Sister Webster led the congregation singing, "We're Marching to Zion". We were led in prayer by Rev. L. W. Goss, after which the Assembly joined in singing "Draw me Nearer".

Rev. Thomas gave an address reading as a scripture lesson Acts 4:23-31.

Roll Call

The roll of Assembly members was prepared and called. There were 14 ministers and delegates present.

Motion made that the first two front seats be reserved as the Assembly Bar. Motion supported and carried.

Time of Sessions

The time of sessions was set from 9 a. m. to 11:45 and to begin at 1:30 p. m. and close at 4:30.

A motion made that the superintendent appoint the following committees: statistical, resolutions, reception, editing. Motion carried.

The reception committee introduced Rev. and Mrs. Webber, Rev. and Mrs. Partridge and Rev. Alice Norris to the Assembly. They were given honorary seats in the Assembly bar.

Meeting adjourned with prayer by Rev. Thomas.

Second Session of Assembly

The second session of Assembly opened at 1:30 p. m. We were lead in prayer by Brother Webster. The Assembly joined in singing " 'Tis So Sweet to Trust in Jesus".

The minutes of the last session were read and approved.

Brother Emon Olson, Sister Galer and Sister Felthouse were introduced to the Assembly and given Honorary seats in the Assembly Bar.

The Committee on Resolutions reported. The following resolutions were adopted:

Res. No. 1: Resolved, that each local church of the district be apportioned the minimum of \$5.00 per member to finance our general church and district obligations, said amount to be distributed as follows: Foreign Missions 40% Home Missions 20%, District Expense 20%, and General Budget 20%.

Res. No. 2: Resolved, that 125 copies of the District minutes be printed and one copy be placed in the hands of each Pilgrim Holiness family and minister of this District, and that 5 copies be mailed to the General Office, and one to each District Superintendent, providing we can get reasonable prices.

Res. No. 3: Resolved, that \$50.00 be paid to our District Superintendent from our District Treasury. This amount to be paid in quarterly installments,

also that special offerings be taken at each quarterly meeting. The amendment was offered as follows: That the District Superintendent receive \$10.00 per month besides the \$50.00 per year.

Res. No. 4: Resolved, that the District Superintendent draw upon the District Treasury for traveling expenses incurred in the interest of the District.

Res. No. 5: Resolved, that the District Superintendent visit all independent churches and missions of the District which are supplied by ministers who are members of this Assembly when advisable.

Res. No. 6: Resolved, that all monies or receipts for monies sent to the different departments of the general church be given to the local church treasurer and then forwarded to District Treasurer in order that our financial records shall be complete.

Res. No. 7: Resolved, that we have four District Group meetings this year and that the time and place be left to the Superintendent and Assistant Superintendent.

Res. No. 8: Resolved, that the District Superintendent appoint the Statistical Committee two weeks prior to the Assembly, and that the Superintendent send two blank reports to each minister, church and Sunday School and that these be filled out and one copy sent to the committee not less than 10 days prior to the Assembly, and the other to be retained and read on the floor of the Assembly.

Res. No. 9: Resolved, that each church of our District set one prayer-meeting night during each month as a special time for donations to the pastor and family, such to be announced by one of the deacons at a previous service.

Res. No. 10: Resolved, that we as an Assembly give a rising vote of thanks to our General Secretary, Brother Thomas, for coming to us in this time of need. His ability and judgment have certainly been an asset to our Assembly and his messages, talks and advice have been unquestionably sound and sensible. We urge his return to us if Jesus tarries. The Assembly gave Brother Thomas a rising vote of thanks.

Res. No. 11: Resolved, that the time of our next Annual Assembly be held during the last half of the month of August.

Res. No. 12: Resolved, that we petition the General Superintendent of the Pilgrim Holiness Church to consider the changing of the boundary of the Idaho-Washington District to include that part of the state of Oregon east of the Cascade Range of mountains, and that a letter of explanation be sent with this resolution, and also that a letter be sent to the District Superintendent of California District explaining the same.

Third Assembly Session

The third session was opened on Monday at 9 a. m. Brother Goss led the singing "Bringing in the Sheaves". Sister Himmelright offered prayer.

Brother Partridge read the 53rd chapter of Isaiah. Brother Thomas gave us a talk in regard to the work on the District and some timely suggestions as to how we might be more aggressive. We were led in prayer by Bro. Thomas.

The roll was called. Minutes of previous session were read and approved.

The Auditing Committee gave in the following report: The District Treasurer's books were audited this 28th day of July, 1934, and were found to be correct and in good order. L. W. Goss, George Doll, Ida G. Garner
Report accepted.

The District Treasurer's report was read and accepted.

A motion was made that the District Council serve as the Camp-meeting Committee or that the Council elect a Camp-meeting committee if necessary. Motion carried.

A motion was made that we accept Orofino and Weippe churches into the District. Motion carried.

A motion was made that we adjourn. Motion carried.

Fourth Assembly Session

Bro. Olson led the Assembly in singing "His Way With Thee". We were led in prayer by Brother Webster followed by singing "The Cleansing Stream". Bro. Doll read the 13th chapter of 1 Corinthians.

Rev. Thomas gave us a talk on holding up the standards of the Pilgrim Holiness Church. He afterwards led us in prayer.

The minutes of the last session were read and approved.

The Examining Board read the following report:

The following persons appeared before the Examining Board and we recommend:

That Dorthea Calhoon be granted renewal of license and that she be retained in the third year course of study for licensed ministers.

That George Doll be granted renewal of license and be retained in the first year course of study for licensed ministers.

That this Assembly receive Mrs. Alice Norris from the California District; that she be granted renewal of license and retained in the second year course of study for licensed ministers.

That J. B. Bush be granted renewal of license and retained in first year course of study.

That J. W. Partridge be granted minister's license and placed in the first year course of study for licensed ministers.

That Mrs. E. M. Himmelright be recommended for ordination as deaconness.

That Pearl Doll and Ruby Goss be granted deaconness license and placed in the first year course of study.

That Kathleen Carter be granted deaconness license and placed in the second year course of study.

That Mabel Bittleston, having completed the course of study required for deaconness work, be granted a license for same.

A request was made that the District grant L. W. Goss and Hazel L. Goss Evangelistic Commission. It was granted.

A motion was made that the matter of raising money to send the Delegate to the General Assembly be left in the hands of the District Council and the plan be submitted to the churches. Motion carried.

A motion made, that if any adjustment need to be made in reference to the Delegates to the General Assembly, that it be left to the District Council. Motion carried.

A motion made and supported that we have our General Secretary, Brother Thomas, give a sennon on Home Missions and take up an offering for the same. Motion carried.

A motion made that the disbursing of District Funds be left in the hands of the District Council. Motion carried.

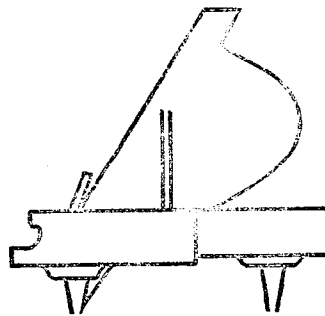
A motion made that the printing of the District Stationery be left in the hands of the District Council. Motion carried.
