DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENTS REPORT SUBMITTED. Moved and carried it be accepted, being as follows:

### DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT REPORT

To the 30th Annual Assembly of the Pilgrim Holiness Church of the West Virginia District in session at Huntington, W. Va., August 28th and 29th, 1939.

#### GREETINGS:

God is greatly to be feared in the assembly of the saints, and to be had in reverence of all them that are about Him." Psa. 89:7.

Many have been the blessings that God has bestowed upon us in the decades through which we have passed since the organization of our district, this being our 30th anniversary. We have numerous blessings in this year for which to praise God. We have come together in this assembly as churches, pastors and laity to view and check over the labors for God in the past year. What have we done? What have we done for our General work? What have we done for foreign missions? After taking inventory can we say, we did our best.

I have held two revival meetings with 100 seekers. I have preached 225 times, held 90 quarterly meetings, 24 annual meetings, conducted 2 funerals and assisted in 4. I also filled in as pastor at Fayetteville for several Sundays. I have traveled 8,983 miles. In all I have been very busy. The district superintendent is paid in full the maximum salary.

#### FINANCIAL

We have raised for foreign missions \$1,776.44, making \$44.44 over our quota. Our general budget was set at \$866.00. We raised \$701.11, a deficit of \$164.89. Our district budget was set at \$916.00. We raised \$765.80 falling short \$150.20. There was a deficit in budgets last year of \$388.90, this year \$315.00. We have done excellent on foreign missi ns. Even though the report does not show so well for the other budgets I feel, considering the seven weeks shut down in the coal fields and the fact that we closed our books the 15th of July raising this amount in 11 months, that we have done well.

We have paid our pastors in cash \$14,383.19. This is an increase of \$1,984.86 over last year when they received \$12,398.33. The district has raised a total cash of \$34,970.91.

We have a property valuation of \$92,900.00, debt of \$5,251.00, equity \$87,649.00.

Membership of churches 835, missions 46, grand total of churches and missions 881. The loss in church membership this year of 31 members is due to the loss of our Accoville and Eskdale churches.

We have fallen down on our home missionary work on the account of lack of funds, and no home missionary worker.

I want to call to our attention as a district that we have a deficiency of funds for district printing and also that there should be provisions made to lay aside sufficient funds yearly for our general assembly expenses in 1942.

I thank every minister and lay member for your cooperation through this year and give the praise to God for all that has been done during the past year.

It was moved and carried this resolution be ADOPTED.

#### FURTHER REPORT OF WAYS & MEANS COMMITTEE

Res. No. 2. Whereas paragraph 20 of section 83 says the district shall provide a parsonage and telephone for the district Supt. We recommend that the district trustees be impowered to buy a parsonage in Huntington or Charleston and until such a time as a parsonage is provided the district will pay \$20.00 per month for rent, also that the district will pay the telephone bill. It was moved and carried this recommendation be accepted.

#### FOURTH BUSINESS SESSION

Forenoon, August 29, 1939

Opened with devotional—Prayer by Sr. Erie Wiley, Delegate Logan Church.

Song by Sr. H. E. Logan.

Address by the Chair—A very plain and comprehensive address in which he urged the ministry to PREACH CHRIST JESUS THE LORD INSTEAD OF OUR OWN IDEAS AND PERSONALITY basing his admonition from scripture taken from 2nd Cor. Chapter 4 Verse 5.

Minutes of last session read and approved.

Rev. E. D. Joy from the Virginia District presented and gave a short testimony. It was moved and carried that we give him a seat in the Assembly with voice in the discussions.

#### WAYS & MEANS COMMITTEE Reports.

Resolution No. 3 Be it resolved that the District Superintendent's salary be a minimum of \$1,300.00 and a maximum of \$1,500.00 per year and traveling expenses at the rate of 3 cents per mile.

The part of the District Superintendent's salary not provided for in the budget shall be raised by officings taken as he visits the churches for quarterly meetings and revivals, half tithe of all preaches in this district actively engaged, and \$8.00 per year of those not actively engaged in the ministry. Moved and seconded that we adopt this resolution Carried.

Moved and carried we have all resolutions read, which was done.

Resolution No. 4. We recommend that the District budget be placed at \$1255.00 and that it be divided as follows: District superintendent

\$700.00, District parsonage \$240.00, Printing \$110.00, Incidentals \$100.00, District Treasurer \$50.00, District Superintendent Telephone \$30.00, District Secretary \$25.00. Moved and seconded we adopt this resolution. ADOPTED.

Resolution No. 5. We recommend that the General budget be placed at \$2454.00. Moved and seconded to adopt this resolution. ADOPTED.

Resolution No. 6. We recommend that each church raise the equivalent of 25c per member for General Assembly expenses.. ADOPTED.

Resolution No. 7. Be it resolved that the District Council shall nominate Three men for District Evangelistic to be voted for by secret ballot by the District Assembly at the time of the election of the officers of the Assembly

The duties of this Evangelist shall be mapped out by the District Council; his SALARY shall be a minimum of \$1,000.00 and a maximum of \$1200.00 per year he snall receive all offerings from meetings held by him until the maximum has been reached and all over the maximum shall be turned into District Treasurer to be applied to the Home Mission fund. He shall report monthly to the District Treasurer all monies received.

The District shall be respons ble for the expense of placing the tent on locations for tent meetings during the tent season. The money for the SUPPORT of the District Evangerist shall come out of the Home Missionary fund.
