch as the District Treasurer has so much work to do at the close of the year, be it resolved that all district and general monies be sent to the District Treasurer not later than July 6th.
3. Be it resolved that all delegates exceed the age of eighteen years.
4. Be it resolved that the Council make arrangements for a quarterly bulletin of district interests to be sent to each church.
5. Whereas it is so expensive to buy new tents and we must conserve the ones we have, be it resolved that each time the tent is used for established churches the sum of \$5.00 be sent to the District Treasurer, and that \$15.00 be paid for the use during the district campaign; also that each Sunday School with an attendance of over 50 pay 20c per week and the school with an attendance under 50 pay 10c per week into the tent fund.
6. In order that we may conserve the Lord's money and give our churches the advantage of evangelistic meetings, be it resolved that we as pastors and churches consult our Superintendent in slating Evangelists and if it is possible and practical that they be slated for two or more consecutive meetings which would keep down traveling expense.
7. Inasmuch as there is such a great blessing derived from a ministerial and Christian workers convention, be it resolved that during the year we have a three-day convention in the district. The council shall be the committee to set the time and prepare the program.
8. We recommend that the District Superintendent appoint all committees for the next year during the present conference sitting.
9. Be it resolved that our camp begin the third Friday in July.
10. Whereas it is quite a job to get ready for camp and to clean up after the camp and as camp comes in a busy time, be it resolved that each minister come a day earlier, stay throughout camp and a day after camp unless excused by the District Superintendent.
11. We recommend that we have 150 copies of the Minutes of the 1944 Conference printed.
12. Resolved that each pastor have the privilege of conducting two revival meetings off charge during the year; providing that his charge be supplied satisfactorily with local board.
13. Resolved that the 1945 Camp have Children's and Young People's Services, the District Council to secure a leader for each and said meetings to be announced on the camp meeting bills.
14. Resolved that the District Council set the date of District Conference.
15. Resolved that each active minister be released for two Sundays during the Camp and Conference and that they receive regular salary provided they attend Camp and Conference.
16. Resolved that the first prayer meeting night of each month shall be the donation night for the pastors of the district. The announcement shall be made the Sunday previous by the Sunday School Superintendent.

NEW RESOLUTIONS

1. Be it resolved that two zone rallys be held in the first and second quarter and that we devote one service of each rally to the interests of the Sunday School work of the district.

2. Be it resolved that we require our pastors to see that all reports are mailed to the District Superintendent by the 15th of the month following the close of the quarter and that the annual reports are mailed to the Chairman of the Statistical Committee by July 15th, or by the 15th of the month following the close of the Church year.

3. Be it resolved that the District Conference grant power to the District Council to incorporate the District in the event state law makes such requirement.

4. Be it resolved that the District Conference delegate authority to the District Council to act in all business matters or unfinished business occurring during the conference year.

5. Inasmuch as the U. S. Service Men's Christian Fellowship paper is deeply appreciated by the men of the armed forces of our country and its support is somewhat neglected among our churches, be it resolved that our pastors take a special offering on the last Sunday of each quarter for this purpose and said offering to be sent to the District Treasurer.

6. We recommend the District Council appoint a Sunday School Board.

7. We recommend that we devote at least one sitting of the Ministerial Convention to the interests of Sunday School work.

SPECIAL RESOLUTIONS

1. Resolved that we as Conference express our appreciation to our District Superintendent, by a rising vote of thanks, for his labors of love among us during the last year.

2. Be it resolved that appreciation be expressed by the Secretary to the business firms who have donated to the Camp.

2. We recommend that District Superintendent be paid 3 cents per mile for travel expenses.

3. We recommend that all ministerial tithe be paid to the District Treasurer monthly. This tithe is to be placed in the district fund.

4. We recommend that the birthday offering of the Sunday Schools be given in the interest of the Bible School.

5. We recommend that the registration fee for adults at camp meeting be set at \$2.00 for those who stay the full time, that children ages 5 to 12 pay \$1.00. Active ministers and their families are exempt from fee.

6. We recommend that the District Treasurer be paid \$20.00 for his services for the year.

7. We recommend that the District postage, stationery, telegrams and telephone calls be paid out of the District Budget.

8. We recommend that all district and general funds be forwarded to the District Treasurer on the first of each month.

9. We recommend that all district checks from the bank be kept on file and turned over with the Treasurer's books.

10. We recommend that the District Home Missionary offering which is taken the last Sunday of Camp be applied to the interest of Home Missions. The distribution of all home missionary monies shall be left to the District Council.
