Vacancies on two of the standing committees were filled as follows: on the board of Education and Examination, Rev. P. H. Greeson takes the place of Rev. R. G. Flexon whose place was made vacant by the organization of the Virginia district; on the Board of Home and Foreign Missions, Rev. H. B. Barger takes the place of Geo. F. Hinshaw who could not be present at the Assembly this year, and as there was much work which needed to be done by this committee it was thought best to have a full board.

The assembly adjourned for dinner.

#### THURSDAY, 2:00 p. m.

Devotional exercises were conducted by Rev. W. R. Cox. The roll was called. Minutes of the morning session were read and approved.

Committee meetings were announced and the assembly adjourned for the day.

#### WEDNESDAY 8:30 a. m.

After the devotional exercises conducted by Rev. Theodore York the minutes of the preceding session were read and approved. The roll call was omitted as practically all the ministers and delegates were present.

Rev. Wm. Walker and Miss Grace Schneider were made honorary members of the assembly. Rev. Mattison and Rev. Paul Billheimer, also Mrs. Geo. Surbrook were introduced and made members of the assembly.

Rev. S. S. Nelson was appointed to fill the vacancy on the reporting committee caused by Rev. Paul Coleman's having been suddenly called home.

Reading of the church reports was resumed and the following reports were referred to the committee on statistics: Bethlehem, Gold Hill, Greensboro, Hillsboro, Harmony, Mebane, Sawyersville, Burlington, Salisbury, John Wesley Stand.

The following Sunday School reports were read and referred to the committee on statistics: Burlington, High Point, Mebane, Salisbury.

The following ministers reported to the Assembly and their reports were referred to the committee on statistics: R. A. Andrew, C. A. Anthony, H. B. Barger, G. H. Butner, M. F. Brendle, W. R. Cox, Rev. and Mrs. M. L. Garrett, Rev. and Mrs. P. H. Greeson, C. W. Hartman, J. T. Kenyon, C. A. Lain, C. A. Ludwick, S. S. Nelson, O. L. Ruth, J. V. Roberts, O. J. Spaugh, J. E. Shaw,

Rev. Caswell Teague and Rev. Lovett, of the Wesleyan

Methodist Church were introduced and made honorary members of the assembly.

The morning session adjourned after which a service was held in the interest of the Bible School at Greensboro. Interesting talks were made by the president and teachers, the band rendered delightful music and a quartet sang, "You may have all the world, give me Jesus," amid the shouts of the congregation.

#### WEDNESDAY, 2:00 p. m.

After devotional exercises conducted by Rev. Robert A. Andrew, the minutes of preceding meeting were read and approved. The roll was called and several more ministers and delegates were registered.

Reading of the church reports was resumed and the following reports were referred to the committee on statistics: Bagley Swamp, Mt. Zion (Davidson county), St. Paul, West Durham, Wilmot.

The following Sunday School reports were read and referred to the committee on statistics: Mt. Zion (Davidson County), St. Paul and W. Durham.

The following minister's report were read and the same were referred to the committee on statistics: C. A. Brown, W. C. Cruse and wife, P. W. Thompson, R. A. Wagoner, J. F. Nance, V. B. Stanley, J. F. Talbirt, W. P. Ware, Mrs. W. P. Ware, W. J. Wilson, Theodore York, T. T. McKissen, Geo. W. Surbrook, Mrs. Geo. W. Surbrook.

The Bible School quartet sang "Glorious Freedom."

It was decided to have the election of officers the first thing Thursday afternoon.

The following were recommended for license by the committee on credentials: W. B. Creech, regular license, and Loval Hipps, local license.

The following ministers were recommended for ordination by the same committee: Rev. and Mrs. Geo. Surbrook, T. Thos. McKissen ,Mrs. P. H. Greeson and Miss Cary A. Anthony. (The charge was given by Rev. W. R. Cox on Sunday afternoon.)

It was voted to hold the annual assembly next year at Bryson City, N. C.

The following recommendations from the board of Home and Foreign Missions were adopted:

- 1. That this district raise \$1,000 this year for Home Missions.
- 2. That \$25 per month each be given to Rev. M. L. Garrett and Rev. M. F. Brendle, toward their support as home missionaries.

The following resolution was adopted. That we as a district adopt the probationary method of receiving ministers from other denominations, the time limit to be one year, said minister to be under the care of the District Council.

The following resolution was tabled until morning: Resolution No. 2. That we as a district adopt the probationary method of receiving members into the church relationship, the time limit to be six months.

The afternoon session was adjourned.

#### WEDNESDAY, 7:30 p. m.

The evening service was in charge of Rev. M. L. Garrett. Rev. M. F. Brendle gave a description of the country geographically and also some idea of the population, read a whitecap letter received by himself and Rev. O. J. Spaugh at one of the preaching points and also told of how a "Moonshine" distiller thrust a revolver at his breast during the preaching service.

