REPORTS SECTION REPORT OF DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

TO THE ANNUAL CONFERENCE OF THE WEST VIRGINIA DISTRICT OF THE PILGRIM HOLINESS CHURCH:

Dear Co-Laborers with me in Christ: Greetings:

Under God's protection we have come through another year, and we have gathered here to give a report of our stewardship as your District Superintendent. This year has indeed required our best attention and effort but God proved that His grace was all-sufficient for each of our problems.

There have been some splendid advances made this year. The churches took advantage of the financial set-up that was passed last Conference and have used the greater portion of their finances for building purposes. Clarksburg and Williamson have purchased new parsonages which is a great asset to the District. I reported last year that Huntington had purchased another parsonage at the cost of \$10,000; this year they sold the old parsonage for \$6,000 and they only lack \$900 to liquidate the entire indebtedness. Bramwell sold their old parsonage on the river bank and purchased an eight-room parsonage in the residential section of the city and they have a very small indebtedness. The church at Wayne has been progressing this year. Electricity has been installed and the church has been painted inside and outside. The Vienna Church has built a full-size basement for Sunday School rooms and installed rest-rooms. The O'Toole Church has raised approximately \$1,000 to build Sunday School rooms and the work is in progress now. The new church at Summerlee purchased a large building and converted it into a church and parsonage and Sunday School rooms. The Spring Fork church has painted their church inside and outside and installed an electric fan. For years our good Pilgrims at Nellis have been worshiping in a schoolhouse; some predicted that we would never be able to get a church building in that coal camp, but Thank God! today we have a nice church with full-size basement with cash and pledges to cover the indebtedness. The Mount Hope Church paid off their indebtedness on both church and parsonage.

Our finances have gone over \$80,000 but the material side is not always a safe guide to the prosperity of the church, but when we consider the statistical and spiritual side, it indicates a healthy state of affairs. However our Home Missionary Work has not been what I would love to have seen. War conditions and the lack of workers have been quite a problem. My heart is burdened for our Missionary Work, there are several large cities that we should evangelize and establish churches. I recommend that the resolution committee consider Home Missions when they bring in their resolutions to this Conference.

I have visited some of the churches six or seven times and every church four times; held annual meetings in each church; held one revival; preached 157 times, dedicated three churches; had forty seekers, baptized four and dedicated five children. I presented the new Headquarter's building in all the churches and raised in cash and pledges \$830.45 of which \$704.72 has come in, traveled 15,261 miles. I have received my salary and my traveling expenses are paid to date.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: that the council be authorized to engage a Home Missionary Evangelist who shall be actively engaged to establish new churches. Said missionary to receive for remuneration the sum of \$1,800.00 per annum, to be paid monthly in advance, in addition to his house rent and moving espenses; and that all money raised in the home mission campaign be turned in to the District Treasurer. Also proper arrangements shall be made between the District Council and the Home Missionary as to payment of the Sundry expenses. Adopted.

RESOLUTION No. 3—

We recommend that the District and General budget be raised in this method. That each church more than two years old shall send to the District Treasurer the first of each month, the amount equal to 10% (or a tithe) of the gross income of the church and Sunday School, except that raised for building fund purposes, whether it be local, district or general, or for church or parsonage.

RESOLUTION No. 4—

In as much as the following items are included in our General and District Budget such as General Home Missions, Foreign Missions and District Home Missions, we recommend that all money raised in these special offerings for the above items, be credited to our budget, or to make up our 10% given to these claims.

RESOLUTION No. 5—

We recommend that each church treasurer be instructed to send their money to our District Treasurer just marked as District Budget or General Budget and the proper allocations be made by the District Treasurer.

RESOLUTION No. 6--

We recommend that the District Superintendent's salary be set at \$2,000.00 per year and traveling expenses at the rate of five cents per mile. That part of salary not provided for in the Budget shall be raised by offerings taken when he visits the churches; the half tithe of all preachers of this District actively engaged, and \$10.00 per year from those not actively engaged in the ministry.

RESOLUTION No. 7—

Inasmuch as there is an amount of \$647.49 surplus in the District Superintendent's account; we recommend that we give him \$300.00 as a love offering.

No PASTOR of the District shall engage in a revival during camp date without permission from the District Superintendent.

ALL District Preachers shall be present the entire Camp.

FREE CAMP Entertainment shall be accorded all licensed and ordained ministers and their immediate dependents; also all District officials.

LODGING AND MEALS TO OTHERS: Dormitory rooms per night 50c, entire 10 days \$4.00. Hall beds per night 20c, entire 10 days \$1.50. MEALS:—Breakfast 20c, Dinner 25c, Supper 25c.

DISTRICT CONFERENCE shall follow Camp.

CHURCH REPORTS MUST be sent to the chairman of Statistical Committee IMMEDIATELY after their ANNUAL MEETING.

MINISTERIAL CONVENTION—One this conference year arranged by the District Council.

An All Day Meeting on the Camp Ground to be held July 4th.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT Must be consulted where an expenditure of \$1,000.00 or more is made for repairs; or purchase of church property.

LOCAL PREACHERS shall receive free books from, and answer to the Educational & Examining Board the same as licensed preachers.

DISTRICT SUNDAY SCHOOL BANNER to be presented to the Sunday School making the highest percentage of gain in attendance over the previous quarter. Complete tabulated reports to be sent to each pastor.

YOUNG PEOPLES SOCIETY: All churches having no Y. P. Organization shall have a special young peoples revival during the year. The District Superintendent shall see to this.

YOUNG PEOPLES RALLY shall be last Saturday of Camp with free entertainment.

The District Council shall appoint a children's worker to conduct children's meeting each day during Camp.

MINISTERIAL BENEFIT FEE and Assessment for their pastor must be paid by the church.

CAMP MEETING PARSONAGE (Cottage) Must be built by each church of the district if financially able.

NO SMOKING SIGNS must be placed conspicuously throughout the Camp Grounds.

LUNCH STAND must remain closed for one-half hour after altar call.
