

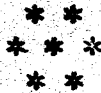

CONFERENCE PROCEEDINGS

First Sitting

The Eleventh Annual Conference of the South Central District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, convened in the Pilgrim Holiness Church at Poplar Bluff, Missouri, Saturday, June 17, 1961 at 9:00 a.m.

The Conference opened with Bro. O. K. Biddlingmeier leading the congregation in singing, "Stand Up For Jesus," and "Must Jesus Bear the Cross Alone?" Bro. Jesse Beatty led in prayer.

Bro. Dwight M. Horn, District Superintendent, introduced the chairman, General Superintendent, Dr. R. G. Flexon, who addressed the Conference, pointing out some of the strong points of the Pilgrim Holiness Church; and setting forth the preacher's and laymen's place in the work of the Church.

The Secretary called the roll.

A motion carried that the first five seats on the south side of the church form the conference bar.

A motion prevailed that we adjourn at 12:00 and convene the afternoon sitting at 1:00 p.m. and continue until the business is finished.

The report of the Examining and Education Committee was read and accepted.

The District Superintendent, Rev. Dwight M. Horn, gave his report which was accepted.

The report of the Auditing Committee was read and accepted.

The District Treasurer, Rev. L. A. Braden, gave his report which was accepted.

The report of the District Statistician, Rev. George W. Carr, was read and accepted.

The District Sunday School Promotional Secretary, Rev. John F. Wilson, gave his report which was accepted.

The Ways and Means reported no recommended changes.

A partial report of the Resolutions Committee was read and accepted.

The Reception Committee presented Sister Flexon to the Conference. A motion carried to grant her an honorary seat within the conference bar.

Bro. Flexon discussed with us the possibilities of uniting with another district as we were so small.

Second Sitting

The second sitting began at 1:00 p.m. with Bro. Ralph Garrison leading the congregation in singing, "We'll Work Till Jesus Comes." Bro. Doyle Burk led us in prayer.

The minutes of the morning sitting were read and accepted. A motion carried to dispense with the roll call.

A motion carried to elect George W. Carr to fill the vacancy on the Board of Trustees. The vote was by acclamation.

A motion carried to elect by acclamation, John Wilson to the vacancy on the Examining and Educational Committee.

Motion carried that we continue another year as we are and that the District Council bring in a recommendation next conference as to uniting with another District.

Bro. F. Paul Bittick was introduced to the Conference and gave words of testimony.

The final report of the Resolutions Committee was read and accepted.

Motion made and carried that any unfinished business be referred to the District Council.

A rising vote of thanks was given to Bro. Flexon and the Conference adjourned.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To our chairman, Rev. R. G. Flexon, General Superintendent, ministers, lay delegates, and friends of the Annual Conference of the South Central District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, greetings.

We are grateful to God that, through His Divine Providence, we are privileged to meet in an annual conference again.

It almost staggers us to realize how rapidly a year passes, and in the light of the great need about us, how little it seems we are able to accomplish for Him. This realization should challenge us anew to our best efforts, in the face of the onslaughts of the enemy, and by God's grace and power to press on to the battle.

Surely Paul's admonition to the Ephesian church is needed today, "Redeeming the time for the days are evil." As we see the present abounding iniquity in the world, the confusion and unrest among nations, the pressure that is on the Church, the encroachment of the spirit of the world, the tragic spiritual indifference and lack of true devotion to God, we believe we are in the "perilous times" that Paul said would come in the "last days." This condition, no doubt, will increase. However, we should take courage in the Lord and be faithful soldiers of the Cross, knowing that one soul is worth more than all the world and that "in due season we shall reap if we faint not." Jesus said, "Be of good cheer I have overcome the world." Though we may have lost a battle, thank God, we have not lost the war.

We have appreciated the good spirit of fellowship and co-operation from the Council, ministers, and laymen of the District.

The District has been through difficult financial waters this year. The West Plains Church and parsonage property payments were putting a heavy monthly drain on the treasury and it was nearly ten months before we were able to dispose of the property, leaving a further burden on the District of a debt of \$1000.00. However, this week the District has received \$500.00 from the Burk Construction Company of Springfield which will be applied on this debt. For this we deeply appreciate and express thanks.

As there was some slackening in District Budget giving this year, it is evident that we need to strive for more faithful support to the District, as well as to the United Stewardship Fund. The greater percent of the membership loss is due to the loss of the West Plains church and some belated clearing of church rolls.

We feel that the pastors and churches of the District want to see the work go forward. The problem is to find the solution in the face of some very difficult situations. I am sure we all agree that the basic need is awakening revivals which will bring men into the Kingdom, thus edifying and strengthening the churches. This is our hearts cry.

It further seems evident that the time is near when we must give prayerful consideration as to possible unification with some other district. If this is God's will for us and can be worked out in a way that will advance the Kingdom and the work of our Church, we are wholehearted for it.

Though we have no glowing report of advancement and are disturbed because of too many losses, we feel the pastors and churches should be commended for staying in the battle.

The Caruthersville Church, during the five months illness of their pastor, Bro. Beatty, did commendably under the local supply pastor, Bro. Benefield.

