CONFERENCE PROCEEDINGS

General Superintendent William H. Neff gave a few words of encouragement, reviewing the responsibility of conference and minister, and constituency of the conference.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To our General Superintendent, Dr. Wm. H. Neff, Pastors, Delegates and Friends:

Greetings in Jesus Name!

To this twenty-fifth annual Conference of the Pacific Northwest District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church now in session at Salem, Oregon.

I bring this report with a grateful heart full of love to our Heavenly Father, who spared wife in her illness and restored her to health as well as she is, also to our friends who made the load easier by their love and donations.

In these days of uncertainty and unrest He has been and is giving peace and rest to all who will accept His offer.

Our great commission is to get men into the Kingdom of God. We thank God for His "Showers of Blessings", but we are praying for a downpour—a real day of Pentecost as in the beginning at Jerusalem. God stir our hearts to the winning of Souls to Jesus. Our prayer is, "Oh, God, make us effective Soul—winnners". For me to write a lengthy report would be only to fill the minutes, but to exhort every one of us to be given more to the task of Soul—winning could be profitable for all if heeded. I could set goals of a 10% increase in Sunday School and Church member—ship, but it would be of no avail unless the Spirit of God moves upon our hearts to accomplish it. However, sometimes it doesn't make any difference how hard one tries to accomplish or reach the goal, it just isn't done.

We have enjoyed another camp meeting with good preaching and singing with Holy Ghost conviction which has caused Souls to seek help at an altar of prayer. The largest group of young people we have ever had at camp was present this year. Some of our churches have had good revivals this year. There has been progress made in our District with some real improvements for which we are thankful.

Klamath Falls sold their property and tore down the building which they worshipped in; bought a new building site; and built a lovely church.

Medford has painted their parsonage inside and out, which changed its appearance greatly on the outside.

View has bought property and built a lovely daylight basement parsonage.

Portland Alberta has painted their church on the outside.

Aurora has made some very important improvements in their lighting system, finished class rooms, and added another restroom.

Corvallis has purchased some lovely pews. Also, it put tile on the auditorium floor.

Vancouver has purchased new pews for their auditorium, made some improvements in the kitchen and added a coat of tar to the roof.

Salem has a large light which comes on and goes off automatically. They have painted their parsonage on the outside.

<u>Central Point</u> painted their church on the outside, fixed the <u>class rooms</u>, put a new floor in the bathroom and made other improvements.

Seattle has done some improving on the church.

Roseburg - The property here sold for \$5,000.00. \$500.00 down and \$1,000.00 in 60 days with the remaining to be paid at \$50.00 a month at 6% interest.

<u>Camp Improvements</u> - The dormitory rooms have had sheet rock put on the walls with the exception of three or four; also small clothes closets were added.

A dishwasher was bought and installed in the kitchen. Hinged and painted shutters have been put on the dining room windows, so they can be opened and closed easily.

The top of the tabernacle has had seven windows put on each side with plywood on the remaining part to protect it from the stones thrown by mischievious youngsters.

There were 300 cedar and fir trees planted for a hedge around the border of the campground.

A large light pole and light were given us by the Kellis family. It has been erected and we enjoyed the light from it during the camp.

The roads have been graveled by money which cost the District nothing.

The Story cabin was moved over beside the other cabins.

Sermons preached, prayer meetings and teaching Sunday School classes—85; zone meetings attended—3; district council meetings—6; annual meetings—16; board meetings—15; helped with communion services—4; visits to churches other than official calls—30; directed 3-day State Holiness Meet—ing—Dr. Snyder as speaker—had 10 seekers at the altar and a goodly number held hands for prayer; attended church leaders meeting in Indianapolis; attended school board meeting at Central Pilgrim College; attended the Sunday School Convention at Denver last August; three joint meetings with Idaho—Washington District; total travel in the interest of the district—35,500 miles; 22,000 or more on the district; I have worked on the campgrounds, kitchen, and dormitory rooms 350 hours.

