Entzminger, pastor at Nellis, after which our presiding General Superintendent, Dr. Paul F. Elliott was introduced to conference.

He greets us with good report and not with complaining. He states we are happy christians. God is for us, His Spirit is in us and He has gone to prepare a place for us. Dr. Elliott introduces Dr. Clyde Parker, President of Southern Pilgrim College, who in turn gives us a very good and interesting report of the school. Moved and supported, Dr. Parker be given an honorary seat in conference.

Roll call completed and conference bar is same as last year. Transfer of Revs. Eugene White and J. L. Estes received. Transfer of Rev. Bert Sayre from Ohio Conference of Wesleyan Methodist Church received. Presentation of visiting ministers: Rev. Earl Jordon, Rev. and Mrs. J. L. Conference opened by singing "I Shall Know Him." Prayer by Rev. H. H. Harrison. Memorials read by secretary. Conference stands in moment of silent prayer after which Rev. Lint led conference prayer. Minutes read and approved.

CAMP AND CONFERENCE STANDING RULES

(WAYS AND MEANS)

No. 1. Be it resolved that the deadline for receiving a deposit on rooms be set at May 15 and in the event no deposit on rooms is received the Registrar be authorized to advertise the room for rent June 15, and the first \$2.00 deposit secure it. Be it further resolved that in the event a lock is placed on the room an identifiable key must be filed with the registrar in order that the room may be used if necessary. This \$2.00 deposit is to hold the room until the first Saturday night of camp at 6:00 p.m.

No. 2. We recommend a charge of \$6.00 for all rooms except rooms with 4 beds — these are to be \$10.00. We further recommend a charge of \$3.00 per person to be made for lodging for the entire camp and .35 for one night.

No. 3. We recommend a charge for meals for the entire camp be as follows:

2 years thru 12 years	\$2.00
13 years thru 18 years	3.00
19 years and over	4.00
Single meals (2 thru 12)20
Single meals (13 and over)30

No. 4. We recommend that each church send to District Treasurer for District Conference Expenses: \$2.00 for each delegate and licensed and ordained minister and ordained deaconess.

No. 5. Whereas, The camp ground has been laid out in streets and lots, and Whereas, leases to these lots have been offered for sale over a number of years and

Whereas, many of the leases have been sold, and

Whereas, some leases have been built upon, and other cottages are in the planning stage, therefore

We recommend that permission in writing be granted by the District council for retired and disabled ministers to live on the camp grounds.

We further recommend that the lease holder be required to pay for utilities and, We further recommend that the District Council set the rate of payment and that the council be guided in rate setting by the size of the cottage and the number of persons occupying it.

And be it further recommended that if at the demise of the lease holder, the heirs or assigns be judged by the District Council to be persons not in harmony with the spirit, intents and purposes of the camp, the property shall be sold as follows:

A notice shall be caused to be posted on the building by the District Council for a period of six months of intention to sell. The property to be sold at the best available price and proceeds of the sale to be turned over to the heirs or assigns. The council shall be required to notify the heirs or

assigns at the time of posting the building, of intent to sell, by registered mail. No more than \$50.00 shall be retained by the District Council for the expenses of the sale.

No. 6. We recommend that each local church pay the expenses of their pastor and delegate to the district conference.

No. 7. We recommend that all Ordained and Licensed ministers and their families other than those from our district be given free meals at our camp, however, the regular charge shall be made for rooms.

WAYS AND MEANS (DISTRICT)

No. 1. We recommend that the United Stewardship Fund be based on \$9.50 per member.

No. 2. We recommend that District Minutes be sold at 25¢ per copy, a roll call be taken of churches either pastor or delegate respond by stating number of minutes they desire; the local church is responsible for this amount.

No. 3. We recommend that each church, upon the official visit of the District Superintendent, raise the following amounts: Churches who have under forty members, \$6.00; with forty or over, \$8.50 per visit.

No. 4. We recommend that District Budget be set at \$5,770.00 divided as follows:

District Printing	300.00
District Secretary	125.00
District Treasurer	250.00
District Home Missions	500.00
Incidental and International Conference	200.00
District Camp and Conference	400.00
District Sunday School	100.00
District Statistician	35.00
District Parsonage Payments	960.00

No. 5. We recommend that the District Budget and the United Stewardship Fund be raised in the following manner: Each church shall send to the District Treasurer, the first of each month, 10% of the income of the church and Sunday school, except money raised for Building Fund, Easter Offering, November Self-Denial, Sunday School Rally Day, all World Missionary offerings, Y.P.S. offerings, and Evangelists pay.