The Poplar Bluff Church, under their new pastor, Bro. Biddlingmeier, made the largest increase in church membership and Sunday School attendance while he was physically handicapped for several months.

The Stanley Church, under their good pastor, Bro. Wilson, have done splendidly in liquidating the mortgage so soon on their new parsonage.

Pastors L. A. Braden, L. A. Crews, and Owen J. Phillips have labored sacrificially in the face of discouragements, while looking after their own livelihood. They shall be rewarded for this faithfulness.

I have preached 15 times on the District; made 17 visits to the churches; conducted 6 annual business meetings; presided over 5 District Council meetings and 5 church board meetings. I attended the annual Board Meeting of Central Pilgrim College at Bartlesville, Okla.; and 2 Zone Rallies. I made 3 business trips to West Plains to make final disposition of the property. I have traveled 5540 miles in the interest of the District and received salary and mileage.

RESOLUTION COMMITTEE REPORT

We, the Resolution Committee, present the following resolutions:

1. Be it resolved that each of our resolutions remain in effect year to year except when revoked by this District Conference.
2. Be it resolved that each church pay its cash offerings for deputational work on the Central Pilgrim College, Foreign Missions, Church Extension, and Pilgrim Youth Project through the District Treasurer, so the District will receive credit for the same.
3. Be it resolved that each pastor be allowed one two-week revival each year, and that he pay out of his salary the expenses of supplying the pulpit in his absence; that each pastor be given a two weeks vacation with pay, and that the church bear the expense of the substituting minister.
4. That the Conference year close April 30; all churches and ministers reports be typed and sent to the District Statistician by the 10th of May, so he may compile his report before Conference. That the District Treasurer shall close his books on May 15th and that our Conference be the last part of June. Money therefore must be mailed to the District Treasurer by the 15th of May to be included in the annual report. By action of the Conference all churches who pay their District and General budget in full shall be counted as Star Churches.
5. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent shall appoint all committees, all these appointments shall be announced at

the Conference and their names shall be printed in the minutes.

6. Be it resolved that no minister or evangelist arrange his revival so as to conflict with the District Camp and Conference.

7. Be it resolved that all telephone numbers of the ministers be included in the Conference roll of the minutes.

8. Be it resolved that the District Secretary issue credentials to those entitled while they are at the Conference, or if absent, they shall be mailed.

9. Be it resolved that no church call an evangelist who is not a Pilgrim Holiness Minister without first consulting the District Superintendent.

10. Be it resolved that we be firm in enforcing Sec. 222, Par. 3, requiring licensed ministers to complete at least two subjects in the course of study each year.

11. Be it resolved that each pastor endeavor to secure subscriptions to the Advocate for each family that attends our Sunday School and Church.

12. Be it resolved that we have a District Young People's Convention, the time and place to be determined by the Council.

13. Be it resolved that we have a Ministerial Convention in the Spring, the place to be chosen by the District Council.

14. Be it resolved that each minister attend our camp and conference.

15. Be it resolved that we strongly urge each church to conduct a Daily Vacation Bible School and report to be made at the District Conference.

16. Be it resolved that in as much as our Church Manual is definitely against any form of dancing, we as a District let school authorities know how we stand on the subject and ask that our children not be compelled to take part in such school affairs where dancing is the entertainment.

17. Be it resolved that the pastor of the church see that the report of the Sunday School be sent to the Sunday School Promotional Secretary by the fifth of each month.

18. Be it resolved that before any church enters into any building project of \$500.00 or more that the matter be cleared with the District Council.

EXAMINING BOARD'S REPORT

We, recommend that F. Paul Bittick be received into the Conference as an ordained minister.

We recommend the following be given District License: Ray Bennefield, Grace Bradley, Gladys Garrison, Peter Klassen, and Lois Roberts.

We recommend that Harold McGill's name be dropped from the licensed minister's list.

WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE REPORT

We, the Ways and Means Committee, present the following recommendations:

1. That each church pay 10% of all tithes and regular offerings to the District and they be sent no later than the first of each month to the District Treasurer.

2. The District Superintendent shall visit each church at least two times during the year. There shall be preaching service at each visit and an offering shall be taken to apply on the United Stewardship Fund.

3. The District Superintendent shall be paid a salary of \$40.00 per month. He shall be allowed mileage for District work at the rate of six cents per mile for the next year, and necessary telephone and office expense shall be paid by the District.

4. In as much as the Pension Plan for preachers has been passed by the General Conference, therefore, be it resolved that we encourage all our pastors and evangelists to cooperate with the plan.

5. In as much as there is a General Conference expense to be raised by each District, we recommend that this money be raised at the Zone Rallies each month. For churches which do not attend the rallies, we recommend that they receive an offering each month for the same and that it be forwarded to the District Treasurer.

6. We recommend that each church place in their budget \$5.00 per member each year for Central Pilgrim College, our zone school.

7. We recommend that twenty-five cents per member be paid each year to the equalization of carfare committee for the College Board travel expense.

8. We recommend that each church pay the assessment fees of their pastor and his wife if they are members of the Ministerial Benefit Association.