STANDING RESOLUTIONS

- Conference -

- Be it resolved that no minister, evangelist or Christian worker be engaged without approval of the District Superintendent.
- 2. Be it resolved that all District and General funds be sent to the District Treasurer by the tenth of each month.
- 3. Be it resolved that the pastor's salary or offerings be paid during camp and conference.
- 4. We recommend where possible that suitable signs of the local church be placed along the highway or highways approaching the city and at the nearest through street.
- 5. Be it resolved that the retiring pastor shall give to his successor an up-to-date record of the names and addresses of members and friends of the local church.
- 6. Be it resolved that the bulletin, "The Northwest Pilgrim", be provided for by the District Council.
- 7. Whereas the constitution of the United States provides for freedom of worship, be it resolved that this conference go on record as being opposed to any school system which violates the conscience of our children by any anti-Christian requirements which are contrary to the teaching of the Pilgrim Holiness Church.
- 8. Whereas some of our churches pay their pastors by the free will offering method and as this often is a handicap in raising finances; therefore we recommend that each church pay their pastor a salary.
- 9. Be it resolved that in the event of the death of a district minister or his wife, the District Secretary be notified at once and he shall notify the pastor of each church.
- 10. We recommend that the editing committee date all standing resolutions in their respective years -- from 1952.
- 11. Be it resolved that no one be elected or appointed to more than one major board or committee, where possible. 1955
- 12. Whereas, the General Board of the Pilgrim Holiness Church has authorized the Pilgrim Pension Plan, Inc., to make loans of Pension Funds to local Pilgrim Holiness Churches under such conditions as require active participation on the Pilgrim Holiness Districts.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Annual Conference of this

district that the District Council, District Trustees, and all District officials be and they are hereby authorized, to do and perform any and all acts required of them in the consummation of authorized loans to local Pilgrim Holiness Churches of this district, subject however, to the limitations and conditions set out in said Resolution of the General Board of the Pilgrim Holiness Church authorizing said loans. We further recommend that foresaid limitations and conditions be on file with the District Superintendent.

- 13. We recommend that each church grant their pastor a two week vacation, with salary paid. 1956
- 14. Be it resolved that each pastor send the annual reports to the District Statistician by July 10. 1956
- 15. We recommend that all district committees and boards, ministerial delegates, and all those needing to meet the district committees, be at the campground by the Friday night preceding conference.
- 16. Be it resolved that the pastoral recall be conducted the first two weeks in April, and the reports of the vote be reported immediately to the District Superintendent. 1959
- 17. Be it resolved that all new resolutions or proposed resolutions changes be written out and delivered to a member of the Resolutions Committee by the Saturday before Conference.
- 18. Whereas the District Superintendent's program will be to a degree governed by his knowledge of district finances; be it resolved the District Treasurer submit a report to him quarterly. 1960
- 19. Be it resolved that the Pacific Northwest District Conference be held the day following the close of regular camp services. 1961
- 20. Be it resolved that plans for all new buildings and all major repairs on buildings of and on the district be authorized and approved by the District Council. 1961
- 21. Be it resolved that a baptismal service be arranged for and conducted during each camp. 1963
- 22. Be it resolved that the district treasurer be bonded; the amount to be determined by the district council. 1964
- 23. Be it resolved that the District Council be authorized to act upon any unfinished business of this conference and any new business which may arise during the period of time before the next conference convenes. 1964

