*Report of Ways and Means Committee as Accepted
by the Conference*

1. Resolved that all minister's ministerial tithe be sent to the District Treasurer to be used for district Home Missions.
2. Resolved that all Birthday offerings be used for the purpose of opening new works on the district.
3. Resolved that \$900.00 be raised for District Home Missions and that each pastor shall take a Home Missionary offering each month.
4. Resolved that \$30.00 shall be sent to General Headquarters each month for General Home Missions.

*Report of the Resolution Committee as Accepted
by the District Conference*

STANDING RESOLUTIONS

1. That the District Council serve as our Missionary Committee.
2. That each church devote one service each month to missionary interests.
3. Be it resolved that no minister, evangelist, or Christian worker in any realm be permitted to hold special services on the District who is not sympathy and harmony with the doctrine and teaching of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, nor without, the advice and consent of the District Superintendent.
4. That each church appoint an individual to see that there is a food offering for the pastor at least once each month to be investigated by the District Superintendent during his visit at each church.
5. All money is to be sent to the District Treasurer by the 10th of each month.
6. That all churches take an offering, both of food and cash for the Camp Meeting.
7. That the fiscal year shall close July 15, with pastors all taking their new charges the first Sunday after Camp Meeting.
8. We insist that each pastor conduct a class of catechism on the doctrine of Holiness each month for the education of the members and their children.
9. Inasmuch as we are living in times of extreme lusts and worldliness and that such a spirit is manifest even in Holi-

ness churches, be it resolved that we request every parent member to see to it that their children dress and conduct themselves as becometh holiness and according to our Church Manual—Page 49, Section 65, and the Bible.

10. Be it resolved that we set aside a three day period of some Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, as a Preachers Convention of which the time, place, and speaker shall be determined by a special committee appointed by the District Superintendent.

11. Whereas two weeks Camp Meeting is too long and more costly, and whereas it is hard to secure competent workers, be it resolved that we have a ten days Camp Meeting which shall convene the first Friday of August each calender year.

12. Be it resolved that each church shall conduct a special Pilgrim Holiness Advocate subscription campaign and that a gold star recognition shall be given to each church that attains a seventy-five percent family membership subscription.

13. Be it resolved that our young people be given a prominent part in our District Preachers Convention.

ADDITIONAL RESOLUTIONS

1. Be it resolved that we give a rising vote of thanks to Sister Snider and her helpers for their labors in the dining room and kitchen.

2. Whereas Rev. R. W. Wolfe, our General Church Secretary of Home Missions and Church Extension has so ably and wisely directed our Conference, be it resolved that we give him a rising vote of appreciation and a hearty Amen.

3. Be it resolved that we stand and sing one verse of "Blest Be The Tie That Binds, in appreciation for and confidence in our new District Superintendent, Rev. Floyd Morgan.

NOTES

District Superintendent's Report

(August 1st, 1943 to May 1st, 1944—9 month period)

To the Fifth Annual Conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Church of the Pacific Northwest District, convened at Quinaby Park, Salem, Oregon, July 27, 1944.

At the close of three years as Superintendent of the Pacific Northwest District, I bring this report for the past nine months of the Conference year of 1943-44 that I served until called into the office by the General Board to assist our beloved Brother Wolfe as Promotional Secretary. It meant the severing of heart ties and friendships that were precious, but such is the lot of any true missionary of the Cross.

This past year was a good year for us as a District. The Church at Marysville came into our ranks with their splendid spiritual people and pastor, Brother Tompkins. The new work at Silverton was started and Brother and Sister Fenton were secured for pastors. Then plans were made for the work at Vancouver, Washington and it was our pleasure to see Brother Canary and his wife on the field before leaving the District. The other churches have all been strengthened this past year and a splendid corps of workers are now on the field. Our Sunday Schools have made a good gain and as a District we have had some good revivals with Brother Roy Morgan, Brother Stikeleather, Brother Wickens and Brother Harrington, as well as others. We have made good strides in property gains, a fine new parsonage in Seattle, purchased and decorated and repaired property in Raymond, purchased property in Bend, and purchased and remodeled the church in Klamath Falls. In addition to this, two lots were bought on the District. Many improvements were made on the Camp Grounds.

Our finances have been very good this past year, personally I have received from District sources some \$200.00 for personal use, the first year that this was possible. I have written some 800 letters, published the Bulletin, visited all churches three times, some many times, have preached about 200 times and had about 250 seekers. I have held three revivals, one School Convention at Colorado Springs, supplied the Montavilla Portland pastorate for five weeks and the Salem pastorate

for two months, have traveled about 30,000 miles, and also attended the General Board meeting at Indianapolis.

Report for last three months as District Minister

We made the move to Indianapolis and finally have been able to get settled. Besides all the office and publicity work, I have held H. M. services at five Camp Meetings, have held H. M. Rallies in churches, and preached for five different churches that were needing help. Also have been privileged to labor some among our colored people.

To the Fifth Annual Conference of the North Pacific District; Greetings.

I bring the following report.

On being notified of my appointment as District Superintendent by the General Board, after prayer and consideration, we decided to accept.

I then, in cooperation with Brother Keller, began to make arrangements to take over the task.

In May, Rev. Keller and I made a trip over the district, visiting all of the churches, preaching and attending to some of the business necessary before Conference.

On June 1st I assumed full charge of the District work, and Rev. O. C. Keller left for Indianapolis to take up his duties in the office.

In June, the second trip was made over the District to complete the unfinished business.

