The following resolutions were acted upon:

Resolution No. 3, That the calling of all the pastors within the district and those coming from other districts and churches considered by the District council, not later than the beginning of the last quarter; and that the locating of all pastors must have the approval of the district council. Adopted.

Resolution No. 4. That no pastor should call an evangelist jointly with the present council in arranging the work of the district for the coming year. Adopted.

Resolution No. 5, That no pastor should call an evangelist from outside the district without the approval of the District Council and the District Superintendent. Lost.

Rev. J. R. Church and Rev. Raymond Browning, of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, were given seats within the conference bar. Their inspiring testimonies were in harmony with the spirit of the conference and they were gladly welcomed.

Resolution No. 6, That our General Church Headquarters be moved from its present location. Referred back to committee.

Resolution No. 7. That our Foreign Mission department be so re-organized as to reduce its overhead expenses. Adopted.

Resolution No. 8. That the members of our various general boards be reduced, or that we have one general correlated board whose duty it shall be to look after the general interests of our church. Adopted.

Resolution No. 9. That we adopt the Bible plan of tithing and apply it for the support of the ministry. Lost.

Resolution No. 10. That the Southern District go on record as being opposed to any proposed plans that might change the location, present plans and policies of Kingswood Holiness College, at the General Assembly, which meets Oct. 7 at Greensboro, N. C.

Motion carried that we amend resolution No. 10 to read, "that we as a Southern District go on record as being opposed to any plan detrimental to Kingswood Holiness College. Adopted.

Resolution No. 11, That no person shall be eligible in the district either as a member of the district council or as district superintendent who has not been working in hearty co-operation in the past year, or who has not been in the district one year. Lost.

Report of Ways and Means committee.

The following recommendations were brought before the Assembly and acted upon.

1. We recommend that resolution no 1 on page 13, of last annual assembly be considered in force until revoked which reads "That we as a district will take up a monthly missionary offering in our church, and turn the same in monthly to our district missionary treasurer, who shall turn same over to the general missionary treasurer, and in default, that our district treasurer inquire into the matter and have the privilege of offering on of ways and means to encourage and stimulate missionary activities in such churches." Adopted.
2. The committee of Ways and Means inquires what has been in regard to recommendation on page 14, No. 4, which reads follows: "That the churches in the Southern District take at one offering annually for our aged ministers, same to be our district treasurer and to be paid out by the direction of district council to such parties as they may deem worthy. The District Superintendent reports that nothing has been done in regard to this. Motion carried that this recommendation be spread on the minutes.

3. We advise that recommendation No. 2 of our minutes of last year be renewed except the amount be changed from \$3.50 to \$3.00 and apportioned as follows: \$1.00 for District parsonage; \$1.00 for Home Missions; \$.50 Education; \$.25 General Superintendent; \$.15 General publishing interests; \$.10 District printing expenses. Adopted.

4. We recommend that an offering be taken at each visit of the District Superintendent or his Assistant, and that the pastor publicly announce his coming and urge that his people give liberally in this offering. Adopted.

5. We recommend that all our pastors make a greater effort to get a larger percentage of the converts of their revivals to join their church. Adopted.

6. We recommend that resolution No. 6, page 14, be included with the other General Assembly resolutions; which reads: "That this Assembly put itself on record as approving the action of the general board of education and also the action of the general church council in accepting as general church schools the Pasadena Bible School, and Greensboro Bible and Literary School. Adopted.

Thursday, 1:30 P. M.

Motion carried that a message of condolence be sent to Sister C. E. Cowman, in her hour of bereavement.

Motion carried that Bro. Putnam, from Wesleyan Methodist church, be granted a seat in the conference bar. He gave testimony which was enjoyed by the assembly.

Election of officers was now taken up.

