## REPORT OF DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

### GREETINGS:

This year has not been one of sunshine and ease. If the work of our District ever demanded divine guidance in every respect, it has been this year. I have no disposition to boast within myself of that which has been accomplished, but God has been faithful in every step, and I have proven His word true.

A number of our pastors have painted and re-decorated their churches. The Fayetteville church has paid off their indebtedness and I had the privilege of dedicating it and burning the mortgage. The Mount Hope folks have sold their old building and purchased a Methodist church with a very small indebtedness. Terra Alta and Nellis have purchased lots and each have a building program under way and are expecting to have their basements ready to worship in by winter. Spring Fork church folks have re-modeled and built new Sunday School rooms. I have organized one new church without any expense to the District and it has paid into the district and general church the sum of \$339.34. The Statistician's report will show that there has been a gain of 30 percent in the Church Finance and 50 percent in the Sunday School; 7 percent in Church Membership and 8 percent in Sunday School attendance.

I have visited some of the churches five or six times, and every church four times; held annual meetings in each church, held two revivals, preached 151 times, had 72 seekers, baptized 7, conducted one funeral and traveled 14,730 miles. I have received my maximum salary and my traveling expenses are paid to date. The treasurer's report will show a balance of \$631.86 in the Superintendent's account.
