## Proceedings

The Southern District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church with the convening of the District Assembly at 10:00 a. m., in the First Church at Greensboro, N. C., is rounding out a quarter of a century of labor in helping to build up the Lord's kingdom and in the tearing down of Satan's strongholds. We are glad of what has been accomplished, but wish it could have been much more. After singing, "In the Cross", Bro. Stikeleather, our District Superintendent, welcomed the delegates and ministers to the Assembly; our senior minister, Bro. M. A. Baldwin, led the people to the throne, followed by Bro. Ruth, of High Point. General Superintendent Surbrook read and commented on the first fifteen verses of the twelfth chapter of Hebrews, bringing to our minds many timely and appropriate truths.

The roll of ministers and delegates was called and the Assembly bar was fixed to take in six seats from the front in the three sections and also the platform. The hours for business were fixed—morning session to begin at 8:30 and adjourn at 11:30; the afternoon session from 1:30 to 5:00, with evangelistic service at 7:30.

The District Superintendent was empowered to appoint committees.

The District Superintendent then made a good and acceptable report as follows:

### Report of the District Superintendent

Greensboro, N. C., October 8th, 1935.

To the Twenty-fifth Annual Assembly of the  
Pilgrim Holiness Church of the Southern District,

Greetings: We are closing another year of glorious victory in our beloved District which has been made possible by the untiring efforts of our pastors and workers and the faithfulness of the Holy Ghost. There have been many fierce battles but He who never fails has been a present help in every time of need. We give Him all the glory.

There have been splendid revivals in most of our Churches besides some wonderful tent and brush-arbor meetings. Splendid gains have been made on many lines and the end is not yet. Blessed harmony prevails in practically all of our Churches and our people generally show a spirit and determination to push on to greater things for our Lord and coming King. Some excellent territory has been taken but there is much land ahead to be possessed.

Through the co-operation of practically all of our people and some of

our friends we are making fine progress on our Bible School indebtedness. Improvements have been made to the extent of \$375.00 besides \$130.00 street assessment and \$30.00 insurance, making a total of \$535.00. Each monthly payment has been met promptly and our present indebtedness on the property is \$2,400. We owe about \$1,000 street assessment. Our people throughout the District seem to be very much encouraged and especially so since they know the property has been deeded to the District. We are happy to tell you the deed has been recorded and is now in the hands of our District Treasurer.

God has enabled us to organize three new Churches this year and a fourth one is well on the way. Three new Church buildings have been erected and while they are not entirely finished they are so we can use them. Two of them, the one at Hemp and the one at High Falls, are practically out of debt and the one at Durham owes less than \$500.00.

A new parsonage has been erected at Albemarle and a substantial addition built at Kannapolis, with additions and improvements in many places such as new roofs, painting, etc. Our Edgeville Church in Greensboro has enlarged its plant very substantially with a seating capacity of 80 in the choir.

Our Sunday Schools throughout the District are doing excellent work and are making splendid gains nearly everywhere. There have been six new schools organized during the year with an enrollment of almost 600 at the present time. With between 40 and 50 Churches and Sunday Schools in the District we own our buildings with the exception of two places and we have purchased lots in one of these and will build this coming year, the Lord willing. The majority of our Churches and charges have parsonages and at least two that do not are making plans to build in the near future.

We are sorry indeed to have to say that on account of working conditions among some of our people we have not been able to meet all of our financial obligations for our General and Foreign Missionary work, but under favorable conditions with our present financial system I believe our District will come to the front within the next year.

During the year I have held one revival and assisted in many others. Have seen many souls pray through to victory for either salvation or sanctification. Have prayed with numbers for healing and have seen quite a few definitely healed. Have prayed in three hundred and thirty eight homes, conducted one hundred and eighty business meetings, preached 220 times and conducted quite a number of prayer-meetings. Have travelled 21,000 miles during the year, 15,000 of which have been for the District and the other 6,000 for the General Church and myself. My expenses for the District for gas, oil, etc., not to say anything about the wear and tear on my car, has been \$251.60. The Lord has enabled me to put into the District \$190.00 and into our headquarters building \$78.33 and elsewhere \$43.00, making a total of \$311.33.

Permit me to recommend to you the continuation of our present

financial program for the coming year as it has worked better than anything we have ever had. Our people generally are satisfied with it and do not want it changed.