Bro. Garrett told of the work at different points, mentioning one place where he and Bors. Brown and Spaugh, who were helping him, built a bridge across a river, having to wade almost waist deep to build the pillars of wood and piles of rock in order to get a place to pitch the tent for a revival. He also gave his own experience as a poor mountain boy and how the Lord saved him and started him out preaching.

An offering of \$90.80 cash and \$26.00 in pledges was taken at the close of the service for the furtherance of the work in this needy district.

#### THURSDAY, 8:30 a. m.

The devotional exercises were conducted by Rev. C. A. Brown and the minutes of the preceding meeting were read and approved, after which the roll was called.

The following ministers reported and their reports were referred to the committee on statistics: P. C. Kivett, F. R. Cooper, W. H. James.

The following deaconnesses reported and their reports were referred to the committee on statistics: Mrs. Mattie Wright, Miss Dovie Wagoner.

Resolution No. 2 was taken from the table, discussed, and referred back to the committee on resolutions for redrafting.

Resolution No. 3, as follows: That we as a district raise an amount equivalent to \$1.00 per member per year for each of the following,—Home Missions, Foreign Missions; 50c per year per member for each of the following: Bible Schools, Rescue Work and Orphanage Work, was tabled until Friday morning.

Resolution No. 4, That we raise as a district an amount equivalent to \$1.50 per year per member for the support of the District Superintendent, was lost.

Resolution No. 5, That each ordained, licensed and local preacher, in addition to the \$1.50, pay \$5.00 per year to the support of the District Superintendent. Lost.

Resolution No. 6, That we raise an amount equivalent to 50c per year per member for district camp meeting expenses was tabled until morning.

The assembly adjourned for the 11:00 a.m. service which was conducted by Rev. Elmer Hanna, Superintendent of the Orphanage, in the interest of orphanage work. An offering in cash and pledges of \$801, was taken in this interest.

#### THURSDAY, 2:00 p. m.

Devotional exercises were conducted by Rev. G. A. Schoombie with special prayer for the guidance of God in the selection of officers for the ensuing year.

The voting was by ballot and following were declared elected: District Superintendent, Rev, S. M. Stikeleather; Assistant District Superintendent, Rev. S. S. Nelson; District Secretary and Treasurer, Miss Cary A. Anthony; District Missionary Secretary and Treasurer, Miss Cary A. Anthony; Members of the District Council: O. L. Ruth, P. H. Greeson, H. B. Barger, V. B. Stanley. Board of Education and Examination: P. H. Greeson, S. S. Nelson, O. L. Ruth.

The birthday-offering plan for the use of the Sunday Schools in raising funds for the Orphanage was adopted.

Rev. W. R. Cox, the General Superintendent, was asked to give a brief summary of the work being done by the churches in the other districts.

It was ordered that no one leave the Assembly without special permission of the Assembly.

The afternoon session adjourned.

#### THURSDAY 7:30 p. m.

The evening session was in charge of Rev. R. G. Finch, our General Missionary Superintendent, who gave a vivid description of the missionary work in the fields and took an offering in cash and pledges amounting to \$303.37.

#### FRIDAY 8:30 a. m.

Devotional exercises were conducted by Rev. T. Thos. Mc-Kisson, prayer by Rev. R. G. Finch. Minuts of last session read and approved.

It was decided to suspend the rules and elect the members of the District Camp Meeting Board, also the vacancies on the Board of Trustees by acclamation.

The Camp Meeting Board elected: Rev. S. M. Stikeleather, Rev. P. H. Greeson, Rev. O. L. Ruth, Rev. H. B. Barger, Rev. W. R. Cox, Mr. D. F. Siler.

The vacancies on the Board of Trustees were filled by the election of H. B. Barger, J. F. Talbirt.

The committee on report blanks submitted their report and blanks as follows: for Christian workers, Sunday School, and church report. These were accepted as read except that the clause, "balance on hand," be inserted on the church blank.

Resolution No. 3, was taken from the table and lost.

Resolution No. 6, That we as a district elect a tithing secretary to visit our churches and indoctrinate our people on the subject of tithing, was ruled out of order.

Resolution No. 8, That all our people be urged to report their donations and offerings to the local church or District Treasurer so that the district may get credit for its work, was adopted.

Resolution No. 10, We recommend that our pastors hold our Missionary Meetings in the interest of our church missionary work and that we use our own missionaries as much as possible, was adopted.

Resolution No. 11, That we urge all our people to support our own work before supporting another, was adopted.

Resolution No. 12, That none of our evangelists go into the territory of our pastors to hold meetings without the consent and cooperation of the pastor and a majority of the most spiritual members, was adopted.