No. 6. We recommend that District Superintendent's salary be set at \$4,200.00 per year plus traveling expenses at the rate of .07 per mile on all official business. This money to be raised in the following manner: \$2,900.00 as provided in budget. Offerings are to be taken when he visits the churches, half-tithes of all district pastors and evangelists. Also \$12.00 from tithes of district preachers, except those whose age is 65 and over.

No. 7. We recommend that the Superintendent's full ministerial tithes be placed in the Incidental and International Conference Expense Fund. These Ministerial tithes to be in addition to the already stipulated amount for this fund.

No. 8. We recommend the continuation of the District Home Mission Calendar offerings.

No. 9. We recommend that one-half of the Mother's Day Sunday School offerings be designated for District Sunday School Department.

No. 10. We recommend that all district assessments be sent to the District Treasurer monthly.

No. 11. We recommend that the local church pay the Ministerial Benefit fee and assessment for their pastor and wife.

No. 12. We recommend that the district pay the District Superintendent's ministerial benefit.

No. 13. We recommend that all evangelists and actively engaged workers who tithe into their local church, said church shall pay 4% into the pension plan and the district pay 4% out of the Incidental account.

No. 14. We recommend that the Youth Society of the district operate the refreshment stand during Youth Camp. We further recommend a capable manager be appointed by the district council to supervise the stand during conference and camp and the profits be divided equally between district and youth.

No. 15. Whereas, our district has received and is receiving money from the estate of the late A. V. Conklin, be it resolved that all money received from the estate be placed in a fund known as the "Conklin Fund." The fund is to be used for the sole purpose of constructing new churches. Loans from the Conklin Fund are to be handled under the same plan as the Church Loan Fund.

No. 16. We recommend that the pastor's and evangelist's half-tithe be paid through the local church treasurer.

No. 17. We recommend that the District Superintendent on each official visit to the churches meet with the pastor and church board and inquire into the financial obligations of the church to the district and General Church, and to make recommendations as to how to meet deficiencies when they are found.

No. 18. WHEREAS, the General Board of the Pilgrim Holiness Church has authorized the Pilgrim Pension Plan, Inc. to make loans of pension funds to local Pilgrim Holiness Churches under such conditions as requires active participation on the part of the Pilgrim Holiness Districts,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Annual Conference of this District, that the District Council, District Trustees, and all District Officials be and they are hereby authorize, to do and perform any and all acts of them in the consumation of authorized loans to local Pilgrim Holiness Churches of this district, subject however, to the limitations and conditions set out in said Resolution of the General Board of the Pilgrim Holiness Church authorizing said loans.

No. 19. BE IT RESOLVED: a church loan fund be established by appropriating \$4,000.00 from the special account for this purpose.

Be it further resolved that the loan fund operate as follows:

(1) The executive members of the council shall be a committee to pass on all loan applications and authorize loans.

(2) Loans shall be made to established churches for new construction of church or parsonage or for repairs and/or improvements of the same.

(3) Loans are not to exceed \$1,000.00. The interest rate shall be 5% and payments must be made monthly on the first day of the month. Payments received after the 15th of the month will be charged an extra months interest as a late charge.

(4) Monthly payments will be figured at 2% of the face of the note as a minimum, however, no payment shall be less than \$5.00 per month except the last payment. This amount is to cover interest and payment on the principal. The minimum interest charge shall be 50¢ per month.

(5) No loan will be granted for amount under \$100.00.

(6) Monthly payments shall be made to the district treasurer.

(7) The local church shall give the district a note covering the amount of the loan, signed by the trustees.

(8) Any amount above the regular payment will be received at payment due time. Not more than one payment will be received in a given month, except that the note may be paid in full at any time.

No. 20. We recommend that the Sunday School Promotional Secretary and District Youth President be paid \$50.00 per year, to be paid from their respective departments.