- I. Be it resolved that Pilgrim Park Camp Meeting Association be governed by the following:
 - 1. The association shall be amenable to the District Council, who shall make the rules governing the camp.
 - 2. Membership in the association shall be open to any Christian who believes in and wishes to help promote the doctrine of entire sanctification.
 - 3. A membership fee of one dollar per year is to be paid during camp or prior thereto; said fees shall be used to promote camp interests.
 - 4. The Treasurer shall be charged with the responsibility of all camp funds.
 - 5. The Secretary shall provide all camp publicity and shall send proper advertisement to each pastor and to the membership of the association not less than thirty days prior to the camp, along with a request urging members to send in their dues at that time.
 - 6. The Secretary shall act as Camp Registrar.
 - 7. The Camp Meeting Board shall be composed of the District Superintendent as chairman; with the following to be appointed by the District Council: Camp Manager, Secretary, Treasurer, Purchasing Agent, Electrician, and Plumber.
 - 8. Be it resolved that each church board appoint a local camp association steward to promote camp interest. 1958
 - 9. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent on his first call enlist each church to provide or underwrite a substantial amount of one or more of the following categories: produce, canned goods, meat and poultry. 1958
- II. Be it resolved that the portion of Pilgrim Park fronting Williams Avenue be for the building of cottages. The District Council shall determine a uniform lot size and shall provide a uniform lease contract, said contract to include these provisions:
 - A uniform building code of type and size of buildings, adequate wiring and necessary considerations for plumbing shall be observed.
 - Cottages shall not be occupied, except for camp and conference, without the permission of the District Council.
 - 3. Leases shall not be transferred to another party without approval of the District Council.
 - 4. If the lease contract be broken, the leasee shall forfeit all rights; and the lot, or lots, with existing improvements, shall revert to the Camp Meeting Association.
 - 5. In event the owner shall be absent from the camp, he shall notify the Camp Meeting Secretary and the cottage or cottages shall be utilized by the Housing Manager during camp and conference.
- III. Be it resolved that the District Council care for the landscaping and maintenance of Pilgrim Park and secure a caretaker on contract.

- IV. Be it resolved that the District Council shall schedule the annual camp and conference. 1958
- V. Be it resolved that those other than ministers and their dependent families, delegates, and workers shall pay for their entertainment at conference the same as during camp.
- VI. Be it resolved that the Bible School Meeting be held at another time than Sunday afternoon.
- VII. The District Youth President shall be a member of the camp board, to coordinate youth activities during camp. 1964
- VIII. Because of the crowded conditions at camp and the complications that arise, be it resolved that no dogs be allowed on the campgrounds during the camp. 1964

- Sunday School -

- 1. Be it resolved that each Sunday School of the District count as present those who are attending the camp.
- 2. We recommend that time during the camp be given to the District Sunday School Promotional Secretary to present the Sunday School work. 1954
- 3. Be it resolved that the District Sunday School Promotional Secretary shall arrange and superintend the camp Sunday School sessions; these sessions to start at 9:30. 1958
- 4. Be it resolved that each zone devote one zone meeting each year to Sunday School promotion. 1958
- 5. We recommend that the District Sunday School Promotional Secretary be invited to conduct the zone Sunday School Promotion meeting if possible. 1958
- 6. Be it resolved that each pastor send to the Promotional Sunday School Secretary on Monday, following the last Sunday of the month, a report of his Sunday School attendance with that of the same month of the preceding year. The Sunday School Promotional Secretary shall send a monthly report of the same to each pastor. 1956

- Zone -

1. Be it resolved that there be one Zone Chairman in each zone appointed by the District Council; he shall promote all zone interests. Be it further resolved that this appointment be made prior to the last Saturday of camp and that the District Youth Executive Secretary and District Sunday School Promotional Secretary be informed of the same. 1958

 We recommend that at least six zone meetings be conducted during the conference year under the direction of the Zone Chairman.

