# CONFERENCE PROCEEDINGS

## FIRST SITTING

The Third Annual conference of the Texas District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church met in the new church at Corpus Christi at 7:30 P.M. June 9, 1953. Rev. J. C. Williams Jr. the pastor of our Borger church led song service. Rev. Roy Nible led in prayer. Rev. Wayne Quinn sang a special number in song. Rev. Parker Husselton our good District Superintendent introduced Rev. R. A. Beltz Secretary of Church Extension from Indianapolis, Indiana as the presiding officer of this Conference. Rev. Husselton also introduced Rev. A. I. Wise, District Superintendent of the Kansas District to be the Guest speaker in the conference. We as a District count it a real privilege to have Rev. Wise with us.

## SECOND SITTING

The conference met at 9:30 A.M. June 10, 1953. Rev. Anatole Ferlet led the congregation in song. Rev. Paul Sherwood led the prayer. Rev. and Mrs. Paul Sherwood sang a special song. Rev. R. A. Beltz, the presiding officer brought a very timely message. He used I Cor. 9:16-27 Text: verse 22, "That I might by all means save some" Subject: "The Church program for the year". The Pilgrims of the Texas District deeply appreciate the good ministry of Rev. Beltz.

The roll was called by the Secretary. Rev. Parker Husselton, our Superintendent, presented the following churches to the conference. Dalhart Church; Rev. Paul Sherwood as the pastor of this new church. Borger Church; Rev. J. C. Williams, Jr., as the pastor of this new work. The Borger church was represented by their delegate Bro. J. W. Norvell. Rev. and Mrs. Roy Nible were introduced to the conference.

It was moved and seconded that we receive the Dalhart church with their Pastor Rev. Paul Sherwood. Motion carried.

It was moved and seconded that we receive the Borger church with their Pastor Rev. J. C. Williams, Jr. Motion carried.

Rev. A. I. Wise was granted an honorary seat within the conference bar.

The District Superintendent's report was read and accepted.

## THIRD SITTING

The Third Setting opened at 2:30 P.M., June 10, 1953. Rev. A. I. Wise brought a message on the Theme, "Abnormal Christianity".

## FOURTH SITTING

The Fourth Setting was held at 7:30 P. M., June 10, 1953, and was an evangelistic service. The song service was led by Rev. Clarence Jackson. Mrs. Roy Nible sang a special number. Rev. and Mrs. J. C. Williams brought a message in song. Rev. A. I. Wise brought a timely message on the subject "Peace with God".

## FIFTH SITTING

The conference met at 9:30 A.M., June 11, 1953. Rev. R. A. Beltz brought the message.

The report of the Examining and Educational board was read. It was moved and seconded that the following report be adopted:

1. Rev. Roy Nible be received from The Rocky Mt. District as an Ordained Minister.
2. Rev. Paul Sherwood be received from the Michigan District as a third year licensed minister.
3. We recommend that he be granted fourth year license.
4. We recommend Rev. J. C. Williams, Jr., for second year.
5. We recommend Anatole Ferlet for second year.
6. We recommend that T. T. Hines be granted fourth year license.
7. We recommend that Sr. Flora Johnson be received from The Rocky Mt. District as an Ordained Deaconess.

Motion carried.

The report of the Sunday School committee was read.

The reports of Rev. R. C. Hines, and Rev. Anatole Ferlet were read.

The reports of the Ways and Means committee was read.

These reports were accepted.

## SIXTH SITTING

The Sixth Setting opened at 2:30 P.M., June 11, 1953. Rev. A. I. Wise brought the afternoon message.

Rev. R. A. Beltz announced that the following District officers had been appointed by the General Board to serve for the coming year.

The conference elected Rev. Roy Nible as the Ministerial Delegate to the General Conference.

The conference elected Bro. Arthur Swihart as the Lay Delegate to the General Conference.

The conference elected Bro. J. W. Norvell as the alternate Lay Delegate to the General Conference.

It was moved and seconded that any unfinished business be taken care of by the District Council. Carried.

A motion prevailed that we accept the Auditing committee's report.

