Mecca, has purchased a new parsonage for their bachelor pastor but it will serve for a family, since it has six or seven rooms. Somerville too, has replaced the home that was destroyed by fire and the lovely new parsonage is now ready for occupancy. A fine parsonage estimated at \$7,500.00 is ready for service complete at a low cost of \$5,500.00. Twin Oaks has a new \$5,000.00 parsonage. Princeton has outgrown their Sunday School and have taken the parsonage for a Sunday School Plant and now they have a new parsonage. Rev. William Gerbig has moved from the little block building to a lovely new church that was purchased for \$6,500.00. Sullivan have moved into their spacious auditorium and it surely is a credit to the old church. A little more will complete the building and it will be a church to be proud of. Westport under the leadership of Wayne Isaacs, is constructing a new auditorium and will be greatly appreciated by the local congregation. Mitchell, under the leadership of Rev. Ray Smith has just finished a new stone dress on the outside of the church and has improved the value of the property many hundred of dollars and also have put new weather proof siding on the parsonage, that has cost many hundred of dollars. Mt. Vernon has a new church building that was purchased by the pastor, Rev. Lemar. Aurora has purchased a new garage, electric organ, and a new piano at a cost of \$3,500.00. ## REPORT OF THE SUNDAY SCHOOL PROMOTIONAL SECRETARY

To the Eighth Annual Conference of the Southern Indiana District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church.

### Greetings:

It is with a deep sense of gratitude and love to our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ, and our beloved District Superintendent, Rev. Mark Storey, the members of the Sunday School Board, and pastors, that we submit the following report of the activities of this most important department of our church.

### District Gains

The District had an average weekly attendance of 6,629 this year as compared to last year's weekly average of 6,190. A gain of 7%.

Forty-seven Sunday Schools had a gain over last year, thirty-two of which were at least 10%.

The Rally Day attendance for 1957 was 7,837 which was 334 more than reported for Rally Day last year. A gain of 4.4%.

The Easter attendance showed a loss of 48 or approximately  $\frac{1}{2}$  of 1%, however the Sunday School Revival helped to overcome this loss by showing a gain of 335 over last year or 5%.

I have traveled over 3,900 miles in interest of the Sunday Schools. Attended and assisted in two National Sunday School Conventions; one State Sunday School Convention. I have also attended S. S. Committee Meetings at South Bend, Indianapolis, Ft. Wayne and Frankfort, and conducted 6 Sunday School Conventions in our Zones. I have also mailed monthly, quarterly, and annual reports and News sheets to all our pastors as well as the 37 other District Promotional Secretaries.

## REPORT OF THE RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE

### CHURCH GOVERNMENT

1.  
We recommend that the pastor be responsible for his new church the second Sunday after Camp.

2.  
Whereas many of our members are not familiar with the actions of the Conference, therefore:

Be it resolved that the pastor shall have a special meeting of his church at the earliest possible date, for the purpose of familiarizing his people with their responsibilities for the Conference year at which time the pastor shall promote sale of Conference Minutes.

3.  
We recommend that the annual business of the church be closed on June 30th of each year. We further recommend that the conference treasurer's books be closed June 30th of each year.

4.  
We recommend that each church provide a parsonage with telephone, utilities, and where parsonages are not equipped with heating facilities, window shades, kitchen and bathroom floor coverings that provisions be made for the same by the local church.

We further recommend that the District Superintendent on his first visit to the churches call the local church board's attention to this matter.

5.  
We recommend that where churches and parsonages are located in cities that the location of the church and parsonage appear in our Minutes. We further recommend if possible, that where parsonages are equipped with phones, that the name of the pastor and Pilgrim Holiness Church be listed in the Phone Book.

6.  
We recommend that no church board endorse for Conference license anyone who is not willing to give full time to the ministry of God's Word.

7.  
When a District Superintendent is to be elected, we recommend that he be elected from the ordained ministers of our District.

We further recommend that the assistant superintendent be elected from the ordained pastors of our District.

8.  
We recommend that each zone be responsible for the promotion of their Home Missionary work, under the direction and advisement of the District Superintendent.

9.  
We recommend that the District Council be the District Parsonage Committee.

10.  
Whereas in many of our building projects there seems to be poorly formulated plans due to incompetent committees which has resulted in some poorly constructed buildings, therefore:

Be it resolved that before constructing church buildings, parsonages, or camp buildings that plans and specifications be approved by the Conference Council or by a committee appointed by same.