- Youth Adenda -

- 1. Be it resolved there be a District Youth Organization, set up in accordance with the Pilgrim Youth Handbook.
- 2. Be it resolved that the annual youth conference be conducted during Youth Camp. (to replace present Youth #5)
- 3. Be it resolved that the District Youth Council appoint a three man conference action committee to formulate resolutions to be presented to the District Youth Conference. This committee also shall present resolutions pertaining to Ways and Means for the youth.
- 4. Be it resolved that there be at least six zone meetings conducted during the conference year under the direction of the zone leader. (Manual Sec. 75, Par. 5:3)
- 5. Be it resolved that the District Youth President be invited as the speaker at at least one Zone Rally in each zone, with the time to be arranged by the Zone Leader and the District Youth President.
 - Be it further resolved that each zone shall receive an offering at the time of the visitation of the District Youth President, this offering to be sent to the District Youth Treasurer for a travelling expense fund. The District Youth Treasurer shall pay the actual travelling expense of the District Youth President incurred in travel to the various zone rallies. This to include car expense at 4ϕ per mile, lodging, and meals. Be it further resolved that if lodging is necessary that the entertaining zone provide for the lodging.
- 6. Whereas the young people have an important part in our district, therefore to promote youth activity, be it resolved that a District Youth Convention be held during the year; the District Youth Council (DYC) shall have charge of arrangements.
- 7. Be it resolved that a District Youth Camp be conducted at a suitable location. Be it further resolved that the date and place for the camp be set by the District Youth Board, with the approval of the District Council.
- 8. Be it resolved that the District Youth Society have a yearly project, to be recommended by the District Youth Council with the approval of the District Council, and to be presented to the Youth Conference for vote.

- Missionary -

- Whereas there is a need of promoting the work of our missionary societies on the district; Be it resolved that a District Missionary President and a Secretary Treasurer be elected. One or more names shall be nominated for the offices by the District Council.
- 2. Be it resolved that the Missionary Societies be permitted to send pledge money to be applied upon the purchase of clothesline T-poles and lines and for the finishing of dorm rooms for winter use.
 - Educational and Examining Boards -
- We recommend that all candidates who are to come before the Educational and Examining Boards shall do so before conference convenes, if possible.
- 2. Be it resolved that a library composed of books pertaining to required study courses be collected. Persons pursuing said courses shall be permitted to rent these books. The Library shall be housed and administered at the discretion of the District Council. 1959

WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE'S REPORT

- Be it resolved that all stationed ministers on the district send their ministerial tithe to the District Treasurer for district expense.
- 2. Whereas the 10% of the Sunday School offerings has been more than enough to pay the General Conference expense: therefore be it resolved that the District Treasurer be instructed to pay the transportation of our representative to Central Pilgrim College board meeting, as well as the expenses of our District Superintendent to the Superintendent's Conference, out of the General Conference expense fund. Be it further resolved that we continue to collect 10% of the Sunday School offerings.
- 3. Be it resolved that 10% of all church offerings be sent to the District Treasurer with the exception of offerings taken for building, improvements, evangelistic expenses and all of all general and specified district offerings.
- 4. Be it resolved that birthday offerings be used for district Sunday School promotion expenses.
- 5. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent pay threefourths of his ministerial tithe into the district treasury and the district pay his conference contribution for Pilgrim

- Pension Plan where desired, or same amount for social security.
- 6. Whereas the United Stewardship Fund is \$8.00 per voting member; Therefore be it resolved that the Church Treasurer be instructed to send that amount to the District Treasurer. The same to be raised at the discretion of the Pastor and local Church Board.
- 7. Be it resolved that we continue the call card plan of \$1.00 per call for District interests.
- 8. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent be paid \$260.00 per month plus \$70.00 per month traveling expense (or five cents per mile, whatever is greater). Be it further resolved that he be allowed five revivals per year either on or off the district from which he may keep the offerings.
- 9. Be it resolved that the District statistician be paid \$30.00 per year plus supplies.
- 10. Be it resolved that the District Treasurer be paid \$150.00 per year plus stationery and postage.
- 11. Be it resolved that the District Secretary be paid \$30.00 per year plus stationery and postage.
- 12. Whereas the Board of Directors of Central Pilgrim College have set a goal for each district in our school zone for the necessary financial support to carry on our school; Be it resolved that we as a district set our goal of giving for the year at \$5.00 per member.
 - 13. Be it resolved that the travel expense of District Council members or their representatives for district work be paid for at the rate of 4 cents per mile, such expense to be authorized by the District Council.