A motion prevailed that we accept the District Treasurer's report.

The following church reports were read and accepted: Abilene, Borger, Corpus Christi, Dalhart, Dallas, and Hillsboro.

A motion prevailed that we accept those reports.

A motion prevailed that we adjourn.

## DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT REPORT

TO THE THIRD ANNUAL CONFERENCE OF THE TEXAS DISTRICT OF THE PILGRIM HOLINESS CHURCH; GREETINGS IN THE NAME OF THE LORD JESUS CHRIST.

We can say with the Apostle Paul. "Never-the-less I am not ashamed; for I know whom I have believed, and am persuaded He is able to keep that which I have committed unto Him against that day."

As we submit to you this report, we are very conscience of the rich blessings of the Lord upon us and of His help and guidance unto us all thru the past year. If any thing has been accomplished worthy of mention it is because God has stepped in and moved on the hearts of the people to accomplish it. To Him be all the glory.

Just one year ago this month, we began our labors among you. At that time we yet lived in the state of Oregon and of necessity had to return to the church we were pastoring in order to close our ministry there. We were not able to move to Texas until about September the first. Thru the months of July and August, we carried on what district work we could by correspondence. By the time we arrived on the field the work at Divine, Texas and Dallas, Texas had been discontinued. This may have seemed for the time to be a retreat, but no doubt the future will prove it to have been an advancement.

The property at Divine was sold and the money is invested in a new project in Amarillo. Those who labored for several years in the Divine work will not suffer loss as the work is being continued in another location along the same line of faithful consecration. Walter Quinn and family were some of the faithful workers there.

The labor and faithfulness of Rev. Will Brantly was not in vain, several of the fine folk now in Dallas, who are ready to start a new work in a new location, were the ones who were associated with Brother Brantly while he was pastor in Dallas.

### CHURCHES

**Corpus Christi**—Here a fine new brick church building has been constructed and dedicated. This is our strongest church; and promises to be a real soul saving station in this growing costal city on the Gulf of Mexico. To Rev. Wayne Quinn and wife, go much of the credit for this fine church. They return to pastor this work another year. It will be their third year, and we pray it shall be their best.

**Dalhart**—In Dalhart a fine group of people were banded together, who had a mind to work, and after being organized into a Pilgrim Holiness church, they thru the help of the Church Extension Department, built and dedicated a fine new church building. They have called a full time pastor and prospects are good for a spiritual light house in this county seat town. Rev. Paul Sherwood and wife are the new pastors. We welcome these fine workers to our district. They come to us from Michigan. God bless them.

**Borger**—Prayer meetings were held in the homes of some faithful saints here, and now under the leadership of the faithful pastors, Rev. Jesse Williams and wife, a nice building has been constructed and has been dedicated. The work here was not started until around the first of the year, and as it is almost impossible to buy lots for a church, a building has been constructed which can later be changed into a parsonage, and moved to a permanent location. The Borger church

looks very promising for another salvation center for the Lord and the Pilgrim Holiness church. The Williams are new on the district. We are so glad to have them. They are a blessing to us.

**Amarillo**—A new two bed room house, and three large lots, have been purchased in Amarillo, and plans are almost complete for Rev. R. E. Niblea and wife to move to this prosperous city to begin a work for God and the church. Rev. Niblea has had experience in this type of work before as he was the first pastor of our growing Pilgrim Holiness church in Albuquerque, N.M. They come to us from Colorado Springs and we are very fortunate to have these fine workers. May God bless them.

**Abilene**—This field is a great challenge to our church. Advancement has been slow here. This work was organized only a short time before the district conference, last year. Altho several reverses have come to this faithful group, yet God has blessed and the open door for the Pilgrim Holiness Church has not been closed. Under the ministry of Rev. B. E. Echols, a new location for services was found and the faithful group moved to this new location. Brother Echols was compelled to resign because of serious sickness. Since last February Brother and Sister Ed Johnson have been faithfully carrying on the work. They are reaching many children and have in addition to the duties of the church, several Bible clubs, which Sister Johnson conducts in such a manner as to add several new members to their Sunday school. Our prayers are for success in every way for this work and workers.

