Report of District Superintendent heard and accepted, being as follows:

## REPORT OF DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

To the 26th Annual Assembly of the Pilgrim Holiness Church of the West Virginia District in session at Charleston, W. Va., Sept. 17th through 22nd, 1935.

Greeting:

Of the 23 years I have been District Superintendent of the West Virginia District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church I do not believe there has been a year that I have been as busy on the district as this year. At the close of the Assembly last year there were several churches without a pastor. This took much of my time trying to satisfy both churches and pastors. I have only been able to hold two revival meetings this year, one at Fayetteville, this district, and one at Lansing, Mich. I have traveled 11,875 miles, have preached 193 times and held 116 business meetings; have attended one general board meeting and one school board meeting. I sent out three letters with quarterly reports to each preacher and local church treasurer of each church in the district relative to the spiritual and financial condition, as well as the progress each church had been making. These letters brought good results, as, with a few exceptions, the churches are coming to this assembly with their budgets paid in full. Some who have done but very little in the past few years have met all obligations this year including the pastor's salary. With the aid of the 25% our District Treasurer has received from the Twentieth Street Bank of Huntington, where some of the district money has been tied up, the district will have a budget paid 100% without any deficit to be raised in this assembly.

I have baptized four adults and five infants, have dedicated six infants. My salary is almost paid in full at the time of the writing of this report and if all the preachers had paid their half tithe as directed by the district assembly it would have been overpaid. The report shows the preachers of this district have received a total support of \$13,645.18. The half tithe of this amount would be \$682.25. The amount paid the District Superintendent is \$553.97. This leaves a balance of \$128.28 that should have been paid for this purpose. I am mentioning this for the benefit of my successor whoever he may be, for as long as preachers disregard the action of our assemblies we cannot expect much more from the laity. The Scripture says, "Like people, like priest." I have preached two funerals, namely, that of Sr. Holly, the Mother of Sr. Ensley, our District Treasurer; and Sr. Webb, the wife of Rev. J. D. Webb, pastor of the Berkeley Springs Church. The condolence committee will bring resolutions of condolence for the bereaved.

The reports of the pastors show there have been 895 regenerated and 392 sanctified through the instrumentality of the church of this district. Of this number there have only been 80 received into the church by profession of faith; 23 have been received by letter. One church reports there were 141 professed regeneration and 33 professed sanctification and yet that church lost one in membership this year. It had two deaths and one dropped and only two out of 141 became members of the church. There should be some means whereby we could at least get one out of ten. Jesus said, "Were there not ten cleansed, where are the nine?" But we would have to say were there

not 141 cleansed, where are the 139? The minutes of the last assembly show we had a membership of 665. The reports show we now have a membership of 696, showing a gain of only 31 members during the year.

We have organized one Pilgrim Holiness Mission of nine members at McComas, W. Va. Rev. J. A. Guill, the pastor of the church at Bramwell, has charge of this mission and is giving them two preaching services a week.

The total indebtedness of all churches in the district is \$2,595.57. Of this amount the Charleston Church owes \$1,939.26, leaving only \$656.31 for the balance of the district. We have a property valuation of \$90,020.63, according to the reports.

I wish to call the attention of the Ways and Means Committee that there is a budget placed on this district by the General Board of the equivalent of \$2.00 per member for Foreign Missions and \$1.00 per member for General Church Budget, making a total of the equivalent of \$3.00 per capita. We now have a membership of 696. This multiplied by \$3.00 makes our general budget \$2,088.00. To this will have to be added the district budget, which should be more than enough to cover all expenses, district superintendent, secretary, treasurer, printing, church extension, incidentals. It should state in its report how much of the district superintendent's salary is to come out of the budget and how the balance of his support is to be provided for; if by offerings from the churches on his quarterly rounds, the churches and pastors should be informed that they are expected to do more than just pay traveling expenses.

