Motion carried that Bro. L. H. Hipps be accepted as a member of our conference.

These preachers were then called upon for a speech.

Bro. Tormohlen says: "I am very glad to be here today. It is the first time I have ever attended a Pilgrim Holiness conference. Bro. Way intimated that I have been a minister for years. I have been preaching about thirty-five years and thirty years of that time in the Friends church. My first message was preached in the German language and for several years I preached in that language. I have been preaching in North Carolina for about a year. Previous to my coming here I was connected with the Cleveland Bible Institute, Cleveland Ohio, which is the oldest Holiness Bible School in America. In coming here to North Carolina, I found a people like my own, and decided to join the "Pilgrims" if they would have me. I feel I am in the order of the Lord and my one ambition is to see sinners saved and believers sanctified, and the church ready for the coming of the

Lord. On thing I am glad to say that not only was I saved and sanctified years ago, but I am this morning. Thank you for this courtesy."

Sister Tormohlen also gives us a very definite testimony. "I am no speaker or speech maker but I am glad I know and love the Lord. We have been holiness people nearly all our lives and I am glad to say that I belong to the King of Kings, and I am glad to introduce him to others. I am glad Jesus saves me, the Holy Ghost abides, and my ambition is to get others into the Kingdom."

Bro. L. H. Hipps then spoke: "I was brought up a Methodist, my parents were strong old-fashioned Methodists. The modern Methodism does not come up to the old-fashioned teaching and so when I became acquainted with the Pilgrim Holiness People I decided that if I wanted to be with old fashioned Methodists, I must join the Pilgrim Holiness church. My people oppose me, but I am here and feel I am in the Lord's will; and mean to give my whole life for him."

Bro. Cox assures these friends that we as a conference welcome them into our midst.

Devotional service conducted by Bro. James Lambert.

Before beginning our business we were given some wholesome advice and encouragement from our General Superintendent as follows:

"Friends, I feel like with what we profess we ought to be getting somewhere. If we cannot measure up to what we had eighteen or twenty years ago, we ought to go to the altar. God is still on the throne and he still answers prayer.

The fire must start with the head and every church that backslides starts with the leader at the head, and I consider what I say. The local church starts backsliding with the man behind the sacred desk. We need to put a plaster on the sore big enough to cover it. I don't want Jesus to come and find me cooled off. I am saying this, this morning because the leaders are here. If it would do any good I would like to have Bro. Way appoint a committee to take us outside to a spiritual whipping post, and stand off about six feet and use a rawhide.

I told God years ago that I wanted to be an extraordinary Christian. We ought to be like Samson's foxes, setting the woods on fire, instead of lacking fire. We ought to dig into the Word of God. I find the more I dig into it, the more I enjoy it, and the more good it does me."

Rev. Hudson said, "I am glad to say that I am saved and sanctified. I have been twenty-five years in this blessed way of publishing full salvation. I thank you."

Motion carried that since Bro. J. V. Roberts has committed no sin but left our work under discouragement that we accept his letter of apology and forgive him. And Secretary notify him of the same.

Motion carried that we accept Bro. T. T. McKisson's report Report of tellers for Home and Foreign Missionary Board. Rev. H. B. Barger, James Lambert and Rev. V. B. Stanley elected.

Motion carried that we have our District Assembly after the General Assembly.

Committee of Ways and Means report: Moved and carried that on the first Sunday in November each pastor take up an offering for the amount we owe Rev. W. P. Ware, and send it in to the treasurer.

Motion carried we raise the \$16.40 due on minutes; a little over which amount was raise and turned over to Rev. S. S. Nelson for the debt.

Motion carried that all workers make a report and send in to the Secretary not later than the opening session of Conference.