Resolution No. 13, That we look with favor upon the matter of union with the Wesleyan Methodist and Mennonite churches, was amended to include the Nazarene church, and was tabled for further consideration.

Resolution No. 14, That our pastors be urged to carry out the decisions of this Assembly, was adopted.

Motion carried to move our annual assembly forward one week.

Report of the District Superintendent was read and accepted and a rising vote of thanks was given as an appreciation of his labors during the year.

Report of our General Superintendent, Rev. W. R. Cox, was read and accepted and a rising vote of thanks was given him for his faithfulness and unstinted services, his unselfishness and his sacrifices, and the appreciation of the number of miles he has traveled.

Rev. G. A. Schoombie suggested that we have a certificate of dedication to be given to the parents of a child dedicated. Referred to the committee on blanks.

Motion that we have quarterly meetings in the district was tabled until the afternoon session.

The morning session adjourned.

#### FRIDAY 2:00 p. m.

Devotional exercises were conducted by Rev. S. S. Nelson after which the minutes were read and accepted and the roll call was made.

The motion in regard to quarterly meetings was taken from the table, but was lost. The ways and means committee made report and the following recommendations were brought before the assembly and acted upon:

- 1. We recommend that our District Superintendent be paid \$2,000 for his support per year; that his evangelistic offerings be turned into the district treasury, and that he be paid out of the district treasury each month. The recommendation was adopted.
- 2. We recommend that each pastor shall raise money on his charge at the rate of \$3.50 per member for the support of district expenses, general church expenses, and home missions. The recommendation was adopted.
- 3. We recommend that each pastor raise 30c per member and send same in to the district treasurer within 30 days for making payment of note to W. P. Ware. The recommendation was adopted.

Motion carried that each pastor stand for a certain amount for the publication of the minutes. The pastors paid and pledged \$25 and it was recommended that the absent members be written concerning same.

The resolutions committee brought the following before the assembly and they were acted upon:

- No. 1, That we as a district will take up a monthly missionary offering in every church, and turn the same in monthly to our district missionary treasurer, who shall turn same over to the general foreign missionary treasurer, and in default that our district treasurer enquire into the matter and have the privilege of offering suggestions of ways and means to encourage and stimulate missionary activities in such churches. The resolution was adopted.
- 2. That we as a district send and support our district superintendent, Rev. S. M. Stikeleather, on a missionary evangelistic trip to our work in Mexico, Central America, and the San Blas Islands, also to organize a work in the Panama Zone. Adopted.
- 3. That no preacher, deaconness, nor delegate shall leave the assembly without being excused by the same and in no instance shall they be excused without a sufficient reason. It is futher resolved that any one wilfully ignoring this reso-

lution, their action shall be publicly denounced by the chairman. Adopted.

- 4. That the churches in the Southern Districts take at least one offering annually for our aged ministers, same to be sent to our district treasurer and to be paid out by the direction of the district council to such parties as they may deem worthy. Adopted.
- 5. That we as a district adopt the probationary method of receiving members into church relationship and all who prove to the advisory board that they experience and practice the Christian life after six months shall be taken into full membership. Laid on table until next annual assembly.
- 6. That this assembly put itself on record as approving the action of the general board of education and also the action of the general church council in accepting as general church schools the Pasadena Bible College and the Greensboro Literary School. Adopted.

The session adjourned.

#### SATURDAY 8:30 a. m.

Devotional exercises were conducted by Rev. J. V. Roberts, prayer by Rev. C. A. Brown. Minutes of preceding meeting were read and accepted and the roll call was dispensed with.

The report blank committee brought before the assembly a blank to be used in the dedication of children. It was ordered that blank be redrafted and the chairman appointed a committee consisting of O. L. Ruth, G. A. Schoombie and J. V. Roberts to do this work.

Motion carried that we express by a rising vote of thanks to Rev. O. L. Ruth and the good people of High Point for the splendid manner in which they took care of the Assembly.

Motion was made that we express our thanks to our district secretary for her faithful labors. The motion was amended to read, "to the amount of \$1.00 each." and the amendment was amended to read, "a marching free will offering." The offering amounted to \$20.10 which is all she received for the year's work, as every penny of the money passing through her hands goes where specified.

Report of the secretary-treasurer of the home and foreign

missionary board was read, the report showing that \$2,758.36 had been received and forwarded for foreign missionary purposes, and that \$1,116.70 had been used in the home work. This report was accepted with applause by the assembly.

A trio from Gold Hill sang, "God answers prayer."

The district superintendent made a talk urging the pastor and delegates to do their best to carry out the decisions of the assembly, and our general superintendent made a speech along the same line.

Motion carried that we live up to the Manual in regard to quarterly reports of pastors and also that each pastor submit an annual report at the end of the year.

The assembly adjourned.