This is my farewell report. For 23 years I have carried the burden of this district as District Superintendent. I could not have done it had I not had the cooperation of the pastors and churches. I am not quitting because of any friction for if there is any I am not aware of it. There has been better cooperation this year than any preceding year I have been District Superintendent and the district is in better condition, as you will see by the reports, but I feel the time has come to let younger shoulders carry this burden. I expect to devote my time to the evangelistic work and will not accept any office, local, district, or general, should I be elected to one, no matter how small, and if elected will resign immediately. I therefore request that no one cast a ballot for me for any office. I thank you for your confidence in me in the past and trust you will stand by my successor as you have stood by me, and that he may be able to lead the district to greater heights than it has ever attained under my administration.

## REPORT OF DISTRICT TENT WORK

Moved and ordered we have report of district tent work, which was heard and duly accepted, same being as follows:

Final report of Sr. Hattie Hickman: Having had charge of the tent work in 1934 I did not receive final settlement until after the assembly, so hereby submit final report. Balance received, \$102.10. Hattie Hickman,, in charge.

Report of Rev. Cecil Phillips, in charge of tent work this year:

To the District Assembly convening at Charleston, Greetings:

We have held three tent meetings this season. We began our first meeting at Alexander, W. Va., June 13th, continuing to the 7th of July. The first two days of this meeting we were assisted by our district superintendent and his wife. In spite of weather conditions God gave us large crowds and there were a number of seekers. Ten souls were converted and two sanctified.

From here we went to Beckley, beginning there July 12th and closing August 11th. I spent the first two weeks there, followed by Rev. J. C. Baynum, who continued this meeting. There were seekers, but only two converted.

We then pitched our tent in Mullens, W. Va., on August 14th and continued until September 15th. In spite of false doctrines and formality, God gave us a revival in which twenty souls were saved and three sanctified. We had a very touching service on the last Sunday morning, followed by a baptismal service at 2:30 in the afternoon and a good service Sunday night. After the services we organized a mission consisting of fifteen members.

### Resolution No. 1

Since many times there is confusion in funeral services, because of lack of wisdom on the part of young preachers to handle it, Be It Resolved: That our District Superintendent give at least two lectures during each assembly on this subject, beginning with this Assembly.

### **Resolution No. 3**

Since the Spirit encourages likemindedness in the Scripture, and since there is diversity of opinions in the ministry, BE IT RESOLVED: That the District Superintendent appoint a committee of three to draft plans for a Ministerial Convention for the coming year. Recommended by the committee. Amended, that the District Superintendent be chairman of this committee. Amendment adopted.

Resolution as amended adopted.

### **Resolution No. 4**

Since Bro. Woods has faithfully served the district in the capacity of District Superintendent for 23 years, and is now resigning, BE IT RESOLVED: That the chair appoint a committee of three to draft a letter expressing the gratitude of this Assembly in behalf of the faithful service rendered by him and his faithful wife.

With recommendations and adopted.

Resolutions Nos. 5, 6, and 7 rescinded, being as follows:

### **Resolution No. 5**

Action of 1929 Assembly, page 13:

"We recommend, relative to the part of the District Superintendent's salary that is not provided for in the budget, one-half tithe, freewill offerings, and unstationed preachers' assessments, that the District Superintendent be given the equivalent of five months off the district for evangelistic meetings. Adopted."

### **Resolution No. 6**

### **Resolution No. 8**

BE IT RESOLVED: That the District Superintendent be requested to give four quarterly meetings and preaching services to each church during the year, and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That his spare time may be given to evangelistic meetings, and all received from such meetings shall be applied on his salary after his expenses have been paid.

Recommended by committee and adopted.

### **Resolution No. 9.**

BE IT RESOLVED: That each pastor shall take up an offering at the quarterly meeting and urge his people to give; which offering shall be applied to the District Superintendent's salary and expense.

Recommended by committee and adopted.

#### **Resolution No. 10 .**

**BE IT RESOLVED:** That the District Superintendent be requested to make out quarterly reports to be sent to each church after each quarterly round, showing spiritual, numerical and financial condition of each church.

Recommended by committee and adopted.

#### **Resolution No. 11**

**BE IT RESOLVED:** That we set the District Superintendent's salary at \$1,300 a year and pay his traveling expenses over the district at a ratio of 3½c per mile. Adopted.

