REPORT OF DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

To the 24th annual district assembly of the Pilgrim Holiness Church of West Virginia held at Spring Fork, September 19th thru 24th, 1933:

Greetings in Jesus dear name:

I am reminded by the heading of this report that I am now closing my twentieth year as Dist. Supt. of the W. Va. Dist. and while the duties of the office have not always been pleasant, it has been a pleasure to have the fellowship and cooperation of the preachers and members of the District.

This assembly will be one of importance as we will not meet again until after the General Assembly has met. We should therefore pass such resolutions as will be helpful in making the church more spiritual, but avoid such resolutions as are non-essential.

During the assembly year I have visited each church four times and held quarterly business meetings each time with the exception of two churches. I was compelled to send my assistant to these for the last quarterly meeting on account of meetings I was engaged in as evangelist. I have traveled 12,334 miles; attended 257 services besides the business meetings; preached 185 times with the result of 285 seekers at these preaching services, and have had six revival meetings, one in each of the following states:- Michigan, Virginia, New York, Pennsylvania and two in West Virginia.

During the year there has been one mission organized with a membership of eleven, at Naugatuck, W. Va., and a mission at Vienna, W. Va. has been organized into a church with a membership of 15 (two have united since, making a membership of 17).

Through the ruling of the last Dist. Assembly, making the support of the Dist. Supt. a preferred claim, my support has been practically paid in full. I have received, above expenses, \$1116.45, leaving a balance of only \$53.62, but you will notice by the District

Treasurer's report that we have fallen short on all other district claims some of which will have to be provided for by the ways and means Committee.

We purchased a tent for the District and two meetings were held, the report of which will be made by Rev. Lloyd Andre who had charge of the same.

Report of DISTRICT TENT WORK:- To the 24th District Assembly of the Pilgrim Holiness Church of W. Va.

Greetings: The tent was first pitched at Kenova, W. Va. beginning on May 25th and ending on June 28th on account of the District Camp at Huntington. We were assisted about 10 days during this meeting by our Dist. Supt. Rev. J. F. Woods, and occasionally by other ministers of our District. At the time of this meeting there were two other tent meetings in progress near by of other denominations, therefore the crowds and results were not normal. Only two saved and three sanctified. My support was approximately \$20.00 less \$10.00 for oil and gas driving to and from Huntington.

Our next meeting was in Weston, W. Va., beginning on the 24th of July, ending on August 27th. We were assisted in this meeting likewise by our District Supt. and Rev. J. S. Hankins, Pastor of our Clarksburg church. In this meeting there were 12 saved and 4 sanctified. My support was \$40.46.

REPORT OF RESOLUTION COMMITTEE

RES. No. 1. We recommend that we change on page 34, Sec. 49 of the Manual which reads; "Three-fourths vote of board" to read "Two thirds vote of board". LOST.

RES. No. 2. We recommend that the last clause of Sec. 49, Page 34 of our Manual which reads: "He may be called from year to year" be changed to read; "He may remain as long as both parties are satisfied". In case either desire a change 60 days notice shall be given prior to annual assembly" ACCEPTED as a MEMORIAL to General Assembly.

RES. No. 3. We recommend and strongly urge that our people do not affiliate with labor unions of any kind. LOST.

RES. No. 4. We recommend that we add to Sec. 76, page 45 of our Manual, that any of our members partaking in strikes, picketing and disorders be dealt with, and if they do not repent and abandon such they be dismissed. ACCEPTED as MEMORIAL to General Assembly.

RES. No. 5. Be it RESOLVED that in a case of a member accepting a pastorate of a church outside the bounds of the district of his residence, upon the termination of such pastorate his membership shall revert back to the local church of which he was a member and his ministerial membership to that district. ACCEPTED as MEMORIAL to General Assembly.

RES. No. 6. Whereas the authority of the Dist. Supt. relative to choosing a pastor who lives in the community where chosen or who is intimately associated with such church is obscure therefore

BE IT RESOLVED That the Dist. Supt., with two members of the Dist.

Council may prevent the election of such minister as pastor of a church until the Council and church may decide.

Moved and carried this be substituted to read;- That we strike out of Par. 3, Sec. 61 of our Church Manual the words "from outside the bounds of the District Organization in which it is located" and the word "should" to shall. ACCEPTED as MEMORIAL to General Assembly.

RES. No. 7. Whereas, too large a district (by which is meant, too many churches as well as too much territory) cannot be properly supervised by one Dist. Supt; therefore, BE IT RESOLVED, That the General Board may arrange the boundaries of such districts as do not have proper supervision until such supervision as is proper may be secured. ACCEPTED as MEMORIAL to General Assembly.

RES. No. 8. Whereas there is a tendency by some of our districts to disregard the direction of the Manual regarding the calling of pastors and choosing stationing committees following customs contrary to the practices and usages of our church government therefore: BE IT RESOLVED that such practices be discontinued and the rules of our Manual be followed. Referred back for redrafting and not presented again.

RES. No. 9. Whereas the only statement as to a quorum of our church meetings is found under the heading of called church meeting, Sec 57, P. 38, therefore, BE IT RESOLVED that a majority of resident members shall constitute a quorum whether a regular or called meeting. Referred back for redrafting and not presented again.

RES. No. 10. Since it is a fact there is nothing binding in our Manual in regards to the dress question and we have reached the time that we must draw a line, therefore, BE IT RESOLVED that our ladies be asked to wear their dresses not shorter than nine inches from the floor and that they do not wear contrasting colors in shoes and hose. Lost.

RES. No. 11. Since it is a fact that many times other Holiness churches coming into the community of the Pilgrim church and in many cases engaging Pilgrim workers, is a detriment to the Pilgrim church, therefore; BE IT RESOLVED That no Pilgrim preacher be permitted in other churches of the same community of the Pilgrim church without the consent of the resident pilgrim pastor. Adopted as a MEMORIAL to the General Assembly.

RES. No. 12. We recommend that the following be inserted in the reception of members. page 26. Sec. 30 at the end of living a christian consistent life: "And are not divorced and remarried and living with second party while first party lives. Adopted as MEMORIAL to General Assembly.

RES. No. 13. We recommend that each church at their annual meeting prior to the General Assembly nominate one lay delegate to the Annual Assembly and that the lay delegates to the General Assembly be elected from this number. Adopted as MEMORIAL to General Assembly.

RES. No. 14. Resolved, That in Sec. 151 of our manual the selection of the ministerial delegation shall read "ten" instead of "seven", and the lay delegation "300" instead of "200". Adopted as MEMORIAL to General Assembly.

RES. No. 15. DISTRICT RESOLUTION. Be it resolved that a standing Statistical Committee be appointed at the close of each annual assembly to serve throughout the next assembly. Adopted.

Moved and carried the same committee serving this year be appointed. Being L. R. Carroll, A. L. Davis and Lloyd Andre.

RESOLUTION OF THANKS: We, the members of the 24th Annual Assembly of the West Virginia District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church do hereby express our sincere thanks and appreciation to the church and community of Spring Fork for the royal way in which we have been entertained. May the blessings of the Lord be upon them.