11.  
We recommend that the time of voting of the church on its pastor be May 1st - 30th.

Inasmuch as many churches outside our denomination are substituting movies for religious services, be it resolved that we go on record as opposed to the use of film strips, slides and movies in the church.

13.

Whereas the need for Ministerial training is great in our District, we recommend that we have Ministerial Institutes.

We further recommend that this meeting or meetings be arranged by our District Superintendent.

14.

Whereas some of our churches are failing to meet their financial requirements, therefore:

Be it resolved that the District Superintendent, as he visits the District, shall give this matter careful consideration with each local church board.

15.

We recommend that our District Superintendent take a three weeks vacation with pay.

16.

We recommend that the District have a Ministerial Convention, the same to begin on the second Tuesday of April each year.

17.

Inasmuch as many of our evangelists are either leaving the field because of insufficient finance, or are forced to injure their health by taking too many meetings without proper rest in order to make ends meet, therefore be it resolved that our churches take more care in determining the evangelist's offering, and not have any more revival meetings than they can adequately finance, nor call a larger evangelistic party than they can properly pay.

18.

Be it resolved that the pastor of any church that fails to pay their District Budget or their United Stewardship Fund, be required to appear before the examining board with a written statement from his local church board explaining why they failed to pay same.

## PASTORAL

1.

We recommend that each pastor take a two weeks vacation with pay.

2.

We recommend that pastors or church secretaries of deceased members of our District Conference bring to the Committee on Memoirs a copy of the Obituary of the deceased and any other information that is available.

3.

We recommend that no pastor call an evangelist outside of our church without the approval of the District Superintendent.

4.

We recommend that each pastor keep a record of all names and addresses of the subscribers to the Pilgrim Holiness Advocate.

5.

Be it resolved that the Conference Secretary notify all pastors of Conference Ministers whose name has been dropped from the roll.

6.

Whereas it seems inconsistent from the commercial viewpoint, and for the sake of our influence, we recommend that when possible pastors be paid on a week day rather than Sunday.

7.

Whereas ministers are now eligible for Social Security and many of our pastors are already participating at their own expense, we recommend that churches that are financially able give special attention to this added expense of their pastors.

## EDUCATIONAL AND EXAMINING BOARD

1.

We recommend that those ministers who desire to pursue the ministerial study course with the thought of receiving credit from Frankfort Pilgrim College, take their studies through the extension service of Frankfort Pilgrim College.

Extension Service  
Frankfort, Indiana

We further recommend that those who pursue the course of study with the thought of ordination only, take the courses from the ministers elected to the Educational Board.

2.

We recommend that those who are to appear before the Educational Board and Examining Board must bring their recommendation in person or send a written reasonable excuse why they cannot appear.

We further recommend those who fail to do so after one year shall be dropped from the conference roll.

Each student pursuing our course of study should conscientiously read the material in the text book. The student may search out the answers to the study questions using the text book.

The Student should write his examination in the presence of his pastor, or in case of a pastor taking the examination, he should write the examination in the presence of an ordained minister. The paper must be signed by the person under whose supervision the examination was taken. All examination questions must be returned with the examination.

The Student shall mail fifty cents (50c) with each request for questions or one (\$1.00) dollar for each subject taken.

All examinations must be in the hands of the instructor 15 days prior to the Camp Meeting. Books used in this study course may be purchased at the Pilgrim Publishing House, 226-230 East Ohio Street, Indianapolis 4, Indiana.

3.

Inasmuch as many of our pastors are pursuing the study course for preachers:

And whereas many of them are forced to work and have very limited time to engage in the study course:

Be it resolved that our district plan a one week (five days) school in which several courses comparable to the study course will be offered. These could be ten hour courses under qualified teachers. The expense to be provided for by a tuition fee.

4.

Whereas the Conference has set the ordination service for Monday evening of Conference, therefore be it resolved that all candidates who are to appear before the educational and examining boards shall meet between the time of 1:00 P.M. Thursday and 7:30 P.M. Saturday night preceding Conference, at which time the boards shall complete their work and receive no more candidates.

5.  
We recommend that all Licensed Ministers that fail to meet their Educational requirements and fail to meet the Educational and Examining Boards, as required in our Minutes, be referred back to their Local Church Board for Local License.

## CAMP MEETING

1.  
We recommend that the District Council appoint a Camp Meeting Board which shall supervise the functional work of the Camp and the same shall be ratified by this District Conference.