#### **Resolution No. 12**

**BE IT RESOLVED:** That \$50.00 be paid to the District Superintendent every two weeks on his salary by the District Treasurer. Tabled.

#### **Resolution No. 13**

**BE IT RESOLVED:** That the following resolutions and all other resolutions made in this Assembly and future Assemblies be spread upon the District Minutes from year to year. Be it further resolved that all other resolutions made by previous Assemblies be null and void. Tabled.

#### **Resolution No. 14**

**BE IT RESOLVED:** That a standing Resolution Committee be appointed by the District Superintendent at the closing of each Annual Assembly to serve at the next Assembly. Adopted.

#### **Resolution No. 15**

Inasmuch as our Assembly date interferes with our public school system, **BE IT RESOLVED** that we change the time of our District Assembly to start the first Tuesday following the third Sunday in August, to continue over Sunday. Adopted.

#### **Resolution No. 16**

**BE IT RESOLVED:** That invitations be received and voted upon relative to the place where the Ministerial Convention shall be. Be it further resolved that this meeting be held three days during the month of May, 1936. Adopted.

#### **Resolution No. 17**

**BE IT RESOLVED:** That a letter be written by the Secretary to Sister Caldwell, who came to this Assembly to cook, the letter to be as follows:

Beloved Sister in Christ:

The blessings of the Lord be upon you.

We take this opportunity to extend to you our deepest sympathy in your illness. All through our pilgrimage here on earth we are confronted on every side by many strange and perplexing circumstances and undoubtedly our Heavenly Father has permitted one of these to come upon you at this time. ## **FORMER RESOLUTIONS PASSED HAVING A DIRECT BEARING ON THE GOVERNMENT OF THE WEST VIRGINIA DISTRICT**

### **Adopted Resolution of 1921**

"That we, the 12th annual assembly of the IHC of W. Va. urge our churches to give preference to preachers of the IHC in calling workers for their revivals and camp meetings.

### **Adopted Resolutions of 1924, Pages 21 and 22**

2—"No money from Church Extension Fund shall be loaned without the approval of the District Council and then only when notes are given to be paid back at a given time, the money to go back to the treasury to be used only for building purposes."

11—"The District Superintendent shall preside over annual church meetings."

### **Adopted Resolutions of 1924—Page 46**

"4"—Since it is a matter of necessity and importance to the district work that the pastors remain through all the District Assembly:

BE IT RESOLVED: That all our churches provide the usual support for their pastor over the Sunday which they will be absent from their church."

No. 5—Whereas there is prevalent in our church much agitation brought into our midst by evangelists and others from the Nazarene Church, such agitation is for the purpose of proselyting our preachers and churches, and the same results in a hindrance to our progress and the unity of our work, therefore.

BE IT RESOLVED: That no pastor in the West Virginia District shall call for evangelistic service any such evangelist without the endorsement of the District Superintendent.

### **Adopted Resolutions of 1927—Pages 10 and 11**

No. 2—Be It Resolved: That resolution No. 2, page 21, and resolution No. 11, page 22, of the minutes of the District Assembly of West Virginia of the year 1924, also all other resolutions that have been, or shall be passed by the District Assembly of West Virginia shall remain valid until such time as they shall be revoked by the District Assembly.

No. 2—Ways and Means Committee, page 11—We recommend that all regular ordained and licensed ministers who are not regularly engaged in the ministry pay into the District Treasury eight (\$8.00) dollars per year, which is equal to one-fourth the average amount paid by those regularly engaged.

### **Adopted Resolutions of 1929**

Resolution No. 1: Be it resolved: That the Auditing Committee appointed at each Assembly shall continue in office until the convening of the next Assembly.

Resolution No. 10: Be it resolved, that as individual churches, we pay into the District Treasury the full amount of our monthly apportionment at or as near the end of each month when due as is possible for us. By God's help.

### **Adopted Resolutions of 1930**

No. 2, Page 9. We, the Committee on Resolutions recommend that each local church pay expenses of their pastor and delegates to the District Assembly.