The Lord has given us a great year and I can truthfully say that I have not spared myself nor any expense to give you the very best service possible.

Yours, first for spirituality, and second for progress.

The Committee on Resolutions reported:

Resolved, That the District Superintendent be required to notify Churches two weeks previous to each quarterly conference. Died.

Resolved, That when engaging evangelists we give the pastors of our District first consideration. Lost.

Whereas some of our pastors are not receiving enough support, be it resolved that when a Church or charge cannot pay \$7.00 per week, the District Treasurer make up the deficit from the District funds. Referred to Ways and Means Committee.

Resolved, That the District Superintendent shall serve as pastor or evangelist, be required to live in the District, make only two rounds per year, and receive \$300 per year. Lost.

The Reception Committee brought forward and presented to the Assembly, Rev. C. H. Dooley, from Virginia; Rev. Jim Green, of the Bible School, Greensboro, and Rev. John Guill, Assistant District Superintendent, from W. Virginia.

Adjournment was made for lunch hour.

## TUESDAY AFTERNOON

The afternoon session was opened with song, prayer by Rev. John Guill, and a Scripture lesson was read by our Assistant District Superintendent, Bro. Barger, who urged us to spend much time in prayer during the Assembly.

The roll was called and minutes of last session read and approved.

The General Superintendent then took several minutes in showing and explaining some graphs which had been made at our general offices showing how the districts were giving to the General and Missionary work and urged us to give in the right proportion to each. He stressed the need of more Home Missionary work and told of different sections in the United States where Holiness was not being preached and the need of our taking advantage of these open doors. He asked that we pay \$2.00 per member during the coming year to our Foreign Missionary work and \$1.00 to the General work, stating that the \$1.00 for General work would also take care of the Home Missionary work which our Executive Council has planned.

The Statistical Report was read, totals only. Report accepted. Bro. Surbrook commended the report, but urged the pastors to always check

the reports to see that everything is correct and proper credits thereby obtained.

The Committee on Ways and Means made report.

Recommended that the Assistant District Superintendent be paid five cents per mile for his services in the District. Accepted.

Whereas our present financial system has worked a hardship on certain Churches and Pastors, thus impeding the progress of our local work, we recommend that Churches having 100 or more members pay 15 per cent. of their gross income to the District Treasurer; Churches with 50 members, or less than 100, pay 10 per cent. and all under 50 member 8 per cent, Foreign Missions and Building Fund exempted. Referred back to the Committee.

The Committee on Resolutions made report:

Resolved, That no Pastor's wife be elected as delegate to the Assembly where the Church has a sufficient number of other members from which to select. Carried.

Resolved, That the District Superintendent consult with the local Church concerning the support of the Pastor on his first visit of the year, as provided for in our Church Manual. Carried.

Resolved, That no Church shall call an evangelist without first consulting with the Pastor. Carried.

Resolved, That our Sunday School records be revised each quarter. Carried.

Resolved, That Sec. 77, par. 2, of our Church Manual be strictly observed in connection with the Sunday School, which reads:

"No person shall hold office, or teach, who is not in the experience of Entire Sanctification, or who does not teach the cardinal doctrines of our Church."

Tabled.

Resolved, That where possible all our Sunday School teachers shall be members of the Pilgrim Holiness Church. Carried.

Resolved, That the District Superintendent be required to make his home in the District. Lost.

Motion carried that the next business be the election of officers. While arrangements were being made for this, Sister Massey, from Virginia, sang very beautifully, "It's Real".

The election resulted in the following officers being elected for the ensuing year:

District Superintendent—Rev. S. M. Stikeleather.

Assistant District Superintendent—Rev. H. B. Barger.

District Secretary—Miss Cary Anthony.

District Treasurer—Rev. William Roy Phillips.

The District Board was empowered to elect two members on the Board of Trustees for three years.

By motion the District Superintendent was given power to appoint the standing committees—Resolutions, Ways and Means, and Statistical.

The General Superintendent took a few minutes to explain the advantages of the Ministerial Benefit Association, after which adjournment was made until 9:30 Wednesday morning.

### WEDNESDAY MORNING

The Wednesday Morning session was opened with singing, and prayer by Bro. Kenyon. Bro. Surbrook then spoke at length especially to the preachers and workers on "Helps and Hindrances to the Ministry." He divided his subject into three parts, "Fire, Field and Future". We wish every minister and worker had a copy of his message.