2.  
We recommend that our District Camp convene on the fourth Friday of July.

3.  
Inasmuch as our Superintendent is very busy with the Spiritual interests of the Camp and Administrative duties of the District at Camp Meeting time:

Be it resolved that the Assistant District Superintendent advise all Department heads of their duties, and responsibilities of their Departments.

Be it further resolved that he supervise the department heads during the Camp Meeting.

Be it further resolved that he be the Assistant Chairman of the Camp Meeting Board.

4.  
Camp Regulations: No smoking. No profane language. No shorts, slacks, or other forms of immodest dress. All parking shall be in the parking lots. Campers may unload their cars at their tents or cottages, after which their car is to be removed to the parking lot provided for them. No promenading on the camp grounds during the three main services of the day. All attending camp meeting must attend these services or stay in their tent or cottage. (Workers performing their duties of the work of the camp are excluded.) 11:00 P.M. curfew.

All campers are to keep the area clean around their tents or cottages and to see to it that they are left tidy when checking out.

5.  
Inasmuch as God has seen fit to give us this beautiful Camp Grounds, and we have fully dedicated it unto God:

Therefore be it resolved that for safety and health reasons we allow no pets upon the grounds during all religious services during the year.

6.  
Be it resolved, in behalf of the spiritual interest of our Camp Meeting, that no cottage construction be permitted on the Camp Ground during the three main services of the Camp Meeting.

7.  
Be it resolved that all able bodied ministers, both stationed and un-stationed, remain long enough after camp meeting to help clean up the premises.

Be it further resolved that if they are unable to do so, they shall either obtain permission from the chairman or secretary of the Camp Meeting Board to be excused, or get a lay member to serve in their place.

8.  
We recommend that we maintain a caretaker with residence on the camp grounds.



We further recommend that the District Council shall have full charge of hiring, designation of duties, and setting of salary of said caretaker.

9.

Whereas the leases for cottage lots on our Camp Grounds clearly states that no lease be bought, sold or transferred without approval of the District Council and whereas our Camp is nontaxable, therefore be it resolved that no cottage shall be bought or sold or rented for the sole purpose of making a profit.

10.

Be it resolved that a Prophet's Hour be included in the Camp Meeting schedule.

11.

Inasmuch as our District now conducts four different Camps, namely; a Senior Youth Camp, two Junior Youth Camps, and our District Camp, and whereas food purchases, etc. are made from the same companies, and whereas these companies are having difficulty in keeping the accounts separated and properly billed, therefore be it resolved that hereafter, all food purchases for both lunch stand and dining hall, and any other purchases in the excess of \$10.00, be charged to the District Treasurer. However, all such bills shall bear the signature of the respective camp chairmen. Upon receipt of said bills, the District Treasurer shall pay same and charge the amount to the respective Camp Treasurers. He shall also prorate the cost of utilities, insurance, etc. and charge the respective Camps for their part.

We further recommend that all bills paid direct by the respective Camp Treasurers, such as travel pay, incidentals, etc. shall only be paid if a voucher is presented containing the O.K. and signature of the respective Camp Chairman.

12.

Be it resolved that each church be requested to take up a free will offering to help cover the Camp Meeting expenses. (A suggested goal might be equal to \$1.00 per member).

Be it further resolved that no registration fee be charged at camp and that a charge of 60c a day be made for meals to all layity. Those paying for meals will not be required to work.

13.

Inasmuch as our children are the church of tomorrow and need the best of training and supervision and should be encouraged to attend Camp Meeting, therefore be it resolved that we give more emphasis to the Children's Services during Camp by obtaining a Children's Worker in advance and publicizing same on the Camp Posters.

Be it further resolved that we also provide a well supervised recreational period or periods between the three main services.

## SUNDAY SCHOOL

1.

The Sunday School Committee shall present an annual report to the Conference which shall include the following:

- a. A statement of the work accomplished during the year.
- b. A statement of the general condition of the Sunday School work in the Conference.

2.

The Council shall instruct the Conference Treasurer to take care of all finance incurred by the Conference Sunday School Board.

3.

Note:—For all other duties of the Sunday School Board, see Manual, Page 39, Section 80.

4.  
We recommend that where possible each local church conduct a summer Vacation Bible School.

5.  
Inasmuch as the District Sunday School Promotional Secretary has been sent to the National Sunday School Convention each year for the past five years, and inasmuch as we feel that it is a most valuable and informative resource that is well worth the cost and the practice of sending the Promotional Secretary should be continued, therefore be it resolved that this be done each year.