RESOLUTIONS

1. Be it resolved that the District Council appoint a children's worker to conduct children's meetings each day during camp.
2. Be it resolved that the District Council appoint a Sunday School board of four, including the Sunday School Promotional Secretary.
3. Be it resolved that this Conference recommend and urge each church financially able, to build a cottage on the camp grounds for their pastor, to be used and known as their "Camp Meeting Parsonage."
4. Be it resolved that we call two evangelists and special singers for our camp.
5. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent be allowed two weeks vacation pay each year, and that he have the privilege of holding two revivals off the District.
6. Be it resolved that each pastor endeavor to secure a subscription list to the Advocate equal to his church membership families.
7. Whereas the District Superintendent needs more time to supervise weak churches and carry on other work on the District, therefore be it resolved that he visit the churches at least twice each year.
8. Be it resolved that our District Council meet at least once each Quarter.
9. Be it resolved that all ministers in the District be considered for pastoral placement before any one out of the District is considered.
10. In as much as many ministers of the District have long distances to travel to ministerial conventions thus finding it expedient to leave after the last afternoon service, be it resolved that the time in the week for ministerial conventions be as follows, the first service beginning on Tuesday afternoon at 2:30 and the last service concluded at noon Thursday and be it further resolved the date of our District Ministerial Convention be the last week in March.
11. Be it resolved that the district Sunday school banners be awarded to the schools having the largest percentage and numerical gains over the previous year.
12. Be it resolved that the Educational and Examining Committees meet with applicants on Tuesday before Conference at the following time:

1st year license	1:00 p.m. - 2:30 p.m.
2nd year license	2:30 p.m. - 3:30 p.m.
3rd year license	3:30 p.m. - 4:30 p.m.
13. Be it resolved that the pastors be allowed two weeks vacation with pay each year.

RESOLUTION COMMITTEE REPORT

(District)

1. Whereas our Nation is caught in the throes of an undeclared, yet nevertheless devastating war, necessitating the involvement of a large number of our Sunday School and Church members in the Armed Services:

Be it resolved that we carry in this year's Minutes a list of the service personnel from our constituency, indicating alphabetically the Rank, Name, and Church, and with an asterisk (*) to denote Sunday School members and with a plus (+) to denote Church members. The pastor with his church board shall determine the proper list.

And be it further resolved that this Conference have a special season of prayer, called at the discretion of the Chair, for those in the armed services of our Great Nation.

Council to appoint three people to take care of Service Men's Roll and pastors use freedom in choosing.

2. Be it resolved that the Annual Sunday School average be based on 50 Sundays.

3. Whereas, in the providence of God, Bro. Parker Husselton has served the West Virginia District as Superintendent for the past five years, and upon taking a pastorate he terminates his work in this capacity at this Conference.

Be it resolved, that as an expression of appreciation to Bro. Husselton, the Conference give him a rising vote of thanks for his untiring labors, faithful leadership, and spiritual ministry and Christian fellowship, in the general oversight of the District; and to Sr. Husselton, who has stood faithfully by him in his work and the District interests. May God's blessing continue to be upon them.

Moved and carried to amend Resolution No. 1 of the 1966 Annual Youth Conference minutes. The resolution as amended is: Since there is such a wide variation in age and abilities in our youth camp group, BE IT RESOLVED, that we divide our youth camp into junior and senior divisions, to be held as one camp. The junior division age span would range from 9-12 years of age, and the senior division from 13-18.

Moved and carried to retain resolutions 2, 3, and 4 of the 1966 Youth Conference.

Resolution No. 2 — BE IT RESOLVED, that youth camp registration begin at 9:30 A.M. on Monday, the first day of camp, and that from 2:00 P.M. to 4:00 P.M. of the same day be designated as the "get acquainted" period, at which time teachers and counselors shall be introduced and the whole group familiarized with the camp program and regulations. Carried.

Resolution No. 3 — (as amended) BE IT RESOLVED, that a recreational director and committee be appointed by the executive Youth Council early in the year, for the purpose of promoting and guiding an enthusiastic recreational program that would involve all campers, and that the recreational facilities be made ready for the first day of youth camp. Carried.

Resolution No. 4 — Whereas it is the obligation of the youth to manage the lunch stand, BE IT RESOLVED, that a manager be appointed by the Youth Council, now, or as soon as possible, and that this manager be responsible for the purchasing of needed supplies so that the same would be ready to sell on the first day of youth camp. Carried.

Motion to retain Resolution No. 5 of 1966 Conference. Motion Lost.

Moved and carried to reconsider vote on Resolution No. 5 of 1966 Conference and amend the resolution. The resolution as amended is: BE IT RESOLVED, that the District adopt the General Youth Quiz Program on a district level. Carried.

Resolution No. 6 — BE IT RESOLVED, that the youth camp be scheduled at a date which will not interfere with July 4th. Carried.

Resolution No. 7 — BE IT RESOLVED, that the date of the Youth Conference be prior to Annual Camp Meeting, on a Saturday, with morning and afternoon business sessions, and that the District Council shall determine the date and location of the meeting. Carried.