As a whole the churches are in good condition, spiritually and financially, and our people are encouraged to push ahead.

The work at Vancouver, Wash., under the leadership of Rev. and Mrs. I. G. Canary, has just been organized with sixteen members.

I have traveled approximately 2,500 miles, made 21 visits to the churches and preaching points. Preached 17 times, and have assisted in getting things ready and looking after the Camp Meeting.

I greatly appreciate the expression of confidence, and the cooperation of our people. Brethren let's go forward.

CONFERENCE PROCEEDINGS

The Fifth Annual Conference of the Pacific Northwest District convened in the Camp Meeting Tabernacle at Quinaby Park, Oregon, July 27, 1944 at 9:45 A. M. The Conference was opened by singing the old hymn "*There is a Fountain Filled With Blood,*" and "*Sunshine in My Soul.*" Rev. Ivan G. Canary led in prayer. Rev. R. W. Wolfe, General Home Missionary Secretary gave the opening address and presided during the conference. This was followed by the roll call.

Mrs. Josephine Mayfield, Mrs. Helena Maynard, and Mrs. Bernice M. Davis, visitors of Pasadena, California, were introduced to and given a seat within the Conference bar. Rev. and Mrs. Holmes from Bend, Oregon were introduced to and given a seat within the Conference bar. A motion was carried that the first three rows of seats were to be the conference bar. A motion was carried that three churches, Marysville, Vancouver and Clatskanie be accepted into the Conference. Motions were carried that Rev. I. G. Canary of Vancouver, Washington; Rev. W. M. Ingersoll of Salem, Oregon; Rev. Omar Fenton of Silverton, Oregon; Rev. Thomas Lee of Ojai, California; Rev. Roy Morgan of Ojai, California; and Rev. James Dole of Prospect, Oregon be given seats within the Conference bar.

The motion was carried that the following ministers would be accepted into the Conference: Rev. W. M. Ingersoll of the Rocky Mountain District, Rev. Paul C. Nering of the Rocky Mountain District, Rev. Omar Fenton of the California District, Rev. I. G. Canary of the Indiana District, Rev. G. E. Banka of the Idaho-Washington District. A motion was carried that the chair appoint a reception committee, which consisted of Rev. McGlassen, Rev. Harrington, and Rev. Canary.

Rev. Morgan appointed Rev. Canary, Rev. McGlassen, and Rev. Fenton to serve on the Resolution Committee. A motion was carried that the council would be the Ways and Means Committee. A motion was carried that Sister Cox be given a seat within the Conference bar. The District Financial report was given by Dr. Dixon and accepted. The following church reports were read and accepted: Raymond, Wash.; Vancouver, Wash.; Portland (Montavilla), Ore.; Bend, Ore.; Seattle, Wash.; Medford, Ore.; Klamath Falls, Ore.; Roseburg,

Ore.; Portland (Central) Ore.; Marysville, Wash.; Salem, Ore.; Silverton, Ore.; and Clatskanie, Wash. Unstationed ministers reports which were read and accepted were the following: Rev. Alice Norris of Marysville, Wash.; Rev. C. E. Cox of Medford, Ore.; Rev. C. L. Dage of Roseburg, Ore.; and Rev. S. G. Tighe of Medford Ore. The evangelistic report which was read and accepted was the following: Rev. Milton Harrington of Salem, Oregon.

The motion was made and accepted to adjourn at 12 A. M. and convene at 1 P. M. An oral report was given by the District Superintendent and accepted. A report of the Seattle church was given by Sister Floyd Morgan and accepted. Conference recessed by expiration of time and was dismissed in prayer by Rev. I. G. Canary.

Second Sitting — Thursday, July 27, 1:00 P. M.

Conference reconvened by singing "*I Gave My Life For Thee.*" Brother Ingersoll led in prayer. Report of resolutions committee were read and accepted.

It is moved and carried that Rev. A. T. Williams continue in the second year Course of Study. It is moved and carried that Rev Wm. McGlassen be placed in the second year Course of Study. It is moved and carried that Mrs. Myrtle McGlasson be placed in the second year Course of Study. It is moved and carried that Mrs. Beulah Strom continue in the third year Course of Study. It is moved and carried that Mrs. Alice Norris continue in the third year Course of Study. It is moved and carried that Mrs. Ida May Morgan continue in the second year Course of Study. It is moved and carried that Rev. Omar Fenton continue in the third year Course of Study. It is moved and carried that Rev. Milton Harrington be placed in the third year Course of Study. It is moved and carried that Rev. Harry Heck continue in the first year Course of Study. It is moved and carried that Mrs. May S. Heck continue in the second year Course of Study. It is moved and carried that Rev. David Phillips be placed in the third year Course of Study. It is moved and carried that Mrs. O. D. Weaver be granted a deaconess license.

Conference was recessed until call of the chair.

Conference reconvened at 3:10 P. M. by singing "*Blest Be The Tie That Binds.*" A brief statistical report of the entire

districts was given by Brother Nering. A motion was carried that 100 copies of the Fifth Annual Conference Minutes would be mimeographed. Brother Nering led the Conference in prayer. A report of the Ways and Means Committee was then given by Brother Nering and accepted by the Conference. A report of of the Auditing Committee was given by Rev. I. C. Canary and accepted by the Conference. The motion was carried that a part of the Ministerial Meeting be devoted to the young people. The appointments of the pastors to their respective churches for the coming year were made by Brother Morgan. The Conference closed by singing the doxology and with a prayer led by Brother Floyd Morgan.