## ZONE WORK

1.  
Inasmuch as the Zone Meetings have been beneficial in advancing the spiritual, educational, and doctrinal interests of the Conference we recommend they be continued.

We further recommend that the Zone Chairman be elected by secret ballot by the ministers and lay delegates.

2.  
We recommend that Zone 6 be divided into two zones numbered 6 and 7. Number 6 to include the Terre Haute Churches, New Goshen, Sandford, Clinton, Mecca, Seelyville, Liggett, and Brazil; and Zone 7 to include Prairie Creek, Scott City, Merom, Coalmont and Linton.

3.  
We recommend that the present Zone in the Vincennes area be designated as Zone 8, and the Zone in the Evansville vicinity be Zone 9.

4.  
We recommend that Ottwell be placed in Zone 8.

5.  
We recommend that Bloomington be placed in Zone 3.

## YOUNG PEOPLE

1.  
We recommend that the Executive Youth Committee be given authority to establish the date for the Annual Youth Convention subject to the approval of the District Council.

2.  
Be it resolved that each of our zones have at least nine youth rallies in the conference year. We further recommend that the program and date of these services be worked out by the zone Youth Leaders.

3.  
We recommend that each zone Young People's President submit a written report of the year's activities to the District Youth Conference.

4.  
We recommend that each zone Young People's President given opportunity for the District Youth President to present the program for the year at a date convenient to the District Youth President.

5.  
We recommend that Junior Youth Camps be held during the Summer months on our Camp Grounds with the following set-up:

1. Separate Camps would be held for Boys and Girls.
2. Camps would be run Monday through Friday, beginning at noon on Monday and closing at noon on Friday.

3. Camps would consist of classes and institutes, supervised recreation and classes in handicraft during the day, and a strong evangelistic program at night.
4. Age groups would be from 9 through 13.
5. A committee composed of the District Sunday School Board and the Executive Youth Council work out complete details and promote said camps. This committee to elect a Youth Camp Chairman from their own group, the same to be ratified by the District Council.

6.

We recommend that each Young People's President submit a written report quarterly to their Zone Youth Leader.

7.

We recommend that the Southern Indiana Youth elect an assistant to the Executive Youth Secretary.

8.

We recommend that the District Youth Treasurer see that the Executive Youth Secretary's expenses be paid when attending Youth Leaders' Conference at Indianapolis, Indiana.

9.

Whereas all our youth projects for the past three years namely; the stone and concrete platform in the Walnut Cathedral, the dish washer in the dining room, and the new bath house have been of a physical nature, and whereas the investment in the life of a worthy Christian worker is a most noble project, therefore be it resolved that we take as a project for the coming year, the establishing of a \$1,500.00 Pastor's Salary Supplement Fund.

The purpose of said fund is to supplement a pastor's salary to the point of \$75.00 per week so that he can give full time to the work of his ministry in the Pilgrim Holiness Church.

The fund shall operate through a three way agreement between the said pastor, his local church board and the District Youth Executive Council and the District Superintendent.

The local church to qualify must agree to pay the pastor a minimum wage of \$50.00 and his utilities.

The pastor must agree to give his full time to his pastoral duties in the Pilgrim Holiness Church, and report monthly to the District Superintendent.

The District Youth Organization will agree to supplement his salary with \$25.00 (to the point of \$75.00 per week).

This fund shall be supervised and put into operation by the District Superintendent and the Executive Youth officers of the District.

Said pastor shall be chosen by them and his identity shall not be revealed until next year's Youth Conference. It shall be the objective to get the program into operation by the first of October 1958.

10.

We recommend that we have a Thanksgiving Harvest Day for Frankfort Pilgrim College. Such day shall be set aside for the various zone youth to bring their canned goods and produce of all kinds for the School.

11.

Inasmuch as our Youth Conference has in the past, been so poorly attended, be it resolved that all pastors be required to attend the District Youth Conference and that they do everything within their power to get the church to send a lay delegate, whether they have a Young People's Society, or not.

12.

Be it resolved that as a zone project, each Zone shall endeavor to establish at least one Branch Sunday School in their respective zones.

13.

All Zone Youth Presidents elected will be expected to come at the call of the District Youth President to help prepare for the District Youth Camp. If one is nominated and does not think he can fulfill this obligation, let him state such before the election.

14.

Be it resolved that the District Youth President's Annual Report also be read at the District Conference and that it be printed in the Conference Journal.

## CONFERENCE

1.

We recommend that only ministers, their wives and unmarried dependent children and lay delegates be given entertainment during Conference. All entitled to this entertainment shall be duly registered and given cards of recognition. For all other entertainment the same rate shall prevail as during Camp Meeting.