H. B. Barger, S. S. Nelson, G. W. Surbrook, appointed as teller.

The voting was by ballot and the following were declared elected: District Superintendent, Rev. W. A. Way; Assistant District Superintendent, Rev. H. B. Barger; District Secretary-Treasurer, Miss Vera Davie; District Home and Foreign Missionary Secretary-treasurer Rev. H. B. Barger, members of the District Council: Rev. O. L. Ruth, Rev. V. B. Stanley, Rev. P. H. Greeson and Rev. S. S. Nelson.

Motion carried that a telegram be sent to Bro. Way notifying him that he has been elected District Superintendent and requesting an immediate reply whether or not he accepts this position and when he will come if he does.

Motion carried that Bro. Greeson telegraph Bro. Way in regard to this matter.

Motion carried that a District Home and Foreign Missionary Secretary be elected and work in conjunction with the district council.

Motion carried that we suspend the rules and declare by acclamation Bro. H. B. Barger elected as Home and Foreign Missionary Secretary-Treasurer.

Board of Education and Examination:

Motion carried that the district camp meeting board be appointed by chairman.

Motion carried that we accept Brother Nelson's offer to resign his place as member of the board of trustees in favor of the District Superintendent in case he will accept.

Motion carried that we extend the time 15 minutes to finish business.

Motion carried that Bro. Schoombie take up an offering to complete the amount required to publish the minutes which amounted to \$8.35. Offering amounted to \$8.05 cash, pledges \$3.00, total \$11.05.

Session adjourned.

Motion that we dispense with the roll call.

Message from Rev. W. A. Way was received and read to the assembly which stated as follows: "Rev. Paul H. Greeson: Since conference has elected me as State Superintendent, and since it comes to me unsought on my part, and since I feel it God's will, I accept; earnestly desiring as I go forth to the church in this capacity, I will have the co-operation of the entire district."

Resolution made that the secretary be instructed to more fully explain and give details in reference to Rev. J. R. Church and Rev. Raymond Browning.

Motion carried that telegram sent to Sister Cowman be inserted in the minutes.

Motion made that fitting remarks be recorded in reference to Rev. Putnam's introduction to Assembly.

Report of Auditing committee read and accepted.

Following resolutions were acted upon:

12. That we recommend to the General Assembly that we as a church apply for membership in the North America Missionary Society. Adopted.

13. Preamble: Whereas considerable misunderstanding could be avoided, and the Home and Foreign work be brought into a closer relationship; Be it resolved that the Home General Superintendent be the chairman of the Missionary Board and that a Foreign Missionary secretary be elected instead of Superintendent. Lost.

14. While we rejoice over the improvement which has been made in our church paper, but realize it is not meeting the need of our church nor receiving the support or co-operation needed due to its present location and awkward relations which prevent haste and the proper mechanical appearance of our paper and that there is so much general dissatisfaction because of this condition, we therefore recommend that the location of our general publishing interests be considered.

Ways and Means committee makes inquiries: Has resolution No. 1 on page 13 been lived up to this past year? Rev. S. M. Stikeleather replies that only partially, which reads: "We recommend that our District Superintendent be paid \$2000 for his support per year, that his evangelistic offerings be turned into district treasury, and that he be paid out of the district treasury each month."

Motion carried that the District Council see that each church pays the District Superintendent, Rev. S. M. Stikeleather, the amount we promised to pay.

Motion carried that each pastor go home and do his duty in raising the amount which they owe as a church to be paid the District Superintendent.

2. What was done with the recommendation of last year? page 13, recommendation 3, which reads: "We recommend that each pastor raise 30c per member and send same to the district superintendent within 30 days for making payment on Rev. W. P. Ware."

Reported three churches carried out this recommendation.

Motion carried that the matter of amount owing Rev. W. P. Ware be turned over to the District Council.

Rev. Mr. Scott, pastor of the Methodist church of Ramsey, introduced to the Assembly and welcomed them into the presence of the Ramsey church.

Unfinished business from last Assembly in regard to minutes for dedication of children and marriages. Requested that this matter be brought to the General Assembly.

Carried that we extend time ten minutes.

Session adjourned for the morning.