No. 4—We your Committee on Resolutions recommend that pastor's salary be paid while he attends the District Assembly.

Carried motion, Page 10, 1930 Minutes—That when it becomes necessary to have the Assistant District Superintendent visit churches, in case he does not receive expenses, the District Superintendent shall pay same and charge it up to his expense account.

## REPORT OF RESOLUTION COMMITTEE OF 1932

Resolution No. 1. Organization of Local Mission Stations.

Adopted as follows:

### Constitution and By-Laws of.....Mission

This Mission shall be known as the Pilgrim Holiness Mission of West Virginia, until such a time as it can be organized into a Pilgrim Holiness Church. It shall be under the supervision of the District Superintendent and the District Council of the Pilgrim Holiness Church of the West Virginia District.

## OFFICERS

The officers of this Mission shall consist of a Pastor, Secretary, Treasurer, Sunday School Superintendent and three Advisory members, which shall be called the Mission Board. They shall be elected annually at the annual business meeting which shall be held one month preceding the District Assembly of the Pilgrim Holiness Church of the West Virginia District.

## DUTIES OF OFFICERS

The Pastor shall preside at all business meetings, and shall have the spiritual oversight of the members of the Mission.

The Secretary shall record all proceedings of Mission meetings and Mission Board meetings.

The Treasurer shall have custody of the finances of the Mission and make disbursements as directed by the Mission Board.

The Sunday School Superintendent shall have charge of the Sunday School, consult with the Pastor in selecting the teachers in Sunday School and shall present these names to the Mission Board to be confirmed by them. No one shall be elected to teach as a regular teacher in the Sunday School who is not in the experience of regeneration or who does not believe in the doctrines of the Pilgrim Holiness Church.

The Advisory members of the Mission Board shall give special attention to the spiritual interests of all members of the Mission and shall feel the responsibility of the oversight of the flock with the Pastor.

## RECEPTION OF MEMBERS

Any person desiring to become a member of this Mission shall first be accepted by the Mission Board then in the presence of Mission, affirmatively answering the following questions:

Have you forsaken and renounced the devil and all his works, the vain pomp and glory of the world with all covetous desires of the same and do you refuse to be led by them?

Have you received the witness of God's spirit to your regeneration?

Do you believe in the doctrine of entire sanctification as a second, definite, instantaneous work of grace, subsequent to regeneration and that it is

the privilege and duty of every believer to seek and find the experience as soon as they receive light concerning it?

Are you willing that all your faith and practice shall be governed by the Word of God and the Holy Ghost?

Will you contribute of your means toward the support of the Lord's cause as you are taught by the Word of God?

Will you abstain from the sale and use of intoxicating liquors, tobacco, and other harmful drugs in all forms?

Will you shun and have no association with or membership in secret societies and lodges which are oath bound?

These persons having satisfactorily responded to these questions are entitled to recognition as members of this Mission. We therefore extend to them the right hand of fellowship.

### BUSINESS MEETINGS AND BOARD MEETINGS

No one shall be elected on the Mission Board who is not a member of the Mission.

The Mission Board shall have power to call a pastor by a two-thirds vote of the Board. A three-fourths vote shall be required to dismiss a pastor.

No pastor shall be called without consultation with and the consent of the District Superintendent of the Pilgrim Holiness Church of the West Virginia District.

Resolution No. 5. Since it is rather conflicting and adds extra work for our District Treasurer to receive money at the Assembly:

Be It Resolved: That all churches send in all moneys not later than fifteen (15) days prior to the assembly. Adopted.

Moved and carried that this Assembly set apart (or order) that at least one donation each month be given all pastors whose support is less than \$1,000.00 per year.

### Resolution No. 15 (1933 Minutes, Page 12)

BE IT RESOLVED: That a standing statistical committee be appointed at the close of each annual assembly to serve throughout the next assembly. Adopted.

### Resolution No. 2 (1934 Minutes, Page 10)

BE IT RESOLVED: That all of our churches set aside one Sunday service in each month for missions, at which time an offering be taken for same. Adopted.