**Hillsboro**—Here Brother Clarence Jackson and wife are faithfully carrying on as pastors. This is the oldest church in the district, and has problems to solve which some of our newer churches do not have. The Jacksons are recalled by a unanimous vote, and are staying. They are praying for a real old time revival in their church. We join them.

**Dallas**—This work was closed last year because of the lack of workers and a place of worship. They paid the district budget, and put their tithes in the bank waiting for the time when a new start would be made to open a Pilgrim Holiness Church in this great city. All this time they were without a pastor. Rev. Clarence Jackson, pastor from Hillsboro, has been their leader in these prayer meetings since the beginning of this year, 1953. He has been a definite help in keeping the little flock together.

A very fine location has been purchased for a building site, which consists of over one acre of ground; close to a bus line and on paved street. The District Supt. plans to start a new church building in the near future. In the mean time services will be held in a home provided for the pastor. The District Supt. is pastor. We desire your prayers very much for this work. We would like to make this work worthy of being a part of the Texas district; and also a work in the Kingdom of God. This may be an answer to our need for a district headquarters.

For this we are indeed thankful, and it has been the work of the pastors and others, plus the blessings of God that made this possible.

Also we are very thankful to the Church Extension Department, and to Rev. R. A. Beltz, who has in a very real way made the development of the work of the Texas district a possibility.

# REPORT OF RESOLUTION COMMITTEE

## Church Government

### YEAR ENDING MAY 31, 1953

(1) We recommend that the annual business of the church be closed May 31.

In as much as it is impossible for the local churches to send district funds to the district treasurer by May 31; We recommend that the District Treasurer hold the books open until June 5. We recommend that each Local Church Treasurer send all funds to the District Treasurer by June 5.

(2) We recommend that the annual Conference be held Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday of the Second week of June. The place to be set by the District Council.

Due to General Conference being at this date next year, we recommend the time be set by the District Council and Secretary of Church Extension.

(3) We recommend that a quarterly bulletin be compiled on District news and interests by the District Superintendent and sent to each Church at the beginning of each quarter.

(4) We recommend that a workers convention be held during the year, the date, the place to be set by the District Council.

(5) We recommend that the first prayer meeting of each month shall be donation night to the Pastor. An announcement shall be made the previous Sunday by someone appointed by the Local Church Board.

(6) We recommend that the sacrament of the Lord's Supper be observed quarterly in each Church.

(7) We recommend that the location of the Churches and Parsonages appear in the minutes. We further recommend if possible where parsonages are equiped with phones, that the name of the Pastor and Pilgrim Holiness Church be listed in the phone book. Also that the phone number appear in the minutes.

(8) We recommend that Churches of the Texas District be Zoned as Follows; Zone 1; Abilene, Corpus Christi, Dallas and Hillsboro. Zone; 2 Amarillo, Borger, and Dalhart.

We further recommend that the Zone Chairman be appointed by the District Superintendent.

Zone chairman—Zone 1, Clarence Jackson.

Zone chairman—Zone 2, Roy Nible.

## Sunday School

(1) We recommend that each Pastor send a report on Monday following the last Sunday of the month; reporting—Average Sunday School Attendance, Average Church Attendance, and Total Calls.

(2) We recommend that we set a goal for 25% gain in Sunday School attendance for this Conference Year.



## REPORT OF RESOLUTION COMMITTEE

### Conference

(1) We recommend that there be a Publishing Committee composed of the District Council. It shall be the duty of this Committee to publish the minutes.

(2) We recommend that the church entertaining the District Conference provide lodging for pastors, their wives and dependent children and lay delegates, others if possible. We further recommend that any expense incurred for the same be taken care of by the District Treasurer.

### Pastorial

(1) We recommend that each Pastor be granted a two weeks vacation with pay.

(2) We recommend that no pastor call an Evangelist outside our Church without approval of the District Superintendent.

### Miscellaneous

(1) We recommend that immediately following the Conference the Secretary mail each pastor an itemized notice of the financial requirements for the year, giving the address of the District Treasurer.