2.

We recommend that there be a Publishing Committee composed of the Conference Secretary and two appointed members. It shall be the duty of this committee to publish the Conference Minutes.

3.

We recommend that the Conference go on record as interpreting I Peter 3:3 where it speaks of the wearing of gold, to mean all rings including wedding and class rings.

4.

Inasmuch as we have an active Memorial Committee, therefore:

Be it resolved that instead of a Memorial Service during the Conference, we ask this committee to bring adequate memoirs of the deceased to the Conference to be read and the same to be recorded in the Conference Minutes.

We further recommend that the Conference Secretary gather the needed information of each of our Ministers by sending out a Questionnaire. This information is to be kept up to date by making the needed additions at the close of each Conference.

5.

We recommend that upon the death of a Conference minister or his wife, that the Conference Secretary be notified at once, who shall notify all Zone Chairmen, who in turn shall notify all Conference pastors and evangelists within reasonable distance, by telephone or telegraph.

We further recommend that the Conference Treasurer order flowers for same.

6.

We recommend that each candidate for ordination shall be given a Bible by the District Conference. This Bible shall have the names of the Ordination Committee in it and shall be used during the ceremony.

7.

We recommend that all annual reports be sent to the Statistician by July 10.

8.

We recommend that all material to be audited shall be brought to the Auditing Committee on Saturday prior to Conference.

9.

We recommend that the Conference buy 1,000 copies of the District minutes this year.

10.

We recommend that conference convene on Monday following Camp Meeting at 8:30 A.M.

11.

We recommend that the Ordination service be on Monday Night of conference at 7:00 P.M.

12.

We recommend that all conference ministers and their wives who have reached the age of 65, be given a guest meal ticket at camp and not be required to work.

13.

Inasmuch as a motion prevailed in our last annual conference to promote the forward movement in our Districts by soliciting pledges to assist in the building of new churches, therefore be it resolved that we have a Revolving Loan Fund. To start this fund, voluntary pledges of one dollar (\$1.00) for each qualifying church, with not more than three calls during the conference year, and with not more than one call in any quarter.

These funds shall be made available to qualifying churches as a loan with the interest rates as follows:

1st and 2nd year .....	No interest
3rd year .....	3%
4th year .....	4%
5th year .....	5%

The District Superintendent shall promote this fund.

14.

Whereas Owosso has been made our General Church Senior College, we recommend that Frankfort Pilgrim College be made a Zone School. If the school should cease to be a school, the property assets at the time of transfer shall revert to the Northern and Southern Indiana Districts.

15.

Inasmuch as there has been quite a demand among our ministers for a Group Insurance Plan in which they can participate and whereas such a plan has been made available to our pastors and full time evangelists by the Brotherhood Mutual Life Insurance Co., be it therefore resolved that our Conference adopt this Group Insurance Plan with the churches assuming responsibility for the premium of their pastors.

Be it further resolved that each church shall be allowed to work out their own method of taking care of same.

16.

Be it resolved that the District Council shall set up Group Insurance Committee, including a chairman, Secretary, Treasurer, and two advisory committee members at large. We further recommend that the District Secretary and Treasurer be on the committee by virtue of their offices.

17.

Be it resolved that the date of the first two month's payments shall not be later than September 1st, 1958, at which time the policy shall become effective.

18.

Whereas, the General Conference of our church has set a general budget to be known as the United Stewardship Fund, and

Whereas, said United Stewardship Fund is necessary if we are to carry on the general work of our church efficiently, and

Whereas, the Manual of our church states definitely that any church not paying the United Stewardship Fund in full for that year will prohibit their pastor and their church delegate from being seated in the District Conference, therefore:

Be it resolved, that we as a conference set the month of September as United Stewardship Fund month, and

Be it further resolved, that some time during that month an offering be taken in each of our local churches for that purpose, and

Be it further resolved, that from then on throughout the year each local church make a desperate effort each month to keep said United Stewardship Fund paid up to date.

Be it also resolved, that any local church, desiring to do so, may pay from unspecified foreign missionary money that portion of their United Stewardship Fund pertaining to foreign missions which is 20%.

Be it also resolved, that any local church desiring to do so may pay from unspecified general church extension funds that portion of their United Stewardship Fund pertaining to church extension which is 14%.