The roll of ministers was called, each one answering to his name with the number of subscribers to the Advocate which he will try to obtain during the coming year. Five hundred and thirty-six subscriptions were promised.

The Auditing Committee reported the Treasurer's books in good shape. Report accepted.

The Treasurer's report was read and accepted.

The Ways and Means Committee reported:

We recommend that to any Pastor, giving his full time to the ministry and receiving less than \$7.00 per week in cash, the deficit be paid from the Home Missionary Department under the jurisdiction of the Council. Accepted.

By expiration of time, the Assembly adjourned for lunch to meet at 2:00 p. m.

### WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON

The session opened with song and prayer, and Scripture reading by Bro. Surbrook. Bro. and Sister Bean, from the Maryland District, were brought forward and presented to the Assembly.

As the Secretary was absent in a Board meeting, the minutes were referred to the District Council for approval.

The Ways and Means Committee completed their report:

Since our Bible School obligation requires \$85.00 per month, we recommend that the Pastor, or Delegate present, subscribe a certain amount from each Church covering this amount, to be paid monthly. Accepted.

(This was done and the proper amount subscribed.)

(This appears on the Financial Report.)

We recommend that Churches receiving an income of \$2,000 yearly pay 20 per cent. for District and General Budget; Churches receiving an income of from \$1,200 to \$2,000 pay 15 per cent.; Churches receiving an income under \$1,200 to pay 10 per cent.; Building Funds, Foreign Missions and offerings for evangelists exempted. Lost.

We recommend that all birthday offerings be used for Church Extension and that each Pastor be strongly urged to push this offering. Carried.

The Committee on Resolutions completed their report.

Resolved, That the Young People's Quarterly Convention be revived. Carried.

Resolved, That 500 copies of the District Assembly Minutes be printed at the expense of the District. Carried.

An offering was taken for the General Superintendent, according to the ruling of the Manual, the amount to be credited to our District on general budget.

A vote of appreciation was given Bro. Green, the teachers and students of the School for their splendid co-operation and help in caring for the Assembly, also to the good people of our two Greensboro Churches.

The Assembly accepted the invitation of the two Greensboro Churches to return to the Greensboro First Church the second Tuesday after the last Sunday in September. As our people are expecting to have charge of our School here at that time, the General Superintendent urged the Churches to bring quantities of foodstuff with them when they came in order to leave a large amount for the School. He told them to bring canned fruits, beef, chickens, eggs (which could be put up in water glass when they are cheap), potatoes of both kinds. He told them that when planting potatoes they should put in some extra rows for the School.

The Ministerial Convention, which convenes the first week in April, was left to be worked out by the District Council; however, Bro. York, left an invitation with them to come to Mt. Zion.

The Board of Examination gave a favorable report on all ministers.

The Board of Education recommended Miss Viola Dillon for ordination. Recommendations accepted.

Motion carried that our Minutes be printed at Kingswood.

Motion carried that any unfinished business be left in the hands of the District Council.

An offering of \$10.00 was given to the District Secretary for her services.

Sister Dillon was ordained in a very sacred service. Bro. Surbrook commented on the fact that our Church lays hands suddenly on no one, but requires spirituality first and then that a very strict course educationally be completed before ordination.

Our Twenty-Fifth Annual Assembly is now history. Our General Superintendent remarked that it was the most spiritual Assembly we have had since he has been meeting with us. We were glad to greet old friends and see new faces. We are looking forward to the time when we shall meet to part no more, but we want to take everybody with us that we can. We are expecting to lengthen our cords and strengthen our stakes, and take in more territory by the help of the Lord, if He tarries, before another twelve months roll by.

## **Report of Ways and Means Committee**

1. Recommended, That the Assistant District Superintendent be paid 5 cents per mile for his services in the District.
2. Recommended, That any Pastor giving his full time to the ministry and receiving less than \$7.00 per week in cash, the deficit to be paid from the Home Missionary Department, under the jurisdiction of the Council.
3. Since our Bible School obligation requires \$85.00 per month, we recommend that the Pastor, or delegate present, subscribe a certain amount from each Church, covering this amount, to be paid monthly. (The amount was subscribed.)
4. Recommended, That all birthday offerings be used for Church Extension and that each Pastor be strongly urged to push this offering.