## MISCELLANEOUS

1.  
We recommend that immediately following the Conference the Secretary mail an itemized notice of the financial requirements of the church for the year in duplicate to each pastor. The pastor shall give one copy to the Church Treasurer. The treasurer is to read the same at the first board meeting after receiving the list.

2.  
Whereas example is more powerful than precept and

Whereas our Officials and Ministers are looked upon as examples of standards of our Church, therefore

Be it resolved that the Southern Indiana Conference call attention to page 35 section 65 of our Manual which reads "whereas the present trend toward immodesty of dress is so evidently out of keeping with the Word of God, the girls and women who are members of the Pilgrim Holiness Church are not to appear in public wearing the immodest forms of dress so current today; such as sun suits, shorts, dresses of immodest length, slacks, or similar garments, or without stockings. Men and boys of the church are not to appear in public in shorts or without shirts."

Inasmuch as television is fast becoming a daily habit and an open door for the infiltration of all kinds of vice and crime into the sanctity of the home in an ever increasing number of homes in America.

Therefore be it resolved, that we as a District go on record as being strongly apposed to the use of television.

Furthermore not only oppose television, but also opposed to preachers appearing on television programs.

## REPORT OF THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

### Local Church Financial

1.  
We recommend that the conference budget consist of 10% of all money raised by the local church, Sunday School and 5% from the Young People's Society, except that raised for Missions, General Budget, Building Funds, and all funds raised for Specific Conference interests. Building fund purposes shall be interpreted to include rent on parsonages and church and money paid on contracts of the same. Said amounts are to be figured by the Ways and Means Committee for each church from the past year's reports and printed in the Conference Journal for the coming Conference Year's District Budget and that each church make every effort to pay on this amount monthly.

2.  
We recommend that the Conference Budget be prorated as follows: Conference Funds 76%; Old People's Home 2%; Frankfort Pilgrim College 10%; Home Missions 10%; and General Conference 2%.

3.

We recommend that each church pay the Frankfort Pilgrim College at the rate of 1% of their annual gross receipts of the local church treasury up to and including \$3,000.00, and 2% for all churches with an annual income over \$3,000.00. Said amount to be paid monthly through the Conference Treasury. And that said amount be figured by the Ways and Means Committee for each church from the past year's reports and printed in the Conference Journal for the coming Conference Year. Said amount to be paid on monthly through the Conference Treasury.

### District Financial

1.

We recommend that the standard mileage rate for those working or traveling in the interest of the District be fixed at 5 cents per mile.

2.

We recommend that our District Superintendent be paid a salary of \$100.00 per week plus mileage at the rate of 5 cents per mile.  
We further recommend that his fuel and utilities be supplied.

3.

We recommend that our Assistant District Superintendent be paid at the rate of \$10.00 per day plus mileage for each day's service.

4.

We recommend that our Conference Secretary be paid \$100.00 for his services for the year.

5.

We recommend that our District Treasurer be paid \$62.50 per month for services for the year.

6.

We recommend that the Conference Statistician be paid \$50.00 for his services for the year.

7.

We recommend that our regular Conference stenographer be paid \$20.00.

8.

We recommend that our District Sunday School Promotional Secretary be paid \$75.00 for his services during the year.

9.

We recommend that the insurance on the car of the District Superintendent be purchased and paid by the Conference.

10.

We recommend that a resident caretaker be paid a salary of \$1,040.00. We further recommend that his fuel, lights and telephone be furnished.

1.

We recommend that each church raise fifty cents per member per year for operating expense of the Old People's Home. And that said amount be figured by the Ways and Means Committee for each church from the past year's reports and printed in the Conference Journal for the coming conference year. Said amount to be paid on monthly.

### Young People

1.

We recommend that the District Young People's financial obligations be raised as follows:

All churches with membership under 40, \$1.00 per month.

All churches with membership 41 through 60, \$2.00 per month.

All churches with membership 61 through 80, \$3.00 per month.

All churches with membership 81 and over, \$4.00 per month.

And that said amount be figured by the Ways and Means Committee for each church from the past year's reports and printed in the Conference Journal for the coming Conference Year. Said amount to be paid on monthly.

2.

We recommend that the District Young People's Project be financed by dividing the expense among the District Zone Youth Organizations. The proportion to be determined by taking into consideration the number of churches and the average income for the past two years. The amount determined to be decided by the Executive Youth Committee.

## GENERAL CHURCH FINANCIAL

1.

We recommend that the United Stewardship Fund for each church be figured by the Ways and Means Committee for the coming Conference Year and be printed in the Conference Journal. This amount to be paid on monthly.
